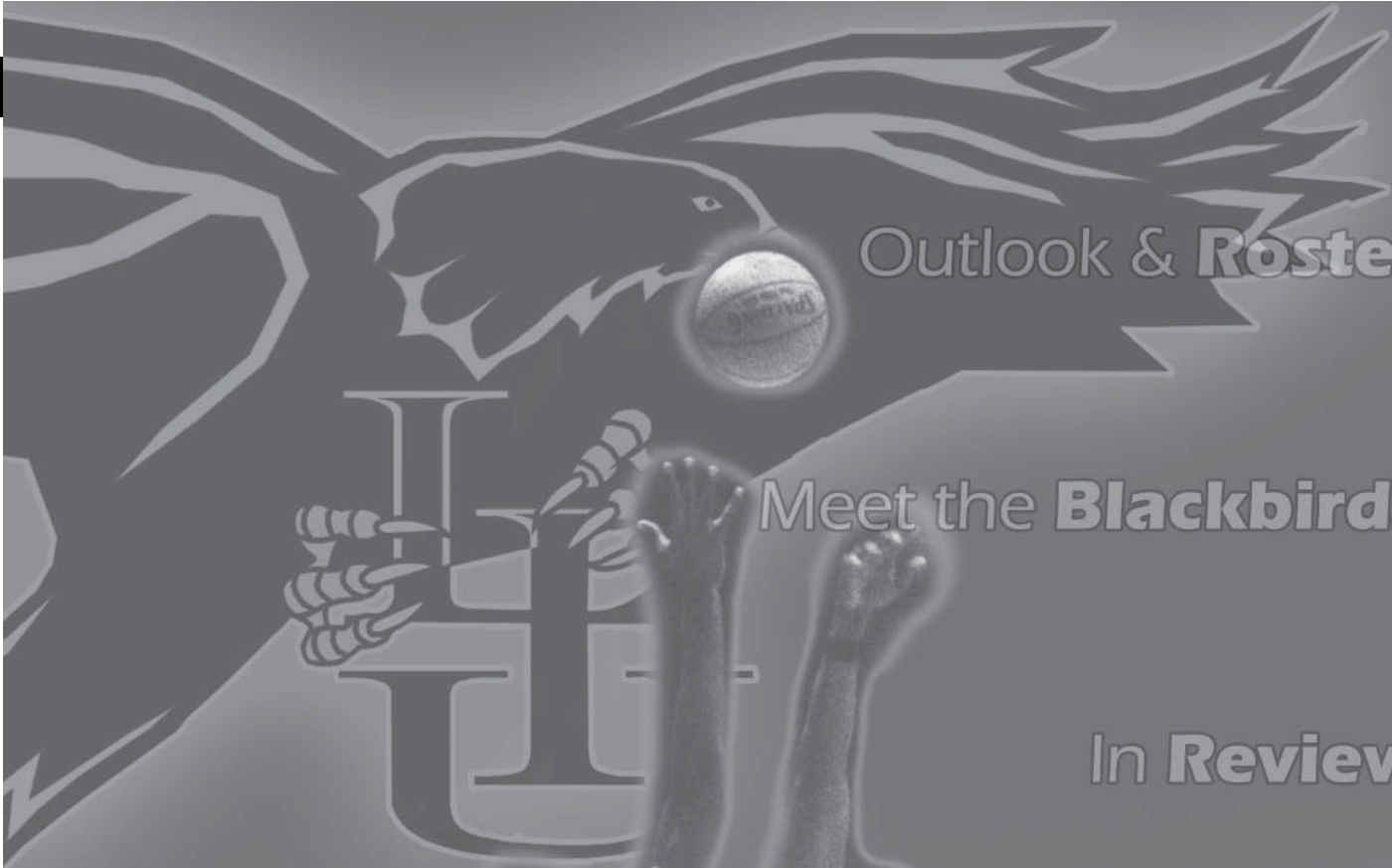

2007-08 Long Island University **Men's Basketball**

1928

Herbert Raubenheimer inherited a dilapidated church gymnasium, a student body of about 200 students and just a handful of athletes when he became the first Director of Athletics when Long Island University opened its doors in 1927. When Raubenheimer resigned, an article in the *Brooklyn Times* on April 30, 1931, carried the headline, "Herbert Raubenheimer, Unaided, Put L.I.U. on Sports Map."

