LSC FOOTBALL

This week features four Lone Star Conference games including Abilene Christian at West Texas A&M, which will be web streamed live on FoxSportsSouthwest.com. The Buffs top the conference at 4-0, followed by Midwestern State and Angelo State, who play this week in Wichita Falls, Texas.

At the halfway point of the 10-game GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, the Gulf South Conference leads the series 3-2, with visiting teams prevailing in each game so far. The average score has been 31-27.

LSC football teams are 25-26 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Keidrick Jackson, Midwestern State University, JR, RB, Arlington, Texas, Bowie HS

Jackson, the leader in rushing and scoring in the Lone Star Conference, set a new personal high as he recorded the seventh best rushing game in Midwestern history with 193 yards and three touchdowns on 21 carries to lead the Mustangs to a 42-27 win at then 18th ranked West Alabama in the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge. Jackson's 193 yards against the NCAA Division II's seventh ranked defense marked his third consecutive 150-plus rushing game. Jackson, who now has 2,087 yards in his career, became the fifth 2,000-yard rusher in MSU history and ranks fifth all-time at Midwestern. His three touchdown runs – all in the second half – keyed a 28-3 second half run by MSU. His final score was a tackle-breaking bounce out on fourth-and-one that gave MSU an eight-point lead in the fourth quarter. Jackson ranks second in NCAA Division II in scoring with 13.2 points a game.

DEFENSIVE

Curtis Slater, West Texas A&M University, JR, CB, Houston, Texas, Cy-Ridge HS

Slater had two interceptions including a 85-yard pick six as Angelo State was knocking at the door midway through the third quarter down 18-3. The pick six made it 25-3 and pretty much sealed the victory. On the ensuing ASU possession, Slater came up with his second pick of the game returning it 39 yards setting up a field goal for a 28-3 lead. It was the first pick six touchdown since Caleb Randolph returned an interception 97 yards last season versus Incarnate Word. It is the first two interception game for a player since Randolph had two versus Texas A&M-Commerce (Nov. 12) last season. It was Slater's first interception return for a touchdown of his career and his second touchdown overall. He had four total tackles with three solo stops and one tackle for loss as the Buffalo Defense held ASU to just 49 yards rushing on 25 carries. Also, Slater's pick six came in the red zone as WT held ASU to a 1 for 4 performance with two missed field goals and the Slater interception inside the 20.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Cade Stone, Abilene Christian University, FR, PR/KR, North Richland Hills, Texas, Fort Worth Christian HS

Stone set the tone early for the Wildcats in their 59-17 win over Eastern New Mexico by returning the game's opening kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown. ... The touchdown return was Stone's first collegiate touchdown. ... The 92-yard return was ACU's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Nov. 14, 2009, when Dennis Campbell returned the opening kickoff 97 yards against Midwestern State in a first-round NCAA Division II playoff game in Wichita Falls. ... The return is the 13th-longest kickoff return in school history and 12th-longest kickoff return for a touchdown in school history.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Anthony Johnson, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, scored the first touchdown of his career as a member of the Javelinas against North Alabama. He scored on a run of 17 yards in the third quarter. He appeared to have a second run for a score of 16 yards but the score was overturned by a penalty. Johnson carried the ball a career-high 13 times in the contest for a team-high 56 yards and has 128 yards in the last two games.

Mitchell Gale, Abilene Christian University, directed the Wildcats to their highest point total of the season on

Saturday by throwing for four touchdown passes in the Wildcats' 59-17 win over Eastern New Mexico. ... Gale completed 18 of 28 passes for 252 yards and four touchdowns in only three quarters of action. ... Gale – who now has 89 career TD passes – threw TD passes of 39 yards to Darrell Cantu-Harkless, 12 yards to Darian Hogg, 17 yards to Charcandrick West and 9 yards to Hogg. ... Gale is now third all-time in LSC history with those 89 touchdown passes, trailing only former ACU standout Billy Malone (114 from 2005-08) and former West Texas A&M star Keith Null (91 from 2005-08). ... Since taking over the Wildcats' starting quarterback in the sixth game of the 2009 season, Gale has led the Wildcats to a 27-10 record. ... In those 37 starts the Wildcats have scored at least 40 points in 17 games, at least 50 points seven times and at least 60 points twice. ... The 59-point output against the Greyhounds on Saturday is the third-best point total for the Wildcats with Gale as the starter behind the 65 they scored in a 2010 win over Tarleton State and the 61 they put up last season in a win over Incarnate Word. ... Gale has throw for at least three touchdowns in three straight games for the Wildcats. ... He has 16 career games with at least three touchdown passes and seven games with at least four touchdown passes.

