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LSC BASKETBALL

Lone Star Conference action starts this week with teams playing a double round robin league schedule, in which each team plays a home and away contest against each of the other teams to determine the LSC champion. The LSC champion will be the regular season winner determined by conference games, while the postseason tournament winner is designated as LSC Tournament Champion and earns the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship. The top eight teams in the final conference standings qualify for the postseason tournament set for March 6-9 in Allen, Texas.

Only three teams remain undefeated after non-conference play including West Texas A&M on the men's side, and Midwestern State and Texas A&M-Commerce on the women's side.

The LSC men have a 34-16 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 10-10 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 3-1 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 21-22 overall. The women's squads are currently 9-6 combined versus Heartland teams, and 5-1 against the RMAC, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Donald Sims, West Texas A&M University, SR, Forward, Chester, SC, Chester

Sims continued to lead the #20 Buffaloes offensively this past weekend as they went 2-0 with wins over Missouri Southern and CSU-Pueblo at the Pak-A-Sak Thanksgiving Classic in Canyon to move to a perfect 6-0 on the season. Sims averaged 18.0 points and 10.5 rebounds per contest while shooting an incredible .800 from the floor (16-20). The senior from Chester, South Carolina registered his first double-double of the season against Missouri Southern on Friday night with 19 points and 12 rebounds in the 57-55 win.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Dennis Hardwell, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Forward, Los Angeles, Calif., Carson HS/LA Harbor

Hardwell's defensive presence enabled the Greyhounds to average 15.8 points off turnovers over four games, which were played in a seven-day span. He turned in two multiple-block performances, with a two-block, four-steal performance in a win over regional powerhouse, Missouri Southern State.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Peyton Adamson, Tarleton State University, JR, Guard, Rockwall, Texas, Rockwall HS

Adamson had a great week as an offensive force for the No. 21 Tarleton TexAnns. The junior guard from Rockwall averaged over 20 points per game for Tarleton against UTPB and Northeastern State. She drained 17 points, including eight of Tarleton's nine points in the overtime period against the Falcons, before returning home where she turned in a 24-point effort against MIAA foe, NSU. She hit over half of her attempts from beyond the arc (9-17) and was a near-perfect 10-11 from the charity stripe. Adamson also had three rebounds and two assists.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, SO, Forward, Dallas, Texas, Life School

Averaged a double-double for the week as the Lady Buffs went 2-1. Tallied a career-high 16 rebounds and her second career-double-double with 11 points and 16 rebounds against Southwestern Oklahoma State. She and the rest of the Lady Buffs held McMurry to just 23 points, including an astonishing three points in the second half of an 82-23 win as the Lady Buff "D" forced 33 turnovers and held the War Hawks to 8 of 45 from the field for 17.8 percent for the game and without a field goal for the final 15:57 of the game. White had a game-high five rebounds on the defensive end and two offensive boards as WT tallied a season-high 47 rebounds. Against SWOSU, White had a season-high six offensive rebounds to go along with 10 on the defensive end. She pulled down 10 offensive rebounds for the week and 20 on the defensive end.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Elliott Lloyd, Abilene Christian University, led all players with 23 points in ACU's 75-73 win over Dallas Baptist last Tuesday at Moody Coliseum. Lloyd scored 12 of his points in the second half and was clutch from the free-throw line, going 7 of 7 as the Patriots threatened to take the lead down the stretch. His final two free throws with :31 seconds left pushed ACU's lead to three points. Lloyd, who has scored 10 or more points in three of four starts, also led all players with four steals.

Davene Carter, Tarleton State University, posted a "perfect" game for the Texans this past Saturday while guiding Tarleton to a 21-point victory. The sophomore forward scored a game-high 21 points going a perfect 10-for-10 from the field and 1-for-1 from the charity stripe. Carter has now made 16-consecutive field goals after going 6-for-6 in his previous contest. The Duncanville native made his presence known on the boards Saturday night as well, pulling down a game-high eight rebounds in the contest.

