Lone Star Conference teams have non-conference games on Tuesday, followed by a full slate of the league action on Friday and Saturday. Angelo State and West Texas A&M top the conference standings with just one loss each.

LSC volleyball teams are 109-90 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 10-10 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Halie Harton, West Texas A&M University, JR, Roswell, N.M., Goddard HS

Harton continued to lead the injury riddled Lady Buff offense this past weekend as WT went 2-0 on the road against Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The Roswell native registered 27 kills for an average of 4.50 per set to hit an impressive .359 on the weekend while also tallying 13 digs for an average of 2.17 per set with four block assists. Harton put down 13 kills vs. UIW and added 14 against TAMUK.

Maddie Huth, Angelo State University, JR, The Colony, Texas, The Colony HS

Huth had a dominant week for the Angelo State Belles, hitting a combined .394 in wins over Tarleton State, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce. Huth led ASU with 36 kills (3.27 per set) and finished the week by hitting .500 against TWU and the Lions. Huth's top performance came on Friday night with a 15-kill effort against TWU where she also added six digs and four blocks. Along with her impressive attacking totals, the junior also finished the week with 11 blocks and 13 digs.

DEFENSIVE

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, SO, Dalhart, Texas, Dalhart HS

Wilt continues to be a pain for opposing team's offenses with her tremendous play on the defensive side of each volleyball match. Wilt helped lead the Belles to three wins last week by having 5.50 digs per set and leading ASU with 66 digs during the matches. Wilt's defense helped limit opponents to a .141 hitting percentage in the matches and has the Belles on a three-match winning streak going into road matches at Midwestern State and Cameron this week.

Erin Dougherty, West Texas A&M University, SR, Omaha, Neb., Mercy

Dougherty continued to impress on the front row for the #7 Lady Buffs this past weekend with 14 total blocks as they went 2-0 on the road against Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The Omaha native registered 21 kills for an average of 3.50 per set to hit an incredible .471 on the weekend with two solo and 12 block assists (2.33 per set).

SETTER

Sarah Siemens, Abilene Christian University, FR, Bakersfield, Calif., Stockdale HS

Siemens set a pair of Lone Star Conference season highs over the weekend as her Wildcats went 3-0 last weekend at the ACU/Whitten Inn Classic over Midwestern State, Cameron and Texas-Permian Basin. Siemens, who finished the tournament with 132 assists and a 13.20 per set average, first recorded a conference season-high for a three-set match with 44 assists against the Mustangs, and then the following morning vs. Cameron established a conference season-high for a four-set match with 53 assists vs. the Aggies. Siemens' total of 53 assists was her second-highest of the season, second only to a 56 assist performance in a 3-2 win at Eastern New Mexico. Siemens' efforts as a setter have her ranked fourth in the conference with 9.85 assists per game. On defense, she also was a bully at the net in coming through with nine of the team's 20.0 blocks - five solo and four assist. Her 4.0 blocks vs. MSU and Cameron tied a season best.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, SR, Plano, Texas, Plano East HS

Woolsey continues to put her teammates in the best positions to win points and her team to win matches. The

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senior was vital in three conference wins last week and finished with 137 assists (11.42 per set). Woolsey had 48 assists in a four-set win over Texas Woman's following a 50-assists performance in a tough five-set win at Tarleton State on Tuesday. She now has 748 assists this season and 4,439 in her career at ASU.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Sara Oxford, Abilene Christian University, kept her name ranked among the conference's offensive leaders with a 42 kill, 45.5 point weekend, which saw the Wildcats go 3-0 against Midwestern State, Cameron and Texas-Permian Basin during the ACU/Whitten Inn Classic. Oxford ripped 17 of her 42 kills in the 3-0 win over Midwestern State and recorded a season-best hitting percentage of .485 (17-1-33). She then contributed 16 kills in the four-set win over Cameron, and had nine kills to go along with a season-best 14 digs vs. Permian Basin. Oxford begins the week ranked eighth in the conference in kills at 3.21 per game, and 10th in points with 3.60 per game.

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, led the Zias this last week in conference play. In two games, Barron put down 25 kills, 4.17 kills per set and two double digit performances. Against Texas A&M-Kingsville she accounted for 11 of the team's 18 kills. Her 14 kill performance against UIW insured she got double digit kills in six of her last seven matches.

Josie Santos, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers on offense with 32 kills (4.00 avg) and 34.0 points in the two roads games last week. She also added 32 digs and two block assists on defense. Santos led all players in kills in both games. She had 16 kills at #12 Angelo State and then added 16 more at Tarleton State. Santos also recorded her third and fourth consecutive double-double with 15 and 17 digs respectively. She continues to lead the team with 118 kills against conference foes.

Kelsey Washington, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a tremendous week for the Javelinas. The sophomore had 34 kills in nine sets over three matches. After opening the week with nine kills and 11 digs against Incarnate Word, Washington posted her fifth double-double of the season 13 kills and 13 digs versus Eastern New Mexico. She hit .385 in the match with 13 kills on 26 attempts versus the Zias. On Saturday against West Texas, she had a team-high 12 kills and hit .240 for the match. No other Javelina had more than six kills. She also was second on the team in digs with seven.

Lydia Werchan, University of the Incarnate Word, had a big week on the back line for the Cardinals. She had 20 digs and four assists in a three-set loss to #7 West Texas A&M. She came back with 20 digs, five assists and two service aces in a three-set win over Eastern New Mexico. She averaged 6.67 digs per set for the week and leads the LSC with 5.40 digs per set for the season.

