LSC VOLLEYBALL

The teams are set for the annual Lone Star Conference Volleyball Championship Tournament, which begins Thursday in San Angelo, Texas.

Angelo State earned the right to host the event as the league's champion for the first time since 1992 with an 18-2 record.

The eight-team, single-elimination tournament consists of four first-round matches on Thursday, followed by two semifinal games on Friday evening and the championship match on Saturday afternoon.

The top eight teams in the LSC will compete for the 2012 tournament championship. In addition to winning the title, the LSC tournament winner will receive the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division II Championship tournament.

All the championship games will be aired live via internet video streaming at www.FoxSportsSouthwest.com. The webcasts are available free of charge. Each webcast includes both video and audio, with viewers needing only a computer with a high-speed DSL or cable modem connection to the internet. Veteran broadcaster Chris Needham has the call for all the games.

Action starts on Thursday at 12 p.m. with No. 3 Tarleton State against No. 6 Texas A&M-Kingsville followed by No. 2 West Texas A&M versus No. 7 Abilene Christian at 2:30 p.m., No. 4 Texas Woman's against No. 5 Texas A&M-Commerce at 5 p.m. and No. 1 ASU versus No. 8 Incarnate Word at 7:30 p.m.

WTAMU won the 2011 LSC volleyball tournament championship with a 3-0 victory over ASU in Canyon, Texas.

LSC volleyball teams are 178-153 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-17 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 14-13 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Mandeville, La., Fontainebleau HS/Central Arkansas
Barron turned in a strong week for the Zias, with 60 kills (4.62 per set). On Friday, she registered 29 kills against Incarnate Word, the highest single-game total for a Zia player since at least the 2001 season. She also turned in an 11-kill, six-dig performance against tenth-ranked West Texas A&M. In Saturday's season finale against Texas A&M-Kingsville, Barron finished with 20 kills, five digs and a block assist.

Stacie Murrah, Tarleton State University, JR, San Antonio, O'Connor HS

Murrah put together two of her best performances of the season to end the TexAnns three-game losing skid and end the season on a high note with wins against Texas Woman's and Texas A&M Commerce. The junior hitter landed a team-high 25 kills and led the team with a .333 hitting percentage. She added 11 digs and totaled 27 points in the two wins, which secured the TexAnns the No. 3 seed in the LSC Tournament.

DEFENSIVE

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, SR, Hereford, Texas, Hereford HS

Beville became WT's all-time career leader in digs this past week as she tallied 54 digs on the week for an average of 6.00 per set to lead the Lady Buffs to three sweeps. Beville moved past former Lady Buff great Sara Contreras who played for WT from 2005-2008 and registered 2,248 career digs. The Hereford, Texas native passes the mark late in the second set on Tuesday against Eastern New Mexico in Portales. The senior has now tallied 2,287 career digs entering the LSC Tournament this weekend.

Chloe' Tate, Texas Woman's University, JR, Denton, Texas, Ryan HS

Tate led the team on defense with a team-high 15 total blocks (3 solo) in the two games last week. She had 13

SETTER

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, SR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair HS

Hayes continued to dominate for the #10 Lady Buffs as she dished out 121 assists on the week for an incredible average of 13.4 per set as WT hit .369 as a team with 147 total kills. The senior also registered 17 digs and eight block assists on the week, The Cypress, Texas native registered 43 assists on Friday night against Texas A&M-Kingsville on Senior Night at the WTAMU Fieldhouse.

Sarah Siemens, Abilene Christian University, FR, Bakersfield, Calif., Stockdale HS

Siemens eclipsed the 1,000-assist plateau this past weekend with a combined 97 assists in a pair of 3-1 wins at Cameron and Midwestern State. She averaged 12.12 assists per set as her teammates hit a respectable .240. With 1,089 assists this season, Siemens moved into 10th place on ACU's all-time career leader list, passing Kayla Fisher's total of 1,074. Siemens had 52 assists Friday vs. the Aggies and 45 Saturday vs. the Mustangs. Her six kills at MSU also tied a career high.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Maddie Huth, Angelo State University, continued her strong season last weekend in matches against Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's. Huth led the Belles with 36 kills (4.00 per set) and finished the weekend with a .388 hitting percentage. The junior had 20 kills in the win over A&M-C on Friday night which clinched the LSC regular-season title for ASU. It was her second 20-plus kill match of the season. Huth also added 12 blocks last weekend.