Antonio Dye, Angelo State University, averaged 18.0 points per game in the Rams two games at the St. Mary's Classic. The senior led the team in scoring against St. Mary's while he was the second-leading scorer versus Minnesota Duluth. He shot 36 percent from 3-point land and hit 64 percent of his free throws.

Rafael Love, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a stellar week for the Greyhounds, with three double doubles in four games. He connected on an impressive .629 from the floor, including a nine-for-12 performance

for 27 points and 11 boards against Missouri Southern. In that game, he also connected on six-of-eight three-point attempts. Love reached double figures in points in all four contests. He did not have more than a single turnover in any of the four contests.

Craig Foster, Cameron University, put together a double-double and a career high 25 points in three games for Cameron. On Nov. 20 against Oklahoma Panhandle Foster had 12 points and 10 assists en route to a 94-75 win in front of over 1,110 fans at the Aggie Gym in Lawton and later on Nov. 24 vs. Bacone College he had a career high 25 points helping get the 75-60 win. In three games, Foster averaged 14.7 points, eight assists, and had eight total steals.

Preston Whitley, Texas A&M University - Commerce, played a key role in helping the Lions to a pair of victories over Ouachita Baptist and Southern Arkansas this past week, averaging 14.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in the pair of victories ... Against the Tigers, Whitley had 10 points and eight rebounds with three assists ... Against the Muleriders, Whitley finished with a season-high 19 points with nine rebounds, hitting 7-of-9 from the floor and 5-of-6 from the line in helping the Lions rally to defeat Southern Arkansas ... For the season, Whitley leads the Lions averaging 12.4 points per game and is second on the team in both rebounds per game (7.4) and assists per game (3.0).

Rashad Basey, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, continues to be the top scorer for the Javelinas. He has scored in double figures in four of five games and led the team in all but one. Last week he averaged 13.0 points a game and hit 51.9% of his shots. He led the team with his eight rebounds and was tied for second with 4.7 boards a game.

Brian Word, Tarleton State University, had three steals and six rebounds in Tarleton's 91-70 win over Dallas Christian on Saturday. The senior guard has at least one steal in all four games for the Texans in leads the team with nine takeaways. Word scored 10 points, had an assist and one block in the victory as well.

Marshall Bonds III, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the team in steals with five and blocks with four. Had a season-high 11 points to go with a season-best with 7 boards against St. Edward. He added a season-high three swipes against the Hilltoppers and matched his best with two blocks.

MEN'S NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats (3-1) defeated Dallas Baptist, 75-73, last Tuesday night in their only game of the week. The victory was ACU's third straight following its season-opening loss vs. the Patriots on Nov. 10. ACU shot over 51 percent in the first half, but just 36 percent in the second as the Wildcats finished 9 of 25 from the field. ACU also struggled at the free-throw line in missing 7 of 23 attempts for a 69.6 success rate. By comparison, the Patriots shot 53.8 percent from the field in the second half as they nearly erased a 22-point ACU lead. ACU's Elliott Lloyd (23) and Eric Lawton (20) both scored over 20 points, but only three of Lawton's points came during the second half. Steven Werner chipped in 10 points, including four from the foul line, but was held to just three rebounds after posting consecutive double-doubles the previous weekend. The Wildcats play three Lone Star Conference games this week. They first visit West Texas A&M Wednesday, and then will play host to Eastern New Mexico Saturday at 4 p.m. and Texas A&M-Commerce next Tuesday, Dec. 4 at 7:30 p.m.

Angelo State

The Rams are 2-2 on the season ... Three players are averaging double-digit points on the season with Chris Talkington (18.3), Antonio Dye (11.5) and Jovan Austin (11.0) ... ASU is second in the LSC in scoring offense (77.5) and leads the league in free throw percentage, turnover margin and offensive rebounds ... Talkington is second in the LSC in scoring at 18.3 points per game while Zach Jones and Ryan Marsh both lead the league in free throw percentage and blocked shots, respectively. The Rams will start LSC play with a game at Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday.

