#### LSC FOOTBALL

The 2012 Lone Star Conference football season wraps up this week with four league contests and the final GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge game. Midwestern State clinched a share of the LSC title with a four-point win over West Texas A&M last week. The Buffs would earn a share of the championship with a win over Texas

The Angelo State at Tarleton State contest on Saturday will be web streamed live on FoxSportsSouthwest. com. The Rams and Texans sport identical 4-3 LSC marks, which has them tied with Texas A&M-Kingsville for third place.

The final GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge matchup is this week with MSU hosting West Georgia. After nine of the 10 games, the LSC leads the series 5-4 and has outscored the GSC 280-267 for an average score of 31-30. The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (VSU 43-10): Abilene Christian at Delta State (ACU 34-28); Midwestern State at West Alabama (MSU 42-27); Delta State at Tarleton State (DSU 38-35); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (UNA 21-16); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (WT 52-28); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (VSU 38-31); Tarleton State at North Alabama (TSU 38-28); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (ACU 22-16 (OT)); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

LSC football teams are 43-43 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

#### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### **OFFENSIVE**

#### Brandon Kelsey, Midwestern State University, SR, QB, Arlington, Texas, Arlington HS

Kelsey led the 10th ranked Mustangs to a share of their second consecutive Lone Star Conference Championship with a 52-48 victory over No. 12 West Texas A&M, the first time since 2004 that MSU has won in Canyon. The signal caller for the Mustangs' Pony Express, Kelsey tallied 348 yards of total offense with his fourth career 200-100 game, going 14-of-22 passing for a career-high 248 yards and rushing 14 times for 100 yards. He rushed for three touchdowns and passed for a fourth in leading the Mustangs to 565 yards of total offense, the secondhighest of the season for MSU and the team's fifth 500-yard offensive performance of the year. His 348 yards was the second-best total offense game of his career as the Mustangs also claimed their third LSC title in the last four seasons.

#### **DEFENSIVE**

#### Matt Ellerbrock, Midwestern State University, SR, LB, Garland, Texas, North Garland HS

Ellerbrock helped lead the Mustangs defense as No. 10 Midwestern State downed No. 12 West Texas A&M 52-48 in Canyon to repeat as Lone Star Conference Champions. Ellerbrock was second on the MSU tackle chart with eight stops, but led the team with 2.5 tackles for losses of nine yards, including a sack of quarterback Dustin Vaughan for eight yards lost, recorded a quarterback hurry, recovered a fumble and led the team with three pass breakups. Ellerbrock's sack of Vaughan was on the Buffs final drive of the game that helped MSU preserve the win for MSU's third LSC Championship during Ellerbrock's four seasons.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

#### Marqui Christian, Midwestern State University, FR, Coverage, Spring, Texas, Spring HS

Christian, a safety and an outside rusher on the 10th ranked Mustangs punt return team, scooped a muffed punt snap and returned it 18 yards for the game winning touchdown with 55 seconds to play as Midwestern State defeated No. 12 West Texas A&M 52-48 to win a share of their second consecutive Lone Star Conference Championship. After both WT punter Kevin Van Voris and teammate Thomas Carper bobbled the ball after the bad snap, Christian scooped up the ball and led a parade of Mustangs into the end zone for MSU's second touchdown in the final 2:09 to overcome a 10-point deficit for the win.

#### OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Wesley Wood, Eastern New Mexico University, played error-free football in leading the Greyhounds to a win over Texas A&M-Commerce, and helped the squad to +2 turnover differential in a tight contest. On the game-

winning drive, he accounted for 34 yards of offense and hit two of three pass attempts. Wood directed the 97-yard drive, which was the Hounds longest possession since September 2007.