Shelbi Stewart, Midwestern State University, hit .316 while putting down 3.57 kills per set helping Midwestern State to a split of Lone Star Conference matches against Cameron and Abilene Christian last week at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The senior outside hitter from Pflugerville slammed down 14 kills to go along with five digs and two blocks in Tuesday's 3-0 win over Cameron. Stewart then notched 11 kills, four digs and four blocks Saturday night against Abilene Christian.

Kalynne Allen, Abilene Christian University, led Abilene Christian on a 2-0 road trip last weekend in which the Wildcats beat Cameron and Midwestern State in four sets. Allen led all Wildcats with 33.0 points, which came off a team-best 28 kills, three service aces and four block assists. She hit .354 overall and made just five attacking errors on 65 attempts. Against the Aggies Friday, Allen hit .448 and recorded her third double-double of the season with 13 kills and 14 digs, and then against the Mustangs on Saturday she tied her career high of 15 kills en route to a season best 17.5 points. Allen has scored 10 or more points in five of ACU's last six matches.

Erin Dougherty, West Texas A&M University, continued to be a standout performer on the front row for the Lady Buffs this past week as she tallied 25 kills for an average of 2.78 per set to go along with 14 total blocks (4 solo, 10 assisted) for an average of 1.56 per set. The Omaha, Nebraska native tallied 11 kills on 17 attempts for a hitting percentage of .529 on Tuesday night in Portales against Eastern New Mexico.

Bethany Friesenhahn, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had two double-doubles on the week in three LSC outings. She had 10 kills and 13 digs versus Incarnate Word and concluded the week with 12 kills in 23 swings and just one error for a .478 hitting percentage. She had 12 digs in the win. She had four blocks in each of the wins.

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers on offense with 34 kills and 38.5 in the two games last week. She had 18 kills in a five-set thriller against Tarleton State and then added 16 kills, 18 assists and five blocks in an upset win over #9 Angelo State. On the season she leads the team with 370 kills and 430.5 points. She also has 211 assists, 23 service aces, 197 digs and 67 blocks.

Shelby Wilt's, Angelo State University, defense has been strong for the Belles all season and continued last weekend as ASU secured its first regular-season title since 1992. Wilt finished the weekend with 53 digs, including 36 digs on Friday night in a win over Texas A&M-Commerce. Wilt had 5.89 digs per set over the weekend and added three aces.

Kalinda Graves, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, just missed setting a record for digs in a match. After posting 11 digs in the first set, Graves had 26 digs which would have tied the record for a three-set match. In the end, she had 32 digs in the five-set match which was the Javelinas second-highest total this season. Ali Insell had 34 in a match earlier this season

Hayley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, accounted for nearly one third of the Zias digs against #10 West Texas A&M, Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. Over the three matches, she registered a strong 5.31 digs per set average and posted a .990 reception percentage, in 105 opportunities. After turning in a 14-dig performance against West Texas A&M, she turned in 22-dig and 33-dig matches against Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville, respectively.

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, racked up 13 total blocks in her final two regular season games as a TexAnn. The senior from Houston was a beast at the net, getting a hand on 11 assisted blocks and stopping two on her own en route to helping the TexAnns clinch the No. 3 seed at the LSC Championship.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, became the all-time career assists leader in Angelo State history and helped to lead the team to its first Lone Star Conference regular-season championship in a win over Texas A&M-Commerce last Friday. Woolsey finished the weekend with 107 assists in the two matches to close out the regular season, including 58 assists in the win over TAMU-Commerce. Woolsey now has 4,891 assists in her career as a Belle.

