### LSC FOOTBALL

This week includes four Lone Star Conference games and one non-conference contest. West Texas A&M tops the standings after a shutout victory over Abilene Christian to extend its winning streak to six games.

At the halfway point of the 10-game GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, the Gulf South Conference leads the series 3-2, with visiting teams prevailing in each game so far. The average score has been 31-27.

LSC football teams are 29-30 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### OFFENSIVE

**Dustin Vaughan, West Texas A&M University, SR, QB, Corpus Christi, Texas, Calallen HS**

Vaughan had his fourth 300-yard game or better last week as WT downed Abilene Christian 36-0 on Homecoming. He was 32 of 46 for 359 yards and three touchdowns. He had 11 yards rushing on three carries and was sacked one time. It was his fourth game with no interceptions as he has had just three for the season compared to a league-best 23 touchdown passes. For the season he is 162 of 255 with three interceptions and 23 touchdowns. He has thrown for a league-best 2231 yards. Vaughan moved into sixth all-time in school history Saturday in passing yards with 5,884. He ranks ninth nationally in passing efficiency at 165.08 and 11th nationally in total offense at 324.29. Both are conference-bests.

#### DEFENSIVE

**Ethan Westbrooks, West Texas A&M University, JR, DE, San Leandro, Calif., Franklin HS**

Westbrooks had a stellar game with a game-high three sacks for 15 yards which was a career-high in sacks in a game and yards in a game against LSC Preseason Player of the Year Mitchell Gale. He also had a team-high three quarterback hurries and has six in the past two games. He helped lead the Buffs to a season-high nine sacks (51 yards) and 14 tackles for loss (61 yards) in a 36-0 blanking of Abilene Christian.

#### CO-SPECIAL TEAMS

**Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, JR, K, La Joya, Texas, La Joya HS**

Castillo had a career and Lone Star Conference season-long 56-yard field goal at the end of the first half giving the Buffs a 13-0 lead. He added a 35-yarder later in the game as WT shutout Abilene Christian 36-0 on Homecoming. Castillo, Jr., went 2-2 in field goals and has made seven-straight field goals and 10 of 12 for the season. Castillo Jr., is a perfect 31 of 31 in extra points this season. He ranks fifth all-time in scoring in school history with 219 points. He is 28 of 38 in field goals and 135 of 137 in extra points. Castillo, Jr., is a league-best 33 of 33 in extra points this season.

**Blake Barnes, Tarleton State University, FR, K, Stephenville, Texas, Stephenville**

Barnes cemented his place in Tarleton school history this past Saturday in the Texans' 46-10 win over A&M-Commerce, as he tied a school record with five field goals in the victory, which is the most made in the LSC this season. Barnes got the Texans on the board with a 18-yarder in the first quarter and then tallied four-straight field goal attempts in the second and third quarters. His school record-tying field goal attempt came at the 2:26 mark of the third quarter - following a near two hour lightning delay. Barnes came out of the locker room and nailed the 38-yarder to tie the school record that has been held for 19 years.

### OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

**Brandon Kelsey, Midwestern State University**, used his running abilities to direct the No. 13 Mustangs to a 35-28 Homecoming win over Angelo State. The senior signal caller led all rushers with a career-high 153 yards on 20 carries with touchdown runs of 19 and 10 yards as he posted the Mustangs fourth 150-yard rushing game in as many weeks. Six of 20 runs against the Rams were 10 yards or better. While he completed 6-of-16 passes for 59 yards, one was a 21-yard scoring strike to Jared Freeman in the third quarter.

**Anthony Johnson, Texas A&M University - Kingsville**, continues to breakout on the gridiron for the Javelinas.

A week after scoring the first touchdown of his career, Johnson finished with a team-best 16 carries for 127 in leading Kingsville to a 20-17 win over Incarnate Word. He iced the win with a 68-yard run to give the Javelinas a 20-10 lead. Currently, the run is the longest play from scrimmage for Texas A&M-Kingsville this season. The 100-yard performance by Johnson was the first of the season for the Javelinas. He averaged 7.9 yards a game which is the team's best yards per carry average this season.

