This week's schedule includes Lone Star Conference action on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday. Angelo State leads the conference at 11-1 with Tarleton State (10-2) and West Texas A&M (7-2) just a game back.

LSC volleyball teams are 122-101 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 10-11 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Marcela Alves, Texas Woman's University, JR, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Pinheiro Guimaraes

Alves helped the Pioneers to two wins over the weekend with a team best 32 kills, .491 hitting percentage, six total blocks and 35.5 points. She led both games in kills including a career-high 21 against Incarnate Word on Friday. Alves posted a .643 hitting percentage against the Cardinals (21 kills and 3 errors on 28 attempts) and then hit .333 against Texas A&M-Kingsville (11 kills and 2 errors on 27 attempts) on Saturday. She also led the team at the net with six total blocks.

Jennie Loerch, Abilene Christian University, FR, Georgetown, Texas, Georgetown HS

Loerch recorded some of the best offensive performances of her young career this past weekend, which helped lead the Wildcats to consecutive 3-0 wins over Eastern New Mexico and No. 8 West Texas A&M. Loerch began the week with a 14 kill outing (.333 attack percentage) in a 3-2 loss to Dallas Baptist, but then produced 10 kills on 23 attempts (.391) in the win over the Zias, and later stunned the Lady Buffs as she racked up 15 kills on 38 attempts (.316). Loerch's offensive numbers (kills, points, attempts) against West Texas were all season highs for her in a three-set match. Overall, Loerch hit .340 for the week and led her club with 39 kills. She also finished second overall to teammate Sara Oxford in points, 44 to 42. Defensively, Loerch gave her side 1.18 digs per set and four blocks (2 solo, 2 assists).

DEFENSIVE

Michaela Spicer, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SO, Katy, Texas, Katy HS

Spicer played a key role in helping A&M-Commerce to a perfect 3-0 record over the weekend, recording sweeps over Henderson State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word ... Spicer tallied 62 digs, including 22 against both the Javelinas and Cardinal, averaging 6.89 per set ... On the year, Spicer has tallied 368 digs, including 210 in conference play, averaging 5.11 per set and ranking second in the LSC.

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, SR, Daugavpils, Latvia, Daugavpils 16 Secondary

Jablonska recorded a triple-double and a double-double to lead the Pioneers to two wins over the week. She posted 18 kills, 12 assists and 13 digs against Incarnate Word on Friday to record her fourth triple-double of the season. Jablonska followed that with 11 kills and 10 digs against Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday. She also posted a .323 hitting percentage and four total blocks. On the season she leads the team with 236 kills and .304 hitting percentage. Jablonska also has 135 assists, 141 digs and 42 total blocks.

SETTER

Jordan Neal, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Joshua, Texas, Joshua HS

Neal helped guide A&M-Commerce to a perfect 3-0 record this past week, leading the Lions to sweeps over Henderson State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word ... Neal finished with 119 assists, including 43 against the Lady Reddies and 41 against the Javelinas, averaging 13.22 per set ... As a team the Lions hit .249, including .301 against the Lady Reddies ... Neal also finished with 9 kills, 3 aces, 32 digs and a block on the week.

Sarah Siemens, Abilene Christian University, FR, Bakersfield, Calif., Stockdale HS

Siemens helped the Wildcats produce one of its best offensive weeks, by tossing up an average of 12.91 assists per set as ACU went 2-1 against Dallas Baptist (L, 2-3), Eastern New Mexico (W, 3-0) and No. 8 West Texas A&M (W, 3-0). Siemens began the week with a season and career high 63 assists, which is the second-highest total

this season in the Lone Star Conference, and then followed that effort with 36 and 43 assists, respectively, in the three-set wins over the Zias and Lady Buffs. ACU's .400 attacking percentage (47-7-100) against the Zias was a season best by more than 70 points, while its .276 clip (51-14-134) against WT was its third highest of the season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Maddie Huth, Angelo State University, continues to increase her offensive production as the season goes on and helped lead the Belles to a 2-0 record last week with road matches at Midwestern State and Cameron. Huth led the Belles with 29 kills during the weekend (4.14 per set) and hit for a .344 percentage. Huth also added five blocks as ASU improved to 11-1 in conference play.

Rachel Robertson, Texas A&M University - Commerce, led the Lions to a perfect 3-0 week, notching sweeps of Henderson State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word ... She tallied 37 kills, a .382 hitting percentage and seven blocks, recording 42.5 points ... Robertson averaged 4.11 kills and 4.72 points per set in the three victories ... She currently leads the LSC in hitting percentage (.373) and points (4.42) while sitting second in kills per set (3.67).

Shelbi Stewart, Midwestern State University, produced a pair of quality performances against the top two teams in the Lone Star Conference. The senior outside hitter from Pflugerville put down 3.33 kills per set while hitting .268 in losses to No. 11 Angelo State and Tarleton State last weekend. Stewart recorded a team-high 12 kills while hitting .321 against the Rambelles before notching eight kills with just two errors (.214) against the TexAnns. The all-around standout also averaged 3.17 digs and 0.33 blocks per set.