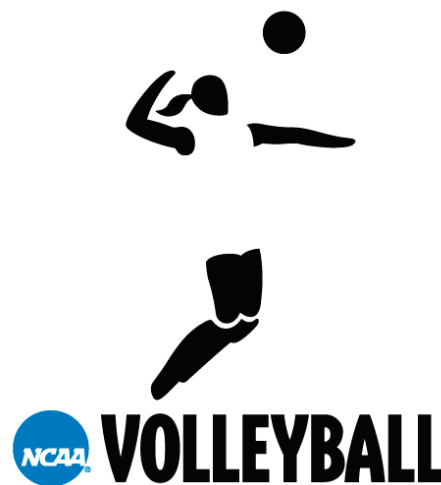

Against Incarnate Word, she registered a career-high 64 digs to go along with 18 digs. Catano added 49 assists and two kills in the season finale against the Javelinas.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, after posting eight double-doubles prior to regular-season finale, she recorded the first triple double of her Javelina career on Saturday at Eastern New Mexico. Fountain had a career-high 11 kills to go with 51 assists and 11 digs. Her previous high in kills was seven in the Javelinas

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

ACU won its last two regular season matches in four sets at both Cameron and Midwestern State and will enter the Lone Star Conference Championship as the No. 7 seed pitted against No. 2 seed West Texas A&M. The Wildcats last week hit a 100 points better than its opposition, .240 to .138, and had six player reach double figures, including setter Sarah Siemens, who scored 11.5 points and moved onto the ACU all-time career leaders list with 1,089 assists. Senior Kalyne Allen led all Wildcats with 28 kills and 33 points, while sophomore Sara Oxford hit .375 in delivering 22 kills and six block assists. Freshman Corrie Reeder also had six block assists and was second to Allen with 29 points.

Angelo State

The Angelo State Belles secured their first Lone Star Conference regular-season championship since 1992 and will host this week's LSC Volleyball Championship at the Junell Center. The Belles completed their conference schedule with an 18-2 record after splitting matches last weekend with a win over Texas A&M-Commerce and then a defeat to Texas Woman's. ASU goes into the tournament as the top seed and will open its play against Incarnate Word at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias turned in a strong final week, nearly defeating both Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word in five sets. Against UIW, Lindsey Barron matched Lindsay Schiely's (10/8/2005) 29 kills, as the highest single-match total for a Zia, since at least the 2001 season. The ENMU volleyball team has concluded its 2012 season.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals closed out the regular season going 1-2 in conference play. They fell to Texas A&M-Kingsville in five sets on Tuesday night in the final home match of the year. A win in that match would have propelled the Cards into a three-way tie for sixth place with TAMUK and Abilene Christian. Instead, the Cardinals finished as the #8 seed and will play LSC Tournament host Angelo State in the first round. Over the weekend, the Cardinals traveled to Eastern New Mexico and held on for a tough five-set win even though they played without libero Lydia Werchan. They lost at #10 West Texas A&M on Saturday in three sets. Werchan moved into third place all-time in career digs in the match with A&M-Kingsville. She had 27 digs and six assists in that match. She heads into the LSC Tournament with 1,440 career digs.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State split a pair of Lone Star Conference matches to close the season at 7-23 overall and 5-15 in LSC play... The Mustangs missed the LSC Postseason Tournament for the first time since 2007... MSU claimed its third three-set win of the campaign Tuesday night against Cameron to improve to 3-14 in three-set matches... The Mustangs logged their third best hitting game of the season logging a .232 team attack percentage Tuesday against Cameron. It was just the fourth time MSU combined for a .200-or-better team attack percentage... Junior outside hitter/setter Courtney Haney nabbed her team-best 15th double-double of the season finishing with 17 set assists and 15 digs Saturday night against Abilene Christian... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell notched her seventh double-double with 21 set assists and 10 digs against Abilene Christian... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart closed strong logging team-highs with 14 and 11 kills against Cameron and Abilene Christian respectively. She closed the season logging 16 matches with 10-or-more kills... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace notched her 13th performance of 10-or-more kills with 10 kills Saturday night against Abilene Christian...