Jake Fenske, Tarleton State University, managed to have one of the greatest games in school history in just his second start ever at the collegiate level. The redshirt senior completed 31 of his 41 pass attempts for 311 yards and a pair of touchdowns as Tarleton defeated North Alabama 38-28 on the road. Fenske was just two completions shy of tying a school record for most completions in a single game. However, the Round Rock native did break a school record with his 99-yard touchdown pass to Cordell Valentine at the 6:37 mark of the second quarter. The 99-yard bomb broke the previous mark of 95 yards at Tarleton, which was set back in 1996. Fenske became just the fifth player in LSC history to achieve the 99-yard play as well, tying the LSC mark in the process

Lance Ratliff, West Texas A&M University, returned to action this week for the first time since Sept. 29 in stunning fashion with a career-high 180 yards receiving on a career-high 11 catches. He had one touchdown and a long reception of 39 yards. His 180 yards receiving were the most in a game since Tyson Williams had 217 vs. Southeastern Oklahoma on Sept. 18, 2010. Ratliff's 11 receptions were the most since Tyson Williams had 14 at Grand Valley State Sept. 2, 2010. Ratliff ranks second on the team in touchdowns with seven despite missing four games. He has a 94.5 yard per game average and 567 yards for the season which ranks him second on the team.

Robert Armstrong, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had his best receiving game of the season Thursday at Valdosta State. He finished with four catches for a season-best 137 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Along with Nate Poppell, he just missed a school record as the two combined on a 94-yards pass on the first play from scrimmage. The TD pass was one yard shy of the school record and gives the junior 8 TD receptions this season. It was his second game of the season with a pair of touchdowns.

Darrell Cantu-Harkless, Abilene Christian University, played one of the best games of his ACU career on Saturday as the Wildcats knocked off No. 21 West Alabama, 22-16, in overtime in the team's final home game of the season. Cantu-Harkless — who played both running back and receiver — accounted for 288 all-purpose yards and scored the game-winning touchdown in overtime as ACU clinched its seventh straight winning season. In overtime, Cantu-Harkless took a swing pass on third-and-10 from the 14-yard line, ducked inside two defenders and scampered into the end zone with the game-winning touchdown. He had a 71-yard punt return in the first quarter that set up ACU's first touchdown, and his 46-yard kickoff return near the end of the regulation gave ACU a shot at a 63-yard field goal that was missed at the buzzer. Cantu-Harkless also added a career-high 113 receiving yards on nine catches and another 58 rushing yards on 13 carries.

Danny Mason, Texas A&M University - Commerce, had a huge day for A&M-Commerce despite the loss to Eastern New Mexico, finishing with a career-best 17 tackles with 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack ... Mason anchored a defensive unit that held Eastern New Mexico to just seven points and 283 yards of total offense, well below the Greyhounds average of 24.2 points and 338.5 yards per game ... Mason notched his 100th tackle of the season and leads the LSC averaging 11.1 tackles per game.

Jeremy Aguilar, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, LB, Los Angeles, Calif, Roosevelt, Aguilar led the Javelinas with 12 tackles in the game and now has 88 on the season. He picked one tackle for a loss for four yards and now has 12 tackles for loss on the season.

Austin Benson, Angelo State University, made his final game at San Angelo Stadium a memorable one as he recorded a career-high 3.5 sacks. Benson has 6.5 sacks on the season and 12 for his career. The 3.5 sacks is the most by a Ram player since Calvin Fance collected five against Southeastern Oklahoma State in 2009.

Jayson Serda, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a strong performance for the Greyhounds in their four-point win over Texas A&M-Commerce, with seven tackles and interception and four passes batted down. His interception came at the ENMU one-yard line, with the Lions holding a 3-0 lead. In the fourth quarter, he batted down a fourth-down pass in the end zone, to allow Eastern to run out the clock. ON A&M-Commerce's previous possession, he deflected a third-down pass attempt to force a punt.

Rufus Johnson, Tarleton State University, recorded six tackles (three solo) and had one tackle-for-loss in Tarleton's 38-28 road win over North Alabama on Saturday. The Dallas native had one sack and a forced fumble for a total loss of eight yards on the day as well. Johnson has now been in on at least one sack in the last five games and has had at least one sack in six of the seven games he has played in.

Juan Asencio, University of the Incarnate Word, set a school record with 3.0 sacks in a loss last weekend at Angelo State. He recorded a total of four tackles. The three sacks went for a total of -24 yards and gives him a team high 4.0 sacks on the season. He also returned two kickoffs for 62 yards.

