LSC VOLLEYBALL

Lone Star Conference action continues this week, with league leader Texas Woman's playing at Angelo State and Tarleton State, who are both just a game back.

LSC volleyball teams are 94-75 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 8-8 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Shelbi Goode, Angelo State University, JR, Georgetown, Texas, Georgetown HS

Goode slammed down 4.73 kills per set to help lead the Belles to a 2-1 record last week. Goode finished the week with 29 kills in a five-set loss to West Texas A&M and had 52 kills for the week. Goode hit for a .336 percentage and led the team with 10 kills in a win over Eastern New Mexico and added 13 more in a home win over TAMU-Kingsville. Goode now has 218 kills this season through her first 52 sets played.

Josie Santos, Texas Woman's University, JR, Sao Paulo, Brazil, Godofredo Furtado

Santos helped the Pioneers to three sweeps on the road last week and move into first place in LSC standings. She led the team with 37 kills and 44.5 points while posting a .337 hitting percentage. Santos also added 26 digs and seven total blocks including four solo blocks. She recorded two double-doubles with 11 kills and 11 digs at Cameron and 12 kills and 11 digs at Midwestern State. Santos led all three games in kills and has posted a team-best 86 kills against the conference foes this season.

Kathryn Evans, Cameron University, FR, Pearland, Texas, Pearland HS

Evans broke her career high in kills twice in the last week. She had a then career high 22 kills against Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 25 and then would break that record on Sept. 29 against St. Mary's (TX) with 24 kills. Over the last week she had 68 kills averaging 4.00 kills per set with a .198 hitting percentage over four matches for the Aggies.

DEFENSIVE

Erin Dougherty, West Texas A&M University, SR, Omaha, Neb., Mercy HS

Dougherty continued to impress in the front row for the #5 Lady Buffs as she tallied 27 kills for an average of 2.70 per set to go along with two solo and eight blocks assists on the weekend. The Omaha, Nebraska native tied her season high of 16 kills on Saturday afternoon against #11 Angelo State as WT outlasted ASU in five sets.

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, SR, Houston, Texas, Channelview HS

Despite missing Tuesday's game against Incarnate Word due to injury, McNorton bounced back with a strong weekend to help lift the TexAnns to two wins - including their first-ever win at the Box with a five-set victory over No. 5 West Texas A&M. McNorton had 17 total blocks on the weekend, including having a hand in nine total blocks against the Lady Buffs (one solo, eight assists). She also had 19 kills, a .255 hitting percentage and 30.0 total points.

SETTER

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, SR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair HS

Hayes continued to grow into a leader for the #5 Lady Buffs this past weekend as she dished out an incredible 118 assists in two matches for an average of 11.8 per set to go along with seven block assists and two service aces on the weekend. The Cypress, Texas native dished out a season high 61 assists on Saturday afternoon as the #5 Lady Buffs outlasted the #11 Rambelles of Angelo State in a five set thriller in Canyon.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, SO, McKinney, Texas, McKinney HS

Rivero helped the Pioneers to three sweeps on the road last week and move into first place in LSC standings. She led the team with 60 assists in a 6-2 offense and guided the Pioneers to a .255 hitting percentage or better

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, paced all ENMU hitters in their three matches last week. In 12 sets, Barron pounded out 45 kills and 3.75 kills per set. In a five-set win against Cameron, Barron collected a game-high 23 kills and team-high 22 digs. This was Barron's third 20-kill match and third double-double of the season.

Kameryn Hayes, West Texas A&M University, had a big weekend for the #5 Lady Buffs as she tallied 34 kills for an average of 3.40 per set to go along with six digs and two solo block assists. The Cypress, Texas native registered 19 kills against #11 Angelo State on Saturday afternoon as the Lady Buffs won a thriller in five sets.

Katie Covell, Tarleton State University, led the TexAnns to three Lone Star Conference wins this week, including a five-set thriller to push the TexAnns past No. 5 West Texas A&M in Canyon Friday night. The sophomore from Lytle led the TexAnns in kills (38), kills per set (2.71), service aces (2) and points (42.0) while playing all 14 sets. She led the TexAnns to wins over Incarnate Word, WT and Eastern New Mexico. She also had 51 digs for the TexAnns.

