LSC VOLLEYBALL

The Lone Star Conference regular season is down to two weeks of play, with the top eight teams advancing to the LSC Championship to be hosted by the No. 1 seed. Angelo State is in the driver's seat to win the LSC Championship and host the Tournament with a two-game lead. ASU, Tarleton State, West Texas A&M, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce have secured a berth in the championship field.

LSC volleyball teams are 150-128 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 11-12 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Rachel Robertson, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SR, Princeton, Texas, Princeton HS

Robertson had one of the best weeks of her career, helping the Lions to three 3-0 sweeps at Abilene Christian, against Cameron and against Midwestern State ... Robertson tallied 53 kills with a .551 hitting percentage, averaging 5.9 per set ... She recorded a career-best 25 kills at Abilene Christian hitting .477 helping the Lions to their first win in Abilene since 1995 ... Robertson had no hitting errors against both Cameron and Midwestern State, recording 15 kills and a .652 average against the Aggies and 13 kills with a .591 average against the Mustangs ... Her .394 hitting percentage on the year sits second in program history and is just 31 kills shy of moving into third-place all-time in career kills.

Maddie Huth, Angelo State University, JR, The Colony, Texas, The Colony HS

Huth showcased herself as one of the most feared offensive threats in the Lone Star Conference in helping lead the Angelo State Belles to three wins last week over Incarnate Word, West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico. Huth had a season-high 21 kills in ASU's four-set win over WT and finished the week with 42 kills and an astonishing .500 hitting percentage in 10 sets played. Huth has been on a tear in LSC play this season offensively, but also with her blocking on defense. Huth had 11 blocks last week and also added three aces for good measure.

DEFENSIVE

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, SO, Dalhart, Texas, Dalhart HS

Wilt was everywhere last week for Angelo State in the team's wins over Incarnate Word, West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico. Wilt finished the week with 78 digs for a 7.80 digs per set average. Her 41 digs against West Texas A&M in a four-set match established a new career record for the sophomore who went over the 1,000 dig mark in her career in Saturday's match against ENMU. Wilt also had two aces and six assists last week.

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, SR, Hereford, Texas, Hereford HS

Beville continued to lead the Lady Buffs this past weekend as they went 2-1 with the lone loss coming to #9 Angelo State on Friday night at the Junell Center. Beville tallied a season high 29 digs on Saturday afternoon in Stephenville to improve her career total to 2,187 and move just 61 digs away from Sara Contreras (2,248) for first all-time in Lady Buff history. The Hereford, Texas native passed former Lady Buffs great Brittani Bell (2,150) on Friday night for second place.

SETTER

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, SR, Plano, Texas, Plano East HS

Woolsey continues to lead a potent Angelo State offense at the setter position and help the team cross goals off its list. Woolsey was instrumental in three wins over Incarnate Word, West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico last week with 132 assists (13.20 per set), including 55 in a four-set win over WT. Woolsey now has 4,691 assists in her illustrious career at ASU and is only 95 assists from becoming the all-time leader in Belle history.

Jordan Neal, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Joshua, Texas, Joshua HS

Neal continued to control the Lion offense to three 3-0 sweeps over Abilene Christian, Cameron and Midwestern

State ... Neal posted 123 assists, averaging 13.67 per set, with 10 aces ... She recorded 39 assists in the win over the Wildcats with four kills and 11 digs, leading the Lions to their first win in Abilene since 1995 ... Against Cameron, Neal had 48 assists with 12 digs as the Lions hit .364 in the win over the Aggies ... Against Midwestern State, Neal had 36 assists and six service aces in leading the Lions to the 3-0 sweep ... She sits 112 assists shy of becoming the fourth player in program history with back-to-back 1,000 assist seasons.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Viktoria Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, recorded two triple-doubles to help the Pioneers to wins over Midwestern State and Cameron. She recorded 17 kills, 10 assists and 10 digs against Midwestern State and then added 15 kills, a career-high 25 assists and 12 digs against Cameron for her fifth and sixth triple-doubles of the season. Jablonska also had a team-best .439 hitting percentage and five total blocks. On the season she leads the team in kills (298), hitting percentage (.321) and points (345.5). Jablonska is currently ranked third in kills and points in LSC and fifth in hitting percentage.

Kelsey Washington, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, was the top hitter for the Javelinas, the senior average over four kills a game on the week with a .306 hitting percentage. She had a team-high 17 kills against Abilene with a .389 hitting percentage. The 17 kills are the most Washington has had in a three-set match. She has twice had 18 kills in 5-set match. She also had 21 digs for a 3.5 average per set.

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, paced all ENMU hitters in their three matches last week. In 10 sets, Barron pounded out 35 kills and 3.50 kills per set. In a four-set match against Midwestern State, Barron collected a team-high 19 kills and eight digs.

Stacie Murrah, Tarleton State University, had one of the best weeks of her three-year Tarleton career. The junior from San Antonio recorded a .310 hitting percentage (34 kills - 8 errors - 84 attacks) in leading the TexAnn to two wins last week. Murrah paced a TexAnn offense which recorded a .224 team hitting percentage. The junior also chipped in five digs, five blocks and two assists in 10 sets in addition to being second on the team in total points with 37.0.

