LSC VOLLEYBALL

After two weeks of non-conference play, Lone Star Conference volleyball teams begin league play this week. Teams will play a home and away match against each of the other teams this season. West Texas A&M ran the table at the Colorado Premier Challenge, with four wins for the challenge crown including three teams that were ranked in the top 10.

WT and A&M-Commerce lead the standings at 7-1 overall, while three teams - Angelo State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Texas Woman's - are 6-2.

LSC volleyball teams are 53-36 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-15 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 6-6 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Rachel Robertson, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SR, Princeton, Texas, Princeton HS

Robertson helped the Lions to a 3-1 mark over the weekend at the Tarleton Volleyball Invitational, earning MVP honors of the tournament with 70 kills, a .400 hitting percentage and 12 blocks. She had two 20-plus kill matches, becoming the ninth member of the A&M-Commerce 1,000-kill club and moving from ninth to fourth all-time in program history with 1,069 career kills. On the season, she is averaging 4.03 kills per set and a .434 hitting percentage.

Shelbi Stewart, Midwestern State University, SR, Pflugerville, Texas, Pflugerville HS

Stewart garnered MVP honors at the Colorado-Colorado Springs Invitational after posting 3.92 kills and 2.58 digs per set with a .255 hitting percentage. The senior from Pflugerville recorded double-figure kills in each match including a 12-kill, 9-dig effort against No. 12 Wayne State (Neb.). She also posted double-doubles against Franklin Pierce (14 kills, 10 digs) and UC-Colorado Springs (10 kills, 10 digs).

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, SR, Daugavpils, Latvia, Daugavpils 16 Secondary

Jablonska recorded 57 kills, 51 assists, 28 digs, six service aces and six total blocks while posting two triple-doubles in the four games at Holiday Inn Crossroads Classic in Grand Junction, Colorado. She had 22 kills, 13 assists and 14 digs against Fort Hays State on Friday and 16 kills, 18 assists and 15 digs against the host Colorado Mesa on Saturday. Jablonska was selected to the all-tournament team after posting a game-high in kills in three of the four games. On the season she has 95 kills, 54 assists, 51 digs and 14 total blocks.

DEFENSIVE

Lydia Werchan, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, Spring Branch, Texas, Smithson Valley

Werchan was a dominant force in the back row for the Cardinals at the Tarleton State Tournament. She had 25 digs and four aces in a three-set sweep of SE Oklahoma. She came back with 27 digs, three aces and three assists in a four-set win over Ouachita Baptist on Friday. On Saturday, she had 17 digs in a 3-set win over New Mexico Highlands and 25 digs in a 3-set loss to William Jewell. She averaged 7.15 digs per set for the week with nine aces. She eclipsed 1,000 career digs in the OBU game.

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, SR, Hereford, Texas, Hereford HS

Beville continued to make her way up the Career Digs list at WT as the #14 Lady Buffs went 4-0 at the Colorado Premiere topping #5 Central Missouri, #10 Metro State, West Florida and #3 Tampa en route to the Tournament Title. Beville was named to the All-Tournament Team for her efforts. The senior libero tallied 75 digs for an average of 5.36 per set to lead the Lady Buffs defensively. Beville now sits at 1,878 career digs just 272 behind second place (Brittani Bell) and 370 out of first (Sara Contreras).

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, SR, Houston, Texas, Channelview HS

McNorton led the team in total blocks with 20 en route to a 57.5-point effort in the Tarleton Invitational

SETTER

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, SR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair HS

Hayes showed why she's one of the best setters in all of NCAA Division II this past weekend as the #14 Lady Buffs went 4-0 at the Colorado Premiere with wins against #5 Central Missouri, #10 Metro State, West Florida and #3 Tampa for WT's third Premiere Tournament Title. Hayes was named the MVP of the tournament for her efforts on the court. The senior registered a staggering 162 assists for an average of 11.5 per set to go along with 59 digs (4.21/set) and seven block assists. Hayes registered a match high 60 assists to go along with 22 digs against West Florida in the Tournament Semifinals.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, JR, Amarillo, Texas, Amarillo HS

As the only active setter on the roster this weekend, Barker played every point of the two-day, four-game Tarleton Invitational. The junior setter from Amarillo posted 162 assists over four games as she led the TexAnns to a 3-1 record. She also added a team-high six service aces and 29 digs over the four games.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Rebecca Green, Cameron University, had a career high 24 kills against CSU-Pueblo and seven kills alone in set four in a close 3-2 victory. Over the course of the four matches she had 49 kills with an .220 percentage, and nine block assists.

Halie Harton, West Texas A&M University, had her best weekend of her career as the #14 Lady Buffs went 4-0 at the Colorado Premiere Challenge topping #5 Central Missouri, #10 Metro State, West Florida and #3 Tampa en route to the Tournament Title. Harton registered a team high 47 kills for an attack percentage of .213 and an average of 3.36 per set while tallying a double-double against West Florida and #3 Tampa. The junior from Roswell, New Mexico also registered nine block assists and one service ace.

Evelyn Escobar, Eastern New Mexico University, led the Zias offensively last week. In four matches, the Zias collected a lone win against Wayland Baptist University. In the win, Escobar pounded out 16 kills, collected a career-high 31 digs, and two service aces for her first double-double of the season. She then went on to top her performance with a career-high 18 kills and her second double-double against CSU-Pueblo. For the weekend, Escobar had team highs in kills (47), kills per set (3.13), and total attacks (238). In addition, she was third on the team in digs with 67.

