Ivy League Championship Notes

- In 60 seasons of play, the men's soccer title has been won outright 44 times. Two teams have tied for the championship 15 times. In 2005 there was a three-way tie for the title as Brown, Dartmouth and Yale all finished at 5-1-1.
- Brown leads the way with 20 total Ivy League titles, followed by Harvard with 13. Of Brown's 20 titles, 12 have been won outright – also a top mark in the Ivy record book.
- Yale and Columbia boast the highest percentage of outright title wins, with four of Yale's five titles coming outright (.800) and seven of Columbia's nine also being outright titles (.778).
- In 59 attempts to date, the Ivy League title has been successfully defended (meaning at least one of the previous season's champions won the League title the following season) 24 times.
- The last team to successfully defend the Ivy title was Dartmouth, which won the 2004 title and then won a share of the 2005 crown (with Brown and Yale).
- The last time consecutive Ivy championships were won in outright fashion was 1997 and 1998 when Brown claimed consecutive titles.
- The most dominant stretch of title defenses was put together by Columbia when it won eight consecutive League titles from 1978-85 (including sharing the 1980 title with Penn).
- In 60 seasons of play, the Ivy League champion has finished without an Ivy League loss 23 times. In 2010, Princeton posted a 7-0-0 record to mark the 12th time an Ivy League champion has finished with a perfect mark (no losses or ties).
- Only in 1964 (Dartmouth at 5-2-0) and in 1975 (Brown at 5-2-0) has the Ivy League champion finished with more than one League loss.
- The most goals scored in League play by an Ivy champion was 31 by Penn in 1972, while the fewest League goals conceded by an Ivy champion was one by Yale in 1986.
- The fewest goals scored in League play by an Ivy champion was eight, which has been done five times (Penn in 1980, Brown in 2001, Penn in 2002, Dartmouth in 2004 and Brown in 2011). The most League goals conceded by an Ivy champion was 13 by Princeton in 1993.

Ivy League NCAA Championship Notes

- Since 1963, the Ivies have sent at least one team to the NCAA tournament 49 of the 52 years (all but 1966-67 and 1988), including each season since 1989.
- The Ancient Eight have combined to post a 65-40-1 record in NCAA first round play since 1963, including 14 first-round wins since 2001 (current format).
- Since 2001 when the NCAA Championship began playing under its current format of a 48-team field with the top-16 seeded teams receiving first round byes, Dartmouth (2008 & 2010), Harvard (2009), Brown (2010 & 2011) have advanced to the third round where they have combined to post a 0-5 record.
- In 2011, Brown became just the second Ivy to play a home game in the third round (Harvard's 2-0 loss to Maryland in 2009 was the other).
- Since 2001 when the NCAA Men's Soccer Div. I Championship began playing under its current format of a 48-team field with the top-16 seeded teams receiving first round byes, the Ivies had not had two teams in the final-16 (third round) until Brown and Dartmouth both advanced to the final-16 in 2010.
- Based on the various changes to the NCAA Men's Soccer Div. I Championship bracket, the Ivy League last had two of the final-16 teams in 1999 (when the tournament featured a 32-team field with no byes). That season, Yale downed Rutgers 1-0 (2 ot) and Brown defeated Rhode Island 2-1 (ot) in the first round to advance to the second round, which included the final-16 teams.
- Before Brown and Dartmouth advanced past two rounds in 2010, the last time two Ivy League teams advanced through multiple rounds in the same NCAA Championship was 1975 when Brown and Cornell each won two games before facing each other in the third round, where Brown downed Cornell 3-0. Brown defeated Bridgeport (3-2) in the first round and Connecticut in the second round (4ot/3-1 penalty kicks). Cornell knocked off Oneonta State in the first round (1-0) and Hartwick in the second (2-1).
- With Brown, Dartmouth and Penn winning their first round games, 2010 marked the first time since the 1973 season that three Ivy League teams advanced to the second round of an NCAA tournament.
- The Ivies have now combined for a 5-11 record in NCAA Championship second round play since 2001 (when the tournament was changed to its current format).
- 2010 marked the first time four Ivy League teams have appeared in the NCAA Championship field in back-to-back years since the 1971 and 1972 seasons.
- Overall, 2010 marked the sixth time four or more Ivy teams made the NCAA Championship field (five teams made the 1977 tournament).
