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LSC BASKETBALL

The schedule prior to the winter break includes a handful of Lone Star Conference contests along with non-conference games. The teams will take a hiatus from play from December 20-28.

The LSC men have a 50-33 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 11-13 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 3-1 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 39-44 overall. The women's squads are currently 10-9 combined versus Heartland teams, and 5-1 against the RMAC, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

The LSC champion will be the regular season winner determined by conference games, while the postseason tournament winner is designated as LSC Tournament Champion and earns the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship. The top eight teams in the final conference standings qualify for the postseason tournament set for March 6-9 in Allen, Texas.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Kennon Washington, West Texas A&M University, SR, Guard, Mobile, Ala., W.P. Davidson HS

Washington had one of his best weeks as a Buffalo as WT went 1-1 with an overtime loss at Midwestern State before rebounding for an impressive victory over Cameron on Saturday in Canyon. The senior guard averaged an amazing 22.5 points per game to go along with 6.0 rebounds and a shooting percentage of .577 on the week. Washington contributed a 23 point performance on Wednesday in the loss to MSU before tallying 22 points and seven boards in the win over Cameron. The Mobile, Alabama native went 3-of-5 from behind the arc and 12-of-14 from the charity stripe.

Jason Smith, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SR, Forward, Fort Worth, Texas, Grace Prep HS

Smith was the Lions' top player this past week as A&M-Commerce notched a pair of Lone Star Conference victories ... Smith averaged 18.0 points and 8.5 rebounds, shooting 80.0% from the floor and 85.7% from the free throw line ... He posted 17 points and five rebounds in the 90-88 victory over Abilene Christian Tuesday ... Against Angelo State, he notched his first double-double as a Lion, finishing with a team-high 19 points and 12 rebounds, shooting 87.5% from the floor (7-of-8) and 83.3% from the free throw line (5-of-6) ... Smith also added a game-high six assists against the Rams ... He is averaging 10.3 points and 5.1 rebounds while shooting 62.7% from the floor on the year for A&M-Commerce.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Corbin Thomas, Midwestern State University, SR, Forward, Chicago, Ill., Seton Academy

Thomas preserved Midwestern State's 65-62 overtime win over then-No. 25 West Texas A&M blocking Mason White's driving layup attempt in the closing seconds of the first overtime Wednesday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The swat closed a big night for the senior transfer from Missouri State. Thomas notched his first double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 rebounds while swatting a season-high five shots to help the Mustangs improve to 3-0 in the Lone Star Conference.

CO-WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Peyton Adamson, Tarleton State University, JR, Guard, Rockwall, Texas, Rockwall HS

Adamson led the TexAnns to back-to-back LSC wins over Angelo State and Abilene Christian last week. The junior guard from Rockwall averaged 17.5 points over those games, including a 23-point performance against ACU for her third 20-point game of the season. At Angelo, Adamson drilled a pair of deep 3-pointers to strengthen an 11-0 run to start the overtime period in the win against the Rambelles. She continued her torrid pace Saturday by going 6-11 from the floor, 5-7 from downtown and 6-6 from the free throw line in leading the TexAnns to a 78-60 win over ACU.

Dianna Jones, Midwestern State University, SO, Guard, Hewitt, Texas, Midway HS

Jones was instrumental in directing the Midwestern State attack in the Mustangs 74-55 triumph over West Texas A&M, the largest in 34 years over the Lady Buffs. The 5-9 sophomore guard from Hewitt, Texas/Midway accounted for 30 of the 74 MSU points, scoring 10 and dishing out 10 assists in the MSU triumph. She also grabbed two rebounds and collected three steals. Jones was 4-of-8 from the floor (.500) and 2-of-5 (.400) from the 3-point arc. It was the first 10 assist game for MSU since Michelle Duff dished out 11 dimes against Angelo State on Jan. 14, 2009 and the most in the LSC this season.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE**Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, JR, Center, Pittsburg, Texas, Pittsburg HS**

Wright was a defensive force for the TexAnns who earned victories over Angelo State and Abilene Christian while holding them to a combined .347 percent from the floor and 60.5 points per game. The junior center from Pittsburg averaged a double-double for the week with 15 points and 16 rebounds per contest. In Angelo, her 13 rebounds gave her 517 for her career which made her the 15th all-time rebounder in school history. She followed up that performance by setting a career-high in rebounds Saturday against ACU with 19 total boards (all defensive.) She also had three blocks and five steals for the week.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Donte McGee, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in scoring with a career-high 14 points in his first career start. He drained three key three-points to keep thwart any Dustdevils rally attempt. He hit 55.6 of his field goals and 60 percent from behind the arc. McGee also was solid on the glass grabbing 7 boards including six defensive.

