LSC FOOTBALL

Three Lone Star Conference games and a trio non-conference contests are on tap this week. The spotlight will be on Canyon, Texas, as West Texas A&M hosts Midwestern State in a top-25 showdown Saturday for the LSC Championship. The Buffaloes have won eight straight games, while the Mustangs tout a seven-game winning streak.

Non-conference action includes three GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge contests with Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State Thursday, plus Abilene Christian hosting West Alabama and Tarleton State at North Alabama on Saturday. The TAMUK-VSU game will be available on ESPN3, and Tarleton-UNA on ESPN3 and ESPN GamePlan.

After six contests of the 10-game GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, the series is even at 3-3, with WT winning at West Georgia last week to continue the trend of the visiting teams prevailing.

LSC football teams are 38-39 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Dustin Vaughan, West Texas A&M University, JR, QB, Corpus Christi, Texas, Calallen HS

Vaughan tied his season and career-high with five touchdown passes as he helped bring the Buffaloes back from a 14-7 first quarter deficit for a 52-28 win at West Georgia extending the Buffs' tie for seventh-longest current winning streak to eight games. Vaughan had five touchdown passes versus Western State in the second game of the season. WT tied the series at 3-3 in the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge. Vaughan's 331 yards gives him 6,536 for his career as he is 888 yards away from fifth all-time in school history for career passing yards. He has 30 touchdowns on the year and just five interceptions with a league-high 2883 yards. He is ninth nationally in passing efficiency for the year (165.90) and 12th in total offense (324.11).

DEFENSIVE

Taylor McCuller, West Texas A&M University, JR, LB, Red Oak, Texas, Red Oak HS

McCuller had a career-high and West Texas A&M season-best 20 total tackles, which is also tops in the LSC this year, with eight solo stops at WT won 52-28 at West Georgia Saturday. He helped lead the team to 96 total tackles and 38 solo tying WT's season-high and helped lead the defense to five sacks for 34 yards and nine tackles for loss for 49 yards. The Buff defense recovered a fumble and had two quarterback hurries. In addition, McCuller and the Buffalo defense held UWG, the 23rd-best rushing team in the country coming in, to 151 yards rushing over 80 yards below its per game average at 223.14. The Buff rush defense is 28th nationally, while total defense is 19th in the country and leads the nation in sacks and is third in tackles for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Matt Stoll, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, JR, K, College Station, Texas, A&M Consolidated HS

Stoll had two first quarter field goals against Angelo State of 45 and 44 yards. The 45-yard field was the longest of the season and first over 40-yards this season. He added four extra points in the Javelinas victory. Stoll kicked his career-long field goal of 49 yards against ASU a year ago. He is closing in on the single-season record for field goals. With at least two games remaining, Stoll has 15 field goals, the single-season mark is 16 set by Walter Rule in 1985.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jake Fenske, Tarleton State University, made his first career start for the Texans on Saturday, guiding Tarleton to a 45-20 win over Incarnate Word in San Antonio. The redshirt-senior completed his first 13 passes of the game and torched the Cardinal defense for 280 yards, while throwing five touchdowns in the process. On a third-and-long situation for the Texans as time was winding down in the second quarter, Fenske threw a strike to his receiver for a 75-yard bomb. The Round Rock native found the end zone on the ground as well, giving him a collective six touchdowns on the evening, just one shy of a Tarleton school record.

Nate Poppell, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, threw for a career-high three TD passes and ran for another against Angelo State. He was 16-of-28 for 209 yards with carries for 32 yards. Prior to Saturday, had 12 games

with two TD passes prior to the Angelo State. For his career, Poppell has 33 TD passes which is eighth in all-time. He became the career leader in completions with nine against Incarnate Word and has 468 in his career. Poppell is fifth in career passing yardage with 5,225

Wesley Wood, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a strong performance, keeping the Greyhounds within a touchdown of 11th-ranked Midwestern State, until late in the third quarter. He accounted for 262 yards of total offense and three touchdowns. Wood hit a 60-yard pass, early in the second quarter to set up the Hounds' first score. Wood also converted a pair of fourth-down attempts.