**Zach Henshaw, Tarleton State University**, looking nothing like a true freshman on Saturday as he recorded his second 100-yard game of his young career in Tarleton's 46-10 win over A&M-Commerce this past Saturday. The Canyon Lake product netted 119 yards on the ground and found his way into the end zone three times. Henshaw had a game-long 43-yard scamper and finished the contest averaging 6.6 yards per carry. He had three receptions for 10 yards coming out of the backfield as well.

**Danny Mason, Texas A&M University - Commerce**, continues to be a force in the A&M-Commerce defense, racking up a game-high 15 tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss, a pair of quarterback hurries and a pass break-up against the Texans. It was Mason's third 10-plus tackle game of the season as he leads the LSC in tackles per game (11.5) while ranking sixth in tackles for loss per game (1.58).

**Taiyon Jackson, Midwestern State University**, led the MSU defensive contingent in the No. 13 Mustangs 35-28 Homecoming win over Angelo State. Jackson posted his second straight game of double-digit tackles, with 11 stops – six solo. It was the first time since 2006 that MSU has had player record double-digit tackles in consecutive games. Jackson recorded a pair of stops that ended key drives for the Rams. Jackson leads the MSU tackle chart with 41 tackles, averaging 6.8 per game.

**Rufus Johnson, Tarleton State University**, made his presence known early, sacking A&M-Commerce's Deric Davis in just the Lions' second possession of the game and then he went on to remain a force on the defensive edge, tallying a team-high nine tackles with 2.5 tackles-for-loss. Johnson was also in on another sack later in the third quarter to finish the game with 1.5 sacks for a combined minus-nine yards.

**Juan Asencio, University of the Incarnate Word**, led the UIW defense in a 20-17 loss at Texas A&M-Kingsville. In the third quarter with the team trailing 10-3 and the Javelinas driving, he intercepted a pass and returned it a school-record 86 yards for a touchdown to tie the game. He added five tackles, including a tackle for loss.

**Jeremy Aguilar, Texas A&M University - Kingsville**, led an inspired Javelina defense to a 20-17 win. The senior tied for the team lead with seven tackles, had a season-best 2.5 tackles for a loss including a sack, and blocked a punt to boot.

**Greg Saladino, Midwestern State University**, kept the field flipped for the No. 13 Mustangs in their 35-28 Homecoming win over Angelo State. He had three punts for a 43.0 average, including a long of 46 yards, with a total of 20 return yards between the three punts. He belted his six kickoffs as well, with four touchbacks and the two kicks returned resulted in drives starting at the 12 and 18. He was also 5-for-5 on his PAT kicks to give him 32 consecutive PATs and match the third-longest streak of consecutive PATs in MSU history.

**Anthony Washington, Texas A&M University - Kingsville**, made a significant impact on special teams. He had three tackles on special teams and had a spectacular hit that led to a fumble by Incarnate Word on a punt in the fourth quarter and then recovered it. The recovery led to a Matt Stoll field goal that broke a 10-10 tie and gave Kingsville the lead for good.

## LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

### Abilene Christian

The Wildcats were shut out at West Texas A&M on Saturday, 36-0, snapping a streak of 121 straight games in which the Wildcats had scored. ... The last time ACU had failed to score was in a 31-0 loss at Angelo State 11 years (to the day) prior to Saturday on Oct. 13, 2001, in San Angelo. ... During that span of 121 games the Wildcats scored 4,166 points for an average of 34.4 points per game. ... The Wildcats ran for just three yards on 28 carries, their lowest total since current head coach Ken Collums became the offensive coordinator in 2005. ... ACU senior quarterback Mitchell Gale was sacked a career-high eight times for 50 yards in losses. ... Gale has now been sacked at least six times in a game six times in his career: at Tarleton State and at Northwest Missouri State in 2009, vs. Central Missouri in 2010, at Washburn in 2011, at Angelo State in 2012, and Saturday at West Texas A&M. ... In 41 games as a Wildcat, Gale has now been sacked 100 times for 536 yards in losses. ... Gale failed to throw a touchdown pass for only the fifth time as the Wildcats' starting quarterback with two of those games coming this season (vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville on Sept. 8 and Saturday).