Taylor McCuller, West Texas A&M University, led the team with 12 total tackles against Midwestern State. Had a half a tackle for loss, along with one forced fumble and one fumble return. He leads the team with 110 total tackles this season with eight tackles for loss (21 yards) and has 3.5 sacks for 11 yards. The forced fumble and fumble recovery against Midwestern State were the first of the season and the second of his career of each. He ranks 14th nationally in tackles per game at 11.0 which is second-most in the conference. He leads the conference in total tackles with 110 and is third in solo tackles with 46.

Blake Barnes, Tarleton State University, was a perfect 3-for-3 in field goals this Saturday when Tarleton picked up a 38-28 road win against North Alabama. The Stephenville native made a game-long 35-yard FG in the third quarter and then iced the game at the 16 second mark of the third quarter with his 29-yarder, giving Tarleton the win over the NCAA Division II powerhouse.

Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, went 2 for 2 in field goals along with a perfect 5 for 5 in extra points against Midwestern State for a total of 12 points. He is 13 of 15 in field goals this season and a perfect 50 of 50 in extra points. Castillo ranks 33rd nationally in scoring per game at 8.90 per game and fourth in the league, but leads the league in scoring among kickers. He is tied for 12th nationally in field goals per game at 1.3 and is third in the league. He has 248 career points on 31 of 41 field goals and 155 of 157 extra points ranking him fifth in scoring in school history.

Matt Stoll, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, kicked a 27-yard field goal in his only FG attempt on the day and was a perfect 4-of-4 on PATs. With the seven points, Stoll, who entered the week leading the NCAA Division in field goals per game surpassed 70 points on the season and has 71.

Dylan Baca, Eastern New Mexico University, posted a deceiving 39.1 yard average on eight punts, in the Greyhounds 7-3 win over Texas A&M-Commerce. That total included two second-half punts, which were downed at the Lion one-yard line with a career-best 62-yard kick. For the game, he had three punts downed inside the 20-yard line, bringing his season total to 11. Baca's final punt of the game was nearly downed inside the A&M-Commerce one-yard line, before rolling into the endzone for a touchback.

Emmanuel Nunez, University of the Incarnate Word, had an outstanding day punting against Angelo State averaging 45.3 yards per kick on seven attempts. He had three kicks end up inside the 20-yard line and also



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debuted in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (Sat, Sept. 15); Abilene Christian at Delta State (Thu, Sept. 27); Midwestern State at West Alabama (Thu, Oct. 4); Delta State at Tarleton State (Thu, Oct. 4); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sat, Oct. 6); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (Sat, Oct. 27); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (Thu, Nov. 1); Tarleton State at North Alabama (Sat, Nov. 3); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (Sat, Nov. 3); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

# LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's) Abilene Christian

Saturday's game at Incarnate Word will be the Wildcats' final football game as members of the Lone Star Conference after a 40-year run. ... The Wildcats have an all-time NCAA Division II record of 159-155-3 going into the contest, including a 141-115-2 mark in LSC contests. ... Last Saturday's ACU win over West Alabama marked the ninth time in his career that ACU senior quarterback Mitchell Gale has rallied the Wildcats to a win after either trailing in the second half or being tied at the end of regulation. ... Has had four such games in 2012 (vs. Tarleton State on Sept. 15, at Delta State on Sept. 27, at Texas A&M-Commerce on Oct. 27, and on Saturday against the Tigers). ... In 41 games as the Wildcats' starting quarterback, Gale is 29-12, leaving him just one win short of tying former Wildcat great Billy Malone for the most wins as a starting quarterback in ACU history. ... Malone was 30-12 as the starter from 2005-08, which means an ACU win over Incarnate Word on Saturday with Gale starting would give the two ACU greats the same career records (30-12). ... That would mean that ACU's two primary starting quarterbacks would have led the Wildcats to a 60-24 on-field record over the last eight seasons (with a win the Wildcats' on-field record would be 65-24 since 2005 as Gale didn't start any of the first five games of the 2009 season when ACU went 5-0). ... Saturday's win over West Alabama marked the ninth opponent in Gale's career that he has played against only once. ACU is 6-3 in those games with wins over Delta State, McMurry, Northeastern State, Southwestern Oklahoma State, Western Oregon and West Alabama, and losses against North Alabama, Northwest Missouri State and Central Missouri. ... In Gale's career as the starter, the Wildcats are 24-8 against LSC opponents with four of those losses coming in 2012. ... Gale will enter Saturday night's contest at Incarnate Word needing 299 yards to become just the second quarterback in LSC and ACU history (behind Malone) to reach 12,000 career passing yards. ... He enters the game with 11,701 career yards, and needs 313 to pass Malone (12,012 yards from 2005-08) to get to 12,013 yards and become the alltime leading passer in both LSC and ACU history. ... Gale already holds LSC and ACU records for career completions (906) and attempts (1,477), and his 95 career touchdowns are second on both lists to the 114 Malone threw during his ACU career. ... If Gale reaches the 12,000yard plateau against Incarnate Word, that would make Abilene Christian only the fifth school in NCAA history to feature two 12,000-yard passers in their record books, ioining Hawai'i. Texas Tech. Houston and Weber State in that select club. ... If Gale tops 12,000 yards, he and Malone will have topped that number as back-to-back starting quarterbacks, something only Houston (Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum from 2003 to 2011) and Hawai'i (Timmy Chang and Colt Brennan from 2000-2007) have done in NCAA history. ... Gale also needs 294 yards of total offense against Incarnate Word to break Malone's career LSC and ACU records of 12,065 total yards from scrimmage. ... Darrell Cantu-Harkless played one of the best games of his ACU career on Saturday as the Wildcats knocked off No. 21 West Alabama, 22-16, in overtime in the team's final home game of the season. Woerner put in another outstanding effort with seven tackles (two solo), one-half tackle for loss and the blocked extra point.

#### **Angelo State**

The Rams have only allowed 160.07 passing yards per game which sits at No. 7 nationally. Abilene Christian is the only team to pass for over 300 yards and six opponents have been held under 200 yards passing ... The Rams enter this week at the No. 1 overall defense in the Lone Star Conference. The defense is giving up 313.1 yards per game this season. It is the No. 21 ranked defense in NCAA Division II as well ... Redshirt freshman Kyle Washington threw his first career touchdown pass in the first quarter to C.J. Akins. Washington would throw three touchdowns on the day and complete 12 of 16 passes for 189 yards for career highs as well ... Sophomore defensive back Jarred Ross scored his first career touchdown on a fumble return during an Incarnate Word kick return. The Cardinals tried to lateral the ball across the field much like the Tennessee Titans did in the Music City Miracle game in 2000. The ball didn't make it across the field and Ross picked up and scored from 13 yards out ... Senior Austin Benson made his final game at San Angelo Stadium a memorable one as Senior Austin Benson made his final game at San Angelo Stadium a memorable one as he recorded a career-high 3.5 sacks. Benson has 6.5 sacks on the season and 12 for his career. The 3.5 sacks is the most by a Ram player since Calvin Fance collected five against Southeastern Oklahoma State in 2009.

#### **Eastern New Mexico**

With Texas A&M-Commerce holding a 3-0 lead and looking for more, Eastern New Mexico University's Jayson Serda recorded an interception at the ENMU three-yard line. Eastern drove 97 yards, with Wesley Wood hitting Lane Wood for a three-yard touchdown, to lift the Hounds to a 7-3 victory. Dylan Baca had a pair of punts downed at the Lion one-yard line during the second half. The Hounds have not limited the opposition to less than a touchdown in any game, since the 2007 finale, which was a 52-0 win over Oklahoma Panhandle State. The Greyhounds 97-yard scoring drive was their longest drive, since JT Thompson sprinted 99 yards on the first play of a fourth-quarter possession against East Central on September 15, 2007. That drive also came after an ENMU interception at the one-yard line. The Eastern New Mexico University football team will close the season at Texas A&M-Kingsville.