Khiry Robinson, West Texas A&M University, had a career-high 145 yards on the ground against Angelo State Saturday. He had 18 carries including a 32-yard scamper setting up the Buffs' first touchdown and then was on the receiving end of a two-point conversion on the touchdown. He also had a 46-yard run breaking a number of tackles on a 3rd and 10 from the Buffs' 20 yard-line setting up a touchdown midway through the second quarter for an 18-3 lead.

Wesley Wood, Eastern New Mexico University, posted the first 100-yard rushing day of his career, running for 128 yards and two scores at Abilene Christian. He also completed nine passes for 68 yards. He finished the game with 196 yards of total offense.

Jeken Frye, Tarleton State University, had three receptions against Delta State this past Saturday, which he hauled in for 68 yards and a score. The Texan wide-out had a season-long 43-yard reception that he took into the end zone early in the third quarter.

Seth Bailey, Eastern New Mexico University, made a team-high 12 tackles against Abilene Christian, last Saturday, with five solo stops and a sack. He also forced and recovered a fumble on the same play, which led to a Greyhound touchdown.

Taiyon Jackson, Midwestern State University, led the Mustangs defenders in the 42-27 victory over then 18th ranked West Alabama on the road in the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge. Jackson chalked up 11 tackles (eight solo) with one tackle for loss of two yards to lead all defenders in the contest. His hit on UWA quarterback Gary Johnston forced a fumble that MSU recovered and set up the third quarter touchdown that gave the Mustangs its first lead – one they wouldn't relinquish. He helped the Mustangs hold Division II's 15th best rushing offense to just 188 yards, 58 yards below UWA's season average.

Mike Wallace, Abilene Christian University, had an interception in his third straight game, and this time he returned it for his second career touchdown as the Wildcats rolled Eastern New Mexico, 59-17, Saturday at Shotwell Stadium. ... Wallace – who started the season at safety but has moved to outside linebacker because of injuries to the Wildcats' linebacking corps – returned a second-quarter interception 48 yards for a score to give the Wildcats a 31-7 lead. ... Wallace had two interceptions two weeks ago in ACU's loss at Angelo State and two more last week in ACU's win at Delta State. ... Wallace finished the game with 11 total tackles (seven solo), including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Ronnie Faimoa, Tarleton State University, had one of his best games of the season on the defensive front, collecting six tackles against Delta State on Saturday. The junior recorded one and a half sacks and a total of two tackles-for-loss as he disrupted the Statesmen backfield. Assisting on four tackles, Faimoa also picked up a fumble recovery for the Texans as well.

Dravanni Johnson, University of the Incarnate Word, spearheaded a strong Incarnate Word defensive effort against Texas A&M-Commerce. He registered a season-high 2.0 sacks for a total loss of 11 yards and also forced a fumble. His two sacks were part of a school-record eight sacks on the night for the Cardinals.

Marquis Singleton, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a team-best 10 tackles. He had two tackles for loss including his team-best third sack that resulted a loss of eight yards. His 10 tackles were a career-high 10 tackles.

Grady Achilles, University of the Incarnate Word, recovered a muffed punt by A&M-Commerce in the end zone to give the Cardinals a 24-0 lead right before halftime en route to a 31-9 victory. His recovery capped off the best half of play on the season for the Cardinals.

Isaac Arellano, Tarleton State University, had five of his six kickoffs go for touchbacks as he averaged 62.7 yards off the tee. He also tallied four punts on the night for an average of 36.5 yards, while placing one of his punts inside the opposing team's 20-yard line.

Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, went 2 for 2 in field goals and 3 for 3 in extra points in the Buffs' 35-9 win at Angelo State Saturday. Castillo Jr., moved into fifth all-time in scoring at WT with 210 career points. He is 26 of 36 all-time in field goals and 131 of 133 in extra points. Castillo Jr., leads the conference this season as he is a perfect 27 of 27 in extra points and is second in made field goals at 8 of 10. Castillo Jr., Saturday surpassed Norman White (1993-1996) who had 208 career points. Castillo Jr., began the season ranked 10th in scoring with 159 career points.

Neiko Conway, Midwestern State University, was able to return only one punt against West Alabama, and boy was it a return. The junior from Houston took the first punt of the second half back 54-yards to flip the field on the Tigers and set up MSU's first touchdown of the second half in the Mustangs 42-27 win over then 18th ranked UWA. Conway's return matched the 10th longest return in program history and was the longest for a Mustang in four seasons.

Jayson Serda, Eastern New Mexico University, made 10 tackles at Abilene Christian, last Saturday. He also had three kick returns for 64 yards, including a 27-yard return in the third quarter.

Matt Stoll, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, connected on three of four field goal attempts and added a point after to score 10 of the team's 16 points. He had FGs of 30, 25 and 29. He has three games with at least 10 points and leads the team with 41. With 10 field goals, he is tied for seventh for most field goals in a season. The junior, who punted as a freshman, now has 19 FGs in two seasons which is tied for sixth all-time.



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debuted in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (Sat, Sept. 15); Abilene Christian at Delta State (Thu, Sept. 27); Midwestern State at West Alabama (Thu, Oct. 4); Delta State at Tarleton State (Thu, Oct. 4); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sat, Oct. 6); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (Sat, Oct. 27); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (Thu, Nov. 1); Tarleton State at North Alabama (Sat, Nov. 3); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (Sat, Nov. 3); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats' 59-17 win over Eastern New Mexico on Saturday marked the first time this season that they've won consecutive games. ... If Saturday's game was the final one ever between the Wildcats and Greyhounds, the Wildcats finished against ENMU by winning the all-time series 23-11. ... In the 78 games the Wildcats have played since the start of the 2006 season they have scored at least 50 points in 22 of those games, including last Saturday's 59-17 win over Eastern New Mexico. ... ACU's offense had its second-most productive day of the season on Saturday with 397 yards and its second-most productive day running the ball with 136 yards on the ground. ... ACU senior quarterback Mitchell Gale directed the Wildcats to their highest point total of the season on Saturday by throwing for four touchdown passes in the Wildcats' 59-17 win over Eastern New Mexico. ... Gale completed 18 of 28 passes for 252 yards and four touchdowns in only three quarters of action. ... The 59-point output against the Greyhounds on Saturday is the third-best point total for the Wildcats with Gale as the starter behind the 65 they scored in a 2010 win over Tarleton State and the 61 they put up last season in a win over Incarnate Word. ... Gale has throw for at least three touchdowns in three straight games for the Wildcats. ... He has 16 career games with at least three touchdown passes and seven games with at least four touchdown passes. ... Junior linebacker Thor Woerner continued to play at an all-conference level with 12 tackles (five solo) with two quarterback hurries. ... Woerner is second on the club in tackles with 48 (25 solo), including 2.5 tackles for loss, one interception, three passes broken up, four passes defended and two quarterback hurries. ... Junior linebacker Jesse Harper had his most productive day as a Wildcat with 11 tackles (five solo), including 1.0 tackles for loss. ... The 312 yards gained by the Greyhounds is the second-lowest total gained by an ACU opponent this season behind the 301 gained by McMurry in ACU's 51-0 season-opening win. ... The Wildcats picked off three passes and recovered one fumble and had a plus-three turnover ratio in the game. ... Senior placekicker Morgan Lineberry made a 29-yard field goal midway through the second quarter, his seventh of the season to give him 50 for his career, which is the all-time ACU career record. ... Lineberry is 138 of 152 all-time on PATs and his 288 career points is the second-best kicking points total in ACU history behind Matt Adams (339 from 2005-08). ... Senior kickoff specialist Spencer Covey had six touchbacks on 10 kickoffs in the win over Eastern New Mexico to give him 22 touchbacks on the season.