Tarleton State

Tarleton bounced back from a brief three-game losing skid to win the final two regular season games over Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce to earn the No. 3 seed in the Lone Star Conference. The 15 wins by Tarleton in LSC play are the most in conference wins in school history since joining the NCAA in 1994.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce closed out the regular season with a pair of defeats at the Field House, beginning with a thrilling 3-2 heartbreaker to ninth-ranked Angelo State, followed by a 3-0 defeat to Tarleton State ... Senior middle blocker Rachel Robertson moved into third-place all-time in program history in career kills against the Rambelles, sitting at 1,346 ... Junior setter Jordan Neal upped her season assist total to 1,084, the 10th best single-season performance in school history and became the fourth player in Lion history to notch back-to-back 1,000 assist seasons ... Sophomore libero Michaela Spicer has tallied 518 digs, the seventh-highest single-season total as she becomes just the fourth player in program history to surpass 500 digs in a single season.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas closed out the regular by going 2-1 in their three matches. They defeated Incarnate Word and Eastern New Mexico 3-2, but were swept by No. 10 West Texas A&M...The Javelinas finished with 17 wins which is their most since 2009 and two more than in head coach Tanya Allen's debut season a year ago...Senior defensive specialist Ali Insell played in her 400th set on Saturday in the win over the Zias. She has now played in 403 sets as a Javelina which is good for ninth all-time...Senior libero Kalinda Graves just missed setting a record for digs in a match. After posting 11 digs in the first set, Graves had 26 digs which would have tied the record for a three-set match. In the end, she had 32 digs in the five-set match which was the Javelinas second-highest total this season. Ali Insell had 34 in a match earlier this season... After posting eight double-doubles prior to regular-season finale, sophomore setter Sarah Fountain recorded the first triple double of her Javelina career on Saturday at Eastern New Mexico.

Fountain had a career-high 11 kills to go with 51 assists and 11 digs. Her previous high in kills was seven in the Javelinas win over Tarleton on Nov. 2. Against ENMU, Fountain had just two errors in 24 attacks for a .375 hitting percentage...Freshman outside hitter Kelsey Felux also had a stellar performance against ENMU. She had a career-high 16 kill performance in the finale. It was her ninth double-digit kill performance. Her previous high came against McMurry in the third game of the season...Texas A&M-Kingsville is just 3-11 since 1988 in the Lone Star Conference Tournament. They have yet to get past the semifinals as they have won no more than one match in the postseason tournament in the program's history. The last time the Javelinas won a match in the conference tournament was in 1998 against Central Oklahoma in the opening round. Kingsville has lost its last six matches in the LSC tournament...Kingsville tied its season-high for service aces in a match with 10 versus the Zias. It is the third time this season they have reached the number. Kingsville is currently second in the league in service aces...After splitting the regular season with Tarleton, the Javelinas hold a slight advantage in the season series with 19 wins to just 18 losses to the TexAnns...Kingsville is currently 16th in the nation with 18.1 digs a set. They are third behind regular-season LSC champion Angelo State and Cameron.

Texas Woman's

The Pioneers ended the regular season with a bang. TWU upset #9 Angleo State 3-1 to improve its record to 22-7 on the season and 15-5 in the Lone Star Conference. The 15 LSC wins are a school record. The Pioneers will advance to the LSC Championship Tournament for the 10th consecutive season and 15th overall. Senior Viktorija Jablonska leads the team with 370 kills, 23 service aces and 430.5 points. She also has 211 assists, 197 digs, 67 total blocks and posted six triple-doubles.

West Texas A&M

The #10 Lady Buffs went 3-0 this past week to end the regular season with a 27-4 overall record and a 17-3 mark in the Lone Star Conference to finish in second place. WT registered sweeps of Eastern New Mexico, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word during the week. Senior libero Lauren Beville became WT's all-time career leader in digs on Tuesday night in Portales against the rival Zias. The Hereford, Texas native enters the LSC Tournament with 2,287 career digs. The Lady Buffs enter the LSC Tournament as the #2 overall seed and will face off with the #7 seed Wildcats of Abilene Christian on Thursday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. in the LSC Quarterfinals. WT will be fighting for their 14th overall LSC Tournament Title this weekend at the Junell Center on the campus of Angelo State University.