#### Incarnate Word

One More Chance The Cardinals have lost four straight games for a second time this year and are down to one final game for the season. This is the final game for a large group of seniors that came to UIW as part of the "Forever First" class. They went 5-5 in 2009, 3-8 in 2010 and 2,-9 last year. The Cardinals closed out the 2011 on the road at Abilene Christian and lost 61-16 to a team that was ranked #12 in the nation. This year, the Wildcats are not ranked, but are still a formidable opponent with a 6-4 record, including a win over nationally ranked West Alabama last week. Saturday's game will be the sixth home game of the season. This is the first time the Cardinals have played six games at Benson Stadium in one season. In the three previous years, the Cardinals played five home games per season. A Record-Setting Day Despite losing 38-21 at Angelo State last week, the Cardinals set a number of school records in the game. Junior punter Emmanuel Nunez broke the school record for longest punt twice in the game with boots of 64 and 65 yards breaking the previous school record of 60 yards by Aaron Willis. Nunez also tied the school record with three punts downed inside the 20-vard line. Junior linebacker Juan Asencio set a new school record with 3.0 sacks in the game edging out Alan Ford's previous record

of 2.5 sacks at Langston on September 26, 2009. The final record set came on the team's final offensive play of the game. Running back Marcus Wright went around the left end and sprinted 70 yards for a touchdown. It broke the previous record held by Paden Lynch who had a 66-vard run against Central Oklahoma on September 18, 2010. Rambling Rios Senior running back Trent Rios had one of his best games of the year on Saturday. He picked up 83 yards on 13 carries for a season-high 6.4 yards per carry. He added five receptions for 33 yards and a touchdown. Despite missing three games due to injury, he is averaging a career high 4.5 yards per carry for the season and needs just two catches and 14 receiving yards to set new career highs in those categories. Heading into the final game of his career. Rios owns 14 career records and 12 single season records. His career records include: rushing yards (2,319), rushing attempts (610), rushing TDs (23), rushing yards per game (64.4), TDs responsible for (30), all-purpose yards (4,110), all-purpose yards per game (114.2), total points (176), touchdowns scored (29), punt returns (17), punt return average (5.4), kick return yards (1.056), kick returns (46) and kick return average (23.0). Rios' single season records include: rushing yards (888, 2010), rushing attempts (218, 2010), rushing TDs (10, 2011), yards per carry (4.1, 2010), rushing yards per game (80.7, 2010), all-purpose yards (1632, 2010), all-purpose yards per game (148.4, 2010), total points (68, 2011), touchdowns scored (11, 2011), kick return yards (521, 2010), kick returns (22, 2010) and kick return average (24.3, 2009).

#### Midwestern State

The Mustangs have completed their Lone Star Conference season at 7-1, clinching a share of their third LSC Championship in the last four seasons. MSU closes out the regular season at home against West Georgia in the LSC-Gulf South Conference 1st and 10 Challenge ... The Mustangs 52-48 win over then 12th ranked West Texas A&M marked the 100th career win for MSU Coach Bill Maskill. Maskill has a career mark of 100-41 (.709) in 13 seasons overall, with a record of 87-33 (.725) at Midwestern in 11 seasons ... Brandon Kelsey recorded a season-high of 348 yards of total offense in the win at WT, the second-highest of his career and 15th best in MSU history. Kelsey threw for a career-high 248 yards on 14of 22 passes with one touchdown and no interceptions and ran for 100 yards and three touchdowns on 14 carries ... Kelsey recorded his fourth career 200/100 game and the ninth 200/100 game in MSU history ... Junior Keidrick Jackson became the second leading rusher in Midwestern history with his 133 yards on 20 carries against WTAMU. Now with 2,632 yards, Jackson passed former Indianapolis Colt Dominic Rhodes (1999-2000) who rushed for 2,541 yards ... Jackson now has 1,159 rushing yards on the year, the fourth-best season in MSU history and the sixth 1,100-yard season in MSU history. It's the first since Daniel Polk rushed for 1,199 in 13 games in 2006 ... Jackson continues to lead NCAA Division II in scoring with 12.00 points a game (108 in nine games). He's tied with Klay Fiechter of Indianapolis (120 points in 10 games) and J.B. Mathews of Colorado State-Pueblo (96 points in eight games) ... Jackson scored two touchdowns on the ground at WT to total 18 for the season and needs one touchdown to tie and two to break the MSU single season touchdowns record ... Jackson tied the career TD mark of 44, shared by Daniel Polk (2003-07) and is third in career scoring for MSU with 264 total points ... Kelsey now is second in scoring in the LSC behind Jackson, averaging 9.3 points a game thanks to his 14 rushing touchdowns. He also ranks 17th nationally ... The Mustangs recorded their first interception in three games with Taivon Jackson's pickoff of Dustin Vaughan in the final seconds to seal the WT victory. Jackson had been the only secondary starter without an interception this season ... With the combination of Jackson's 133 yards and Kelsey's 100 yards rushing, MSU recorded its fifth double-100 yard game of 2012 ... Midwestern State is 46-of-49 (93.9%) in the Red Zone through nine games with 38 touchdowns and eight field goals, and while MSU opponents are 28-of-33 (84.8 %) with 20 touchdowns and eight field goals ... With its ranking this week, Midwestern has appeared in the last 20 AFCA Division II Top 25 polls (nine in the Top 10), has been ranked in 42 of the last 47 periods and has received a vote on at least one ballot in 81 of the last 82 reporting periods dating back to the 2006 season ...

