LSC ANNOUNCES SOFTBALL ALL-CONFERENCE HONORS

RICHARDSON, Texas -- Lone Star Conference champion Central Oklahoma had five players receive first team all-conference accolades Monday as the LSC softball postseason awards were announced by league officials.

UCO, which claimed its first league championship since 1998 with a perfect run through the postseason tournament last weekend, had five players on the first team All-LSC North Division squad, while South Division champion Angelo State had five and runner-up Abilene Christian four players on the All-LSC South first team.

In all, 70 student-athletes were recognized by the all-conference program, including at least one player from each of the 13 softball teams in the LSC. The awards are voted upon by the league coaches in each division.

UCO also took four of the five individual awards in the North, with catcher Tommie Mitts being named Player of the Year and teammate Alli Blake garnering both Freshman and Pitcher of the Year honors. Genny Honea was named North Division Coach of the Year, having led the Bronchos to a school-record 39 wins thus far.

Mitts and Blake were both first team all-conference picks for UCO, along with second baseman Lindsay Tripp, center fielder Danielle Blackwell and utility player Stacy Walden.

In addition to UCO's five first-teamers, Midwestern State was represented on the first team by pitcher Brittany Willson, first baseman Courtney Veal, third baseman Sarah Huddleston and designated player Kristen Stonecipher.

Other first-team picks in the North were shortstop Emily McNamara and outfielder Kylie Ferguson of Southeastern Oklahoma, outfielder Candace Brown from Southwestern Oklahoma and shortstop Shae Moore of Northeastern State.

NSU pitcher India Williamson earned Newcomer of the Year acclaim to round out the individual awards in the North Division.

Abilene Christian first baseman Katie Bryan was hailed as South Division Player of the Year, and she was joined by teammates Ashley Whittenberg (catcher), Valerie Malkinson (third baseman) and Jade Wilson (outfielder) as first team All-LSC South picks for the Wildcats. ACU coach Chantiel Wilson also was recognized as South Division Coach of the Year after guiding her team to a school-record 13 wins in divisional play.

South champion ASU had five first team all-conference picks, including utility player Christel Neal, who also was named Freshman of the Year. Neal was joined on the first team by ASU's pitcher Brittney Cargill, second baseman Dionne Lopez, shortstop Stephanie Fofi and outfielder Andrea Payan.

Texas A&M-Kingsville junior Jennifer DeMay was named South Division Pitcher of the Year, while Eastern New Mexico designated player Tori Picazo was voted the division's Newcomer of the Year.

 $DeMay\ and\ Picazo\ also\ were\ on\ the\ South\ first\ team,\ along\ with\ pitcher\ Lindsey\ Russ-Keller\ of\ Texas\ Woman's\ and\ outfielder\ Amy\ Braquet\ of\ Tarleton\ State.$