Jovan Austin, Angelo State University, helped lead the Angelo State Rams to a 57-52 win over Tarleton State last week by scoring 19 points, including knocking down four free throws in the final 17 seconds to ice the game. Austin also added four assists and two steals in the win over the Texans. He would then be held to three points in a Saturday afternoon loss at Texas A&M-Commerce.

Darnell Jackson, West Texas A&M University, continued to impress during his first and only season at West Texas A&M this past weekend as he averaged 8.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per contest as the Buffs went 1-1 with an overtime loss at Midwestern State before rebounding with a huge win over Cameron on Saturday afternoon in Canyon. Jackson registered his first double-double of his WT career on Saturday afternoon as he tallied 12 points and 10 rebounds to push the Buffs past Cameron, 57-38. The Savannah, Georgia native continued to navigate the powerful WT offense as he registered nine assists and three steals on the week.

Antonio Dye, Angelo State University, continued to have a strong season on both sides of the court last week in a win over Tarleton State and a loss to Texas A&M-Commerce. Dye grabbed six rebounds in both games and also had two blocks and two steals during the week. He averaged 15 points per game on the offensive side of the court and helped to limit opponents to 63.5 points per game.

Brian Word, Tarleton State University, was inspirational in holding ACU's offense to just 2-of-25 (8.0%) shooting from the field in the first half on the way to just 10 points. Tarleton's lone senior managed to hold ACU's second-leading scorer to just four points when he came into the contest averaging more than 14 ppg. Word averaged 5.0 rebounds on the week and collected a pair of steals as well. He now leads the team with 12 takeaways on the season.

Angelo State

The Angelo State Rams split a pair of Lone Star Conference games last week with a 57-52 win over Tarleton State before falling at Texas A&M-Commerce to complete the week. ASU is now 1-3 in conference action and will not return to LSC play until a Jan. 2 game at Cameron. The Rams earned the win over TSU after trailing 16-4 to open the game. Jovan Austin led the way with 19 points while Antonio Dye added 16 in the win. Dakota Rawls led the Rams with a career-high 25 points in the loss to A&M-Commerce.

Cameron

Cameron's men's team let another halftime lead slip away for their third loss in a row as they fell to West Texas A&M, 38-57. The Aggies came out in the first half with a strong defensive effort, holding the Buffs to only 16 points. Things unraveled for the Aggies after halftime as they gave up a 13 point lead in the span of about six minutes. CU was outplayed in the paint and gave the ball up too many times, which led to points for WT. Tim Johnson led the Aggies in scoring with 14 points in the game, which is his Cameron high in points. The Aggies will host Eastern New Mexico for the last home game of 2012, on Wednesday, Dec. 12, after the women's game. Later on in the week, the Aggie men will head to Las Vegas to play in the Las Vegas Classic, where they will take on Florida Tech on Dec. 15 and Rollins College on Dec. 16.

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds last played on Saturday, December 1, and defeated Abilene Christian on a buzzer-beater from Rodney Blackmon. The ENMU men's basketball team will return to Lone Star Conference action on Wednesday at Cameron, before taking on California Polytechnic State, on Friday.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 0-2 last week dropping a pair of games on the road. They lost, 71-61 at St. Mary's on Tuesday and 76-68 at McMurry on Saturday. In the game with St. Mary's, freshman Mitchell Badillo scored 15 points in a 3:46 span in the second half. On Saturday, freshman Kyle Hittle poured in a career high 24 points. Men and Women: March 6-9, 2013

The Mustangs matched the fourth longest homecourt winning streak in NCAA Division II by winning their 19th-consecutive game at D.L. Ligon Coliseum Wednesday against West Texas A&M. MSU trails only Shorter (26), Bellarmine (22) and Newman (22) consecutive home victories. Sioux Falls (S.D.) and West Liberty (W. Va.) have also won 19 straight at home... Midwestern's 60-1 mark over its last 61 games under the dome stands as the third-best one-loss streak in all divisions of NCAA play. Kansas and West Liberty (W. Va.) have won 67 of its last 68 games at home... The Mustangs have faced double-digit first half deficits in each of their last five games and have trailed at halftime in each of their last five games, but has outscored the opposition in the second half of all seven of its games this season by an average of 9.9 points per game... MSU has out-rebounded the opposition in all eight games this season and lead the LSC with a +9.1 rebounding margin... The Mustangs average a league-best 15.3 offensive rebounds a game... Senior Corbin Thomas (14 points, 10 rebounds) and junior Eddie D'Haiti (13 points, 10 rebounds) delivered MSU's first two point/rebound double doubles Wednesday night against West Texas A&M. Junior point guard Monzaigo Williams owns MSU's other double-double with 13 points and 10 assists at Ouachita Baptist (Ark.)... Thomas spearheaded the Mustangs' best block party of the season with five blocked shots while D'Haiti swatted three of his own. MSU finished with a season-high 10 as a team which were the most since the Mustangs blocked 10 shots against Incarnate Word on Feb. 8, 2012...