### Angelo State

The Ram defense limited No. 13 Midwestern Mustangs to only 59 yards in the air. It is the lowest output by the Mustangs and the lowest total by an Angelo State defense since holding Eastern New Mexico to zero yards in 2007 ... The Ram offense gamed 351 yards of total offense and 168 came on the ground. The 168 rushing yards is the highest output of the season. Blake Smith was the leading rusher with 59 yards followed by Blake Hamblin's 43 yards. Donovan Roberts contributed 37 and Jermie Calhoun gained 29 yards ... The Rams forced a season high three turnovers against No. 13 Midwestern State. The two interceptions are the most this season by the defense. It was Austin Sparks' first interception of the season and his career while Rush Seaver picked off his second pass of his career and season.

### Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds are coming off a bye week and will host West Texas A&M, on Saturday, October 20, at 6 p.m. MDT.

### Incarnate Word

The Cardinals dropped a close game on the road to Texas A&M-Kingsville, 20-17 this week. It was the second straight year the Javelinas beat the Cardinals by three points. Juan Asencio led the UIW defense against Texas A&M-Kingsville. In the third quarter with the team trailing 10-3 and the Javelinas driving, he intercepted a pass and returned it a school-record 86 yards for a touchdown to tie the game. He added five tackles, including a tackle for loss. He now has four career interceptions and a total of 213 return yards for an average of 53.2 yards



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debuted in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (Sat, Sept. 15); Abilene Christian at Delta State (Thu, Sept. 27); Midwestern State at West Alabama (Thu, Oct. 4); Delta State at Tarleton State (Thu, Oct. 4); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sat, Oct. 6); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (Sat, Oct. 27); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (Thu, Nov. 1); Tarleton State at North Alabama (Sat, Nov. 3); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (Sat, Nov. 3); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

per interception. Senior corner back Devan Avery picked off his first pass of the season and now has nine total passes defended. Freshman quarterback Taylor Woods made his best appearance of the season. Playing only the final offensive series, he drove the team for a touchdown and went 5-of-6 for 63 yards passing, including a 25-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Mocio. It was Mocio's second touchdown in as many weeks and he now leads the team with 22 receptions for 199 receiving yards. The Cardinals return home this week to play McMurry for the first time.

