LSC BASKETBALL

This week includes a mix of Lone Star Conference games and non-conference contests. In league play, two men's squads and five women's team remain undefeated.

The LSC men have a 43-24 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 10-10 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 3-1 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 31-34 overall. The women's squads are currently 9-7 combined versus Heartland teams, and 5-1 against the RMAC, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

The LSC champion will be the regular season winner determined by conference games, while the postseason tournament winner is designated as LSC Tournament Champion and earns the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship. The top eight teams in the final conference standings qualify for the postseason tournament set for March 6-9 in Allen, Texas.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Keith Spellman, Midwestern State University, SO, Guard, Brooklyn, N.Y., Jefferson HS

Spellman poured in 17 points a game to help Midwestern State to a pair Lone Star Conference road wins last week over Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The sophomore guard from Brooklyn, N.Y. scored 19 points including a pair of 3-pointers while going 7-of-12 from the free throw line as the Mustangs recovered from a 16-point first half deficit to claim a victory Thursday at Incarnate Word. The Wizard fired in 10 of his 12 shots from the charity stripe to score 15 points in 21 minutes as the Mustangs once again overcame a 10-point first-half deficit Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Dennis Hardwell, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Forward, Los Angeles, Calif., Carson HS/LA Harbor College
Hardwell's defensive presence helped the Greyhounds win their first two Lone Star Conference games of the season and limit the opposition to 63.5 points per game, and a .282 shooting percentage from outside the three-point line. The performance allowed ENMU to post 18.5 points per game off turnovers. Hardwell finished the week with 12 defensive boards, five blocked shots and six steals. Against Abilene Christian, he finished with 13 points, seven rebounds, four blocks and three steals. In the LSC opener against Angelo State, he had 13 points, 10 boards, three steals and a block.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Sadie Dickinson, Abilene Christian University, SO, Forward, Graham, Texas, Graham HS

Dickinson led ACU in scoring this past weekend during which the Wildcats defeated conference opponents West Texas A&M, 81-76, and Eastern New Mexico, 74-56. Dickinson dropped 18 points on the Lady Buffs, who the Wildcats had not defeated since the 2010-11 season, and then scored a career high 25 points on 8 of 13 shooting vs. Eastern. She also pulled down 11 boards vs. the Zias for her second double-double in four games. Dickinson started both of last week's games and finished with a remarkable 3-point field goal percentage of .529 (9-17). She knocked down 4 of 9 attempts in Canyon and 5 of 8 at home vs. the Zias. Her overall field goal percentage was .600 (15-25). Dickinson's efforts pushed her into a tie for fourth among the conference scoring leaders with 15.5 points per game, and her .550 field-goal percentage ranks third.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Ashlyn Green, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, Guard, Irving, Texas, Irving HS

Green sparked the Cardinals to an 82-81 double overtime win against Midwestern State. She came off the bench to score 18 points while grabbing seven rebounds and getting five steals. In the win over Cameron, she only scored three points, but was valuable as the top person on the team's zone press that forced the Aggies into 32 turnovers. In all, Green helped the Cardinals force 61 turnovers in their two wins.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Coleman Furst, Tarleton State University, set a career-high with 23 points on Saturday as he guided the Texans to a 16-point win over Arlington Baptist and extend Tarleton's win streak to four games. He also recorded a career-high five rebounds on the night as well. Furst went 7-for-11 from the field, which included going 2-for-3 from beyond the three-point line. The junior had a knack for getting to the foul line as well, where he went 7-for-9 on the evening.

Jamahl Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in scoring outright in each game last week with a career-high 20 points versus Cameron and 14 versus Midwestern State. He has shared team-high honors in the last three games. He was 7-of-15 from the floor against Cameron and 6-of-13 versus the Mustangs.

Dionelle Rucker, University of the Incarnate Word, had a strong opening week of the LSC season. He had 15 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field in a 74-69 loss to Midwestern State. He came back with his second double-double of the season in a 74-69 win over Cameron. He led the team with 17 points and 11 rebounds while blocking two shots and getting two steals. At one point, he scored six straight points for UIW with under four minutes remaining to help secure the win. He averaged 16.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game for the week.