Angelo State

The Rams are the No. 1 overall defense in the Lone Star Conference for the second-straight week. The defense is giving up just 317.3 yards per game this season. It is the No. 33 ranked defense in NCAA Division II as well. ... Jarred Martin kicked a season long 40-yard field goal in the first quarter against West Texas A&M. It is his second field goal of the year and ties his season-long field goal. Martin has a career-long of 42 yards. ... The Ram defense held West Texas A&M's high-powered offense to 398 total yards which is 76 yards below the Buffs per game average. ... In the fourth quarter of the West Texas A&M game, sophomore Courtney Moore picked off Dustin Vaughan for his first career interception. It is the fourth interception by the defense this season.

Eastern New Mexico

Senior quarterback Wesley Wood posted the first 100-yard rushing performance of his career, going for 128 yards and two scores in a loss at Abilene Christian. Eastern entered that contest leading the Lone Star Conference with a +8 turnover differential, but the Wildcats capitalized on an uncharacteristic four ENMU miscues to score 24 points. Seth Bailey led the Hounds with 12 tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Eastern will return to action on October 20, when they host West Texas A&M in the Wagon Wheel Game.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals played their best all-around game of the season in a 31-9 victory over Texas A&M-Commerce. The defense set a school record with eight sacks on the night, including seven in the first half. The offense moved the ball well and had a few big plays turn into touchdowns. On special teams, Jake Wilcox was perfect on extra-point and field goal attempts and Grady Achilles recovered a muffed punt in the endzone for a touchdown. Dravanni Johnson and Robbie Horton each had a pair of sacks in the game and Johnson also forced a fumble. Seven different players had at least a half sack. Quarterback Zach Rhodes had another solid performance going 17-of-28 for 189 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. He connected with Andrew Mocio on a 61-yard touchdown pass and freshman Brandon Yates with a 26-yard strike. Senior running back Trent Rios maintained his perfect passing record when he completed a 22-yard pass to Dominic Hamilton. He is now 4-for-4 for 55 yards and a touchdown in his career. Marcus Wright had his best game of the season carrying the ball six times for 49 yards to lead the team. The Cardinals are now 3-0 all-time against Texas A&M-Commerce. This week, they travel to Texas A&M-Kingsville for the first time.

Midwestern State

The Mustangs tallied their third straight win over a Gulf South Conference team with last Thursday's 42-27 win over then 18th ranked West Alabama. ... Junior running back Keidrick Jackson's career-high 193 rushing yards were the seventh most in a single game in school history and the most since Daniel Polk ran for 290 yards against Abilene Christian on Nov. 10, 2007. ... Jackson became the fifth 2,000-yard rusher in MSU history while moving past Henry Anders (1,957 rushing yards/1991-92) into fifth place on the school's all-time rushing list with 2,087 yards. ... Jackson recorded his third consecutive 150-plus rushing game, joining Dominic Rhodes in 2000 and Daniel Polk in 2005 with the feat. ... Jackson posted his second 3 TD or more game this season and the fifth in his career. He leads the LSC in scoring and is second nationally with 13.2 points a game. ... Senior quarterback Brandon Kelsey rushed for 117 yards on 16 carries, his sixth 100-yard rushing game. He also scored three touchdowns rushing, the second time he's done that in his career. ... Kelsey jumped past former quarterbacks Craig Pettigrew (1,516 rushing yards/1991-93) and Phillip Boggs (1,590 rushing yards/1999-03) into ninth place on MSU's all-time rushing list with 1,614 yards. Only MSU all-time rushing leader Daniel Polk (3,590 yards/2004-07) has more rushing yards from the quarterback position. ... With his six point-after-touchdown kicks, junior kicker Greg Saladino moved into eighth place on MSU's all-time scoring list with 132 points to equal Jerry Holstrom (132 points/2002-03) and tied for third most by a place kicker. ... Saladino also has tied