He began the basketball program in 1928 and single-handedly turned LIU into a athletics power with a non-stop routine of scheduling, purchasing, coaching and publicizing LIU's five varsity squads, spearheading attention-getting events and ultimately attracting outstanding coaches and athletes.

1933

In 1933, Jimmy Gladden became the first African-American to play basketball on the campus.



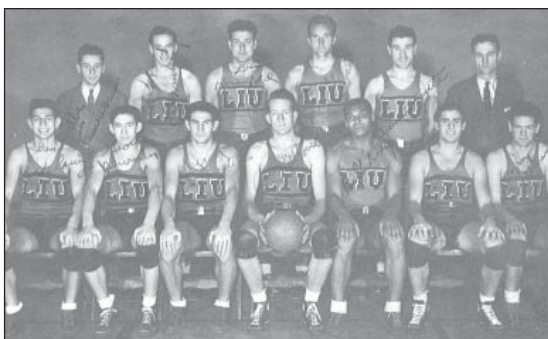
Ossie **Schectman**

1947

Former All-American Ossie Schectman is credited with scoring the first basket in NBA history while playing for the New York Knicks against the Toronto Huskies. Schectman played for LIU from 1938-41 and won two NIT titles.

World War II

Simon Lobello, the leading scorer on LIU's 1941 NIT Championship squad, is killed in action during World War II.



The 1938-39 Blackbirds went 24-0 and won LIU's first NIT.

1951-57

No basketball team, due to New York City point-shaving scandals.

1957-58

The Blackbirds reinstate the basketball program and extend their home court win streak. Dating back to a win over Mount St. Mary's during the 1934-35 season, LIU won 142 straight at home until a 59-49 loss to Wittenberg in 1957.

1967

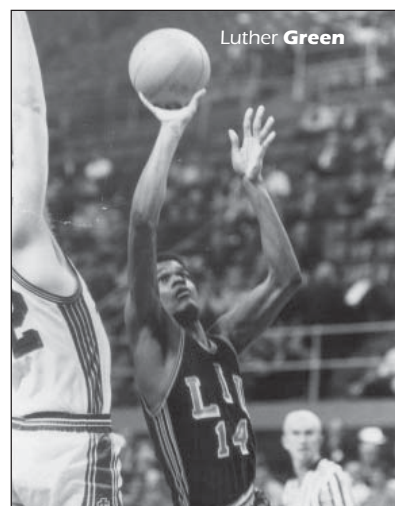
Former head coach Clair Bee is inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Bee led the Blackbirds to a pair of NIT titles and posted a 412-87 record in 21 seasons. His .826 winning percentage ranks as the highest in NCAA history.

1968 NIT

Led by All-Americans Luther Green and Larry Newbold, the Blackbirds become the No. 1 ranked small college team in the country by the AP. LIU won its first 20 games en route to a 22-2 record and a trip to the quarterfinals of the NIT, where its season ended with a 62-60 loss to Notre Dame.



Clair Bee led LIU to undefeated seasons in 1935-36 and 1938-39, as well as, two NIT Championships in 1939 and 1941.

1935-37

Beginning with a 43-29 win over Catholic during the 1934-35 season, LIU began a 43-game win streak that lasted into the 1936-37 season. The Blackbirds posted an unbeaten season in 1935-36 going 25-0 and won the first seven games of the next year. The win streak still stands today as the sixth longest in NCAA history.

1936

Several LIU players, including Jules Bender and Leo Merson, boycotted participating in the 1936 Berlin Olympics.

1939 NIT Champions

The Blackbirds went 24-0 during the 1938-39 season and captured their first National Championship at the National Invitation Tournament.