Emily Klein, Tarleton State University, led the second-place TexAnn with 67 digs in 10 sets last week as Tarleton won two of its three LSC games. The junior libero recorded a season-high 34 digs in Saturday's match against West Texas A&M en route to passing Sharon Lister for fifth place on Tarleton's single-season digs list with 468. Klein also added four assists and two service aces last week.

Kalinda Graves, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had 22 digs in the loss to Tarleton which is a season-high for the senior. It is the second most digs in a three-set match this season. Ali Insell had 25 digs against A&M-Commerce in September which is the most in a three-set match this season. She followed it up with 18 digs versus ACU. In the team's two matches last week Graves had 40 digs in six sets.

Haley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, led the Zias in both digs and digs per set for the week. In three matches, Couch tallied 55 digs while posting 5.50 digs per set for her highest d/s average this season. Against Midwestern, Couch tallied 21 digs for her ninth 20-dig performance of the season and was just shy of her tenth effort as she collected 19 digs against Angelo State.

Michaela Spicer, Texas A&M University - Commerce, continues to lead the Lions defensive unit, recording 42 digs in the three 3-0 sweeps over Abilene Christian, Cameron and Midwestern State ... Spicer notched 19 digs in the 3-0 win over the Wildcats, followed by 15 against the Aggies and eight against the Mustangs ... On the year, Spicer has 459 digs, which is the ninth-best single-season performance in program history.

Marcela Alves, Texas Woman's University, recorded a team-high 10 total blocks to help the Pioneers to two wins over the weekend. She also had 14 kills on the offense while hitting .314. Alves recorded nine kills and six blocks against Midwestern State including a career-high four solo blocks. She then added five kills and four total blocks against Cameron. On the season Alves has 66 total blocks and 210 kills.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, continues to rise to the challenge of being the only healthy setter on the TexAnn roster. The junior from Amarillo shouldered the load for Tarleton last week, leading the team to a 2-1 record and a .224 hitting percentage. Barker recorded 126 assists in 10 sets and is currently on pace to join the top 5 of Tarleton's all-time, single-season assist leaders. She also recorded three service aces, 11 kills, 22 digs and 14.0 points for the TexAnn last week.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had 10.67 assists per set last week. She had 34 assists in the loss to Tarleton which is tied for second most in a three-set match for the Javelinas this season. Fountain had 30 in the 3-0 win over Abilene.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, led the team with 62 assists in the two games over the weekend while guiding the Pioneers to a .303 hitting percentage. Running a 6-2 offense she posted 41 assists (1 shy of career-high) and 10 digs against Midwestern State and then added 21 assists against Cameron. The Pioneers hit .323 against MSU and .283 against Cameron behind Rivero. On the season she has a team-best 581 assists and six double-doubles.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, played strong all the way around the court this week as she collected 81 assists, 37 digs, and had no service errors. Against MSU, Catano had 43 assists while adding 16 digs for her eight double-double of the season. Catano continued her solid play and collected double-doubles in both weekend matchups, and now has ten for the season.

Cameron

Cameron's volleyball team went 0-3 in their road trip this past week as they fell to West Texas, Tuesday, Texas A&M-Commerce, Friday, and Texas Woman's, Saturday. CU lost in three sets for all three of these matches, but battled in close sets with Texas Woman's and Commerce. Shannon Dulaney had a total of 41 kills of the three matches and led the team in that category for the week. Kathryn Evans was in a close second with 39 kills. Dulaney's 23 kills was her second career high, behind her 26 kill match against Newman earlier this season. Setter Jenna Risoli had a total of 99 assists during the three matches and also turned in a double double in the match against Texas Woman's (28 assists, 12 digs); this is her 11th double double of the season. Defensively Cameron was led by Julisa Ocasio who had a total of 52 digs and Annelise Carpenter who had nine blocks over the three matches this week. Cameron will look to end this four game losing streak with a win against non-conference opponent Southeastern Oklahoma Oct. 30 at Aggie gym. This will be Cameron's first home match since Oct. 13.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias opened the week with a match against Midwestern State University before traveling to Tarleton State University and Angelo State University over the weekend. In their opening match the Zias fell 3-1 to the Mustangs, and then dropped two 3-0 matches to Tarleton and ASU. Lindsey Barron and Kaitlyn Maddams led the offensive charge as Barron picked up another double-digit kill game of the season and Maddams averaged 2.50 kills per set. In the back court Eastern was led by Hayley Couch who collected 5.50 digs per set, and Dallas Russell posted 52 reception attempts. The Zias will be back in action Friday, November 2nd when they face off against Midwestern State University.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals dropped a pair of matches on the road last week at #9 Angelo State and at Abilene Christian. The team fell to 5-10 in conference play and eighth place in the conference. With five LSC matches left in the season, the Cardinals are two games up on ninth place Cameron and Midwestern State. Senior libero Lydia Werchan was the team's top performer last week averaging 6.67 digs per set. She continues to lead the LSC with 5.48 digs per set which is the second best figure in school history behind her sister, Hannah's, 5.62 digs per set average in 2005. The Cardinals travel to St. Edward's on Tuesday night for a non-conference match before welcoming Angelo State and Tarleton State at home this weekend.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State snapped a season-long seven-game skid defeating Eastern New Mexico 3-0 in Portales before taking road losses at Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce over the weekend... The Mustangs trail Incarnate Word by 2 1/2 games and Abilene Christian by three with four matches to play for the final two berths in the 2012 Lone Star Conference Postseason Tournament... Midwestern has qualified for the last five LSC Postseason Tournaments and has appeared in postseason play in six of Venera Flores-