Cameron

Cameron went 2-1 over the last week getting wins over Oklahoma Panhandle and Bacone College. In their win against OPSU the Aggies put up 51 points in the first 20 minutes getting 11 points off of OPSU turnovers and 17 points off second chance opportunities. CU shot 51% in the first half with a 44% three point percentage. The second half consisted of a lot of scoring as both Aggie teams putting up over 40 points. Cameron bettered their first half percentage by shooting 54% from the field in the second. On Nov. 24, the Aggies led all the way through against Bacone College and as a team Cameron shot 50.9% from the field (27-53) and 77.8% (14-18) from the free point line. The Aggie also dominated the rebounding battle with 39 compared to 25 from the Warriors. Additionally, CU worked with their inside game getting 36 point in the paint. Cameron will make a return trip to Kingsville to open the Lone Star Conference season against Texas A&M Kingsville.

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds split four games over a seven-day stretch, with wins over Colorado State-Pueblo and Missouri Southern State. The Hounds' win over Missouri Southern marked the second ENMU win over the Thunderwolves and the first in the regular season (ENMU defeated the Lions in the 1993 playoffs) and the first win over a MIAA opponent since the 2004 season. Rafael Love posted three double doubles over the four contests. This week, the Hounds will open Lone Star Conference play against Angelo State and Abilene Christian.

Incarinate Word

The Cardinals lost their only game of the week on Saturday at home to St. Edward's, 75-62. Dionelle Rucker scored 20 points in the game to lead the team. It was the fourth time this year he has reached 20 points in a game. He also grabbed 10 rebounds for his first double-double of the year. Lyn'Dale Brown had a strong game as well with 13 points and six steals. The Cardinals shot just 34.4 percent from the field for the game and only 23.5 percent in the first half.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State has lost consecutive games for the first time since suffering the feat twice during the 2010-11 season. The Mustangs lost 68-56 at #23 West Texas A&M (2/19/11) before falling to #25 Tarleton State 49-47 (2/21/11). MSU dropped two straight games earlier that season at #18 Central Oklahoma (1/8/11) and at Angelo State (1/12/11) in overtime. Midwestern did advance to the Elite Eight for the second straight year at the end of the campaign... Each of MSU's last five losses dating back to last season have been by 4 points or less... Midwestern

State opens Lone Star Conference play with games at Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville this week. MSU is 8-8 all time in LSC openers with 11 of the 16 games coming on the road. The Mustangs are 5-6 in those 11 road contests... Midwestern will open Lone Star Conference play away from Wichita Falls for the fourth straight season. The Mustangs took losses at Angelo State in 2009-10 and 2010-11 before winning at Texas A&M-Commerce last season... Midwestern State boasts four players amongst the Top 23 scoring leaders of the LSC including sophomore guard Keith Spellman (15.8 ppg/6th), senior guard Kevin Grayer (12.8 ppg/12th), senior forward Corbin Thomas (12.4 ppg/14th) and junior guard Monzaigo Williams (10.6 ppg/23rd)... Thomas rates fourth in the league with a .639 field goal percentage... Williams ranks second with 6.8 assists per contest... Spellman has knocked down 52 percent of his shots from beyond the arc (4th) while splashing 2.6 3-pointers a game (3rd)... Grayer has tallied double figures in each of his five games this season while knocking down at least one triple in each game... Williams recorded MSU's first double-double of the season with 13 points and 10 assists Saturday night at Ouachita Baptist... Spellman has fired in multiple 3-pointers in each of his five games and leads the team in scoring at 15.8 points per game... Sophomore guard Derrell Gibbs turned in a stellar performance posting season highs with nine points, five assists, four steals and two blocked shots Saturday night at Ouachita Baptist... Junior forward Eddie D'Haiti had a season-high 10 points while pulling in six rebounds Saturday at Ouachita Baptist...