Courtnee Davis, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers on defense with a team-high 38 digs (4.75 avg) in the two road games last week. She also added 14 kills, two service aces and three total blocks. Davis led all players in digs in both games. She had a career-high 23 at #12 Angelo State and then added 15 at Tarleton State. Davis also had 10 kills against ASU to record her second double-double of the season. On the season she has 191 digs, 111 kills and 23 total blocks.

Dallas Russell, Eastern New Mexico University, led the Zia defense with two perfect performances behind the 10 foot line. Russell earned perfect marks in both serves and service reception as she did not make one service error in 17 attempts and collected 21 service receptions. In addition she scooped up 22 digs for 3.67 digs per set.

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, led the #7 Lady Buffs to a 2-0 mark this past weekend on the road against Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville to improve WT to 16-2 overall with a 7-1 mark in the Lone Star Conference. The Clemson transfer dished out 69 assists for an impressive average of 11.5 per set to go along with 13 digs and nine total blocks (1 solo, eight assisted).

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, continues to run the offense for the Zias. In two games she collected 39 assists. 6.5 assists per set and 15 digs. Catano was also perfect at the service line and made 13 serves with no errors.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats began their climb out of the Lone Star Conference cellar with a 3-0 home weekend at the ACU/Whitten Inn Classic. ACU started its weekend Friday night with a 3-0 win over Midwestern State and then followed it with a Saturday doubleheader sweep of Cameron and Texas-Permian Basin. ACU won by scores of 3-0, 3-1, and 3-0, hit .193 overall and out-blocked the opposition, 20-15. The offense was paced by Sara Oxford, who finished the weekend with a team-best 45.5 points on the strength of 42 kills and three blocks. She also contributed 30 digs and a pair of service aces. Others making a name on offense were Corrie Reeder (22K, .308), Kalyne Allen (20K .383), Rachel Riley (32K) and Jennie Loerch (28K). Sarah Siemens set the offense in motion with 13.20 assists per set, and was a bully at the net with nine blocks (5.0 solo). In her first full weekend back from injury, Madelyn Robinett delivered four aces and dug out 24 balls. Madison Hoover, however, had the most digs with 61.

Angelo State

The Angelo State Belles improved to 9-1 in Lone Star Conference play with three wins last week over Tarleton State, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce. The Belles were forced to make a five-set comeback against TSU after the TexAnns had jumped out to a 2-1 lead on their home court, while ASU took care of business with a four-set victory over TWU before sweeping the Lions in San Angelo. The Belles finished the week with a .198 hitting percentage and limited opponents to a .141 mark. Maddie Huth led the team with 36 kills, while Shelbi Goode and Kaelen Valdez both added 34. The Belles return to the road this weekend with a match at Midwestern State on Friday night before playing at Cameron on Saturday.

The Cameron University volleyball team went 1-2 this week as they lost to Midwestern State 3-1 on Tuesday, Oct. 2 and lost to Abilene Christian 3-1 and beat the University of Texas-Permian Basin 3-0 on Saturday, Oct.

Rebecca Green had a good game against MSU with 15 kills and she followed up with 11 versus ACU. Setter Jenna Risoli had three continues to be a double-double machine with three double-doubles this week, which makes five games in a row. She recorded assist numbers of 39, 35, and 34 along with having 15 digs in each of the matches this week. Julisa Ocasio had 22 digs and Mariah Westlake had 20 digs against ACU and Ocasio added 34 digs against UTPB. The Aggies had a big loss as freshman starter Annelise Carpenter was hurt in the Abilene Christian match. Carpenter has recently been adding up the kills with 39 in her last three games. The Eastern New Mexico volleyball team went 0-2 for the week as they fell to both Texas A&M University-Kingsville and University of the Incarnate Word.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 1-1 last week. They lost to #7 West Texas A&M in three sets on Friday and came back with a straight sets victory over Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. UIW is currently tied for fifth in the LSC and are looking to get back to the conference tournament after missing out last year. Lydia Werchan had a big week on the back line for the Cardinals. She had 20 digs and four assists in a three-set loss to #7 West Texas A&M. She came back with 20 digs, five assists and two service aces in a three-set win over Eastern New Mexico. She averaged 6.67 digs per set for the week and leads the LSC with 5.40 digs per set for the season. She is ranked 19th in the nation in digs per set. The Cardinals had a season high attack percentage against Eastern New Mexico with a .351 attack. It was only the second time they have attacked at over a .300 percentage this year.

Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace enjoyed a stellar week putting down 3.07 kills per set while posting a team-best .288 attack percentage... Wallace posted double-figure kills in three of her four outings last week including a season-high 16 kills (.308) Friday against Texas-Permian Basin... Wallace has produced eight matches with 10-or-more kills... Wallace ranks 10th in the Lone Star Conference with a .269 attack percentage... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart knocked down eight kills without an error Friday against Texas-Permian Basin before ripping 12 kills with two errors Saturday at Dallas Baptist... Junior outside hitter/setter Courtney Haney notched her second and third double-figure kill matches with 11 against Texas-Permian Basin and 10 at Dallas Baptist... Haney has accounted for one triple double (kills, digs, set assists) and eight double-doubles... Sophomore middle blocker Kasey Decker matched a season-high with 11 kills Friday night at Abilene Christian... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell ranks second in the Lone Star Conference

with 0.38 service aces per set after drilling 12 service aces last week including matching season higher of three against Cameron and Texas-Permian Basin... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher followed a career-best 32-dig effort against Texas-Permian Basin with a 20-dig performance at Dallas Baptist...