On Thanksgiving Day, 1939, team captain Dolly King played end for the LIU football team against Catholic University at Ebbets Field and then played 40 minutes of basketball at Madison Square Garden that night.

1942

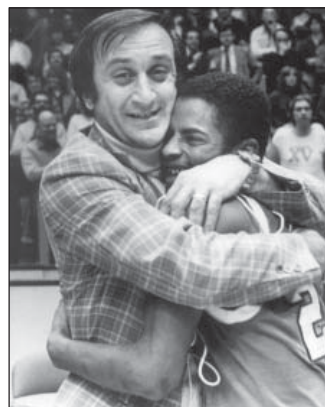
Larry Doby begins his collegiate career on a basketball scholarship at LIU. Doby followed the lead of Jackie Robinson and broke the baseball color barrier in the American League with the Cleveland Indians during the 1947 season.

1941 NIT Champions

Clair Bee led LIU to a 25-2 mark in 1940-41 and its second NIT Championship in three seasons. The Blackbirds defeated Ohio, 56-42, in the final.



Roy **Rubin**



Paul Lizzo led the Blackbirds to their first-ever NCAA Tournament in 1981 and is the second-winningest coach in LIU history.

1972

Roy Rubin ends his 11-year run as head coach at LIU with a 174-94 record. He had a strong postseason reputation, leading the Blackbirds to three Tri-State League titles and three ECAC Division II titles. He also guided LIU to three NCAA College Division Tournaments where it captured two Eastern Regional crowns, in addition to appearing in two national NCAA Tournaments. Rubin's biggest accomplishment might have been guiding the 1967-68 Blackbirds to the No. 1 small college ranking by the AP and a trip to the quarterfinals of the NIT.

1981, 1984 NCAA Tournaments 1982 NIT

Paul Lizzo coached the Blackbirds from 1975-95 and amassed 245 wins, the second-most in LIU history. He led LIU to the school's first NCAA appearances in 1981 and 1984. Lizzo, an assistant under Roy Rubin, also guided the 1981-82 squad to the NIT for the first time since the 1967-68 season. From 1980-84 he led the Blackbirds to a 78-41 record.

1984

Sherman White is named to Madison Square Garden's 50th Anniversary Team, along with legends Elgin Baylor, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Oscar Robertson, Bill Russell and Jerry West.

2006

Long Island University completes construction on its state-of-the-art Wellness, Recreation and Athletic Center. The \$45 million facility houses the Blackbirds basketball teams and includes a 2,500-seat arena, an NCAA regulation pool and fitness center and weight room. LIU played its first home game in the facility on Jan. 26 and defeated Sacred Heart, 63-60.

1998 NIT

Led by Charles Jones and Mike Campbell the Blackbirds post a 21-11 record and average 96.9 points per game. After falling in the NEC tournament, LIU earns an invite to the NIT where it drops a narrow 95-92 contest at Dayton.

1997 NCAA Tournament

Powered by the highest scoring offense in the country at 91.5 points per game, LIU wins the Northeast Conference and advances to the NCAA Tournament for the third time in school history. The Blackbirds push Villanova before falling 101-91.



Clair Francis Bee (1896-1983)

Clair Bee coached basketball at Long Island and Rider for a total of 21 years, compiling a career record of 412-87. His .826 winning percentage is the highest of any coach in NCAA history. In 18 seasons at LIU he posted a 360-80 mark, including undefeated seasons in 1935-36 (25-0) and 1938-39 (23-0). In seven postseason trips to the NIT he led the Blackbirds to championships in 1939 and 1941.

The Grafton, W. Va., native remains the fastest coach in Division I history to reach 200 and 300 wins. A devoted teacher of the game, he also helped LIU post a 43-game winning streak, which was an NCAA record at the time.

By the time he left coaching in the 1950's, Bee had already begun writing the Chip Hilton series, which is considered the top sports fiction series ever written. In 1967, he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., but his coaching influence remains intact today. He is credited with developing the 1-3-1 zone defense, the three-second rule and advocating the adoption of the NBA's 24-second shot clock.