Tarleton State

The Texans opened up LSC play this past week, going 1-1 in those contests... After jumping out to an early 16-5 lead against Angelo State on Wednesday, the Rams managed to hold-off the Texans on the way to a 57-52 victory... Tarleton opened the half going 7-for-11 from the field, but then went more than 11 minutes without a bucket and closed out the remainder of the period with a 1-for-9 effort from the floor... Despite shooting 40 percent from the field on the evening and holding ASU to just a 34 percent effort, the Texans committed a season-high 19 turnovers and ASU's nine-points scored on those turnovers turned out to be the difference... The Texans got back in the saddle though as they hosted Abilene Christian on Saturday; holding the Wildcats to just 2-for-25 (8.0%) from the field and just 12 points over the first 20 minutes of play... ACU bounced back though, outscoring the Texans in the second half 38-26, but the 26-point lead at the break was enough for the Texans to pullout a 14-point win, 64-50... Chuck Guy (G, Jr, Fort Worth) led the Texans in scoring this week as he averaged 12.5 points a game (14, 11)... Coleman Furst (G, Jr, Denison) followed with 12.0 ppg this week as he led the team with 18 points against ACU on Saturday... Brian Word (G, Sr, Baltimore, Md.) had 10 rebounds and a pair of steals for the Texans on the week... Davene Carter (F, So, Duncanville) was tops in rebounds on the week as he averaged 6.0 boards per outing... A'Darius Pegues (F, Jr, Louisville, Ky.) had three blocks on the week, which included swatting away back-to-back field goal efforts from ACU on Saturday... Tarleton's 36 turnovers this week was the worst two-game span for the Texans dating back to last season's opening two games where they committed 36 turnovers as well... Tarleton held both teams they faced this week to under 35.0 percent shooting from the field... It was the first time all season the Texans had not allowed a team to shoot under 40.0 percent... Tarleton will not play again until

next Tuesday, Dec. 18, as the Texans host Henderson State in non-conference action.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce started off its 2012-13 LSC schedule in style, taking a thrilling 90-88 victory at Abilene Christian Tuesday, followed by a 75-58 victory over Angelo State Saturday ... Against the Wildcats, the Lions held a 10-point lead with just over two minutes remaining, only to see ACU rally to tie the game at 88-88 with 16 seconds left. But a lay-up by Tyrie Wooten with two seconds remaining gave A&M-Commerce the 90-88 victory ... Five Lions finished in double figures, led by 17 points each for Jason Smith and Preston Whitley with Andrew Davis adding 14 points ... Against the Rams, the Lions built an early advantage and never looked back, cruising to the 75-58 win ... Smith notched his first career double double, finishing with 19 points and 12 rebounds while adding 6 assists ... With the wins, head coach Sam Walker improved his career record to 199-150, needing just one more win to reach 200 and three to surpass Jim Gudger (201-190) as the all-time winningest coach in A&M-Commerce history.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas have played stellar defense through their first nine games of the season. After last week's game with Texas A&M International in which the defense limited the Dustdevils to just under 32% shooting from the floor, the Javelinas are fourth in the Division II ranks field goal defense at 35.7% and are fifth in the defending the three-point line at 24.7%. Both numbers lead the Lone Star Conference. Kingsville has allowed just three opponents to shoot better than 40%. International shot a season-best 51.1% in the opening game of the season, while McMurry shot 41.7% and St. Edward's 43.1% in the second meeting between the Hilltoppers and Hoggies. The team is second in the Lone Star Conference and 15th in the nation in points allowed at 58.4... Rashad Basey is the Javelinas leading scorer and assist man. He is seventh in the league in scoring with 14.2 points a game and fifth in assists with 4.6 a game. Basey has the team's top field-goal percentage at 50.5%... Seniors Reid Wallace and Marshall Bonds III each find themselves in the top five in the Lone Star. Wallace is fifth in the LSC in three-point shooting hitting at 47.6%, while Bonds is fifth in blocks with 1.1 a game... The Javelinas have done a tremendous job of spreading the wealth on offense. Five different players have led Kingsville in scoring so far. Rashad Basey has led the team five times, Jamahl Brown has shared the lead one time with Basey and on his own once. Reid Wallace and Donte McGee have also helped the team by leading them in scoring once.