Stafford's eight seasons after failing to qualify for the tournament in the seven previous seasons after joining the league in 1997... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart needs six kills to become the seventh player in program history to amass 1,000 kills... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace ranks 13th in the LSC with a team-best .248 hitting percentage... Senior outside hitter Shelby Stewart rates 20th in the LSC with a .213 hitting percentage and leads the team with 2.67 kills per set... Stewart notched her 13th and 14th double-figure kill matches with 14 at Eastern New Mexico and matched a campaign high with 16 against TWU... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell ranks 10th in the LSC with 5.82 set assists per set and recorded her 13th match with 20-or-more assists with 28 at Eastern New Mexico and 20 versus Texas A&M-Commerce... Aduddell is third in the LSC with 0.33 service aces per set and matched a season-high with three aces Friday at TWU... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher is eighth in the LSC at 4.11 digs per set... Midwestern State committed a season-high 11 reception errors Saturday night at Texas A&M-Commerce. It was the most since Nebraska-Omaha hung 12 service aces on the Mustangs on Sep. 4, 2010...

Tarleton State

Just one week removed from clinching a berth in the Lone Star Conference Championship Tournament, the Tarleton TexAnns continued their strong play in the LSC by going 2-1 last week - including back-to-back sweeps of Texas A&M-Kingsville and Eastern New Mexico. Tarleton's win over ENMU marked its third straight 20-win season and fourth since joining the NCAA in 1994. All four NCAA 20-win seasons have come under the instruction of head coach Mary Schindler.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce recorded three 3-0 sweeps over the weekend, defeating Abilene Christian, Cameron and Midwestern State ... The Lions' 3-0 victory at the Wildcats was their first win in Abilene since 1995 ... Rachel Robertson had a career game, recording 25 kills and a .477 hitting percentage with three blocks ... A&M-Commerce hit .364 as a team in defeating Cameron 3-0 Friday evening ... Robertson had 15 kills and hit .642, followed by a 3-0 sweep of the Mustangs Saturday ... 15 of the Lions' 19 wins this season have been sweeps as they reached 10 LSC wins for the first time since 1995.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelina defense has been solid in recent weeks with shift of Kalinda Graves to libero. In the team's two matches last week Graves had 40 digs in six sets and three others had over three digs a set. Kelsey Washington had 3.5, Bethany Friesenhahn dug 3.83 and Sarah Fountain collected 3.17...Kingsville completed its first season sweep of ACU dating back to the 1990s with the 3-0 win over the Wildcats on Saturday...Kalinda Graves had 22 digs in the loss to Tarleton which is a season-high for the senior. It is the second most digs in a three-set match this season. Ali Insell had 25 digs against A&M-Commerce in September which is the most in a three-set match this season. She followed it up with 18 digs versus ACU...Kelsey Washington was the top hitter for the Javelinas, the senior average over four kills a game on the week with a .306 hitting percentage. She had a team-high 17 kills against Abilene with a .389 hitting percentage. The 17 kills are the most Washington has had in a three-set match. She has twice had 18

Texas Woman's

The Pioneers picked-up a four-set win over Midwestern State and a three-set win against Cameron to improve their record to 18-6 on the season and 12-4 in the Lone Star Conference. Senior Viktorija Jablonska recorded 17 kills, 10 assists and 10 digs against Midwestern State and then added 15 kills, a career-high 25 assists and 12 digs against Cameron for her fifth and sixth triple-doubles of the season. On the season she leads the team in kills (298), hitting percentage (.321) and points (345.5). Jablonska is currently ranked third in kills and points in LSC and fifth in hitting percentage. Junior Marcela Alves had 10 total blocks at the net while sophomore Morgan Wilson posted 41 digs. Sophomore Kayla Rivero had 62 assists. The Pioneers will play three home games this week against Texas A&M-Commerce, St. Edward's and Abilene Christian.

West Texas A&M

The #11 Lady Buffs went 2-1 this past week with wins against Cameron and Tarleton State with the loss coming to #11 Angelo State in San Angelo. Lauren Beville moved into second place all-time on the career digs list at WT this past weekend with 2,187 career digs. She sits just 61 digs away from Sara Contreras (2,248) in first. The Lady Buffs host Dallas Baptist on Wednesday night before hitting the road to take on Cameron and Midwestern State this weekend,
