LSC VOLLEYBALL

There are three weeks of Lone Star Conference action remaining, with the top eight teams advancing to the LSC Championship to be hosted by the No. 1 seed. Two teams - Angelo State and Tarleton State - have secured a berth in the championship field. Matches to watch this week include: West Texas A&M at ASU and WT at Tarleton.

LSC volleyball teams are 135-113 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 11-12 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Halie Harton, West Texas A&M University, JR, Roswell, NM, Goddard HS

Harton continued to shine offensively for the Lady Buffs as she registered 34 kills for an average of 3.40 per set to go along with five service aces, 26 digs and six total blocks to tally 42.5 points on the weekend. Harton registered a team high 17 kills on Friday night with a .324 attack percentage as the Lady Buffs topped rival Texas Woman's in a huge Lone Star Conference win in four sets in Canyon.

Bethany Friesenhahn, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, JR, Poth, Texas, Poth HS

Friesenhahn had a career weekend with her first two double-doubles (both in kills and digs) of the season. On Friday, she had 13 kills in the five-set win over Midwestern State. She hit .320 in the win as the Javelinas avenged an earlier 5-set loss to the Mustangs. The middle blocker had her first double-double of the season with 10 digs. She performed even better in the team's four-set win over Cameron. She tied her career-best with 16 kills while hitting for .625. Her defense didn't lag in the performance as she recorded 19 digs which is the third highest total of her career. She added six blocks and a season-best three assists.

DEFENSIVE

Haley Bianco, Angelo State University, FR, Austin, Texas, Bowie HS

Bianco led Angelo State with 17 digs in a 3-0 sweep of Abilene Christian last Friday in the Belles' lone match of the week. The freshman also had one kill and ended the match with a service ace to help ASU improve to 19-3 overall, 12-1 in LSC play and to 8-0 at home.

Kalinda Graves, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, Amarillo, Texas, Palo Duro HS

Graves has shifted from her role as a defensive specialist to libero over the last four matches. She began the weekend by tying her season-high with 17 digs against Midwestern State in five games. She followed that with 21 digs in four sets over Cameron which is the second most this season by a Kingsville player in a 4-set match.

SETTER

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, SR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair

Hayes registered 121 assists for an average of 12.10 per set this past weekend to solidify herself as one of the top setters in the South Central Region. The Clemson transfer also registered five kills, five service aces, 28 digs and five block assists on the weekend. Hayes registered a double-double in two of No. 11 West Texas A&M's matches at The Box this past week including a 49 assists and 11 dig performance on Friday night against Texas Woman's on WT's annual Dig Pink Night.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SO, Las Cruces, NM, Las Cruces HS

Fountain propelled the Javelinas to two of its best offensive performances of the season. Fountain had two of her top three performances of the weekend in leading the Javelinas to the sweep of Midwestern State and Cameron. She had 52 assists in the 5-set win over Midwestern State. She had 53 in the four-set win over Cameron which was a season-best in four sets by 10 assists. Fountain was unavailable to play in the first meeting with both Cameron and Midwestern State which resulted in Javelina losses.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, led the team in kills (30) while hitting .367 in the two road games over the weekend. She also had a team-best eight total blocks. Jablonska led the team in kills in both games including a game-high 15 against Eastern New Mexico. On the season she has a team-best 266 kills and .310 hitting percentage.

Angelique Vidaurri, University of the Incarnate Word, led the team with 24 kills and 26.5 points for the week. She was outstanding in a 4-set loss to Cameron with a 12-0-27 line that included four blocks. She came back with 12 more kills in a 4-set win over Midwestern State the following day while adding eight digs and two assists. The win kept the Cardinals in a tie for sixth in the league.

Chelsea Gibson, Angelo State University, helped lead the Angelo State to a 3-0 sweep of Abilene Christian last Friday in the Belles only match of the week. The senior recorded six kills and led the team with a .462 against the Wildcats. A team captain, Gibson also had four block assists in two sets for ASU. Gibson now has 163 kills (2.20 per set) and is hitting for a .232 percentage this season and has 40 blocks.

Kaitlyn Maddams, Eastern New Mexico University, in three games, Maddams led all Zias with 29 kills and 94 total attempts. Over 10 sets she accumulated 2.90 kills per set and 10 digs. Against Texas Woman's University, she had a team-high 14 kills and set a personal best as 14 was a career-high for a three set match.

Michaela Spicer, Texas A&M University - Commerce, had another big weekend in helping A&M-Commerce to a 1-1 weekend against Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M ... Spicer had 28 digs against the Zias, followed by 21 against the Lady Buffs, averaging 7.0 digs per set along with a service ace ... Spicer leads the conference in total digs (417) while ranking second in digs per set (5.28), ranking 22nd nationally.