Rafael Love, Eastern New Mexico University, averaged 14.5 points per game and shot 50 percent from the

field and three-point range, to lead the Eastern New Mexico University men's basketball team to a 2-0 start in Lone Star Conference play. He poured in 17 points, grabbed eight rebounds, blocked a shot and hit three of his four three-point attempts, to lead Eastern to a win over Angelo State. All 12 of his points against Abilene Christian came in the second half, as Eastern went on to a two-point win.

Davene Carter, Tarleton State University, scored 11 points and pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds on his way to recording his first double-double of the season. The sophomore was a beast on the boards at both ends of the court, pulling down seven offensive boards and six on defense. Of the seven offensive boards, Carter turned those rebounds into eight of his 11 points. Carter also tallied his first block of his career on Saturday as he helped lead the Texans to its fourth-consecutive win over Arlington Baptist.

Steven Werner, Abilene Christian University, helped the Wildcats post a 1-1 record to being conference season. The senior center dropped 16 points on #18 West Texas A&M on 7 of 9 shooting, which included an important layup and free throw made during the closing minutes. The victory was ACU's first in Canyon since 1997-98. Werner pulled down 13 rebounds vs. the Greyhounds, 10 of which came off the defensive glass, and recorded a blocked shot.

Lyn'Dale Brown, University of the Incarnate Word, played his best two games of the season for the Cardinals. He knocked down his first eight shots of the game against Midwestern State en route to a season high 23 points. He also grabbed seven rebounds, blocked a breakaway layup from behind and had four steals. He harassed MSU point guard Monzaigo Williams into eight turnovers in the 74-69 loss. On Saturday, he only had six points, but dished out six assists and had seven rebounds. Abilene Christian

The Wildcats posted a 1-1 record in starting their conference season, following a historic 59-58 victory at nationally ranked West Texas A&M with a disappointing 62-60 home loss to Eastern New Mexico. ACU's win vs. the Buffaloes was its first since a buzzer-beater 61-60 triumph at Moody Coliseum near the end of the 2008-09 season. The Wildcats last win in Canyon, 91-87, took place during the 1997-98 campaign. The Wildcats shot a season best 55.8 percent (24 of 43) vs. WT led by Steven Werner's 16 points and 15 each from Eric Lawton and Elliott Lloyd, who also tied for the team lead with six assists. ACU senior forward Dosh Simms pulled down a team-high six rebounds in his season debut. Against the Greyhounds, ACU battled all the way back from an eight-point deficit in the second half to tie the score twice during the final minute and 38 seconds, but the defense couldn't get the stop it needed as Rodney Blackmon swooped past his defender for the game-winning layup with a second remaining. Lloyd shared the team lead in points with 10 with Cornelius Cammock, while Werner pulled down the most rebounds with 13. The Wildcats return to action Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m. vs. Texas A&M-Commerce for the second-annual Christmas Slam.

Angelo State

The Rams are 2-4 and 0-2 in conference play ... The Rams lead the LSC in free throw percentage at .708 and turnover margin with a positive 5.60 ... Chris Talkington is the LSC's fourth-leading scorer at 16.8 points per game ... Jovan Austin is the top free throw shooter with .895 percent and Ryan Marsh is the top blocker with 1.8 per game.