Darian Hogg, Abilene Christian University, caught an 85-yard touchdown pass with 1:20 left in the game last Saturday to push ACU to a 24-17 win over Texas A&M-Commerce. ... The 85-yard scoring play is the sixth-longest touchdown pass in ACU history and is the longest play in Hogg's three-year career. ... Hogg caught two touchdown passes for the Wildcats, who rallied from a 17-3 third-quarter deficit to beat the Lions. ... He caught an 8-yard scoring pass from Mitchell Gale with 6:26 left in the third quarter to bring ACU to within 17-10, and then caught the game-winner with 80 seconds to play in the game.

Chauncey Harris, Midwestern State University, collected his second 100-yard night as No. 11 Midwestern State ran over Eastern New Mexico 51-28 as the third man in the Mustangs' Pony Express. Harris earned a career-high 155 yards on 15 carries with touchdown runs of 20 and 21 yards against the Greyhounds. Harris became the third different MSU rusher to collect a 150-yard game this season and helped Midwestern collect its sixth 150-yard game from a runner this year. He helped the Mustangs to their fourth game of 350 or more rushing yards in 2012. Harris is averaging 10.6 yards a carry on the season and is the sixth leading rusher in the Lone Star Conference with a 71.3 yards per game average.

Seth Bailey, Eastern New Mexico University, made a game-high 10 tackles at 11th-ranked Midwestern State.

Matt Ellerbrock, Midwestern State University, led the defensive charge for the No. 11 Mustangs in MSU's 51-28 win over Eastern New Mexico. Playing in a little over two quarters, Ellerbrock chalked up eight tackles with one tackle for loss of 1 yard and a quarterback hurry. The senior left the game midway through the third quarter with MSU up by 14 points and having allowed just 233 yards in the game.

Rufus Johnson, Tarleton State University, was a nightmare for the Cardinal offense on Saturday as he notched six tackles in Tarleton's 45-20 win over Incarnate Word in San Antonio. The senior end had five solo tackles, with three of them coming from behind the line of scrimmage. The Dallas native disrupted the UIW passing game as well, collecting a pair of sacks on the evening.

Jeremy Aguilar, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had six tackles on the day but proved to be quite a disruptive force in the Angelo passing game. The senior linebacker intercepted a pass in the third quarter and had three pass break ups on the night.

Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, made his 11th field goal for 29 yards as he improved to 11 of 13 in field goals for the year, while connecting on 7 of 7 extra points. He is a league-best 44 of 44 in extra points for the year and is tied for the second-most field goals made in the conference this season. Castillo, Jr., leads the team in scoring with 77 points and leads the conference in scoring for kickers at 8.6 per game and is second in overall scoring tying him for 41st nationally. For his career he is 29 of 39 in field goals and 148 of 150 for a total of 235 points as he ranks fifth all-time in scoring in school history.

Isaac Arellano, Tarleton State University, the top two punters in the league were on display in San Antonio on Saturday night, but it was Arellano who had the better night, averaging 46.2 yards on four punts against the Cardinals. The Euless native had one punt of 50 yards and pinned the UIW offense inside the 20-yard line on one punt as well.

Dillon Metzger, Eastern New Mexico University, returned four kickoffs for 70 yards, including a 24-yard return in the second quarter, which set up the Hounds' first touchdown drive. He also caught three passes on offense, for 36 yards and a touchdown.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

Saturday's game against West Alabama marks the ACU Wildcats' final home game as an NCAA Division II member as the entire ACU athletics program will make the move to NCAA Division I and the Southland Conference beginning in 2013. On the football field, ACU is 158-155-3 all-time as a Division II member and is assured of finishing its 30 years at the Division II level above .500. ... ACU senior quarterback Mitchell Gale needs 583 yards in his final two regular-season games to hit 12,000 career passing yards and become just the second passer in LSC and ACU history (Billy Malone) to hit that career yardage mark. ... Gale would need 596 yards to surpass Malone (12,012 yards from 2005-08) as the all-time leader in passing yards in both LSC and ACU history. ... If Gale finishes with 12,000 yards, that would make ACU only the fifth school in NCAA history to feature two 12,000-yard passers in their record books, joining Hawai'i, Texas Tech, Houston and Weber State in that select club. ... If Gale tops 12,000 yards, he and Malone will have topped that number as back-to-back starting quarterbacks, something only Houston (Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum from 2003 to 2011) and Hawai'i (Timmy Chang and Colt Brennan from 2000-2007) have done in NCAA history. ... The Wildcats improved to 5-4 on the season last Saturday with a 24-17 win over Texas A&M-Commerce in what could be the final game ever between the two long-time rivals. ... Saturday's game was the 69th meeting all-time between the teams in a series that dates back to 1922, the Wildcats' oldest rival. ... ACU finishes the series with the all-time lead at 41-27-1. ... The Wildcats trailed 17-3 early in the third quarter before rallying for the win, the ninth time in his career and third time this season that Mitchell Gale has brought the Wildcats back to win after trailing in the second half. ... ACU won the game with 1:20 left in the contest when Gale hit Darian Hogg with an 85-yard touchdown pass, the sixth-longest touchdown pass in ACU history and the longest TD pass of Gale's career. ... In each of their last two wins over Commerce, the Wildcats have used an 85-yard play to get the win. In 2009 at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Drew Cuffee picked off a pass on the first play of overtime and returned it 85 yards to give ACU a 20-14 win. In Saturday's 24-17 win at Commerce, Gale's game-winning pass to Hogg covered 85 yards.



