### LSC FOOTBALL

The 2012 regular season is in the books with postseason play on tap for three Lone Star Conference teams. West Texas A&M claimed a share of league title with a win over Texas A&M-Commerce to tie Midwestern State, as both teams posted 7-1 league records. The Mustangs earned their third title in the last four years, while the Buffs won their fifth crown and first since three straight from 2005-07.

The LSC won the inaugural GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge with a 6-4 advantage in the 10-game series including MSU's win over West Georgia last week. The LSC outscored the GSC, 315-284, for an average score of 32-28 with five of the contests decided by seven points or less. The 10 games included: Valdosta State at Angelo State (VSU 43-10); Abilene Christian at Delta State (ACU 34-28); Midwestern State at West Alabama (MSU 42-27); Delta State at Tarleton State (DSU 38-35); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (UNA 21-16); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (WT 52-28); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (VSU 38-31); Tarleton State at North Alabama (TSU 38-28); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (ACU 22-16 (OT)); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (MSU 35-17).

LSC football teams are 48-47 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

### MSU, WT SELECTED FOR PLAYOFFS

Midwestern State and West Texas A&M were selected to represent the Lone Star Conference in the field of 24 teams for the 2012 NCAA Division II Football Championship.

The Mustangs (9-1) are the fifth seed in Super Region Four, while the Buffaloes (9-2) are the sixth seed.

MSU, the co-LSC Champions, plays at No. 4 Indianapolis in the first round on Nov. 17 at 11 a.m. The winner advances to meet top seed CSU-Pueblo in the second round.

WT, who won a share of the LSC title, faces No. 3 Chadron State in first-round action with kickoff set for 1 p.m. The victor moves on to play Ashland, the No. 2 seed.

### TAMUK TO PLAY IN KANZA BOWL

The teams are set for the fourth annual Kanza Bowl, with Texas A&M-Kingsville representing the Lone Star Conference against Emporia State from the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, bowl officials announced on Monday. The teams will play Sunday, Nov. 25, at Hummer Sports Park in Topeka, Kan., with kickoff at 1:30 p.m.

The Javelinas (6-5) enter the postseason having won four of their last five games, and will appear in the program's second-ever bowl game. TAMUK defeated Arkansas Tech 45-14 in the 1960 Great Southwest Bowl game in Grand Prairie, Texas.

The Hornets (9-2) won their first eight games in 2012, before dropping two of three to end the season. Emporia State, who is making its first postseason appearance since 2003, has played in four bowl games with a 2-2 mark.

This will be the first-ever meeting between the two squads.

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### CO-OFFENSIVE

**Mitchell Gale, Abilene Christian University, SR, QB, Alva, Okla., Alva HS**

In the final game of his remarkable four-year ACU career, Mitchell Gale completed 25 of 36 passes for 408 yards and two scores as he became the all-time leading passer and total offense leader in both Lone Star Conference and ACU history. ... Gale finished his career with LSC and ACU records for passing completions (931), attempts (1,483), yards (12,109) and total offense (12,177). ... He is second to former ACU teammate Billy Malone in career touchdown passes (114 to 97), but topped Malone for first place in each of the other categories. ... Gale's effort also makes ACU just the third school in NCAA history (joining Hawai'i and Houston) as the only schools to feature back-to-back starting quarterbacks who have thrown for at least 12,000 career yards. ... Gale threw two long touchdown passes against Incarnate Word: 87 yards to Charcandrick West and 80 yards to Darian Hogg in the second quarter to give his record quest a solid boost. ... His 408-yard effort is tied for

the fourth-best single-game effort of his career and gave him 18 career 300-yard passing days, the second-best total in ACU history behind Malone's 20.

#### Jake Fenske, Tarleton State University, SR, QB, Round Rock, Texas, McNeil HS

Fenske completed 23 passes and broke the school record for passing yards in a single game with 460 yards in Tarleton's 54-37 win over Angelo State in the regular-season finale in Stephenville on Saturday. Fenske, who made just his third start ever at starting quarterback, had a 53-yard touchdown strike and a game-long 66-yard touchdown bomb en route to three passing TD's on the evening.