Cameron

This week the Aggies went 0-2 in conference play, with losses against Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word. In the game against Kingsville, it was a tale of two halves for the Aggies. In the first half CU held the Javelinas to 15 points and had the lead going into the break, but let them come back and score 41 in the second half to win the game 56-48. It was the same story, different day in the game against Incarnate Word. The Aggies were up three at the half against the Cardinals but then gave up 40 points in the second half to give UIW the win 74-69. The Aggies were able to best the Cardinals in shooting percentage and rebounds but costly turnovers and a lack of production in the paint was ultimately their demise in this game. Craig Foster led the team in both games with 20 points against Kingsville and 16 against Incarnate Word. Cameron will take a week off and then head to West Texas to take on the Buffs on Saturday, Dec. 8.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University men's basketball team opened Lone Star Conference play in dramatic fashion, posting wins over Angelo State and Abilene Christian. After going back and forth at home for a win over ASU, the Hounds used Rodney Blackmon's buzzer-beating layup to earn a big win at ACU. Next up for the Greyhounds is another LSC matchup at Cameron, next week.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State rolled to a 2-0 start in Lone Star Conference play claiming wins at Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville last week... The Mustangs are now 6-6 in Lone Star Conference openers played away from D.L. Ligon Coliseum and have started league play on the road in 12 of their 17 seasons as a league member... MSU is 2-0 in league play for the second straight season after opening its conference ledger with six consecutive victories last season... The Mustangs improved to 34-6 (.850) under second-year coach Nelson Haggerty... MSU extended a pair of series streaks last week having now won its last four and eight of the last nine against Incarnate Word... Midwestern claimed its 10th consecutive victory over Texas A&M-Kingsville to improve to 26-11 all time against the Hoggies. The Mustangs also own a 10-game winning streak in its series with Texas A&M-Commerce, have won nine-straight against Cameron and eight in a row against Abilene Christian... MSU completed its second longest season-opening road spell of seven games with a 5-2 mark. Midwestern opened the 1988-89 season with nine games on the road going 1-8... The Mustangs have trailed at halftime in each of its last four games and in five of their seven games this season, but have outscored the opposition in the second half of all seven games this season by a margin of 10.9 points per game... MSU has outrebounded the opposition in all seven games this season ranking second in the LSC with a +9.4 rebounding margin... The Mustangs leads the league with 15.1 offensive rebounds per game snagging an LSC-best 42.9 of the rebounds on the offensive end of the floor... Sophomore guard Keith "Wizard" Spellman has scored 10-or-more points in each of his last five games ranking fourth in the LSC with 16.1 points per game... Junior point guard 'Zaigo Williams upped his LSC-best assist average to 6.9 per game dropping seven dimes in games at Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville last week. Williams also rates fourth in the league with 2.1 steals a game...

Tarleton State

The Texans improved to 4-1 following a 16-point win over Arlington Baptist (77-61) on Saturday... Coleman Furst (G, Jr, Denison) led the way with a career-high 23 points and Davene Carter (F, So, Duncanville) posted his first-ever double-double with 11 points and a career-high 13 rebounds... De'Andre Upchurch (G, Jr, Flint, Mich.) added 13 points for the Texans giving him double figures in four of his five games... The Texans head into Lone Star Conference games for the first time this season with a game against Angelo State in San Angelo on Wednesday... Tarleton is 12-6 all-time in LSC openers under head coach Lonn Reisman... The Texans are 2-1 when playing ASU in the first LSC contest... ASU leads the all-time series 34-27, but Tarleton has won four straight and six out of the last seven... Tip-off is set for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at Stephens Arena.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, carried the TexAnns through the week, including the best overall game of her career in the Lone Star Conference opener. In Saturday's win over Texas Woman's, Wright recorded a double-double with 22 points and 17 rebounds. For the week, she was an incredible 15-20 shooting from the floor and a monster on the boards with 27 total rebounds - 19 defensive. She also added four assists, two blocks and three steals.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, led Midwestern in scoring as the Mustangs opened Lone Star Conference play with an 82-81 double-overtime loss at Incarnate Word, then bounced back with a 75-63 triumph at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Carter scored 16 points and grabbed 17 rebounds against UIW, then followed it with 17 points and six rebounds at TAMUK. She averaged 16.5 points and 11.5 boards for the week to go with her 55.2 percent shooting from the floor and 1-1 from the foul line. She also recorded three assists, two steals and one blocked shot on the week.