### Midwestern State

The Mustangs 35-28 win over Angelo State moved their current win streak to five games, marking the 11th time for Midwestern to string that many wins together in a season, with seven of those occurring in the Bill Maskill Era. It matches the fifth-longest streak in school history ... With his two touchdowns against Angelo State, Keidrick Jackson now has 13 touchdowns, all rushing, for 78 points and leads NCAA Division II with 13.0 points a game ... His 13 TDs mark the sixth best rushing touchdowns mark for a season in school history ... a junior, Jackson has a career total of 39 touchdowns and 234 points – second and third respectively in MSU history ... Jackson remains fifth in MSU career rushing with 2,177 yards ... Quarterback Brandon Kelsey's career-high 153 yards gave MSU four consecutive games with a 150-yard rusher ... Kelsey recorded the seventh 100-yard rushing game of his career to rank fifth in MSU history ... Kelsey's 212 yards of total offense against ASU moved into him into fourth in MSU career total offense now with 4,779 yards to pass Rahsaan Bell (2003-06) with 4,720 ... Kelsey remains ninth in MSU career rushing yardage with 1,767 yards ... With his five point-after-touchdown kicks, junior kicker Greg Saladino took over eighth place on MSU's all-time scoring list with 137 points passing Jerry Holstrom (132 points/2002-03) ... Saladino also tied Jose Martinez for the third-longest consecutive PAT string of 32 that he put together in 2008-09 ... Neiko Conway snared his third interception of the season, marking the third straight season with three interceptions ... With his ninth interception, Conway is alone in second on the MSU career interceptions chart, breaking the tie of eight with Marcus Stenix (2002-04), Herman Walker (2005-08) and Micah Hill (2008-09). The MSU career leader is Bruce Logan (1988-91) with 21. Conway already holds the MSU record for career interception return yardage (206 yards) ... Taiyon Jackson's back-to-back 11 tackle games was the first time a Mustangs defender posted consecutive double-digit tackle games since 2006, when Darius Bortters had 12 tackles against Missouri Western and 11 at Northwest Missouri in the NCAA Division II playoffs on Nov. 18 and Nov. 26, 2006 ... Saturday's game with Abilene Christian is the 27th between MSU and ACU, the longest senior college series for MSU. The 27th game matches MSU's series length with Tarleton State, but four of those games were played when MSU and Tarleton were junior colleges ...Midwestern trails in the series to Abilene Christian 6-19-1 and 2-10 in games played in Abilene. However, MSU is 2-2 in the last four games played in the Big Country and holds a 5-4 advantage in the last nine games ... Midwestern State is 28-of-29 (96.6%) in the Red Zone through six games with 22 touchdowns and six field goals, while holding opponents to 13-of-18 (72.2 %) with eight touchdowns and five field goals ... With its ranking this week, Midwestern has appeared in the last 17 AFCA Division II Top 25 polls has been ranked in 38 of the last 42 periods and has

received a vote on at least one ballot in 78 of the last 79 reporting periods dating back to the 2006 season ...

### Tarleton State

The Texans got back in the win column with a 46-10 blowout victory over A&M-Commerce on Saturday... The Texans held the Lions to just 55 total yards in the first half and a grand total of 205 yards in the contest... A&M-Commerce netted just 20 yards rushing, while the Texans eclipsed 200 yards on the evening... Freshman tailback Zach Henshaw recorded his second 100-yard game of his career with 119 yards and a career-high three touchdowns... Blake Barnes, a freshman kicker for the Texans, nailed five field goals in the game to tie a school single-game record... His fifth and final field goal of the night came right after a near two hour lightning delay... Aaron Doyle completed 22 of his 42 passes for 224 yards and a touchdown... Jeken Frye led the squad with 103 yards receiving on eight catches... The Texan defense held the Lion offense scoreless on the night as A&M-Commerce's only score came in a pick-six early in the second quarter... Vaughn Smith had 44 yards rushing and is just 70 more yards to hit the 500-yard mark on the season... The Texans return home this weekend to host Texas A&M-Kingsville... It will be Tarleton's 51st homecoming contest... Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. on Saturday in Stephenville.

### Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce fell to Tarleton State 43-10 Saturday evening, falling to 1-5 on the season ... A&M-Commerce is now 0-3 against Tarleton State in President's Cup games dating back to the start of the trophy game in 2010 ... Danny Mason had his third 10-plus tackle game, finishing with 15 ... Pablo Vasquez notched his first career interception, returning it 43 yards to give the Lions their only touchdown of the game ... Cameron Frosch had eight punts for 359 yards, averaging a season-best 44.9 yards per punt ... The Lions failed to score a point in the first quarter for the seventh-straight game, dating back to 2011, being outscored 71-0 during that span ... The Lions are 1-17 in their last 18 games against a team from the state of Texas, dating back to 2008 ... Head coach Guy Morriss is 1-16 all-time against teams from Texas during his career at A&M-Commerce.