#### Chauncey Harris, Midwestern State University, SO, RB, San Antonio, Texas, Converse Judson HS

Harris posted the best rushing game in the Lone Star Conference since 2009 and the best at Midwestern State since 2007 as he rushed for 232 yards and two touchdowns in the No. 9 Mustangs 35-17 win over West Georgia. Harris ran for 169 yards in the second half alone on his way to posting the fourth-best rushing game in MSU history and the best by running back. It was the most yardage by a Midwestern runner since quarterback Daniel Polk ran for 290 yards against Abilene Christian on Nov. 10, 2007. Harris posted touchdown runs of 21 and 31 yards for the Mustangs and added non-scoring runs of 28, 25, 21 and 39 yards as he averaged 14.5 yards on his 16 carries. He also had one pass reception for 12 yards. Harris led the Pony Express ground game to the second-best team rushing effort in school history with 470 yards, the best in the LSC since Eastern New Mexico's 488 against East Central on Sept. 15, 2007. MSU's third-leading rusher in total yardage on the season, Harris averages 85.9 yards a game with his 773 yards in nine contests with six touchdowns.

#### DEFENSIVE

##### Justin Stephens, Abilene Christian University, SO, LB, Keller, TX, Fort Worth Christian HS

Stephens put together one of the best games of his ACU career Saturday in the Wildcats' season-ending 24-12 win at Incarnate Word. ... Stephens finished with 14 tackles (11 solo) and one sack for a 19-yard loss as the Wildcat defense limited the Cardinals to just 285 yards of total offense, including just 104 passing yards.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

##### Blake Barnes, Tarleton State University, FR, K, Stephenville, Texas, Stephenville HS

Barnes went 3-for-3 in field goal attempts on Saturday as Tarleton went on to defeat Angelo State 54-37 in Stephenville. The Stephenville native kicked a career-long 47-yard field goal late in the third quarter to give the true freshman 18 field goals on the season to tie the school's all-time single-season record. Barnes netted 92 total points on the season, going 18-for-20 in FG's and 38-for-38 in extra point attempts. He finished the season with the third most points scored in a single season at Tarleton.

#### OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Robert Armstrong, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, continued where he left off against Valdosta State the week before Saturday night as he tied a school record with three touchdown receptions. He had grabs of 34, 4 and 80 yards in the win over Eastern New Mexico and now has five in the last two contests to finish the regular season with a career-best 11. The junior finished with a season-high 144 yards receiving giving him 281 yards receiving in the past two games and has posted five career 100-yard games.

Khiry Robinson, West Texas A&M University, led the team with 151 all-purpose yards with a game-high 110 yards on the ground on 16 carries and two touchdowns. Had 11 punt return yards, along with two catches for 30 yards. His 110 yards put him over 1,000 yards for the season with 1,015 in just nine games along with a team-high 11 rushing touchdowns. Saturday he became the first Buffalo player to eclipse 1,000 yards on the ground in a season since Keithon Flemming had over 1,200 yards in 2007. It was Robinson's seventh 100-yard rushing game of the season and the third multi-rushing touchdown game this season. Robinson is second in the conference in rushing at 112.8 yards per game, while ranking 24th nationally. He is 10th nationally and first in the league in all-purpose yards at 170.89 per game.

Jacob Johnson, Eastern New Mexico University, accounted for more than half of the Greyhounds passing offense at Texas A&M-Kingsville. He set career-highs, with nine catches and 120 yards. Five of his receptions resulted in ENMU first downs, including two catches of at least 20 yards.

Danny Mason, Texas A&M University - Commerce, concluded his A&M-Commerce career in style, notching 15 tackles, including 8 solo, in the 45-14 loss to West Texas A&M ... Mason also tallied half a

tackle for loss and forced a Buff fumble in the second quarter, setting up the Lions' first touchdown of the game ... Mason concludes the 2012 season as the LSC leader in tackles, finishing third in the nation averaging 11.5 tackles per game ... He finishes the year with five games of double-digit tackles and two others with nine stops.

Mark Savere, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a career-best 14 tackles against Eastern New Mexico as the Javelinas played without top tackler Jeremy Aguilar. His previous high was six earlier this season at Tarleton State. With the 14 stops he tied Aguilar for the most tackles in a game this season.

Perron Sellers, Eastern New Mexico University, made a team-high 14 tackles at Texas A&M-Kingsville, which included nine solo stops.

Gadrian Muse, Midwestern State University, led No. 9 Midwestern State defensively in the Mustangs 35-17 win over West Georgia by collecting his third double-digit tackle performance of the season. The junior from Brookshire/Royal tallied a season-high 13 tackles against the Wolves along with a quarterback hurry. Muse helped the Mustangs hold UWG to just 187 yards rushing and 336 yards of offense, both below their season averages. Muse is the leading tackler on the MSU squad with 63 stops and leads the team with 7.0 tackles a game.