Tarleton State

The Texans have now won three-straight after opening the season with a loss... Tarleton pushed its series lead to 8-0 over Dallas Christian with Saturday's 91-70 win... Davene Carter (F, So, Duncanville) scored a game-high 21 points and pulled down a game-high eight rebounds... The 21 points were a career-high for Carter, who went a perfect 10-for-10 from the field and 1-for-1 from the free throw line... Coleman Furst (G, Jr, Denison) chipped in 13 points for the Texans on Saturday and leads the team with 14.3 points a game... Carter leads the way with 6.0 rebounds per game, while Damion Clemons (F, So, Dallas) closes in with 5.5 boards per outing... Chuck Guy (G, Jr, Fort Worth) leads the squad with 22 assists on the season... Brian Word (G, Sr, Baltimore, Md.) leads the way with nine steals defensively... Tarleton is leading opponents in both rebounding (+4.5) and turnover margin (+4.8)... Tarleton will host Arlington Baptist this Saturday, Dec. 1, in its final tune-up before opening up LSC action in San Angelo next week... Saturday's contest tips-off at 7 p.m. in Stephenville.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce improved to 5-2 on the year with victories over Ouachita Baptist and Southern Arkansas during the past week, giving both opponents their first losses of the season ... The Lions defeated the Tigers 69-56 as four different players scored in double figures, led by 14 points by Tyrie Wooten .. Andrew Davis notched his fourth double-double of the year, posting 12 points and adding 10 rebounds ... Against the Muleriders, A&M-Commerce built a 17-point first half lead, then trailed by six in the waning minutes before closing out the game on a 10-0 run to defeat Southern Arkansas 74-67 ... Devondrick Walker finished with a season-high 20 points while Preston Whitley added 19 points and nine rebounds ... The Lions have now won their last 13 games against an opponent from the state of Arkansas, dating back to 2008-09 ... Head coach Sam Walker upped his career record to 197-150, leaving him three wins shy of 200 for his career and five away from surpassing

Jim Gudger as the all-time winningest coach in A&M-Commerce program history.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelina men went 2-1 on the week. They won a crucial region contest over St. Edward's before splitting games with Bacone and McMurry in the Holiday Inn Emerald Beach Thanksgiving Classic...The Javelinas were down right defensive against St. Edward's last Tuesday. Kingsville limited the Hilltoppers to just 15 points in the first half as SEU shot just 12.5% from the floor. For the game, the Javelina defense allowed the visitors to shoot just over 25 percent from the floor...The Javelinas made it three straight wins on the first day of their tournament. Kingsville downed Bacone by 30 points, 85-55, hitting a season-best 51.4% of its shots from the floor...The Javelinas suffered their second loss of the season in game with McMurry. Kingsville hit just 8-of-21 from the foul line for 32.7 percent from the foul line. In their first loss, Kingsville was 11-of-25 from the stripe... Newcomer Rashad Basey continues to lead the Javelinas in scoring with a team-best 13 points a game last week and 14.6 on the season. He has scored in double digits in each game except the last finishing with nine versus McMurry. Basey has led the team in scoring in every game except the Bacone contest...Reid Wallace tied his career high with 22 points in the win over Bacone to become the first Javelina to lead the team in scoring other than Basey...Marshall Bonds III is having a block party as a senior. He has eight blocks in five games. He posted two blocks apiece in each of the season's first three games...With conference games this week against Cameron and Midwestern at home the Javelinas will have opened the season with seven straight home games. They hit the road for the first time on Dec. 4 when they head to St. Edward's.

West Texas A&M

The #20 Buffaloes moved to 6-0 this past weekend as they took a pair of games at the Pak-A-Sak WT Thanksgiving Classic in Canyon at the First United Bank Center. The Buffs topped Missouri Southern on Friday night on a Mason White game winning layup as time expired before rolling Colorado State-Pueblo by 14 points in the tournament finale on Saturday. Donald Sims averaged a double-double for the weekend with 18.0 points and 10.5 rebounds to lead the Buffs offensively. The other four WT starters all averaged over nine points per game and the Buffalo defense continued to lead the league in defense, allowing just 56.3 points per game. WT will start off the Lone Star Conference schedule this Wednesday as they host the rival Wildcats of Abilene Christian at the FUBC for the last time in the rivalry.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kirsti Degelia, Midwestern State University, led the Midwestern State to its fourth straight win with a 78-59 at Oklahoma Panhandle State. In taking the Mustangs to 4-0 for the first time in 12 seasons, the 5-8 junior guard collected 17 points with five assists and a steal. She shot 67 percent from the field (6-9), hit 1-of-2 from the 3-point arc, and sank 2-of-3 from the free throw line. The third leading scorer in the Lone Star Conference, Degelia leads MSU with 16.5 points a contest and leads the LSC in assists with 4.3 a game.