Haylee Oliver, Angelo State University, averaged 16 points and 11 rebounds to help the Belles to a 2-0 start in conference play for the first time since 2005-2006. She recorded her first double-double of the season a with 24 points and 12 rebounds against West Texas A&M. It is the first time ASU has defeated the Lady Buffs since the 2004-2005 season. The 24 points is a season best and she recorded back-to-back double-digit rebound games for the first time in her career. The San Saba native added six assists and three steals over the last week. She connected on 60-percent of the 3-pointers she shot and was 42.9-percent from the field

Breanna Gonzalez, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, scored a career-high 17 points in a losing effort to Midwestern State and had 11 versus Cameron. The senior was 6-of-9 from the field including 3-of-5 from behind the arc in the clash with the Mustangs. She was 2-of-2 from the foul line. Against Cameron, Gonzalez had 11 points and two steals. She was 3-of-4 from behind the arc. With three double-digit games in a row, she now leads the team with 10.2 points a game.

Amber Carver, Texas A&M University - Commerce, had a solid week in helping the Lions to a 1-1 mark, defeating Texas Woman's in the LSC opener before falling to Division I Sam Houston State ... Carver notched her first double-double of her Lion career with an 11-point, 10-rebound performance against the Pioneers, shooting 5-of-8 from the floor ... Five of her rebounds were offensive as she also added an assist, a steal and a block ... Against the BearKats in Huntsville, Carver led the Lions with 10 points and six rebounds, hitting four of her six shots from the floor with two assists and a block ... She is averaging 9.5 points and 7.5 rebounds in 16 minutes per game for the Lions.

Lauren McKinney, University of the Incarnate Word, did not score an exceptional amount of points last week, but her points were the ones that mattered for the Cardinals as they went 2-0 to open the LSC schedule. In the double overtime win against Midwestern State, she hit her first three-pointer of the season with eight seconds remaining in the first overtime to tie the game and send it to a second OT. In the second overtime period, she drained a step-back three-pointer as the shot clock was winding down that gave the team a lead they would not relinquish. She led the team with 11 points in their 43-35 win over Cameron on Saturday. She went 5-of-6 from the free throw line and had three steals.

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, carried the TexAnns through the week, including the best overall game of her career in the Lone Star Conference opener. In Saturday's win over Texas Woman's, Wright recorded a double-double with 22 points and 17 rebounds while holding the entire TWU team to just 20 points in the paint. For the week, she was an incredible 15-20 shooting from the floor and a monster on the boards with 27 total rebounds - 19 defensive. She also added four assists, two blocks and three steals.

Kelsey Smith, Abilene Christian University, helped carry the Wildcats to a pair of victories this past week vs. West Texas A&M, 81-76, and Eastern New Mexico, 74-56, contributing 12.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. In the victory at Canyon, she scored a season best 16 points on 7 of 9 shooting (2 of 3 from 3-point range) and blocked a season-high three shots. ACU's win vs. WT was its first since the 2010-11 season and first on the road since Feb. 27, 2010. Against the Zias, Smith finished with 11 rebounds and was a point shy of attaining her second double-double of the year. She also helped lead a defensive effort that held Eastern to 34.5 shooting, which included a dismal 8.7 percentage from 3-point range.

Kaitlyn Lowen, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, capped the week with the second double-double of her career as a Javelina on Saturday. She finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds. For the week she had four steals to lead the team including a team-best three versus Cameron. She hit 7-of-8 free throws against Midwestern State

Shatoia Gober, Midwestern State University, helped lead the defensive attack for Midwestern State as the Mustangs split games to open Lone Star Conference play. She averaged 7.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals for MSU, with 9.5 points and 2.5 assists as the Mustangs fell at Incarnate Word 82-81 in double-overtime and defeated Texas A&M-Kingsville 75-63. She helped MSU average 23.5 opponent turnovers as the Mustangs held their opponents to shooting 37.9 percent from the floor.