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debuted in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (Sat, Sept. 15); Abilene Christian at Delta State (Thu, Sept. 27); Midwestern State at West Alabama (Thu, Oct. 4); Delta State at Tarleton State (Thu, Oct. 4); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sat, Oct. 6); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (Sat, Oct. 27); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (Thu, Nov. 1); Tarleton State at North Alabama (Sat, Nov. 3); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (Sat, Nov. 3); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

Angelo State

Michael Cochran set a new career high in passing yards in his first start of the 2012 season. He completed 17 passes for a career high 235 yards. He hit Dakarai Pecikonis and Joey Knight each for his fifth and sixth touchdown career touchdown passes ... The Rams have only allowed 163.13 passing yards per game which sits at No. 15 nationally. Opponents are being held to 87.6 yards less in the air compared to 2011. Abilene Christian is the only team to pass for over 300 yards and five opponents have been held under 200 yards passing ... Dakarai Pecikonis and C.J. Akins have been the Rams leading receivers all season. The duo are also two of the top receivers in program history. Pecikonis became the fourth player in Ram history to surpass 2,000 receiving yards in a career and Akins became the fifth player against Texas A&M-Kingsville. Pecikonis is currently No. 4 all time with 2,097 yards behind Don Burrell (2,798), Darron Johnson (2,711) and Steve Wilson (2,102). Akins is not far behind as he has 2,074 yards for his career. He is No. 5 on the career list ... C.J. Akins caught eight balls for 128 yards and it marks the third time this season he has eclipsed 100 yards receiving. It is the seventh game of his career of 100 receiving yards or more and it is tied for third most in program history.

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds traded scores with 11th-ranked Midwestern State for nearly three quarters and trailed just 28-21, with 1:30 left in the third period, before the Mustangs used the Lone Star Conference's top running game to pull away. Senior quarterback Wesley Wood accounted for 262 yards of total offense and tossed three touchdown passes, while Seth Bailey made a game-high 10 tackles. Malcolm Butters registered a sack and forced a fumble, in the second half. This Saturday, the Greyhounds will return to Blackwater Draw, for the final time this season, to host Texas A&M-Commerce.

Incarnate Word

Interception Returns The Cardinals picked off a season high three interceptions against Tarleton State. Senior Chaz Pavliska picked off the first pass with 2:38 left in the second quarter and returned it 20 yards. The second pass was intercepted by Devin Haywood with 9:05 left in the third quarter and was returned 36 yards. The final interception was by Robert Williams on the final play of the game and he returned it 16 yards. Pavliska picked up his seventh interception of his career. He was briefly tied with Haywood for the program's record for most career interceptions. Haywood notched his eighth career interception to move into first place. It was his first interception of the season after setting a school record with seven interceptions in 2011, the seventh best total in the nation. For Williams, a senior, it was his first career interception. The three interceptions for the Cardinals tied the school record. It was the fourth time the Cardinals have intercepted three passes in a game. The last time was on September 10, 2011 against Eastern New Mexico. Welcome Back Trent Senior running back Trent Rios made his return to the lineup this past week after missing three of the previous four weeks with an injury. He made the start and picked up 39 yards rushing on 11 carries. He also led the team with eight receptions, but they only went for nine total yards. Despite missing three games, Rios still leads the team with 305 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns. He is averaging 4.1 yards per carry and 50.8 yards per game on the ground. His 48 all-purpose yards