In February 2000, he was inducted with the inaugural class of the LIU Athletics Hall of Fame. His daughter, Cindy Farley, was on hand to accept the honor posthumously.

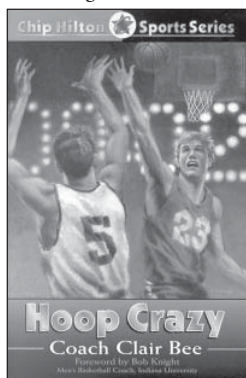
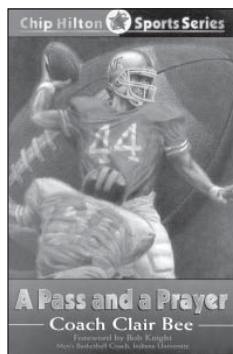

The Coach Clair Bee and Chip Hilton Awards were created by Chip Hilton Sports and the NCAA Foundation in 1996 as a way to honor the memory of Clair Bee, who had a great impact as a coach, administrator, innovator and teacher. The awards promote positive character in basketball, which were hallmarks of Bee and his teams.

The Coach Clair Bee Award honors the active Division I men's basketball coach who made the most significant positive contribution to his sport during the preceding year. The winner reflects the character and professional qualities of Bee, a Hall of Fame coach whom many consider the best technical basketball coach in history and a man who cared deeply about his players' well-being. The criteria for the award involves actions that inspire, motivate, coach and educate their teams to achieve their fullest potential and demonstrate outstanding character.

The Chip Hilton Award is given in recognition of a college player who meets the competitive and ethical standards that were the theme of the 24-book Chip Hilton series. Criteria for the award involves athletic skill, team spirit, personal discipline and integrity, respect of university and athletic authority, service to others, team leadership and accountability to family, coaches and the university.

The selection committee features some of the most prolific names in college basketball, including former coaches Dean Smith, Dave Gavitt and Pete Newill, along with Texas Tech coach Bobby Knight and TV commentators Billy Packer, Jay Bilas and Dick Vitale. The awards have honored coaches and players from across the basketball landscape such as Jim Phelan of Mount St. Mary's and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, as well as Tim Duncan from Wake Forest and Hassan Booker of the U.S. Naval Academy.





Blackbirds History

NCAA Tournament History

Long Island University's storied basketball history includes three trips to the NCAA Division I Tournament. The Blackbirds earned their first trip to the NCAA Tournament by defeating Wagner, Fordham and Iona to capture the 1981 ECAC Metropolitan playoffs. LIU entered the tournament as a 12-seed and was led by Riley Clarida and Eric Short. In the first round LIU met fifth-seed Virginia Commonwealth at Oklahoma City and fell to the Rams, 85-69.

Led by Carey Scurry, the nation's leading rebounder, the 1983-84 Blackbirds posted a 20-11 record and made the school's second trip to the NCAA Tournament. LIU entered the tournament with a six-game win streak before falling to Northeastern, 90-87, in the preliminary round in Philadelphia.

The Blackbirds returned to the tournament in 1997 with the nation's highest-scoring offense and a final record of 21-9. LIU played a strong schedule and boasted an upset of St. John's, 76-73, in the season-opener, as well as the nation's leading scorer in Charles Jones who averaged 30.1 points per game. The Blackbirds dropped a hardfought 101-91 decision to fourth-seeded Villanova in the first round at Winston-Salem, N.C.

NIT Tournament History

Under the tutelage of Clair Bee, LIU earned seven NIT berths. Beginning in 1938 the Blackbirds made five consecutive trips to the tournament. The 1939 team capped an undefeated season by winning LIU's first championship with a 44-32 win over Loyola-Chicago. The title game featured the only meeting in major-college history between two unbeaten teams in a national postseason tournament. The Blackbirds captured their second NIT crown in 1941. In the semifinals, LIU snapped Seton Hall's 42-game win streak with a 49-26 win. The Blackbirds defeated Ohio, 56-42 in the title game. LIU was heavily favored to win its third NIT in five years in 1942, but suffered a first round defeat by West Virginia. LIU also earned NIT berths in 1947 and 1950, but fell to Kentucky and Syracuse in the first round both times, respectively.