Curtis Slater, West Texas A&M University, had a blocked punt on the first defensive possession for the Buffs in a 45-14 win at Texas A&M-Commerce Saturday. Tallied six total tackles with two solo stops and one of seven tackles for loss for two yards. His blocked punt led to the initial touchdown as Eric Finefeuiaki scooped up the ball and scored. It was his first blocked punt of his career and the sixth blocked kick of the season for the Buffs. Slater is third on the team in tackles with 63 and he has 37 solo stops to go along with 7.5 tackles for loss for 22 yards and one sack for nine yards while leading the team with three

Saul Meza, University of the Incarnate Word, accounted for all 12 of the Cardinals points in their 24-12 loss against Abilene Christian. The four field goals set a new school single game record. He connected from 43, 28, 37 and 26 yards. He finished the season 8-for-8 on field goal attempts after taking over the role for the final four games of the season.

Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, went 6 for 6 in extra points and 1 of 1 in field goals helping lead the Buffs to a 45-14 win at Texas A&M-Commerce and a share of the Lone Star Conference crown Saturday as he moved into fourth all-time in scoring with 257 career points surpassing Eugene "Mercury" Morris (1966-68). He made his 14th field goal of the season in 16 tries. His 14 made field goals are second-most in the conference while he improved to a perfect 56 of 56 in extra-points which is the best in the conference. The nine points he scored in the game gives him 98 for the season as he ranks 32nd nationally in scoring at 8.91 points per contest. He is 32 of 42 in his career in field goals and 161 of 163 in extra points for 257 career points.

Angel Millan, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had his best game of the season. The junior punted six times for 273 yards and a season-best 45.2 yard average. He had a 65-yard punt which is his second longest of the season. His previous best was 87 yards at Tarleton State tying the school record.

Cameron Froesch, Texas A&M University - Commerce, closed out the 2012 season with eight punts against West Texas A&M, tallying 357 yards and averaging 44.6 yards per punt, including a long of 61 ... He had three punts inside the Buff 20, pinning West Texas A&M inside the 10 twice ... Froesch ranks 10th nationally and second in the LSC averaging 42.30 yards per punt with a career-long of 76 and 14 inside the 20.

Dylan Baca, Eastern New Mexico University, had three of his seven punts at Texas A&M-Kingsville, downed inside the Javelina 20-yard line. His performance limited the Javelinas to 2.5 yards per punt return.

### Abilene Christian

The Wildcats played their 259th and final Lone Star Conference football game Saturday night after 40 years in the league. ... The Wildcats' 24-12 win over Incarnate Word gave them a final league record of 142-115-2 since they joined the league in 1973. ... The Wildcats also played their final game as a member of NCAA Division II on Saturday and finished their stay at that level of NCAA competition with a record of 160-155-3. ... The Wildcats missed out on the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2012 for the first time since 2005. ... The Wildcats' seven wins in 2012 (7-4) mark the seventh straight season the Wildcats have won at least seven games and gives them 25 seven-winning seasons in the program's 90-year history. ... In the final game of his remarkable four-year ACU career, senior quarterback Mitchell Gale completed 25 of 36 passes for 408 yards and two scores as he became the all-time leading passer and total offense leader in both Lone Star Conference and ACU history. ... Gale finished his career with LSC and ACU records for passing completions (931), attempts (1,483), yards (12,109) and total offense (12,177). ... ### Angelo State

Angelo State quarterback Kyle Washington threw for 245 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another score in his first collegiate start, but Tarleton State (6-4, 5-3) defeated the Rams (5-6, 4-4) 54-37 in the season finale at Tarleton Memorial Stadium.

### Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University football team concluded the 2012 season on Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Senior quarterback Wesley Wood finished his career as the all-time ENMU leader in total offense and holds most of the career passing records. The Hounds held a 7-6 lead midway through the first half, but the Javelinas capitalized on a pair of turnovers to pull away for the win.

### Incarnate Word

The Cardinals dropped the final game of the season

24-12 at home to Abilene Christian. Saul Meza accounted for all 12 of the team's points. The four field goals set a new school single game record. He connected from 43, 28, 37 and 26 yards. He finished the season 8-for-8 on field goal attempts after taking over the role for the final four games of the season. Safety Chaz Pavliska made 12 tackles in the game to lead the team and he passed up linebacker Dakota Mawyer for the career tackles record. Pavliska finished his career with 249 while Mawyer finished with 244. Running back Trent Rios picked up 101 yards on the ground against ACU. It was his second 100-yard performance and seventh of his career. He finished his career with over 25 single season and career school records.