Holstrom for the fourth-longest consecutive PAT string of 27 ... Neiko Conway's 54-yard punt return in the third quarter of Thursday night's 42-27 win at West Alabama matched the 10th longest in program history. It was the longest punt return since BeeJay Mathis went 66 yards against Angelo State on Sep. 27, 2008 ... The MSU defense held West Alabama to 364 total offensive yards and 188 rushing yards, the Tigers second-lowest offensive output behind the 248 total yards and 21 rushing yards allowed by Division I-FCS Samford ... Taiyon Jackson's 11 tackles is just the second time this season that MSU has recorded a double-digit tackle game ... Thursday's game was the first this season that MSU did not intercept a pass ... With the win over West Alabama, Midwestern has now won five straight games played on Thursday night ... the win also gives MSU an 11-1 record against Division II regular season non-conference opponents in the Bill Maskill Era ... Saturday's game with Angelo State is part of Homecoming activities for MSU. The Mustangs are 8-2 on Homecoming in the Maskill Era and 14-10 since reinstating the football program in 1988. MSU has won three straight Homecoming games and eight of the last nine ... Through the first half of the season, the Mustangs are 23-of-24 in the red zone (.958), with 17 touchdowns and six field goals. Defensively, MSU has allowed the opponents to score on 10-of-15 red zone appearances (.667), with seven touchdowns and three field goals ...

Tarleton State

The Texans dropped consecutive games for the first time this season and the first time since falling to West Texas A&M and Midwestern State last season (Oct. 1, Oct. 8), after losing in the final seconds to Delta State in Stephenville on Saturday... The loss snapped a five-game win streak at Memorial Stadium, while head coach Cary Fowler falls to 5-6 overall in home contests... Both of Tarleton's interceptions led to scores in the waning seconds of each half... The first interception led to a touchdown with three seconds left on the board that gave DSU a 15-14 halftime lead, while the final interception led the DSU's game-winning field goal as time expired... Tarleton netted just 92 yards rushing in the game, stopping a four-game streak in which the Texans had at least one, 100-yard rusher... Aaron Doyle, despite the two interceptions, completed 27 of his 39 attempts for a game-high 293 yards and a career-high four touchdowns... Cordell Valentine, Jeken Frye, Arthur Buckingham and Zach Henshaw were all recipients of Doyle's touchdown passes on Saturday... Matt Knicky led the defense with nine tackles and one forced fumble... Ronnie Faimoa tallied 1.5 sacks and a pair of tackles-for-loss... Tarleton fell to 0-3 all-time against Gulf South Conference opponents with the loss to the Statesmen... The Texans return to the road this weekend to face A&M-Commerce in Commerce... Tarleton is 11-10 overall in the series and 5-5 when playing in Commerce... Head coach Cary Fowler is 2-0 against the Lions in his career.

Incarnate Word 31, A&M-Commerce 9

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Senior Anthony Johnson scored the first touchdown of his career as a member of the Javelinas against North Alabama. He scored on a run of 17 yards in the third quarter. He appeared to have a second run for a score of 16 yards but the score was overturned by a penalty. Johnson carried the ball a career-high 13 times in the contest for a team-high 50 yards and has 122 yards in the last two games...With the loss