Stephanie Bonura, University of the Incarnate Word, headlined the Incarnate Word attack last week in the team's two LSC matches. She had 11 kills, two blocks and a .321 attack in a five-set loss at Tarleton State on Tuesday. She came back with eight kills, three blocks and a .636 attack in a sweep of Abilene Christian at home. She averaged 2.4 kills per set and posted a .410 attack percentage during the week.

Dedra Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had another solid week in her first season with the Javelinas. The junior college transfer averaged 4.57 kills a set against Angelo State and Abilene Christian. Brown had 17 kills against Angelo State as Kingsville was the first team to take a set off the Belles in LSC action this season. She added two aces as well. She finished with a .293 hitting percentage for the match. In helping Kingsville snap a six-match losing streak on Saturday, Brown had 15 kills in a 3-set sweep of ACU. She added four total blocks and five digs in the win. She hit .273 in the match. For the week she had 32 kills on 74 attacks with 11 errors for a .284 hitting percentage. She averaged 5.21 points a set.

Lydia Werchan, University of the Incarnate Word, led a strong defensive effort by the Cardinals throughout the week. She led the team with 25 digs in a five set loss at Tarleton State. She contributed 15 digs and a season high seven assists in a three set sweep of Abilene Christian. She did not have a reception error during the week and was a big reason why the Cardinals allowed just three service aces in two matches.

Chloe' Tate, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to three sweeps on the road last week and move into first place in LSC standings. She was a force at the net for the Pioneers with 10 total blocks including three solo blocks. Tate also added 22 kills and 29.5 points on the offense. In eight games against the conference foe this season she recorded 73 kills and 31 total blocks.

Haley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, led the Zias in both digs and reception attempts for the week. In three matches, Couch made 81 receptions while only committing two errors for a .975 reception percentage. Over 12 total sets played, she averaged 4.83 digs per set and scooped up 58 total digs. In the Zias win against Cameron, Couch scooped up 21 digs. She then topped that effort when she had a game-high 24 digs against Tarleton.

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, continued her strong defensive plays at the libero position for the Belles last week. Wilt had tied a career high in digs with 30 against Texas A&M-Kingsville on Tuesday before contributing 28 in ASU's five-set defeat at West Texas A&M. Wilt had 69 digs for the week for a 5.75 digs per set average and also had three service aces. Her defense helped hold opponents to a .155 hitting percentage.

Julisa Ocasio, Cameron University, had three matches with over 30 digs including breaking her Cameron career high vs. St. Mary's (TX) on Sept. 29 with 36 digs. Her previous CU high was 34 digs which was set in the 2011 season. Ocasio had 30 digs vs. Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 25 and 30 digs vs. Texas A&M Commerce on Sept. 29. She also had four kills and three service aces over the last week.

Bethany Friesenhahn, Texas A&M University - Kingsville exhibited a tremendous all-around game this past weekend. Defensively, she had 12 digs in each of the Javelinas matches this past week to 3.43 a set. At the net, she had six block assists to average 0.33. She also had 12 digs in each match and was second on the team with 3.43 digs a set for the week.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, recorded a career high 71 assists against West Texas A&M and finished a three-match week with 157 assists. The senior had 13.08 assists per set for the Belles and helped lead the team to a .254 hitting percentage. Woolsey now has 611 assists this season (11.98 per set) and 4,302 assists in her career.

Jenna Risoli, Cameron University, put together a week with 158 assists for the Cameron Aggies averaging 11.12 assists per set. She tied a then career high 57 assists at Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 25 and would break that career high vs. St. Mary's (TX) with 58 assists on Sept. 29. Risoli also had 47 assists earlier in the day on Sept. 29 against Texas A&M Commerce. Defensively, Risoli was outstanding with 66 total digs for the last week and had a career high 29 digs vs. Eastern New Mexico. She averaged 3.89 digs per set.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, played strong all the way around the court this week as she collected 115 assists, 32 digs, and two service aces. Against Cameron, Catano collected a career-high 59 assists while adding 13 digs for her seventh double-double of the season.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, controlled the games for Tarleton this week and led the TexAnns to three wins, including a five-set victory at Canyon against No. 5 West Texas A&M. The junior from Amarillo posted 100 assists (7.14 assists per set) while also recording 38 digs and six kills.