ACU won its first two conference games of this season played this past weekend. The Wildcats defeated West Texas A&M on the road, 81-76, for their first win in Canyon since Feb. 2010 and then extended their series-winning streak over Eastern New Mexico to 15 behind a 74-56 home triumph. The Zias last beat ACU in Feb. of 2001. The pair of victories pushed ACU to the top of the conference leader board in scoring (80.0 ppg), field-goal percentage (.464), assists (17.5), 3-point FG made (39), defensive rebounds (29.8), and 3-point field goal defense (.233) after Eastern connected on just 2 of 23 attempts. Individually, three of ACU's starters are ranked among the top-10 in scoring led by Sadie Dickinson, who averaged 21.5 points per game this past weekend. Kelsey Smith is fifth with a 9.0 rebound average and is no. 2 in field goal percentage (.567) with Dickinson right behind at no. 3 (.550). Junior guard Mackenzie Lankford is tied for fourth in assists with 3.3 per game.

Angelo State

The Belles moved to 4-3 and 2-0 in conference play after defeating Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M ... It is the first time ASU has started the season 2-0 since the 2005-2006 season ... The Belles defeated rival West Texas A&M in double overtime for the first time since 2004-2005 ... ASU is tied for the league

lead in field goal percentage defense and defensive rebounds and are second in scoring defense and blocked shots ... Haylee Oliver is third in the league in assists with 3.8 per game while Lauren Holt still leads the league in blocked shots at 2.3 per game.

Cameron

The Cameron women went 0-2 in their games this week against conference opponents Texas A&M-Kingsville and Incarnate Word. Cameron got off to a slow start offensively and defensively against the Javelinas. CU was held to 19 points in the first half while giving up 37. The Aggies played way better in the second half but could not overcome the Kingsville league as they lost 61-55. The Aggies turnovers killed them, because the Javelinas were able to capitalize on them with 19 points off CU's turnovers. Against Incarnate Word, the Aggies were again held to under 20 points in the first half with 14. CU came back again in the second half and outscored the Cardinals 21-15, but it was not enough to get the win as they lost 35-43. Chelsea Stamp was the leading scorer in both games with a career high 18 against UIW and 11 against TAMUK. The Aggies will head to West Texas to face the Lady Buffs for their next match up on Saturday, Dec. 8.

The Cardinals opened the conference schedule with a pair of victories. They defeated Midwestern State, 82-81 in double overtime in a game that had a number of wild swings back and forth. Then, they knocked off Cameron, 43-35 in a defensive struggle. Ashlyn Green sparked the Cardinals to an 82-81 double overtime win against Midwestern State. She came off the bench to score 18 points while grabbing seven rebounds and getting five steals. In the win over Cameron, she only scored three points, but was valuable as the top person on the team's zone press that forced the Aggies into 32 turnovers. In all, Green helped the Cardinals force 61 turnovers in their two wins. Lauren McKinney did not score an exceptional amount of points last week, but her points were the ones that mattered for the Cardinals as they went 2-0 to open the LSC schedule. In the double overtime win against Midwestern State, she hit her first three-pointer of the season with eight seconds remaining in the first overtime to tie the game and send it to a second OT. In the second overtime period, she drained a step-back three-pointer as the shot clock was winding down that gave the team a lead they would not relinquish. She led the team with 11 points in their 43-35 win over Cameron on Saturday. She went 5-of-6 from the free throw line and had three steals. Katy Cooke had her best game of the season against MSU with 18 points and five steals while knocking down 4-of-7 from three-point land. The Cardinals only game this week is Saturday at home against Texas A&M-International.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 5-1, 1-1 in Lone Star Conference play ... the Mustangs had their four-game winning streak, tying the second longest to start a season, snapped with the 82-81 loss at Incarnate Word ... The loss to Incarnate Word was the sixth in 18 games against the Cardinals and the first back-to-back loss to UIW since 2004 and 2005 ... The Mustangs followed with a 75-63 win at Texas A&M-Kingsville marking the fourth consecutive win over TAMUK after losing six straight to the Javelinas ... Midwestern State faces

