LSC BASKETBALL

All 21 Lone Star Conference basketball teams have competed with six squads still undefeated early in the 2012-13 season.

The LSC men have a 22-8 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 7-5 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-1 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 12-15 overall. The women's squads are currently 5-4 combined versus Heartland teams, and 3-0 against the RMAC, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Steven Werner, Abilene Christian University, SR, Center, Fort Worth, Texas, Birdville HS

Newcomer and senior center Steven Werner averaged a double-double this past weekend at the ACU/Whitten Inn Classic, where the Wildcats beat York, 93-82, and Sul Ross, 83-66. Werner led ACU with 19.0 points and 14.5 rebounds per game. Against the Panthers, Werner had 17 points and 16 rebounds, and vs. the Lobos he had a season-high 21 points and 13 boards. Werner shared the team lead with 3 blocks.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Darnell Jackson, West Texas A&M University, SR, Guard, Savannah, Ga., Savannah HS

Jackson has stepped into a starting role for his first and only season at West Texas A&M as the senior guard averaged 10.5 points and a team leading 8.0 rebounds in WT's wins against CSU-Pueblo and Oklahoma Christian this past weekend to pick up MVP honors at the 29th annual Al Kaly Shriners' Classic in Pueblo, Colorado. The Savannah, Georgia native registered eight rebounds in each game to go along with a team leading 12 assists and four steals on the weekend. Jackson found teammate Kennon Washington open in the corner for a game winning three as time expired on Friday night as the Buffs topped CSU-Pueblo in their home opener.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Breanna Harris, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Forward, Mansfield, Texas, Mansfield Summit HS

Harris scored 30 points and added 15 rebounds in A&M-Commerce's 76-57 victory over Southern Arkansas Wednesday ... Harris hit 9 of 16 shots from the floor and 12-of-15 from the line ... She also grabbed 15 rebounds, 10 of which were offensive ... She had a double-double by halftime, recording 22 points and 11 rebounds in the first half as the Lions notched their most decisive victory in five seasons, also marking the first time in five years they were above .500.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, SO, Forward, Angleton, Texas, Angleton HS

Carter helped lead Midwestern State to a pair of wins over Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams and a title in MSU's Comfort Inn and Suites Ashbrook Classic. Carter double-doubled in both games, with 12 points, 11 rebounds and two blocked shots against Colorado Mines and 17 points with 13 rebounds and four steals against Fort Lewis (Colo.). MSU downed CSM 67-60 and Fort Lewis 68-54 to lead the LSC at 3-0 on the season. Carter shot 41.2 percent from the floor (7-17) and 83.3 percent from the foul line (15-18) as she averaged 14.5 points, 12.0 boards and 4.0 steals for the weekend and was named to the all-classic team.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Chris Talkington, Angelo State University, led the Rams to a 95-68 victory over Arlington Baptist with 25 points. The junior hit all eight free throws, three three-pointers and seven shots from the field. Talkington also grabbed seven rebounds in the victory.

Dionelle Rucker, University of the Incarnate Word, continued his scoring spree to start the season last week. He poured in a career high 29 points in a 94-87 loss to St. Mary's on Wednesday. He went 9-of-13 from the field and 11-of-15 from the foul line. He also grabbed six rebounds and had four steals. He came back with 15 points and three steals in a 72-68 win at Texas A&M-International. He averaged 22.0 points for the week and he is leading the LSC with 23.3 points per game overall.

Dennis Hardwell, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a 12 point second half with six free throws, as the Greyhounds pulled away from Lubbock Christian. For the game, he poured in 21 points, grabbed eight rebounds and shot .500 from the floor to help Eastern open its home schedule, successfully.

Rashad Basey, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in scoring in each of his first two games... He made his debut for the Javelinas with 13 points against A&M International adding a team-best eight assists... Against Texas Lutheran he led the Javelinas to their first win with 21 points...He was 7-of-14 from the floor in the win and 6-of-7 from the foul line...He added five defensive rebounds, six assists and two steals...In his first two games he has a remarkable assist/turnover of 2.3.

Coleman Furst, Tarleton State University, tied a career-high with 15 points in Tarleton's 60-46 win over Texas-Permian Basin on Friday and then poured in 14 points on Saturday as guided Tarleton to a 72-62 win over East Central. The junior guard lead the team with 14.5 points per game last week, while dishing out five assists and collecting four steals in a pair of games at the Texan Tip-Off Classic. Furst shot 52.6 percent (10-19) from the floor, 50.0 percent (4-8) from beyond the arc and 62.5 percent (5-8) from the free throw line.

Andrew Davis, Texas A&M University - Commerce, helped A&M-Commerce to a 2-1 mark over the weekend,

Mason White, West Texas A&M University, continued to become a strong scorer for the Buffs this past weekend as the senior averages 10.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game as the Buffs topped CSU-Pueblo and Oklahoma Christian in Pueblo, Colorado. The Amarillo, native gave the Buffs their fourth win of the season on Saturday afternoon as he hit a wide open three from the top of the key with three seconds remaining as WT topped the Eagles, 55-52 to move to 4-0 on the season.

