## ROOTED IN IVY - IVIES IN THE NFL

22 Ivies earned National Football League (NFL) roster spots entering the 2019 season, with 15 on 53-man active rosters, two on 10-man practice squads and four on reserve lists during Week 5. Twelve Ivies saw the field in Week 5 of the 2019 National Football League (NFL) season, including five that started for their respective teams.

An FCS-leading 24 Ivies appeared on NFL rosters during the 2018 season, with Harvard alumnus Kyle Juszczyk earning his third-straight Pro Bowl nod with the San Francisco 49ers and Brown alum James Develin becoming the first Ivy to win three Super Bowls as a player with the New England Patriots.

## SETTING THE STANDARD

For the second-straight season, an Ivy League football program employs the lone full-time female football coach at the NCAA Division I level. Dartmouth's Callie Brownson—now with the Buffalo Bills—was the first-ever full-time female coach at the NCAA Division I level with Dartmouth in 2018 and offensive quality control coach Heather Marini is the second with Brown in 2019.

### IVY LEAGUE ON ESPN

The Ivy League and ESPN have agreed to a long-term relationship to showcase Ivy League events through a variety of ESPN platforms, including at least 24 events annually on ESPN's linear networks and more than 1,100 annually on ESPN+.

ESPN and the Ivy League have reached a comprehensive, 10-year deal for ESPN to become the exclusive national media rights partner for the conference, carrying more than 1,100 events annually from more than 30 sports on ESPN media platforms. The majority of those will be exclusively available on ESPN+, the new direct-to-consumer sports streaming service from The Walt Disney Company's Direct-to-Consumer and International division in partnership with ESPN. The Ivy League will also have at least 24 events air on ESPN's linear networks each year, including a six-game football packaged headlined by The Game: Harvard-Yale this season.

The expanded live content and enhanced fan experience through ESPN+ will also provide a greater value to Ivy League fans, as they will receive more games and content at a cost less than the previous Ivy League Network. For just \$4.99 a month or \$49.99 a year, subscribers will get the Ivy League on ESPN, MLB, NHL and MLS games, Grand Slam tennis, Top Rank boxing, PGA Tour golf, additional college sports, international rugby, cricket, the full library of ESPN Films (including the award-winning 30 for 30 documentary series) and more.

A subscription to ESPN+ is available for purchase via the ESPN App and ESPN.com. Subscribers can watch ESPN+ in the Watch tab of the latest version of the ESPN App, available on the web, iPhone, iPad, tvOS, Android Handset, Roku, Chromecast and FireTV.

### POSTSEASON AWARDS

Following the conclusion of the 2019 season, the Ivy League will announce its football postseason award winners, as voted on by the League's eight head coaches.

The All-Ivy teams (First, Second and Honorable Mention), Rookie of the Year and Coach of the Year will be announced on Tuesday, Nov. 26. The finalists for the Asa S. Bushnell Cup, which recognizes the League's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year, will then be announced on Tuesday, Dec. 3. Finally, the winners of the Asa S. Bushnell Cup, will be recognized at the Bushnell Cup Presentation on Monday, Dec. 9 at 12:30 p.m. ET in the Mercury Ballroom of the New York Hilton Midtown.

For the 10th-consecutive year the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame (NFF) has partnered with the Ivy League to co-host the press conference and reception. The Pasadena Tournament of Roses returns for a sixth-straight year as the presenting sponsor of the event.

**PRESEASON PRIMER**

For the second-straight season, Yale was picked as the League favorite in the 2019 Ivy League Football Preseason Media Poll. The Bulldogs, who are a year removed from an outright League crown, received 9-of-17 first-place votes and accumulated 119 points. Yale will be led by senior wide receiver Reed Klubnik, who is 1-of-25 players on the preseason watch list for the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award—given annually to the most outstanding offensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Klubnik ranked among the top 10 in the FCS and set a Yale program record with 1,143 receiving yards in 2018.

Yale got the nod over Dartmouth, which returns 2018 Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year senior defensive back Isiah Swann, and

earned two first-place votes and 111 points, and reigning Ivy League champion Princeton, which received four first-place votes and tallied 107 points. Swann is 1-of-25 players on the preseason watch list for the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award—presented annually to the most outstanding defensive player in the FCS.