Dedra Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a team-best 16 kills as the Javelinas knocked off Division I UTPA on Tuesday night. She finished the week with 28 kills

Courtney Bolton, Eastern New Mexico University, hit .593 over two matches last week, against Abilene Christian and New Mexico Highlands, with 16 kills and no attack errors. She registered a nine-kill performance with a .600 attack percentage in the Zias' sweep of Highlands.

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, made sure that opponents never got anything going last weekend as the Belles picked up two road wins over Midwestern State and Cameron. Wilt led ASU with 37 digs (5.29 per set) and helped limit opponents to a .138 hitting percentage. Wilt leads the Belles this season with 356 digs.

Kalinda Graves, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a tremendous week as a defensive specialist averaging 3.91 digs a set. She had 43 digs on the week just shy of the 47 libero Ali Insell had despite playing half the rotations. She had 14-or-more digs in each match. Graves had 15 digs against UTPA and had 14 against both Texas Woman's University and Texas A&M-Commerce. She had a team-high three aces at UTPA.

Corrie Reeder, Abilene Christian University, helped lead the Wildcats to a 2-1 week, which included a pair of conference wins over Eastern New Mexico and No. 8 West Texas A&M. Against the Zias, Reeder hit a career best .333, striking down 13 kills on 24 attempts, and then against the Lady Buffs, she blocked five shots (2 solo, 3 assists), which were her most since a Sept. 1 match vs. Colorado State-Pueblo. Reeder finished the weekend with a team-best eight blocks, scored 25 points, and ripped 19 kills to go along with a .259 hitting percentage.

Hayley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, recorded 5.83 digs per set last week, in matches against New Mexico Highlands and Abilene Christian. She posted a .909 reception percentage in Eastern's win over New Mexico Highlands and followed with 12 digs at Abilene Christian.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, continues to orchestrate a dynamic Angelo State offense through consistent sets that are resulting in clean wins for the Belles. ASU went 2-0 last weekend with wins over Midwestern State and Cameron to improve to 11-1 in conference play and hit for a .229 percentage during the victories. Woolsey finished with 86 assists (12.29 per set) and now has 834 assists this season.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, posted a team-best 55 assists in a 6-2 offense and helped the Pioneers to two wins over the weekend. She recorded 31 assists and 15 digs against Incarnate Word on Friday and then added 24 assists against Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday. Rivero helped the team post .266 hitting percentage for the week including .263 against UIW and .270 against TAMUK. On the season she has played in every set for TWU and leads the team with 471 assists.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, finished the week with 85 assists but more impressive with her defensive effort. She recorded 37 assists on the week to average 3.36 digs which was third on the team. She finished with three double-doubles including 40 assists and 16 digs at UTPA. The setter had 22 assists and 11 digs at Commerce and 23 assists and 10 digs at TWU.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats finished their six-match homestand at 5-1, which included two conference victories this past weekend over Eastern New Mexico (3-0) and No. 8 West Texas A&M (3-0). ACU's victory over the Lady Buffs was its first since 2005, snapping a 12-match losing streak in the series, while its win over Eastern improved head coach Kellen Mock's record vs. the Zias to 10-0. During this week, which also included a five-set loss to Dallas Baptist, ACU recorded a .267 hitting percentage, an average of 15.64 kills per set, plus 22 blocks and 13 service aces. Three of the Wildcats' primary attackers all hit well above .250, led by freshman Jennie Loerch, who hit .340 (39-7-94) and senior Kalyne Allen, who hit .396 (27-6-53). Sophomore Rachel Riley hit .268 to finish with 38 kills. Freshman Sarah Siemens had the most assists with 12.91 per game, while freshman Corrie Reeder recorded four solo blocks and four block assists. Rookie libero Madison Hoover averaged 6.18 digs per set.

Angelo State

Angelo State picked up two road wins last weekend with victories over Midwestern State and Cameron. The Belles improved to 11-1 in LSC play with the wins and had a .229 hitting percentage while limiting opponents to a .138 percentage. ASU had 109 kills, 102 assists and 163 digs during its road trip. The Belles are now hitting at a .241 percentage this season and are currently on a five-game winning streak. ASU hosts Abilene Christian on Friday in its lone match this week.