Rafael Love, Eastern New Mexico University, had two steals, four defensive rebounds, a blocked shot and 20 points in the second half, to propel the Greyhounds to a home-opening win over Lubbock Christian. His performance allowed ENMU score eight points on six LCU turnovers and score 14 fast break points, while allowing just four.

Damion Clemons, Tarleton State University, pulled down 10 rebounds in a pair of Tarleton wins this past weekend and the junior forward recorded three blocks in the tournament as well. Clemons helped lead the Texans to a 14-point victory as well as a 10-point win. He averaged 6.5 points a game as well this weekend, while helping the Tarleton defense hold opponents to just 54.0 points per game.

Lyn'Dale Brown, University of the Incarnate Word, had a solid game with 11 points, six assists, four rebounds, three blocks and two steals in a 94-87 loss to St. Mary's. He came back with five rebounds, three steals and a block in a 72-68 win at Texas A&M-International. He averaged 2.0 blocks and 2.5 steals per game for the week.

Marshall Bonds III, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, showed his ability to be a game changer on the defensive end finishing the week with four blocks and four steals in two games in just over 18.5 minutes a game. He had two of each in each game.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats went 2-0 this past weekend at their Whitten Inn Classic, beating York, 93-82, and Sul Ross State, 83-66. The Wildcats shot a combined 50.7 percent from the floor and averaged 88.0 points per game, led by senior Steven Werner's double-double average of 19 points and 14.5 rebounds. Senior Eric Lawton and junior Cornelius Cammock also were major contributors. Lawton netted a game-high 23 points in the win over York to finish with a 13.5 point average, and Cammock recorded 25 bench points and a .667 shooting percentage. Werner, Lawton and Cammock all blocked three shots, while freshman Parker Wentz had the most steals with six. Defensively, the Wildcats held the opposition to .380 shooting and won the rebounding war, 98-71. Opponents also shot well below 70 percent from the free-throw line and connected on just 32 percent of their 3-pointers. ACU completes its three-game homestand Tuesday with a 7 p.m. game vs. Dallas Baptist.

Angelo State

The Rams moved to 2-0 on the season after a 95-68 victory over Arlington Baptist ... Chris Talkington led the Rams with 25 points ... The Rams are averaging 83.0 points on the season while holding opponents to 66.5 ... ASU is out rebounding teams by 11 in its two victories on the season .. The Rams will play in the St. Mary's Classic this upcoming weekend.

Cameron

Cameron traveled on Nov. 16 to North Texas in an exhibition game and fell 78-49. The Aggies kept the game tight for the ten minutes but the Mean Green opened up an offensive attack that lasted through the 12 minute mark in the second half with Cameron trailing as far back as 40 points. Junior Assad Robinson provided a spark off the Aggie bench hitting a pair of 3s late in the game cutting back the Mean Green lead to under 30 points. Tarleton State