### Midwestern State

The Mustangs finished the season at 9-1 overall and co-champions of the Lone Star Conference at 7-1. Midwestern has now won 19 of its last 20 regular season contests ... MSU was selected to play in the NCAA Division II Championships for the third time in the last four seasons ... won both of their games in the LSC-Gulf South 1st and 10 Challenge with the 35-17 win over West Georgia ... the Pony Express rolled up 470 yards rushing against West Georgia, the second-highest rushing game in MSU history, second only to MSU's 522 yards gained against McMurry on Oct. 26, 1991 ... Chauncey Harris chalked up the fourth-best rushing game in MSU history with his 232 yards on 16 carries, a remarkable 14.5 yard average with touchdowns of 21 and 31 yards. It's the best game of an MSU running back in history and the best performance since quarterback Daniel Polk rushed for 290 yards against Abilene Christian on Nov. 10, 2007 ... It's the third 145-plus game for Harris on the season, who had 148 against A&M-Commerce and 155 against Eastern New Mexico ... Keidrick Jackson tallied 104 yards on 17 carries with a touchdown before being pulled at halftime for his seventh 100-yard game of the season ... It was the sixth time this season that MSU has recorded a double-100 yard rushing game and it was almost a triple-100 as quarterback Brandon Kelsey rushed for 99 yards on 10 carries with a touchdown ... Jackson leads the LSC and is 14th in Division II in rushing with 126.3 yards a game. He now has 1,263 yards on 179 carries, averaging 7.1 yards a carry. It is the third-best rushing season in Midwestern history and Jackson needs just 29 yards to pass Henry Anders 1,291 yards in 1991 and 125 yards to pass Dominic Rhodes 1,387 yards in 2000 ... Jackson continues to lead the Lone Star Conference, but is now third in NCAA Division II in scoring. With only one touchdown in the half he played against West Georgia, Jackson has 114 points to average 11.4 points a game, trailing Findlay's Montrae Williams (126 points/12.6 ppg) and Bloomsburg's Franklyn Quiteh (138 points/12.55 ppg) ... Jackson now has 19 rushing touchdowns on the season to tie Daniel Polk's single season record set in 2007. He also has 44 career rushing touchdowns that ties Polk's career rushing TDs mark. Jackson has a total of 45 career touchdowns (one receiving) that is the new MSU career record ... Jackson's 114 points this season ties him with Polk's 2007 scoring and his own 2011 scoring record ... Jackson also has become the highest scoring non-kicker in MSU history, ranking second with 270 points and is 21 points behind Jose Martinez (2007-10). Brandon Kelsey is fourth in career scoring with 180 points ... Neiko Conway grabbed his fourth interception of the season to give the junior 10 for his career, which is second on the MSU career list ... With its ranking this week, Midwestern has appeared in the last 21 AFCA Division II Top 25 polls



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debuted in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (VSU 43-10); Abilene Christian at Delta State (ACU 34-28); Midwestern State at West Alabama (MSU 42-27); Delta State at Tarleton State (DSU 38-35); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (UNA 21-16); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (WT 52-28); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (VSU 38-31); Tarleton State at North Alabama (TSU 38-28); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (ACU 22-16 (OT)); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (MSU 35-17).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

