LSC FOOTBALL

This week all nine Lone Star Conference football teams will play at Cowboys Stadium as part of the 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone. The event includes four league contests, one non-conference game and a high school contest.

Texas A&M-Kingsville and Tarleton State top the LSC standings after upset wins over Abilene Christian and Midwestern State, respectively, last week.

LSC football teams are 8-8 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

LONE STAR FOOTBALL FESTIVAL

The Lone Star Football Festival, a three-day, six-game affair which includes all nine LSC football teams, is set for September 13-14-15 at Cowboys Stadium. The event starts on Thursday with Midwestern State versus Texas A&M-Commerce at 7 p.m. The game will be televised live on the CBS Sports Network.

Friday's lineup includes one LSC game and a high school contest, with Incarnate Word versus Eastern New Mexico at 3:30 p.m., followed by defending 5A state champion Southlake Carroll against Temple at 7:30 p.m.

On Saturday, the action starts at Noon with Angelo State in opposition to two-time NCAA Division II national champion Valdosta State from the Gulf South Conference, followed by a pair of conference clashes with Tarleton State against Abilene Christian at 4 p.m. and Texas A&M-Kingsville versus West Texas A&M at 8 p.m.

The 2011 Lone Star Football Festival drew an LSC attendance record 24,837 fans to a tripleheader of games, which included Midwestern State defeating Texas A&M-Commerce 63-17 in the Harvey Martin Classic, North Alabama stopping Abilene Christian 23-17, and West Texas A&M using a quick start to top Texas A&M-Kingsville 42-21.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Jerome Regal, Tarleton State University, SO, RB, Garland, Texas, Naamon Forest HS

Regal led the Texans to an upset of No. 4 Midwestern State in the season opener Saturday. The sophomore workhorse carried the ball 33 times for a total of 152 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Regal averaged 4.6 yards per carry in the contest, and was the major offensive cog in the Texans' 20-17 win over the Mustangs.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Marquis Wadley, Tarleton State University, JR, LB, Mesquite, Texas, Mesquite HS

Wadley showed why he led the conference in tackles last season as the junior linebacker racked up 12 total tackles in Tarleton's win over No. 4 Midwestern State. The Mesquite native recorded seven solo tackles, a half-tackle for loss, and a pass break-up. Wadley's biggest play of the game though was an interception with 48 seconds left that ended the Mustang's comeback hopes and sealed the Texans' victory.

Marquis Singleton, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, DE, Decatur, Ill., Harmony Community

Singleton was a force from his defensive end position as the Javelinas upset the Wildcats 16-13. He finished the game with just four tackles but three were for losses of 15 yards. He had two sacks of ACU's Mitchell Gale including one on 4th-and-9 to seal the win for the Hogs. His two sacks match his career total coming into the game.

SPECIAL TEAMS**Matt Stoll, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, JR, K, College Station, Texas, Consolidated**

Stoll connected on three field goals and an extra point accounting for 10 of the Javelinas 16 points in a win over No. 9 Abilene Christian. He had FGs of 35, 29 and 31 yards with the last giving the visitors a 16-6 lead. He now has six FGs in two games this season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Dustin Vaughan, West Texas A&M University, threw for a season-high 409 yards in a 57-20 win over Western State and tied his career-high with five touchdown passes. He went 22 of 32 with no interceptions and had a 77-yard touchdown pass, while leading two drives of 49 and 47 seconds with the 77-yard touchdown pass and a 67-yard scoring pass, respectively. Had two receivers with over 100 yards receiving each for the second game in a row.

Nate Poppell, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had a career game against Abilene Christian on Saturday. He threw for career-high 372 yards and a touchdown. Poppell completed 33-of-50 passes as the Javelinas upset the Wildcats 16-13.

Wesley Wood, Eastern New Mexico University, accounted for 222 yards of total offense and three touchdowns against Sul Ross State, including a career-high 94 rushing yards. He completed more than 86 percent of his passes for the day and broke a 26-yard run, to set up the game-winning touchdown, late in the fourth quarter.

Jermie Calhoun, Angelo State University, started his first game for the Rams and led the team with 123 all-purpose yards. He rushed for 91 yards on 24 carries and tied for the team lead with six receptions.

Perron Sellers, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in one of the strongest performances of his career, in a hard fought win over Sul Ross State. Eight of his team-high 13 tackles were solo stops, with four tackles for a loss and 1.5 quarterback sacks. Sellers forced a punt with a third-down sack in the fourth quarter, which set up a go-ahead touchdown for the Greyhounds.