in the game gives him 3,996 for his career, the most in school history. Rios has numerous school records heading into his last two games. He has carried the ball 597 times for 2,348 yards and 23 touchdowns in his career. He has accumulated 87 receptions for 610 yards and five touchdowns receiving. On special teams, he has returned 46 kicks for 1,056 yards and 17 punts for 93 yards. One Down, One to Go Senior tight end Andrew Mocio has been homing in on a pair of milestones this year. On Saturday, he had a strong game with four catches for 51 yards, all of it coming in the second half. He leads the team with 32 receptions for 293 yards this year. This is the third straight year that Mocio has caught at least 20 passes. He had 21 receptions in 2010 and 32 last year. He needs just one more catch to set a personal record for single season receptions. Mocio headed into last week with two milestones in reach and he surpassed one and closed in on the other. He reached 1,000 career receiving yards on Saturday becoming only the second player in school history to accomplish the feat. He needs just five more catches to join teammate Dominic Hamilton as the only players in school history to reach 100 career catches.

Midwestern State

Saturday's Midwestern State-West Texas A&M game will assure the winner a share of the Lone Star Conference Championship. MSU is after its third league crown in the last four years While West Texas A&M has a 14-11 series advantage over MSU, the Mustangs are 7-5 against the Buffs in Canyon ... The Mustangs 51-28 win over Eastern New Mexico moved their current win streak to seven games, the fourth-longest winning streak in MSU history. Of the four longest winning streaks, three have occurred in the Bill Maskill era ... The Mustangs closed the month of October 4-0, marking 10 straight wins in the month dating back to 2010 ... Midwestern chalked up its 100th win since the start of the 2000 season, the only Lone Star Conference institution to do so. MSU's 100-40 mark (.714) in that time is the best of any LSC institution ... The Mustangs' Pony Express collected its fourth 350-yard plus rushing game of the season, with the 350 yards against Eastern New Mexico ... MSU recorded its fourth 500-yard total offense game of the year by tallying 516 yards against the Hounds ... The leading rusher in the Lone Star Conference, Keidrick Jackson had 16 carries for 125 yards against ENMU for the 11th 1,000-yard season in MSU history. Jackson has 1,026 yards for a 128.2 average per game to lead the league and rank 13th in NCAA Division II. He needs only 19 to pass his rushing mark of 1,044 in 2011 ... Jackson moved up to third on the MSU All-Time rushing list, sitting now at 2,499 yards. He needs only 43 yards to pass former Indianapolis Colt Dominic Rhodes (1999-2000) as the second leading rusher and top running back in MSU history. Quarterback Daniel Polk (2004-2007) has the MSU record of 3,590 yards rushing ... Jackson continues to lead NCAA Division II and the LSC in scoring with 12.00 points per game (96 points in eight games). He's tied with Franklyn Quiteh of Bloomsburg (Pa.) who has 108 points in nine games ... MSU has six 150-yard rushing games from players in 2012, Jackson has four (156-TAMUK, 173-UIW, 193-West Alabama, 197-ACU), Brandon Kelsey has one (156-ASU) and Chauncey Harris one (155-ENMU) ... The Mustangs now have four games of double-100 rushers. Jackson and Jimmy Pipkin doubled up at Texas A&M-Kingsville, while Jackson and Kelsey have doubled against West Alabama and Abilene Christian, then Harris and Jackson against Eastern New Mexico ... Greg Saladino had his perfect PAT string snapped at 43 when his final attempt of