#### **Tarleton State**

The Texans defeated North Alabama 38-28 on the road in Florence, Ala., this past Saturday... The Texans were leading by as many as 13 points with 6:01 left to play in the third quarter, but that lead unraveled and Tarleton found themselves down 28-27 with 4:37 left to play... Jake Fenske, who finished the game completing 31 of his 41 passes for 311 yards, engineered the eventual game-winning drive, which began at Tarleton's own 25-yard line... The guarterback, which was making just his second start in his collegiate career, went 4-for-5 for 40 yards on the drive that included a 22-yard strike to Arthur Buckingham to give the Texans the lead... Tarleton completed the two-point conversion, made a great defensive stand, and Blake Barnes iced the game at the 16 second mark with his 29-yard field goal... Fenske became just the 11th player in school history to pass for 300 yards or more in a game... He set a school record with a 99-yard pass to Cordell Valentine and became just the fourth player in LSC history to achieve the feat, tying a conference record as well... Vaughn Smith (126 yds) and Zach Henshaw (101 yds) rushed for 100 yards or more each in the same game for the second time this season (ENMU)... The Texans accumulated over 500 yards of total offense (537 yds) for the third time this season (ACU, ENMU)... Valentine led the way with his 107 yards receiving, while Jeken Frye led the group with eight catches... Matt Knicky and Devin Figures led the defense with nine tackles each... Rufus Johnson recorded a sack in the game, giving him at least half a sack in five straight games and six of the seven contests he has played in this season... Clifton Rhodes III moved to No. 10 on the school's all-time receptions list (single-season) with 55 catches for the season... Henshaw eclipsed the 500-yard mark for the season, heading into Saturday's game with 503 yards rushing... The Texans will host Angelo State (5-5, 4-3 LSC) this Saturday, Nov. 10, in the team's final regularseason game... The contest will be streamed live on the web at www.foxsportssouthwest.com... Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. at Tarleton Memorial Stadium in Stephenville.