Rush Seaver, Angelo State University, led the Rams in tackles for the second-straight game with 12 total tackles. The Rams defense held Chadron State to 93 yards passing and under 300 yards of total offense.

Shane Sobnosky, West Texas A&M University, earned his first career start at outside linebacker and tied for the team lead in total tackles with six. He had a game-high 2.5 tackles for loss for nine yards and added a forced fumble.

Jamal Mays, Tarleton State University, recorded a key block on a punt by Midwestern State deep in Mustang territory and recovered the blocked kick inside the 20-yard line. That set up the go-ahead score for the Texans that led to their 20-17 win over the fourth-ranked Mustangs.

Kevin VanVorhis, West Texas A&M University, had 10 kickoffs for a 65.0 average and 650 yards with eight touchbacks and just two were returned. He had two punts for 44.5 yards including a 46-yarder which was downed at the WSCU one yard-line.

Dylan Baca, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a strong performance on special teams for the Greyhounds. He controlled field position with a 46-yard punting average, with a long kick of 57 yards. Baca Also connected on a 28-yard field goal. Both of his tackles came in kick coverage, including a big sideline tackle, with less than one minute left in the game.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)**Abilene Christian**

The last time the Wildcats lost a home game in the regular season was Oct. 17, 2009, when the then-No. 1-ranked Wildcats dropped a 32-21 decision to unranked West Texas A&M. ACU's next home game was Oct. 31, 2009, against Texas A&M-Kingsville, a game that ACU won 47-35 to start the 12-game home field winning streak that was snapped in Saturday's loss to Kingsville. ... ACU senior quarterback Mitchell Gale completed just 13 passes against Kingsville, the fewest completions of his career in a game when he's played all four quarters. His previous career low was 14 (14 of 25) in the 2009 loss to West Texas A&M. ... Gale didn't throw a touchdown pass in Saturday's game, snapping a streak of 24 straight games in which he had thrown a touchdown pass. Prior to Saturday night's game, the last time Gale failed to throw a touchdown pass in a game in which he started was Nov. 21, 2009, when the Wildcats lost to Northwest Missouri State, 35-10, in the second round of the NCAA Division II playoffs. ... The Wildcats' offensive output of 224 yards against the Javelinas is their worst in a game since the 164-yard output in a 19-14 win over Northwest Missouri State on Aug. 27, 2009. That game – carried live on CBS College Sports Network – featured two stingy defenses and an ACU offense trying to replace the triumvirate of Billy Malone, Bernard Scott and Johnny Knox. ... The Wildcats played the game without running back Charcandrick West, who sat out with a groin injury, and they definitely missed his explosiveness. ACU finished with just 87 yards on the ground and 65 of those came on a fourth-quarter touchdown run by Darrell Cantu-Harkless. Redshirt freshman Travis Tarver started in West's place and gained just 21 yards on 12 carries, while Marcel Threat – last week's leading rusher with 88 yards against McMurry – had just three yards on one carry. Wide receiver Taylor Gabriel had ACU's only other carry, going seven yards for a touchdown in the first quarter. ... After allowing just 12 yards rushing in last week's win over McMurry, the Wildcats gave up just 48 yards on the ground against the Javelinas. ACU's rush defense ranks sixth in the country at 30.0 yards per game, and it ranks third in the country in sacks per game at 6.0. ... The Wildcats' pass defense, however, has allowed 301 yards against McMurry and 372 against the Javelinas and ranks 142nd in the country at 336.50 yards per game. ... The Javelinas' win over ACU snapped the Wildcats' eight-game winning streak against Kingsville. The Javelinas' last win over ACU prior to Saturday night was a 10-7 decision over the Wildcats in 2003 at Shotwell Stadium. The next season the Wildcats went to Kingsville and knocked off the No. 2 Javelinas, 17-10, to snap a