West Texas A&M

The #25 Buffs went 1-1 this past week to move to 8-2 (2-2 LSC) on the season with a heartbreaking overtime loss at Midwestern State on Wednesday night before they rebounded with a 57-38 victory over the Cameron Aggies on Saturday afternoon in Canyon. The Buffs were led by senior guard Kennon Washington who averaged 22.5 points per contest followed by Mason White with 10.0 per game. Darnell Jackson registered his first double-double as a Buff on Saturday against Cameron with 12 points and 10 rebounds in the win. The Buffs will now take a break for the holidays as they focus on finals before returning to the court on December 29th as they host the Aggies of Oklahoma Panhandle State.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Rose Whitehead, University of the Incarnate Word, sparked the Cardinals to a 77-67 win over visiting Texas A&M-International last week. She came off the bench to pour in a career high 24 points. She went 7-of-12 from the field and drained 10-of-11 at the foul line. She is currently third in the LSC in free throw percentage at 86.8.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers with 16.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game last week. She scored a career-high 19 points against St. Mary's and then recorded her third double-double of the season with 13 points and 13 rebounds at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Pateraki shot 53.8 percent from the floor and helped the Pioneers snap a six-game losing streak with a road win at Texas A&M-Kingsville. She is averaging 11.3 points and 9.3 rebounds against conference foes this season.

Leah LeMaire, Angelo State University, averaged 16.0 points per game and led the Belles with 18 points in a close overtime loss to Tarleton State ... She shot .500 (11-22) from the field and 64-percent (9-14) from the charity stripe ... She scored six of the Belles last 10 points against Texas A&M-Commerce to put the game out of reach ... The Corpus Christi native dished out five assists as had two steals as well.

Casey Land, West Texas A&M University, tied for the team lead in points as the Lady Buffs split two games last week. She averaged 15 points on a team-high 13 of 18 from the field for a .722 clip. She was 3 of 6 from beyond the arc and had a team-high 13 assists, including a season-high eight against Cameron. Tallied a team-high four steals for the week. Went 7 of 12 from the field against Cameron which was a season-high helping the Lady Buffs to their first conference win.

Alexa Candelaria, Eastern New Mexico University, shot a team-high 40 percent against UTEP and paced the Zias with 10 points on Saturday, with one steal. The performance came against a Miner team which boasts an 8-1 record this year, with a 21-2 record at home since last season.

Kaitlyn Lowen, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, recorded her third double-double of the season in the loss to Incarnate Word. The senior had 10 points to go with a career-high 15 rebounds. It was the most rebounds by the Javelinas this season. Eight of her rebounds came on the offensive glass. She is tied for 30th in the nation in double-doubles...

Haylee Oliver, Angelo State University, recorded two-straight double-doubles in a road win over Texas A&M-Commerce and an overtime loss to Tarleton State. The sophomore collected a career high 15 rebounds and scored 14 points in the win over Texas A&M-Commerce and led the Belles in both games in rebounds. She averaged 13.5 points and 13.0 rebounds in the two games and of her 26 total rebounds 25 were defensive. The San Saba native shot 81.8-percent (9-11) from the free throw line and dished out eight assists.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, led Midwestern State on the defensive end of the floor in the Mustangs 74-55 win over West Texas A&M, the largest in 34 years over the Lady Buffs. Carter, a 5-10 sophomore from Angleton, grabbed 11 rebounds, including seven of MSU's 17 defensive boards, and collected a steal in the game. She added nine points and three assists as well. She helped MSU hold WT to 55 points, the second fewest points allowed this season by the Mustangs.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers with 16.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game last week. She scored a career-high 19 points against

St. Mary's and then recorded her third double-double of the season with 13 points and 13 rebounds at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Pateraki shot 53.8 percent from the floor and helped the Pioneers snap a six-game losing streak with a road win at Texas A&M-Kingsville. She is averaging 11.3 points and 9.3 rebounds against conference foes this season.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, helped lead the Lady Buffs to a 1-1 record over the week.