Devin Griffin, West Texas A&M University, Led the team averaging 15.7 points for the week and a 2-1 record. She tallied the first 20-point game of the season for the Lady Buffs in a 78-54 win over previously undefeated University of Colorado-Colorado Springs. In that game she went a perfect 10 for 10 from the charity stripe with a season-high seven assists and two steals.

Against McMurry she went 6 of 9 from the field and 5 of 5 from the line with eight rebounds. In the finale for the week against Southwestern Oklahoma, she tallied her first double-double of the season with 10 points and a season-high 11 rebounds and one of two double-doubles in the game for the Lady Buffs. Griffin started all three games and averaged 29 minutes per game to lead the team and was a team-high 19 of 21 from the charity stripe.

Rose Whitehead, University of the Incarnate Word, came off the bench to spark the Cardinals to a 65-54 win at St. Mary's. With the team trailing by four points with 8:00 remaining, she entered the game and scored 10 points down the stretch to lead the team to a victory. She finished with 14 points in 20 minutes on 4-of-7 shooting from the field and a 6-for-8 performance at the foul line.

Cassi Stegall, Angelo State University, scored a career high 23 points in a close loss to McMurry on Saturday at the Lady Buff Thanksgiving Classic. Stegall went 8-13 from the field and hit 6-8 field goals. She led all scores in the game.

Breanna Harris, Texas A&M University - Commerce, once again paced the Lions in the 73-69 victory over Southeastern Oklahoma, notching her second double-double in as many games, finishing with 13 points and 13 rebounds ... Harris pulled down five offensive rebounds while adding a pair of steals in leading the Lions to their first 2-0 start since 2008-09.

Jaylyn Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a season-best 13 points against Wayland Baptist on Saturday, in addition to grabbing three steals.

Kaitlyn Lowen, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, recorded the first double-double of her career as the Javelinas downed OLLU. She was 6-of-10 from the field to finish with 12 points and had six offensive and six defensive rebounds apiece to finish with 12 boards. She had a career-high five steals and a block in the win. Against New Mexico Highlands she had 11 points and two steals in the win. She was 9-of-15 from the floor for the week.

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, was a dominant defensive force for Tarleton last week, averaging 13 rebounds per contest over two games. The junior center was held scoreless in the first half against Northeastern State but did grab nine first-half rebounds and finished the game with 15. In Tuesday's contest, Wright recorded her second double-double of the season with 11 rebounds to go along with 17 points. She also added two blocks and five steals as well as going a perfect 9-9 from the free throw line.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, averaged a double-double in the two games at Colorado Christian Thanksgiving Tournament last week with 11.5 points and 11.5 rebounds. She led both games in rebounds including a career-high 13 against the host Colorado Christina. Pateraki recorded her first career double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds against CCU on Friday and then added seven points and 10 rebounds against Northwest Missouri State on Saturday. On the season she is averaging 7.6 points and a team-best 7.6 rebounds.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, once again led the defensive attack for Midwestern State in its 78-59 win at Oklahoma Panhandle State. Playing only 18 minutes, Carter picked up four steals with 11 points and seven rebounds for the Mustangs to help MSU go to 4-0 for the first time in 12 years. Carter was 3-of-5 from the floor and 5-of-5 from the foul line. Carter led the defensive attack, holding OPSU to just 31 percent shooting from the floor – only 22 percent in the first half. Carter leads the Lone Star Conference in steals with 4.3 per game and is second in rebounding with 12.8 boards a contest.

Kaitlyn Lowen, Texas A&M University - Kingsville,

recorded the first double-double of her career as the Javelinas downed OLLU. She was 6-of-10 from the field to finish with 12 points and had six offensive and six defensive rebounds apiece to finish with 12 boards. She had a career-high five steals and a block in the win.