Angelo State

The Rams and No. 20 Valdosta State will play for the first time at 12 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 15 at Cowboy Stadium in the Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone. It will be the first time the Rams have played in the Lone Star Football Festival. The game is the fourth game out of six during the three day event ... Chadron State forced four critical turnovers, two by cornerback Conor Casey, in defeating the Angelo State Rams 19-7 in a non-conference game at San Angelo Stadium this past Saturday. The Eagles forced a pair of turnovers inside their own 20-yard line, another on a special teams play to set up a critical third quarter touchdown and the final time to halt a Ram fourth quarter drive ... The Ram defense is limiting opponents to 228.50 yards per game this season. The yardage has the Rams ranked No. 13 in total defense in NCAA D-2. The pass defense is even higher at No. 11 in D-2 limiting teams to 122 yards per game. The total defense and passing defense has the Rams ranked No. 1 in the Lone Star Conference in both categories ... The Rams gave Chadron State four turnovers that prevented Angelo State from finding a rhythm on the offensive end. The three fumbles and one interception were the most in a game since ACU forced two fumble and two interceptions on Oct. 10, 2009 ... Sophomore Rush Seaver is slowly making a name for himself. The Lampassas native has led the Rams the last two games with 24 total tackles and is currently tied for No. 6 in NCAA Division II at 13 tackles per game.

Eastern New Mexico

Greyhound senior quarterback Wesley Wood added 222 yards to his team record for total offense and Eastern needed all of it, to rally past Sul Ross State, last weekend. He rushed for a career-best 94 yards with two touchdowns and added 128 passing yards with one score on a 13-15 performance. Wood's 26-yard spring set up Derek Kendall-Campbell's game-winning touchdown with 1:18 left. Eastern surged to a 17-0 lead, before falling behind by a 28-17 score, but two big defensive stands allowed the Hounds to surge for the win. Perrons Sellers led the effort with 13 tackles, eight solos, four for a loss and 1.5 sacks. This week, the Greyhounds will face Incarnate Word, as part of the Lone Star Conference football festival.

Incarnate Word

Playing at Jerry World The Cardinals travel to Arlington, TX on Friday for their game with Lone Star Conference rival Eastern New Mexico for a 3:30 p.m. kickoff. The game is part of the Lone Star Football Festival and will be played at Cowboys Stadium. The UIW-ENMU matchup is just one of six games that will be played there over the weekend. Midwestern State plays Texas A&M-Commerce on Thursday night at 7 p.m. to open the festivities. After the UIW game on Friday, Southlake Carroll and Temple High School will play at 7 p.m. The festival continues on to Saturday with a full slate of games. Angelo State plays Valdosta State at noon, followed by Abilene Christian against Tarleton State at 4 p.m. and West Texas A&M versus Texas A&M-Kingsville at 8 p.m. Playing the Greyhounds The Cardinals are 1-1 all-time against Eastern New Mexico. The two programs first met in the final game of the 2009 season with the Greyhounds prevailing, 35-30 in New Mexico. Last year, ENMU traveled to San Antonio and UIW pulled out a 41-28 victory. In last year's win, the Cardinals led 41-14 with 7:54 remaining in the game before

the Greyhounds scored a pair of late touchdowns. Running back Trent Rios had a record-setting day for UIW gaining 202 yards on 34 carries and scoring four touchdowns. He finished the game with 233 all-purpose yards. On defense, Robby Horton had a pair of sacks and Chaz Pavliska had two interceptions. Highlight of the Night The Cardinals entered their game at Sam Houston State overmatched, but that did not prevent the team from putting a good foot forward. The highlight of the night for the team came when Chavis Barron picked off a pass giving the Cardinals good field position at the SHSU 36-yard line. Four plays later, Zach Rhodes hit Trent Rios on a swing pass and he scored from 18 yards out giving UIW a 7-6 lead. The lead held up for 4:40 and the Cardinals went into halftime trailing only 20-7 before the Bearkats lit up the scoreboard in the second half. Just Like the Patriots The Cardinals have an offense this year that appears to be built around the team's high quality tight ends, similar to the New England Patriots. On Saturday, the team played a total of four tight ends and had a number of three tight end formations. Senior tight ends Andrew Mocio and Caleb Kocian were able to get open all game long and Zach Rhodes had no trouble finding them. Mocio finished the game with a career high eight catches for a total of 51 yards. Last year, he finished second on the team with 32 receptions for 401 yards. He currently leads the team with 11 catches for 70 yards this year. He is on pace to finish the year with 60 catches which would set a school record. He had accumulated 74 catches for 803 yards in his career.