West Texas A&M on Wednesday night, then is off for final examinations until Saturday, Dec. 15 when they face Texas-Permian Basin ... Junior Andrea Carter posted her fourth double-double of the season against Incarnate Word with 16 points and 17 rebounds ... Carter, a sophomore from Angleton, Texas, continues to average a double-double, ranking fourth in the LSC in scoring and third in rebounding with 15.5 points and 12.3 boards a game. She also is second in the LSC in steals, with 3.2 a game ... Junior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum is third in the conference in scoring and second in the league in assists with her 16.2 points and 3.7 assists an outing ... It's the ninth time that Midwestern State has been 5-1 or 6-0 after six games, but just the second time since becoming a full NCAA Division II institution (5-1 in 2000-01). MSU was 6-0 in 1987-88 and 5-1 in 1985-86, 1989-90, 1990-91, 1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97, and 2000-01 before 2012-13. MSU is 6-2 in the seventh game of those seasons ... Midwestern forces an average of 22.2 turnovers a game from its opponents and has scored 23.7 points a contest off turnovers ...

Tarleton State

Kiara Wright was dominant for the TexAnns last week as they were on the road against St. Mary's and Texas Woman's for the Lone Star Conference opener. The junior recorded a double-double in both games as the TexAnns lost at St. Mary's and won at Texas Woman's.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce continued their fast start to the season, knocking off Texas Woman's 63-52 in its LSC opener ... Breanna Harris and Amber Carver each finished with double-doubles on the night as Harris posted 13 points and 16 rebounds while Carver added 11 points and 10 boards in the victory ... Aubree Butts led the way with 15 points on the night for A&M-Commerce, continuing her fast start to her freshman season ... The win over Texas Woman's gave the Lions three victories in their first three games, surpassing the total number of victories in each of the past two seasons ... It matched the best start in program history since 2008-09 and was the program's first four-game winning streak since that season ... The Lions then took on Division I opponent Sam Houston State, hanging tough in the first half before falling 78-50 in Huntsville ... Carver once again led the way with 10 points and six rebounds while Butts had eight points for A&M-Commerce ... It marked the Lions' first game against a Division I opponent since taking on three of them in the 2006-07 season.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Senior Kaitlyn Lowen earned her second double-double of the season for Texas A&M-Kingsville with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Lowen was 7-of-8 from the foul line in completing her second double-double of her career. Her first double-double came in the second game of the season against Our Lady of the Lake when she had 12 points and 12 rebounds... Senior Breanna Gonzalez scored a career-high of 17 points in the game against Midwestern, beating her previous high of 13 from a season ago. She made both of her free throws attempts, 6-out-of-9 of her field goal attempts. She tied her career-high by sinking three 3-pointers...Texas A&M-Kingsville had scored a career-high 31 points off of turnovers by Midwestern State, the most this season by the Javelinas...Kingsville outshot Midwestern State at the free-throw line, 76 percent to 63 percent. They also scored 18 second-chance points compared to Midwestern's six...The women's win against Cameron

marks the first Lone Star Conference opener win for the Javelinas since 2009-10 season when they defeated Texas A&M-Commerce, 90-60...Three Javelinas scored double-digit points against Cameron in the LSC opener. Newcomers Sheana Jones and Rita Banaszczak led the team with 13 points each followed by senior Breanna Gonzalez who added 11...the Javelinas scored 19 points off turnovers compared to Cameron's one point. She also led the team with .474 shooting percentage. Sophomore guard Toree Mason also averaged in double digits with 11.5 points per game. On the season Mason leads the Pioneers in scoring (12.1 ppg) and Pateraki leads TWU in rebounds (7.6 rpg). The Pioneers will play their final non-conference game on Wednesday, Dec. 5 when they host St. Mary's at 7:00 p.m. TWU will also play at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday, Dec. 8 before taking a break for the finals.