to North Alabama, the Javelinas are now 0-5 against the Lions. There are just five other teams in Kingsville history that the Javelinas have yet to get a win over in multiple contests. Kingsville is 0-6 against Rice and 0-5-1 in contests with the Aggies of A&M. They are 0-3 versus North Dakota State. Hardin-Simmons and Western Oregon have each posted a 2-0 record versus the Javelinas...The Javelinas are heading into uncharted territory with four straight losses. The Javelinas have not lost five games a row since Ron Harms club started the 1993 season with an 0-5 record. Harms' club regrouped to win seven of its last eight games en route to a 7-6 season. Since joining the NCAA Division II ranks in 1980, the team has lost five games in a season only 10 times in 33 seasons... For just the second time this season, Jeremy Aguilar did not lead the Javelinas in tackles. Senior defensive Marquis Singleton had a team-best 10 tackles. Aguilar was second on the team with eight along with defensive back Anthony Forker...Matt Stoll continues to be Mr. Reliable for the Javelinas. He connected on three of four field goal attempts and added a point after to score 10 of the team's 16 points. He has three games with at least 10 points and leads the team with 41. With 10 field goals, he is tied for seventh for most field goals in a season. The junior, who punted as a freshman, now has 19 FGs in two seasons which is tied for sixth all-time...Through six games, Kingsville is still searching for its first TD in the opening quarter. Thus far the Javelinas have scored nine first period points on three field goals by Matt Stoll. Kingsville, which has been outscored 79-38 in the first half, has outscored foes 81-61 in the second half...Saturday's game will be the third in the short series amongst the Javelinas and Cardinals. In the first two meetings, the Javelinas have outscored Incarnate Word 78-47. After a 37-9 win in the first meeting two seasons ago, Kingsville won by three, 41-38 last year. Last year Jonathan Woodson finished with 362 yards of total offense and three scores. He had 162 rushing yards, 106 receiving and 94 on kick returns. The two starting quarterbacks combined for 684 yards passing and seven touchdowns in the shootout.

West Texas A&M

Senior Khiry Robinson continued his impressive season with a career-high 145 yards rushing Saturday evening at Angelo State. He had 18 carries for an 8.1 average per carry. Robinson had a huge 46-yard run on a 3rd and 10 to get the Buffs out of their own end as WT scored a touchdown on the next play on a 23-yard touchdown pass from Dustin Vaughan to Nathan Slaughter for an 18-3 lead...Junior defensive back Curtis Slater came up with two huge interceptions against Angelo State on Saturday. His two interceptions came in the second half for 124 yards, including a thrilling-85 yard pick six after ASU had gotten to the WT 15 early in the second half. It was the first interception return for a touchdown by the Buffs since Caleb Randolph returned a pick 97-yards versus Incarnate Word last season (Sept. 24). Slater's second interception came on the next Ram possession returning it 39 yards setting up a Sergio Castillo, Jr., field goal...The Buffalo "D" came up with another big outing, especially rushing as it held the high-powered ASU rushing offense to just 49 yards on 25 carries. It was the second consecutive game that the Buffaloes held their opponent well below its average in rushing...Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen had two more touchdown receptions on Saturday as he leads the team with seven touchdowns on the year...Despite only recording one sack on Saturday, the Buffaloes had a season-high 13 quarterback hurries as the defense made living in the

ASU backfield. Junior linebackers Kyle Voss and Bryan Johnson each had three hurries to lead the team. Voss had a team-high 11 total tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss...The Buffalo Defense came up huge in the red zone on Saturday as it held ASU to 1 for 4 in the Red Zone, including two missed field goals holding ASU to just three points and a WT 18-3 lead at intermission. They also had one of Slater's two interceptions in the red zone. WT ranks third in the league in red zone defense at 71.4 percent on 10 of 14 chances...Junior place kicker Sergio Castillo, Jr., moved up to fifth all-time in school history in scoring as he tallied two field goals and three extra points surpassing Norman White (1993-1996) with 209 career points on 26 of 36 field goals and 131 of 133 extra points. Castillo, Jr., leads the conference in PAT kicking this season at a perfect 27 of 27 and is second in field goals at 8 of 10 for the year...The Buffalo offense ranks highly in a number of areas nationally as they are ninth nationally in passing offense at 342.5 yards per game. They are 14th in total offense at 474.50, 18th in scoring offense averaging 38.5 points per game. They are sixth in passing eff. at 166.39...Not only are the Buffs a strong offense, they are a good defense, too, as they rank fifth nationally in tackles for loss at 9.67 per game, ninth in sacks (3.5 per contest), 20th in scoring defense allowing just 17.33 points per game which is tops in the Lone Star Conference.