Lydia Werchan, University of the Incarnate Word, had an outstanding week on the defensive back line for the Cardinals. She registered back-to-back 4-set matches with 26 digs apiece. In the loss to Cameron, she also dished out seven assists. In the win against Midwestern State, she added five assists, a service ace and a kill. She averaged 6.50 digs per set raising her LSC best total to 5.39 digs per set for the season.

Haley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, had a team-high 35 digs with 5.0 digs per set. Couch was also the only Zia with more than one reception attempt to be error free, as she posted a perfect reception percentage out of 46 attempts. Couch reached double digits in both of her matches, with 25 digs coming against Texas A&M-Commerce.

Morgan Wilson, Texas Woman's University, led the team on defense with 30 digs in the two road games over the weekend. She led both games in digs including 17 against Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. On the season Wilson has a team-best 300 digs and 4.00 digs per set. She also has 16 service aces.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, continues to lead the Angelo State offense with great decision making and continued that last Friday in the Belles' 3-0 win over Abilene Christian in ASU's only match of the week. Woolsey led the team with 34 assists and also contributed nine digs. The senior added three kills for good measure and took her season's assists mark to 868 with the effort against the Wildcats. Woolsey now has 4,559 assists in her career at Angelo State.

Danielle Suarez, University of the Incarnate Word, guided the Cardinals to a 1-1 week with a 4-set loss to Cameron followed by a 4-set win over Midwestern State. In the loss she posted a double-double with 20 assists and 13 digs. In the win, she handed out 30 assists and just missed a double-double with nine digs. For the week she averaged 6.25 assists and 2.75 digs per set.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, despite splitting time with fellow setter, Catano still leads the Zias with 58 assists and 6.44 assists per set. Catano was also able to pick up ten digs and three kills for the week.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, led the team with 48 assists in a 6-2 offense. The team posted a .260 hitting percentage in the two road games over the weekend. Rivero had 27 assists at West Texas A&M on Friday and then added 21 at Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. She also had eight digs in each game. On the season Rivero leads the team with 519 assists and is third in service aces with 16.

Angelo State

Angelo State improved to 12-1 in Lone Star Conference play with a 3-0 win over Abilene Christian last Friday in its only match of the week. The Rambelles are now 8-0 at home going into Tuesday's match against Incarnate word and have a big weekend at home coming up with West Texas A&M on Friday before Senior Day on Saturday against Eastern New Mexico. The Belles hit for a .211 percentage against ACU and limited the Wildcats to a .066 percentage. The sweep was ASU's 14th of the season and the Belles have now only dropped two sets in eight home matches this season. ASU is hitting for a .240 percentage through the first 22 matches and have won six straight and 14 of 15 coming into this week.

Cameron

The Cameron University volleyball team split their road trip defeating Incarnate Word 3-1 and falling to Texas A&M Kingsville 3-1 over the weekend. On Friday night against Incarnate Word, the Aggies did not start off well after being dominated early by the Cardinals who hit .333 compared to CU's .056. In the second set, Incarnate Word had Cameron's number leading 22-16 and looking to put the Aggies back 0-2 heading into the break. Following an Aggie time out at the 22-17 mark in set two was the turning point for the entire match. Cameron was unstoppable taking the next eight points in a row to win the set 25-22. The momentum continued for CU as they went on to take the following two sets 25-23 and 25-20 and getting a needed win in the Lone Star Conference standings. On Saturday against Texas A&M Kingsville, Cameron in set one got behind early trailing 11-5 but they went on a 9-3 run to even the set. From there both teams traded points until the Aggies took a late 23-22 lead and held on to win 25-23. In set two, the Aggies struggled offensively with a -.115 attack and managing only three kills falling 25-14. The same can be said for CU in sets three and four only managing to put