Midwestern State

The Mustangs game with Texas A&M-Commerce will be televised by the CBS Sports Network and is the first-ever national telecast of an MSU game ... It is the fifth neutral site game played by MSU since reinstating football in 1988. Midwestern is 1-3 in the previous four games, with the win coming last season against A&M-C at the stadium 63-17 on Sep. 17, 2011 ... The game with the Lions will be the 17th meeting between the schools with A&M-Commerce leading 11-5, but MSU has won five of the last six games ... The game also is the first time that MSU and A&M-Commerce have met in consecutive seasons since 2005 when A&M-C went into the LSC North Division and the schedules didn't match up until last season when the divisions were eliminated ... The Thursday night affair is the first for MSU since 2010 when the Mustangs opened the season at New Mexico Highlands and won 52-6 ... The contest is the eighth time since 1988 that MSU has played on Thursday, sporting a 3-4 record. However, MSU has won its last three Thursday games and both games in the Bill Maskill era (Aug. 28, 2003 vs. Arkansas Tech 27-12 and Sep. 2, 2010 at New Mexico Highlands 52-6) ... with MSU's scheduled home game taken to Cowboys Stadium for the Lone Star Football Festival, the Mustangs won't play at home until Sep. 29 when they face Incarnate Word ... MSU finds itself in a rare position, 0-1 on the season, after the Mustangs 20-17 loss at Tarleton State snapped MSU's 11-game season-opening winning streak. It was the first time Midwestern has lost a season opener since dropping a 34-13 decision at Texas State on Aug. 31, 2000 ... it was the first time MSU has lost to a Division II team to open the season since falling at Northwest Missouri State 55-16 on Sep. 5, 1998 ... the loss was also the first season opening loss for coach Bill Maskill at MSU who had won his previous 10 season opening games ... the loss to the Texans at Tarleton Memorial Stadium is the fourth straight in Stephenville, with the last MSU at Tarleton coming on Nov. 4, 2000 ...

Midwestern, who led NCAA Division II in total offense and scoring a season ago, collected only 319 yards and 17 points. It was the lowest output for MSU since the Dec. 4, 2010 Kanza Bowl against Washburn when they collected 246 yards and 14 points ... kicker Greg Saladino hit his only field goal attempt of the season with a 37-yarder that gave MSU a 10-7 lead in the third quarter. Saladino is now 8-of-11 in his career ... Saladino also posted his second career punt at Tarleton, with a 51-yard boot that left Tarleton inside the 15 ... The Midwestern State defense did give up 20 points and 354 yards to the Texans, but it was below last season's average of 23.4 points and 357.4 yards allowed ...

Tarleton State

The Tarleton Texan football team opened up the 2012 season with a bang as they upset No. 4 Midwestern State at home Saturday night in Memorial Stadium. Tarleton got off to a fast start, taking a 7-0 lead, before MSU rallied and tied the game at 7-7. The Mustangs then took a 10-7 lead, but Tarleton would answer with another score by sophomore running back Jerome Regal. A 14-10 lead quickly became a 21-10 advantage, which was too much for the Mustangs to overcome on the road. The Texans finished off the 20-17 win with an interception by junior linebacker Marquis Wadley with 48 seconds to go. The Tarleton offense totaled 354 yards while the defense held last year's top-ranked offense to just 314 total yards. Quarterback Aaron Doyle finished the game 18-of-26 for 137 yards, but it was Regal's 33 carries for 156 yards and two touchdowns that led the way. Defensively, Wadley had a team-high 12 tackles, while Dashaun Phillips recorded an interception as well. The Texans will now face Abilene Christian in Cowboys Stadium as part of the LSC Football Festival.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce held its own in its first-ever game against a Division I FBS opponent, falling to UT-San Antonio 27-16 in front of 30,000 fans at the Alamodome. The Lions fell behind 24-3 at halftime, then outplayed the Roadrunners in the second half, outscoring UTSA 13-3 thanks to a 61-yard touchdown reception by Garrett Smith and a five-yarder by Tevin Godfrey. Joel Wren led the way defensively with 12 tackles while Danny Mason added nine.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

With Saturday night's win over Abilene Christian, the Javelinas snapped an eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats ... The win was the first by Kingsville coach Bo Atterberry over the 'Cats in six attempts ... Ranked No. 24 in the AFCA poll and No. 23 in the D2Football.com rankings entering Saturday's game the Javs have now played 216 games as a ranked team since entering DII in 1982 and have played 88 games against ranked teams. TAMUK has won over 75% of its games as a ranked opponent (162-54), but are now just 14-21 versus ranked teams when away from Javelina Stadium ... Quarterback Nate Poppell threw for a career-high 372 yards at ACU. He completed 66% of his passes hitting 33 of 50 attempts with 1 TD pass. It was his second 300-yard game of his career ... Following Poppell's lead through the air, the TAMUK offense finished with 420 yards of total offense on 84 plays to average five yards a play ... Wide receiver/kick returner Joseph Vela was another Javelina with a career-best 85 yards receiving on five catches. He had 15 yards in punt returns missing his first 100-yard game at the collegiate level ... Receivers Sherman Batiste and Robert Armstrong each pulled