Cameron

This weekend Cameron went 0-2 in their matches at home, after two hard fought losses against Tarleton State (3-1) and Angelo State (3-1). Kathryn Evans accumulated 27 kills over the two games, giving the freshman a total of 144 on the season. Julisa Ocasio had a big game versus Tarleton State with 32 digs which is her third highest of the season. She followed with 25 the next day against Angelo State to give her 57 for the weekend. Jenna Risoli continued to dish up the assists with 29 against Tarleton State and 40 against Angelo State. Next up for the Aggies is a five game road trip where they will head south to Texas for matches against Incarnate word, Texas A&M-Kingsville, West Texas A&M, Texas A&M-Commerce, and Texas Woman's.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias snapped a four-match skid, last week, with a sweep over New Mexico Highlands, before falling at Abilene Christian. Over the week, junior middle blocker Courtney Bolton hit a sizzling .593, with no attack errors. Junior libero, Hayley Couch registered 5.83 digs per set, with 23 in the win over Highlands. This week, Eastern will visit eighth-ranked West Texas A&M, before hosting Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals dropped a pair of close matches on the road last week to Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce. In the TWU match they lost 25-23, 25-23, 23-25, 25-16 and they lost the Commerce match 25-23, 25-22, 25-23. Beth Soukup continued her recent string of strong play. She had 11 kills and 15 digs at TWU and then had seven kills and 11 digs at A&M-Commerce. She posted a .207 attack for the week and is now third on the team with a .167 attack for the season. Kelci Lind posted a pair of double-doubles last week. She now leads the team in kills for the season and is second in digs. Senior Lydia Werchan led the team in digs in both matches last week. She now has 1,233 career digs, sixth most in school history.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State dropped a pair of LSC matches to No. 11 Angelo State and Tarleton State to fall to 4-17 on the season and to 2-9 in league play... MSU has dropped five-straight matches for the second time this season and has lost eight of its last nine... The Mustangs suffered sweeps to Angelo State and Tarleton State and are now 1-12 in three-set matches this season... Midwestern State's Shelbi Stewart and Caitlin Wallace combined for 23 kills to lead the Mustangs to a .203 team attack percentage Friday against No. 11 Angelo State. The 'Belles are limiting the opposition to a .117 attack percentage this season... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace ranks 10th in the LSC with a .269 attack percentage... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell rates second in the LSC with 0.38 service aces per set... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher is ninth in the LSC averaging 4.08 digs per set... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart put down 40 kills (2.78 kps) last weekend and now has 948 career kills. The Pflugerville native ranks eighth on MSU all-time kills list and needs 52 more to become the seventh player in program history to amass 1,000 kills...

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce improved to 15-6 on the year and 6-5 in Lone Star Conference play, notching 3-0 sweeps over Henderson State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word this past week ... Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas picked up their first win against a Division I opponent since 2004 when they knocked off Texas-Pan American 3-2 in Edinburg last Tuesday. Kingsville pulls to within a game of UTPA in the series trailing 20-19 snapping a five-match losing streak to the Broncs... Dedra Brown had a team-high 16 kills against UTPA and Ashley Bukowski came off the bench to replace and ailing Kelsey Washington to finish with nine kills. Kelsee Felux also had nine digs...Kalinda Graves had a tremendous week as a defensive specialist averaging 3.91 digs a set. She had 14-or-more digs in each match. Graves had 15 digs against UTPA and had 14 against both Texas Woman's University and Texas A&M-Commerce. She had a team-high three aces at UTPA...Outside hitter Kelsey Washington and libero Ali Insell also shined defensively. Despite playing just a portion of the game against the Broncs, Washington had 31 digs in two sets. She had 16 digs against and six in one game at UTPA and nine versus TWU. She finished with a team-best 4.43 digs a set. Insell had 27 digs against the Lady Broncs on Tuesday night with 10 digs in each of the other two matches to average 4.27 digs a match...Setter Sarah Fountain had 40 sets in the five-game match versus UTPA and finished the week with 85. The sophomore had double-doubles in all three matches with 16 digs against the Lady Broncs, 22 assists and 11 digs at Commerce and 23 assists and 10 digs at TWU.

Texas Woman's

The TWU volleyball team posted two home wins over the weekend to improve its record to 15-5 on the season and 9-3 in the Lone Star Conference. Junior Marcela Alves posted a team-best 32 kills, .491 hitting percentage, six total blocks and 35.5 points during the week. She led both games in kills including a career-high 21 against Incarnate Word on Friday. Alves posted a .643 hitting percentage against the Cardinals (21 kills and 3 errors on 28 attempts) and then hit .333 against Texas A&M-Kingsville (11 kills and 2 errors on 27 attempts) on Saturday. She also led the team at the net with six total blocks. Senior Viktorija Jablonska recorded a triple-double and a double-double in the two wins. West Texas A&M

The #11 Lady Buffs dropped a heartbreaking loss on Saturday afternoon in their only match of the week, falling in straight sets to the Wildcats of Abilene Christian on the road to move to 16-3 (7-2 LSC) on the season. The loss marked the first time since 2005 that the Lady Buffs had been swept in an LSC match and the first time since 2005 that WT has lost multiple LSC matches in a single season. The Lady Buffs return to Canyon to start a four match LSC homestand on Tuesday as they host the Zias of Eastern New Mexico before Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce come to The Box.