The 1968 squad entered the NIT as the top-ranked small college team in the country and advanced to the quarterfinals before falling 62-60 to Notre Dame. LIU made return trips to the NIT in 1982; and most recently, 1998. The Blackbirds fell to Dayton 95-92 in their last visit to the postseason.

Blackbirds in the NBA

Operation Rebound



Following a six-year hiatus, the LIU men's basketball program returned to action in 1957 through a program dubbed, "Operation Rebound." The revitalization was carried out by **Buck Lai**, who was serving as director of athletics as well as the school's head baseball and basketball coach at that time.

LIU and several other New York City schools were involved in point-shaving scandal that rocked metropolitan basketball. The entire LIU athletic program was dropped during the six-year recovery period and Lai led the Blackbirds back to action for the 1957-58 campaign.

Lai was inducted into the original LIU Athletics Hall of Fame class in 2000 before passing away in the fall of 2003.

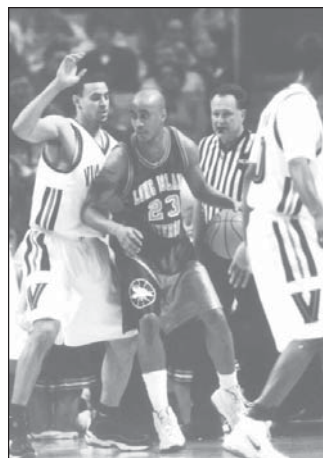

Haggerty Award

The Lt. Frank J. Haggerty Award is presented annually by the National Invitation Tournament and the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association. The award, which is named for the co-captain of the 1939-40 St. John's basketball team is given to the top basketball player in the metropolitan area.

The Haggerty Award has been awarded since 1936, when it was given to LIU's Jules Bender. Overall, the Blackbirds have had seven athletes honored with the award during its 74-year history.

LIU Athletics **Hall of Fame**

The Long Island University Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 2000. In total, 44 individuals have been enshrined, including 20 with ties to the men's basketball team, which is the most represented team in the Hall.

"This institution has one of the longest and proudest traditions of excellence that is unparalleled by most universities in the country," director of athletics John Suarez noted in February of 2000. "We believed it was time to recognize those who have given so much to Blackbirds athletics."

The members are chosen from a committee comprised of current and former administrators. The inductees receive a replica plaque of the permanent version which is displayed on the Wall of Fame, located in Founders Hall, adjacent to the Arnold & Marie Schwartz Athletic Center.

The latest men's basketball inductees into the LIU Hall of Fame were Art Hillhouse and the 1967-68 men's basketball team. Hillhouse was the starting center on the Blackbirds' men's basketball teams during a three-year span when they went 73-8. He helped LIU to its first undefeated season in 1935-36 (25-0) and was then part of the 1936-37 team that set the school-record for wins with 28. As a senior in 1937-38, he served as team captain on a team that went 25-3 and advanced to the National Invitation Tournament. Hillhouse went on to enjoy a three-year professional career with the Philadelphia Warriors from 1946-48.

The 1967-68 men's basketball team enjoyed one of the most successful seasons in the Blackbirds' storied history. The team raced out to a 20-0 start and climbed to the No. 1 small college ranking by both the Associated Press and United Press International. The Blackbirds dropped a late-season contest to Saint Peter's, but still earned an invitation to the NIT. Under the guidance of head coach Roy Rubin and led by All-Americans Larry Newbold and Luther Green, the Blackbirds defeated Bradley, 80-77, in the opening round before dropping a 62-60 decision to Notre Dame in the quarterfinals. The Blackbirds finished the season with a 22-2 record and are the last LIU basketball team to win a game in a national postseason tournament.

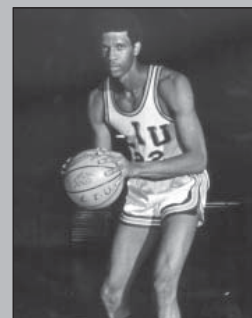