together 16 points in both sets. Leading the Aggies over the weekend was Kat Evans who had 22 kills against Incarnate Word and 11 kills against Texas A&M Kingsville. For the season Evans has averaged 3.57 kills per set and has managed 332 kills. Jenna Risoli recorded her ninth double-double of the season after 50 assists and 15 digs against Incarnate Word. She is 92 assists short of 1,000 this season. Julisa Osasio for the second time this season tied a Cameron all-time program record with 36 digs against Incarnate Word on Friday night and has averaged 6.26 digs per set so far this season.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias fell in all three matches last week, as they traveled to West Texas A&M before hosting Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's University. Kaitlyn Maddams led the team offensively with 29 kills, while Lindsey Barron wasn't far behind with 21. Haley Couch and Dallas Russell continue to be strong on defense as they combined for 63 digs and only two reception errors. The Zias will be back in action this week as they host Midwestern State University and then travel to Tarleton and Angelo State.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 1-1 at home during the week to remain in a tie for sixth place in the conference. Danielle Suarez guided the Cardinals to a 1-1 week with a 4-set loss to Cameron followed by a 4-set win over Midwestern State. In the loss she posted a double-double with 20 assists and 13 digs. In the win, she handed out 30 assists and just missed a double-double with nine digs. For the week she averaged 6.25 assists and 2.75 digs per set. Angelique Vidaurri led the attack with 12 kills in a each match. She was at her best in the loss when she had 12 kills, no attack errors, a .444 attack and four blocks. Baleigh Schaeffer led the defense against Cameron with a season high eight blocks. Lydia Werchan was stellar as usual on the back line. She had 26 digs in each match and now has 1,297 in her career. She raised her season average to 5.39 per set and is currently first in the LSC.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State dropped a pair of Lone Star Conference road matches at Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word to fall to 4-19 on the season and to 2-11 in league play... The Mustangs have lost seven consecutive matches for the first time since ending the 2011 season on a seven-game skid... Midwestern ranks 11th in the LSC in opponent hitting percentage at .236 and has yielded better than a .200 opponent hitting percentage in each of its last 11 matches while hitting .200 as a team just twice in the same span... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart put down 11 kills to raise her career total to 959. She needs 41 more to become the seventh player in program history to amass 1,000 career kills... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace ranks 13th in the LSC with a .248 hitting percentage while Stewart is 20th at .213... Sophomore setter Kristian Aduddell ranks 10th in the LSC with 5.82 set assists per set and is third in service aces with 26... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher ranks eighth in the LSC at 4.11 digs per set... Junior outside hitter Beatriz Villalba led MSU's attack with 10 kills against Texas A&M-Kingsville and eight against Incarnate Word. It was third 10-kill effort of the season and first since posting consecutive 11-kill matches against TAMUK and UIW on Sep. 20 and 22...

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce improved to 16-7 on the year and 7-6 in Lone Star Conference play, splitting a pair of matches over the weekend ... After dropping the first set to Eastern New Mexico, the Lions rallied to down the Zias 3-1, followed by a 3-0 loss to 11th-ranked West Texas A&M Saturday evening.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Texas A&M Kingsville avenged earlier conference losses to Midwestern State and Cameron over the weekend climbing up to a tie for sixth in the Lone Star Conference in the process...Both matches between the Javelinas and Midwestern State went five sets. The teams are definitely evenly matched with just one point separating the two sides when adding the points scored...Bethany Friesenhahn put together tremendous all-around numbers over the weekend with her first two double-doubles of the season. She had 13 kills and 10 digs against Midwestern State on Friday. On Saturday, the junior made the most of her opportunities recording 16 kills to match her career high hitting at a .625 clip. She also had her third highest total in digs with 19 in the four-set win... Entering the weekend the Javelinas had not won the fourth set in any match. Now they have won the set twice. They won the fourth set for the first time in the win over Midwestern State in order to win the match in five sets. On Saturday, A&M-Kingsville knocked off Cameron in four sets. The team was 0-7 in the fourth set prior to winning the fourth set twice over the weekend...The 62 kills Kingsville had in the match with Cameron is the most this season in 4-set match by the Javelinas. It was the fifth most kills in a match this season...Kingsville had 73 digs against Cameron on Saturday. It was the most by the team in a 4-set match and fifth most all season...Against the Aggies, Kingsville recorded 14 blocks in the win which is a new season-high. The prior high was 10. Stephanie Johns led the way with seven total blocks. Bethany Friesenhahn and Kelsey Washington each had six total blocks...Bethany Friesenhahn had 22 points against Cameron which is the third most this season and makes her the only player other than Dedra Brown in the top four...Kingsville matched its season-high in aces with 10 against Cameron. Bethany Friesenhahn led the way with three aces.

Texas Woman's

TWU split the two games over the weekend and has a 16-6 overall record and 10-4 LSC record. The Pioneers closed out their road schedule this season and will play the final seven games at home during the regular season. Senior Viktorija Jablonska is the team leader on offense with 266 kills. She also has 139 assists, a team-best 17 service aces, 152 digs and 50 total blocks. Junior Marcela Alves is second in kills (196) and total blocks (56) while junior Chloe' Tate is leader at the net with 76 total blocks. Sophomore Kayla Rivero has a team-high 519 assists and sophomore Morgan Wilson leads the Pioneers with 300 digs.

West Texas A&M

The Lady Buffs extended their win streak to three matches and moved themselves into a position to control their own fate in the Lone Star Conference title race. WT went 3-0 this past week as they swept Eastern New Mexico, and topped rival Texas Woman's in four sets in WT's annual Dig Pink event on Friday night before registering their 15th sweep of the season on Saturday afternoon against Texas A&M-Commerce.