### Texas A&M-Kingsville

Senior running back Anthony Johnson continues to breakout on the gridiron for the Javelinas. A week after scoring the first touchdown of his career, Johnson finished with a team-best 16 carries for 127 in leading Kingsville to a 20-17 win over Incarnate Word. He iced the win with a 68-yard run to give the Javelinas a 20-10 lead. Currently, the run is the longest play from scrimmage for Texas A&M-Kingsville this season... The 100-yard performance by Johnson was the first of the season for the Javelinas and first since fellow senior Randall Toney rushed for 144 in the 2011 finale against Eastern New Mexico... Toney opened the scoring for the Javelinas against Incarnate Word with a 23-yard run in the second quarter. It was the first touchdown of his career and was the longest run from scrimmage by the Javelinas until Johnson's run... With the win, the Javelinas snapped their four-game losing streak. It was the longest losing streak since Kingsville lost four in a row during the 2007 season in head coach Bo Atterberry's first season. They avoided the team's first five-game losing streak since Ron Harms' team in 1993 opened with a 5-game losing streak...The Javelinas special teams had an impact

However it was just the first interception for the Javelinas since the Abilene Christian contest the second week of the season...With the interception by Forker and the fumble recovery by Washington, Kingsville forced two turnovers by the Cardinals, while committing just two. It was only the third time this season the Javelinas did not lose the turnover battle. The last time Kingsville did not lose the turnover battle was against Abilene Christian in week two. The only time the Javs have not lost the turnover battle was against Central Washington in the opener. In that game Kingsville forced four turnovers and did not commit any...The Hoggies are still looking for their first touchdown in the opening quarter this season. Thus far they have tallied just three field goals by Matt Stoll. Kingsville just missed against the Cardinals scoring a touchdown just 73 seconds into the second quarter...Kingsville has won the time of possession every game this season. Against UIW, the Cardinals controlled the ball 18:28 to hold an advantage. In the second half, Kingsville dominated holding the visitors to 7:43, while maintaining possession for 22:17.

### **West Texas A&M**

WT won its eighth consecutive Homecoming game with a 36-0 blanking of Abilene Christian as it improved to 42-26-2 all-time in Homecoming games... It was the first time ACU had been shutout since ironically the same date - Oct. 13, 2001 as ACU had a string of 121-straight games with a score snapped... Fourth time WT has blanked Abilene Christian 1921 (35-0), 1932 (12-0), 1997 (20-0) and Saturday (36-0) all being in Canyon...It was the Buffs' second shutout this season and first time accomplishing that since blanking Tarleton State and Angelo State in 2008...WT improved to 5-5 against Abilene Christian under Carthel...With the win, WT ensured its eighth consecutive winning season all under Carthel and tying a streak between 1935-1942 for the longest in school history...Held ACU to a season-low three yards rushing as the defense totally dominated... Held LSC Preseason Player of the Year Mitchell Gale to 207 yards passing and 17 of 29 throwing with two interceptions...Had a season-high nine sacks by seven different players for 51 yards and 14 tackles for loss for 61 yards...Ethan Westbrooks recorded a career-high three sacks and a game-high three tackles for loss for 15 yards...Quarterback Dustin Vaughan had a season-high 32 completions against ACU...Running back Khiry Robinson had his third consecutive 100-yard rushing performance...Sergio Castillo kicked two field goals including a career and Lone Star Conference season-long 56-yarder at the end of the first half...Punter/KO Kevin VanVoriss had a season-high four punts inside the 20 and averaged 65.0 yards on kickoffs with six kickoffs and five touchbacks...Recorded the third safety of the season sacking Gale in the end zone by Shane Pennix...WT ranks first nationally in sacks (4.29) and third nationally in tackles for loss (10.14)...With the shutout, the Buffs are 11th nationally in scoring defense allowing just 14.86 points per game which is tops in the conference...They hare seventh in passing efficiency (165.13), ninth in kickoff returns (25.64),

17th in total defense (303.86) and 14th in rushing defense (96.86)...Offensively, they are seventh in passing (349.00), 12th in total offense (474.57) and 21st in scoring (38.14).