#### Texas A&M-Commerce

Eastern New Mexico 7, A&M-Commerce 3

#### Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas began their first offensive possession of Thursday night's game with a 94-yard touchdown pass from Nate Poppell to Robert Armstrong. It is the thirdlongest reception in school history. The longest pass for in school history is 95 yards which has been accomplished twice. The first time a 95-yard pass was recorded in October 1995 on a completion from Oktay Basci to Karl Williams versus Central Oklahoma. The most recent 95yard toss came in 2008 against Angelo State from Daniel Ramirez to Ryan Lincoln...A&M-Kingsville set a new season-high for total offense with 495 yards in Thursday's clash with Valdosta State. They had 389 yards passing and 106 rushing yards...Junior wide receiver Robert Armstrong had his first 100-yard receiving game of the season on Thursday night. He finished with 137 yards receiving and a pair of scores. His prior season-high receiving was 94 yards in the Javelinas win over Abilene Christian back in week two and Armstrong now has 600 yards receiving on the season. The 100-yard receiving game was the fourth of his career and the 137 yards were the second highest total in his career. He had a career-high 175 yards receiving on 10 catches a year ago...Armstrong had two TD catches in a contest for the second time this season for the fourth time in his career. He has tied his personal best of eight touchdown receptions in a season from a year ago and has 26 career touchdowns in the air. He is third in TD receptions in a career behind Glenn Starks and Dwight Harrison, who are tied with 30...A&M-Kingsville was forced to use multiple quarterbacks on Thursday night as Bryan Ehrlich replaced Nate Poppell, who was banged up late in the first half. It was the third time this season that Ehrlich had to relieve Poppell in a game. Poppell was 7-of-9 in the first half for 154 yards and an interception. Poppell fumbled twice but the Javelinas recovered both leaving after the second fumble. He returned to throw an 11-vard pass on the final play. Ehrlich finished 12-of-24 with an interception when he slipped passing. He finished with two TD passes and 4-yard scoring run. Ehrlich hit Armstrong for an 18-vard score in the third and then hit a wide-open Jake Willingham to tie the game at 31 midway through the fourth ... Willingham is one of just three Javelina tight ends to catch a pass this season and has 11 catches for 170 yards. Chandler Hill and Derek Tesch each have one catch. Willingham is the lone tight end with a TD reception scoring on Thursday night and in the opening game on a 48-yard pass...With a field goal and four successful PATs at Valdosta State, kicker Matt Stoll has 71 points this season leading the team in scoring. His 71 points are ninth amongst kickers all-time in a singleseason. He is eighth amongst kickers in career points with 132. Stoll, who punted as a freshman, had 61 points in 2011.

#### West Texas A&M

Junior wide receiver Lance Ratliff made a stunning return as he had a career-high 180 yards receiving on a careerhigh 11 catches against Midwestern State...It was the most receiving yards in a game since 2010 and the most catches in a game for the Buffs since 2010, too...Senior running back Khiry Robinson is just 95 yards away from 1,000 for the season and the amazing part is he has only played eight of 10 games...The last 1,000-yard rusher for the Buffs was Keithon Flemming with 1,229 in 2007...Junior linebacker Taylor McCuller led the team once again with 12 tackles against Midwestern State with a half a tackle for loss and a forced and recovered fumble...Robinson had 147 yards on the ground and three touchdowns against MSU, while junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan was 30 of 47 for 391 yards and three scores along with an interception...The Buffs, the nation's top-ranked team in sacks, didn't have one against MSU for the first time this season...In addition, they only had four tackles for loss which was a season-low as WT was third nationally in tackles for loss...Senior running back Khiry Robinson had a season-high 233 all-purpose yards against Midwestern State with 147 yards rushing, 54 receiving with 26 in kick returns and six in punt returns as the one kick return was the first of the season for him and the first of his career... in the red zone, the Buffs have scored 93 percent of the time on 40 of 43 which is good for second in the league and they are holding opponents to 75 percent (21-28) which also is second in the conference...WT leads the league in converting third downs at 43 percent on 52 of 122 and are third in the league in opponents converting third downs at 35 percent on 54 of 153...The Buffs have a league-high 234 sacks on the season which almost doubles Tarleton State who is second with 122...The Buffs have converted six of 10 fourth downs, including a 4th and goal late Saturday against MSU and the Buffs are fourth in fourth down conversions in the league, while leading the conference in opponent fourth downs at 36 percent on 5 of 14...The Buffs had a chance to win the outright league championship, but came up just short Saturday...However, with a win this coming Saturday at Texas A&M-Commerce, the Buffs would clinch a share of the conference championship which would be their fifth in school history and first since winning three-straight between 2005-2007...WT is averaging 41.1 points per game which is second-best in the conference and 13th nationally as they are allowing just 20.5 points per game which is tops in the conference and 27th nationally...WT is fourth nationally in attendance at 41,514 for its four home games this season, while the 12,238 fans for the MSU game was the third-highest this week nationally... The loss to MSU snapped the league's longest winning streak at eight games this season while MSU improved its streak to eight.