down a game-high 10 receptions. Batiste had 10 catches for 128 yards and the first 100-yard receiving game of his career, while Armstrong had 94 yards receiving ... With 159 yards receiving this season, the Javelinas' Batiste has moved into 11th all-time with 1,583 receiving yards ... The A&M-Kingsville defense continued its strong play on Saturday. The defensive unit limited the Wildcats to 224 yards of total offense. During the second and third quarters the Javelinas rewrote the definition of stingy by limiting Mitchell Gale and the 'Cats to just three total yards and no first downs. Sixty-five of ACU's yards came on a TD run by Darrell Cantu-Harkless to make the score 16-13 ... Led by Marcus Singleton with two sacks, TAMUK has posted eight sacks and 14 tackles for loss... After ACU's Morgan Lineberry missed a 51-yard field goal with 7:05 left, the Javelina defense allowed one first down. The Wildcats got no further than their own 21 ... The Kingsville special teams got into the act as well ... After forcing three turnovers a week ago the Javelina had three more on Saturday – two fumble recoveries and an interception. The Javelina offense has just two fumbles lost ... Punter Angel Millan, who struggled with a 10-yard punt in the first quarter due to a low snap that led to an ACU score, showed off his talent late in the game. The Kingsville punter had his final two punts downed at the Wildcat six ... With field goals of 35, 29 and 31 yards, placekicker Matt Stoll provided the final nine points of the contest for the Hoggies and had 10 points in the game. He now has six field goals on the season.

West Texas A&M

CARTHEL TIES KERBEL - With the 57-20 win over Western State Saturday, eighth-year head coach Don Carthel tied former head coach Joe Kerbel for the most wins in school history with 68. Kerbel coached the Buffs from 1960-1970 with a record of 68-42-1. Carthel also has had a school-record seven-straight winning seasons at the helm of the Buffalo football program. He surpassed Kerbel for the most consecutive winning seasons while at head coach for the Buffs. Kerbel had six-straight winning seasons at the helm of the team from 1965-70. **A for Alridge** - Redshirt freshman running back Jeremy Alridge earned his first career start and ran for a career-high 102 yards in the Buffs' 57-20 win over Western State last Saturday. He had 11 carries on the day for a 9.3 average per carry. **5 for Vaughan** - Junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan tied his career-high with five touchdown passes against Western State. He went 22 of 32 for 409 yards, throwing touchdowns to four different receivers and no interceptions. **TWO OVER 100 TIMES 2** - Junior wide receivers Torrence Allen and Nathan Slaughter had a strong outing Saturday versus Western State as they combined for 254 yards on 11 receptions and three scores. It was the second consecutive game that two WT receivers had over 100 yards receiving. Last week at CSU-Pueblo, Allen and junior wide receiver Lance Ratliff combined for 317 yards on 164 and 153 yards, respectively and three scores. **QUICK SCORING BUFFS** - The Buffs had two scoring drives of 49 seconds or less against Western State Saturday. The first came with just 49 seconds off the clock on a 77-yard touchdown pass from Vaughan to Allen in the first quarter. Later in the second quarter, Vaughan hooked up with Slaughter for a 67-yard strike and score in just 47 seconds. The week before, the Buffs had three scoring drives of under a minute with the shortest being 38 seconds. **SPECIAL TEAMS** - The special teams play was solid for the Buffs on Saturday versus Western State as junior linebacker Kyle Voss blocked a punt and junior punter/place kicker Kevin VanVorhis had 10 kickoffs

and all 10 went into the end zone for 650 yards and just two were returned. He also had two punts for 44.5 yards and one was downed inside the 1-yard line. **TOTAL OFFENSE** - The Buffs amassed 677 yards in total offense on Saturday versus Western State with 170 on the ground and 507 through the air. It was the most yards of total offense since a 735 output against East Central on Nov. 13, 2010. **PERFECT HALPIN** - Junior quarterback Luke Halpin was a perfect 11 for 11 Saturday as he threw for 94 yards and one touchdown in relief of starter Dustin Vaughan. **QUICK START** - The Buffs got off to a quick start against Western State, scoring 21 points in the first quarter on Saturday. For the season they have outscored their opponents 35-14 in the opening frame.