The Texans picked up its first win of the season with a 60-46 win over Texas-Permian Basin in Stephenville on Friday... Tarleton then improved to 2-1 on the season with a 72-62 win over East Central on Friday... Tarleton shot 48.3 percent from the field as a team over the two-game span, which included going 37-for-633 (.310) from beyond the three-point line... The Texans averaged 66.0 points per game, while limiting the Falcons and Tigers to 54.0 points per game average... Chuck Guy (G, Jr, Fort Worth) scored a tournament-high 21 points in Saturday's win en route to being named MVP of the Texan Tip-off Classic... Coleman Furst (G, Jr, Denison) averaged 14.5 points on the weekend; he tied a career-high with 15 points on Friday... Brian Word (G, Sr, Baltimore, Md.) scored a career-high 17 points to lead the Texans to a victory on Friday as well... Tarleton will have the entire week off until returning to the court on Saturday, Nov. 24 in a non-conference home contest against Dallas Christian.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce went 2-1 this past week, starting with a 91-87 overtime win over Dallas Baptist ... Trailing by five with 50 seconds to play, the Lions notched the final five points of regulation, then the first seven to win their home opener ... Andrew Davis notched a career-high 20 points and 11 rebounds for his third double-double of the season ... The Lions then split a pair of games at the Tarleton Texan Tip-Off Classic, falling to East Central 71-65 before defeating UT-Permian Basin 84-76 ... Jason Smith and Stefon Carson each against the Tigers with Devondrick Walker and Davis logging 17 points against the Falcons, aided by 14 points and 10 rebounds from Preston Whitley for his first double-double of the season.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas opened the 2012-13 season with a 1-1 week at home...After falling 67-60 to Texas A&M International in the first game of the season, Kingsville rolled past Texas Lutheran on Thursday night 80-55... The loss to International was just the second in 14 meetings to the Dustdevils. The last time Kingsville lost to International – the season opener in 2008-09 – It ended the season in the NCAA tournament at the end of the 2008-09...Coach Pete Peterson had talked about the ability of Rashad Basey to lead as exhibited as the newcomers election as one of three captains. He showed those qualities in the first two games from his spot in the backcourt by leading the team in scoring and assists. He had 13 points and 8 assists in the opener with 21 points and six assists in the win over Texas Lutheran...The Javelinas shared the wealth versus the Bulldogs with 21 assists. Basey led the way with six assists, while Jamahl Brown and Ryan Garcia each had three. Three players – Reid Wallace, Donte McGee and Daymon Warren – had two...The Kingsville swiped 16 steals this past Thursday night against TLU. It was the most steals by the Javelinas since swiping 16 against A&M International on Dec. 17, 2007. The last time a Kingsville team had more than 16 steals was in the 2006-07 season when it recorded 18 on the road at Abilene Christian...The 16 steals were a group effort. Junior post Daymon Warren led the way with four steals. Five others had two steals apiece and eight in all had at least one theft...The Javelinas warmed from the field in the second half against TLU. After shooting 37 percent (31-of-84) through the first 60 minutes of the season, Kingsville hit 52.9 percent (18-of-34) from the floor in the final 20 minutes against the Bulldogs.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs moved to a perfect 4-0 this past weekend as they registered a pair of last second wins at the 29th annual Al Kaly Shriners' Classic in Pueblo, Colorado with wins against host CSU-Pueblo and Oklahoma Christian. Friday night saw the ThunderWolves tie the game on a pair of free throws before a Kennon Washington game winning three as time expired gave WT the 76-73 win. Saturday saw Mason White hit a wide open three from the top of the key to move WT to 4-0 on the season with a 55-52 win over Oklahoma Christian. The Buffs will host the Pak-A-Sak Thanksgiving Classic this weekend at the First United Bank Center in Canyon, Texas as Missouri Southern and CSU-Pueblo come to town for games against the Buffs along with LSC member Eastern New Mexico.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kirsti Degelia, Midwestern State University, led Midwestern State in a pair of wins over Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams in MSU's Comfort Inn and Suites Ashbrook Classic. Degelia averaged 18.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists as the Mustangs beat Colorado Mines 67-60 and Fort Lewis (Colo.) 68-54 over the weekend to lead the LSC at 3-0. Degelia had 22 points with seven boards and seven assists against Colorado Mines, while adding 14 points with seven boards and five assists against Fort Lewis. She was 17-of-19 from the free throw line as well in being named to the all-classic team.

Toree Mason, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers in scoring with 14.7 points per game. She shot 43.2 percent from the floor and 70.0 percent from the free-throw line. Mason led the team in points in two of the three games last week. After averaging 14.0 points in the two games in the Marriott Champions Circle Pioneer Premiere, she was named to the all-tournament team. Mason also recorded 4.7 rebounds per game on the defense.

Madara Gulbe, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the team in scoring with 13 points in her first game with the Javelinas. She hit 5-of-9 field goal attempts. Gulbe added five rebounds and two steals in her debut.

Haylee Oliver, Angelo State University, led the team in scoring over the weekend with 16 points in both games. She is averaging 7.3 rebounds per game and has 11 assists on the season. The San Saba native is averaging 12.0 points per game this season.

Ashlee Pierson, Eastern New Mexico University, shot 50 percent from the floor, picked up ten points and collected two rebounds, in games against 13th-ranked Grand Canyon University and Southern Nazarene. Defensively, she contributed two steals.

Lauren Holt, Angelo State University, is averaging a double-double on the season with 12.3 points per game and 12.7 rebound per game. She had grabbed double-digit rebounds in all three games this season. She scored a career high 23 points in the season opener against St. Edward's. The junior has blocked seven shots and made five steals.

Tabbatha Thurmond, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers on defense with 8.7 rebounds per game. She recorded 26 rebounds in three games including 10 offensive boards and 16 defensive boards. Thurmond also averaged 10.0 points while shooting a team-best 55.0 percent. She recorded a double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds in the win at Ouachita Baptist in the season opener. Thurmond then led TWU with 14 points and eight rebounds against Texas A&M-International. She also added a team-best seven rebounds against Central Oklahoma.

Ashlyn Green, University of the Incarnate Word, had one of the best defensive games in school history in a 70-69 loss to Our Lady of the Lake. Her eight second half steals sparked a comeback from 19 points down and gave the team a chance to win in the last few seconds. She finished the game with 13 points, nine steals and six assists. She picked up another steal in a 77-52 loss at UT-Permian Basin.

Hannah Altheide, played well balanced games for the Zias. Defensively, she collected three steals and three rebounds, while also pouring in 19 points for the squad.

In front of over 700 fans on Thursday, Nov. 15 against East Central, Cameron fell 46-78 hitting 12-56 from the field and 4-18 three point land.