The Javelinas have a short week to get ready for their game with Valdosta State on Thursday. It is the first time since the opening game of the 2011 season when they opened the season on a Friday afternoon at Central Washing that the Javelinas will have a non-Saturday game. It is the first time since the 2010 season when Kingsville visited East Central on a Thursday night in the second week that the team hasn't played on Saturday. Both resulted in Javelina victories...This is the second game this season for the Javelinas in the Lone Star Conference-Gulf South Conference First-and-10 Challenge. Earlier this season, the Javelinas suffered a 21-16 loss to North Alabama on Oct. 6. The series between the league's is knotted at three...Thursday's night game will be the second meeting between the two perennial powers. The teams met in the Division II semifinals back in 2002 in Valdosta with Kingsville falling 21-12... Nate Poppell threw for a career-high three TD passes and ran for another against Angelo State. He had 12 games with two TD passes prior to the Angelo State. He is the second Javelina quarterback to throw for three TDs this season as Bryan Ehrlich did it against Midwestern State in his first start for the Hoggies. For his career, Poppell has 33 TD passes which is eighth in all-time. He became the career leader in completions with nine against Incarnate Word and has 468 in his career. Poppell is fifth in career passing yardage with 5,225...Jonathan Woodson scored on a 6-yard pass from Poppell in the second quarter. Woodson has

five touchdowns on the season and is tied for 17th in career points with 162. The senior has 972 all-purpose yards this season. He is closing in on his third season with 1,000 all-purpose yards... Junior Matt Stoll had two first quarter field goals against Angelo State of 45 and 44 yards. The 45-yard field was the longest of the season and first of 40-yards this season. Stoll likes facing the Rams as the three longest successful kicks of his career have come against them. He kicked his career-long field goal of 49 yards against Angelo State. Stoll is closing in on the single-season record for field goals. With at least two games remaining, Stoll has 15 field goals for Kingsville, the single-season mark is 16 set by Walter Rule in 1985...Safety Anthony Forker has picked up his play in recent weeks. His 19 total tackles the past two weeks are tops on the team. Forker had seven this past week to lead the team after 12 a week ago. He is second with 54 total stops and is second with five passes broken up. Aguilar leads the team with 76 and intercepted his second pass Saturday to share the lead in that category...With Saturday's win over Angelo, head coach Bo Atterberry now has 40 in his five-plus seasons with the Javelinas.

It all comes down to this as No. 12 West Texas A&M hosts No. 10 Midwestern State Saturday at 6 p.m. at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium. The Buffs enter with an 8-1 record and a league-leading 6-0 mark in the Lone Star Conference, while Midwestern State is 7-1 overall and 6-1 in conference play...The Buffaloes continued the trend in the first Gulf South Conference-Lone Star Conference First and Ten Challenge of the road team winning each game with a 52-28 thumping of West Georgia Saturday evening in Carrollton, Ga. The upstart Wolves wouldn't go quietly early on as they scored on their first two possessions for a 14-7 lead at the end of the first quarter. However, the Buffaloes, who have been down early in games this season, came back once again and scored 24-straight points in the second quarter for a 31-14 lead at intermission. WT junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan tied his career-high with five touchdown passes, while junior linebacker Taylor McCuller had a career-high 20 total tackles on the night. The Buff "D" held UWG, who entered the game ranked 23rd nationally in rushing at 222 yards per game, to just 151 yards on the ground... Senior running back Khiry Robinson had 89 yards on the ground on 15 carries, while redshirt freshman receiver Jarrian Rhone had a career-high 10 catches for 77 yards with a touchdown. True freshman Word Hudson had career-high five catches to go along with a career-high 90 yards receiving and his first collegiate touchdown...The eight-game winning streak by the Buffaloes is the longest current active streak in the Lone Star Conference and is tied for the seventh-longest current winning streak in Division II. Shippensburg leads the way with 13-straight wins... Senior offensive lineman Aaron Mullane was named one of 15 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athletes and he is a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy which goes to the absolute best student-athlete in the nation. Mullane, a native of Amarillo, Texas, has a 3.84 overall grade-point average and a 3.95 overall in the science discipline as he is a biology and chemistry double major. The \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship he will receive will certainly help fulfill his dreams of being a physician. In December, Mullane and the 14 other final national scholar-athletes will be honored in New York City and one will win the 23rd William V. Campbell Trophy as it is the Academic Heisman of college football... The Buff defense had another strong outing at West Georgia on Saturday as it tallied four sacks for 34 yards

and nine tackles for loss for 49 yards and recovered a fumble. WT had 96 total tackles in the game which is second-most in a game this season and 38 solo stops and held the 23rd-ranked rushing team in the country to 151 yards on the ground as it entered averaging 222 per contest...True freshman wide receiver Word Hudson had a career-high five receptions for 90 yards and his first collegiate touchdown which tied the game at seven in the first quarter Saturday at West Georgia.