Danielle Suarez, University of the Incarnate Word, nearly sparked the team to a 2-0 week. She led the team with 31 assists and contributed seven digs in a five-set loss at Tarleton State. She was outstanding in the team's three-set win over Abilene Christian with 10 assists, 13 digs and two aces while serving up a number of points.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, in her first match back after an injury, led the Javelinas to their first LSC win of the season in a sweep of Abilene Christian. She averaged 8.67 sets a game despite sharing time with Giselle Carreon.

The Angelo State Belles went 2-1 last week, picking up wins over Texas A&M-Kingville and Eastern New Mexico before dropping a five-set match at West Texas A&M. The Belles (13-3, 6-1 LSC) finished the week with a team hitting percentage of .254 while limiting opponents to a .155 percentage. Shelbi Goode led the team with 52 kills, while Maddie Huth had 32 kills and 11 blocks. Kaelen Valdez contributed 28 kills with Shelby Wilt adding 69 digs and Alex Woolsey 157 assists. ASU returns to action this week with a road match on Tuesday at Tarleton State before hosting Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce this weekend.

Cameron

The Cameron University volleyball team went 1-3 over the last week defeating Texas A&M Kingsville and falling at Eastern New Mexico and St. Mary's (TX) in five sets. CU was led by Julisa Ocasio who had three matches with over 30 digs including breaking her Cameron career high vs. St. Mary's (TX) on Sept. 29 with 36 digs and tied a program high last set in 2007. Additionally, Ocasio had 30 digs vs. Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 25, 30 digs vs. Texas A&M Commerce on Sept. 29. She also had four kills and three service aces over the last week. Aggie setter, Jeanna Risoli continued her standout season with 158 assists for the Cameron Aggies averaging 11.12 assists per set. She tied a then career high 57 assists at Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 25 and would break that career high vs. St. Mary's (TX) with 58 assists on Sept. 29. Risoli also had 47 assists earlier in the day on Sept. 29 against Texas A&M Commerce. Defensively, Risoli was outstanding with 66 total digs for the last week and had a career high 29 digs vs. Eastern New Mexico. Sophomore Kristan Aduddell recorded 29 set assists out of the 6-2 system Friday against Texas A&M-Commerce with an impressive .439 set percentage... Led by Dedra Brown, the Javelinas had a tremendous advantage in hitting percentage on Saturday. The junior finished with a match-high 15 kills as TAMUK outhit the Wildcats .276 to .075. Bethany Friesenhahn hit .476 as she ended with eight kills. Kelsey Washington had nine kills and Kelsey Felix eight... Sophomore setter Sarah Fountain returned to action on Saturday after missing several

matches due to a minor knee injury. The first-year starter split the setting duties with Giselle Carreon and finished with a match-high 26 assists. Carreon, who had 56 assists last Saturday at Midwestern State in a 5-set loss, had 17 assists... Javelina coach Tanya Allen had been looking for Dedra Brown to pick up her blocking performance and the senior did just that. Brown finished with a solo block and three block assists. She entered the game with just one solo block and five block assists in the first 13 matches. Bethany Friesenhahn who averages a team-best 1.02 blocks, four block assists. As a team the Javelinas had seven total blocks... Beginning with Saturday's victory over Abilene Christian, the Javelina's are in the midst of a four-game homestand. Texas Woman's

The TWU volleyball team swept all three opponents on the road last week and improved its record to 13-3 overall and 7-1 in the Lone Star Conference. The Pioneers also moved into five place in LSC standings and matched their win total from last season when they posted a 13-17 overall record. Six of the Pioneers' seven conference wins came on the road. Junior Josie Santos led the team with 37 kills and 44.5 points while posting a .337 hitting percentage last week. She has posted a team-best 86 kills against the conference foes this season. Five players recorded over 20 kills last week and four players posted over .300 hitting percentage. TWU also had four players with 25 or more digs on defense last week.

West Texas A&M

The #5 Lady Buffs went 1-1 this past weekend in Canyon to move to 14-2 overall with a 5-1 mark in the Lone Star Conference.