### Tarleton State

The Texans (6-4, 5-3 LSC) won for the 11th-straight time over the Rams with a 54-37 victory over ASU on Saturday night and regained the all-time series lead for the first time since 1968. Tarleton now leads the series 15-14... Jake Fenske (QB, Sr, Round Rock) completed 23 of 39 passes for a school-record 460 yards and three touchdowns, which included a 53-yard strike to Jeken Frye (WR, Jr, El Paso) and a 66-yard bomb to Clifton Rhodes III (WR, So, Fort Worth)... The 460 passing yards topped the previous mark set by Cliff Watkins, who had 438 yards (Oct. 25, 2003)... Frye caught seven passes and accumulated the eighth-most yards in a single game with 180 yards receiving on Saturday... Both ASU and Tarleton combined for 964 yards of total offense (Tarleton 580, ASU 384)... Tarleton's 56 points were a season-high and it marks the most points scored in a game since the Texans scored 66 points against Southwestern Oklahoma back on Sept. 26, 2009 (66-3)... Rufus Johnson (DE, Sr, Dallas) finished the season with 10 sacks for a total loss of 48 yards... The Dallas native had at least one-half sack in seven of the nine games he played in for the Texans this season and finishes his career at Tarleton with 15.5 sacks... In three starts and playing in five games for the Texans this season, Fenske finished the year with 1,259 yards passing and a team-high 11 touchdowns... Aaron Doyle (QB, Jr, Tarleton) led the team with 1,579 passing yards and 10 touchdowns in eight game... Both quarterbacks combined to throw for 2,838 yards on the season, which ranks seventh-most in a single-season... Vaughn Smith (RB, Jr, Menlo Park, Calif.) rushed for a team-high 816 yards with five touchdowns this season, while Zach Henshaw (RB, Fr, Fischer) rushed for 608 yards and a team-high seven rushing touchdowns... The Texans rushed for a combined 1,787 yards in 2012... Rhodes led the Texans in receiving this season as he hauled in a team-high 56 passes for 694 yards, giving him the eighth-most receiving yards in a single season... Frye had 46 receptions for 674 yards... Arthur Buckingham (WR, Sr, Pilot Point) led the squad with seven receiving touchdowns on the season... Offensively, the Texans finish the regular-season with 4,625 yards (2,838 pass, 1,787 rush) of total offense, which ranks fifth-most all-time in school history... Tarleton tallied 800 offensive plays on the season – sixth-most in school history... Blake Barnes (K, Fr, Stephenville) finishes the regular-season with 92 points on the season, going 18-for-20 in field goal attempts and 38-for-38 in extra-point tries. His 92 total points are third-most in school history behind J.W. Boren (2nd, 94 points; 2001) and Derrick Ross (1st, 134 points; 2004)... Tarleton finished with an overall record above .500 for a second-consecutive season and a 12th out of the last 13 years.

### Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce closes out the 2012 season with a 45-14 loss to West Texas A&M, finishing the year 1-9 overall and 1-7 in LSC play for the second-straight year ... The 2-18 mark over the past two seasons marks the worst two-year span in the program's 98 year history ... Head coach Guy Morriss' record at A&M-Commerce falls to 10-31, including a 1-20 mark against teams from the state of Texas ... There were a few highlights on the year, including linebacker Danny Mason who finished the regular season third nationally in tackles per game (11.5) and punter

Cameron Frosch who was 10th in punting average (42.30) ... A&M-Commerce also led the Lone Star Conference in passing defense (180.3 ypg), ranking 19th nationally.

The Buffaloes earned their sixth NCAA Tournament bid as the six-seed in Super Region Four as they will travel to third-seeded Chadron State Saturday at 1 p.m. Central Time in the first round...The Buffs are coming off a 45-14 win at Texas A&M-Commerce and earned a share of the 2012 Lone Star Conference Championship with Northwestern State...Senior running back Khiry Robinson became the first WT running back since Keithon Flemming in 2007 to go over 1,000 yards in a season as Robinson has 1,015 yards in just nine games played...Junior kicker Sergio Castillo tallied nine points on Saturday to move into fourth all-time in scoring in school history with 257 points surpassing Eugene "Mercury" Morris (1966-68) as he is 32 of 42 in field goals and 161 of 163 in extra points...Junior defensive back Curtis Slater blocked a punt on the opening defensive possession for the Buffs Saturday as it was the sixth blocked kick of the season for WT...Junior linebacker Eric Finefeuiaki returned the blocked punt for a touchdown for the fifth defensive/special teams touchdown of the season...Junior wide receiver Torrence Allen is just 44 yards from 1,000 for the season and, if he gets 44 yards Saturday at Chadron State, it would be the first 1,000-yard rusher/receiver combo in a season since 1994...It also marked back-to-back games with 100 yard rusher/receiver in the same game and fourth time in the last five games and fifth time for the season...The Buffs are first nationally in sacks as they tallied four against TAMUC Saturday averaging 3.91 per contest...Junior Ethan Westbrooks leads the team with 12.5 sacks on the year which is third-most in a season in school history and leads the league this season...The 3,552 passing yards put up by junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan is eighth-most in a season in school history...Vaughan's 278 yards Saturday gave him 7,205 for his career as he is just 219 yards from surpassing Tod Mayfield for fifth all-time in school history...Robinson's 11 rushing touchdowns ties his output from last season...The Buffs have scored over 100 points in each quarter this season with 129 in the third being the most and haven't allowed over 70 in any quarter with 69 in the fourth being the highest allowed.