Dedra Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had double-digit kills in three of four matches. She had a season-high 25 against Southwest Baptist with 13 vs. Rockhurst and 10 against Harding. She hit .385 against Southwest with just five errors on 52 attacks and had a .298 hitting percentage for the week.

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, led the TexAnns in kills (40), blocks (20) and points (57.5) as well as posting a .383 hitting percentage as she paced Tarleton to a 3-1 record throughout the Tarleton Invitational Tournament in Stephenville last weekend. She was also named to the all-tournament team.

Kaelen Valdez, Angelo State University, recorded three double-doubles at the Colorado Premiere Challenge last weekend including having 14 kills and 15 digs in the Belles' 3-1 win over No. 17 Lewis in their final match of the tournament. Valdez finished her four-match stay in Colorado with 41 kills with a .206 hitting percentage for ASU which improved to 6-2.

Chetina Chavis, University of the Incarnate Word, was the Cardinals most efficient attacker and top net defender at the Tarleton State Tournament. She led the team to a 3-1 weekend. She had four kills and three blocks in a win over SE Okla. On Saturday, she combined for 13 kills, a .500 attack, four aces and four blocks in a three-set win over New Mexico Highlands and a three-set loss to William Jewell. She led the team with a .391 attack for the week with eight blocks.

Emily Lubbers, Eastern New Mexico University, had a breakout weekend as she collected a season and career-high for digs in a match. In four matches, Lubbers only committed one reception error for a .981 reception percentage. Over 15 total sets played, she averaged 5.07 digs per set, scooped up a team leading 76 digs, and tied for the most service aces, with eight. In the Zias win over Wayland Baptist, Lubbers led the dig count with 38 and was the first Zia to collect 38 digs in a single game since the 2008 season. Since the 2001 season, Lubber's 38 digs is good for second overall for a five set single-game dig performance.

Ali Insell, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, cleaned up with 63 digs in four matches and 15 total sets. She had double-digit digs in three of four matches. She had a season-high 34 digs in the five-set match with Southwest Baptist. She added three aces in the win.

Courtnee Davis, Texas Woman's University, posted 51 digs and five total blocks on defense and 25 kills on offense in the four games at Holiday Inn Crossroads Classic in Grand Junction, Colorado. She recorded her first career double-double with 10 kills and 17 digs against Fort Hays State on Friday. On the season Davis has 88 digs, 48 kills and seven total blocks.

Emily Booth, Angelo State University, contributed consistent play for the Belles at the Colorado Premiere Challenge on defense, finishing with nine total blocks. Booth, a senior from Haltom, had 1.12 blocks per set and eight block assists.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, just missed a school record with 61 assists in the Javs five-set win over Southwest Baptist. Her 35 digs on the tied for third on the team. She posted two double-doubles with 34 assists and 10 digs in a sweep of Harding. In the team's 5-set win over Southwest Baptist she had 13 digs to go with her 61 assists. For good measure Fountain had nine blocks on the week including four against Southwest Baptist.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, helped lead the Belles to two wins over top-25 ranked opponents at the Colorado Premiere Challenge last weekend in Denver. Woolsey finished the tournament with 116 assists as the Belles improved to 6-2 on the season. Woolsey had 29 assists against No. 11 Cal-State San Bernardino in the Belles' sweep and now has 274 assists through the first eight games of ASU's season.

Jenna Risoli, Cameron University, surpassed 2,000 career assists at Cameron during the ThunderWolves Classic in Pueblo, Colo. Helped lead the Aggies to a 3-2 comeback victory of CSU-Pueblo with 55 assists (2 short

of a career high). Risoli is also third in the Lone Star Conference in total assists at 290.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in strong showings at the CSU-Pueblo ThunderWolves Classic. In four matches she averaged 7.67 assists per set, and had 115 assists overall. In the victory over Wayland Baptist, Catano picked up a season-high 41 assists. Catano also picked up 40 digs, ten kills, five service aces, and a team-high .229 hitting percentage for the week.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, led the team with 105 assists in a 6-2 offense in the four games at Holiday Inn Crossroads Classic in Grand Junction, Colorado. She posted a career-high 42 assists against Fort Hays State on Friday and then recorded a double-double with 29 assists and 15 digs against the host Colorado Mesa. Rivero averaged 7.00 assists while posting 35 digs on defense. She has a team-best 184 assists and 61 digs this season.

Danielle Suarez, University of the Incarnate Word, directed the Cardinal attack to a 3-1 record at the Tarleton State Tournament. She averaged 6.1 assists per set from the 6-2 formation. She had 26 assists, seven digs and two aces in a win over SE Okla. She posted her first double-double of the season with 22 assists and 10 digs in a three-set win over Ouachita Baptist. She contributed 2.1 digs per set and four aces without a service error.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats posted a 1-3 record at the prestigious Colorado Premier Challenge last weekend in Denver. ACU faced four AVCA top-25 teams and defeated No. 21 Colorado School of Mines, 3-1, but lost 3-0 to No. 3 Tampa and No. 10 Metro State, and 3-2 to No. 11 Cal State Bernardino - a match the Wildcats led 2-0. West Texas A&M won the Challenge team title and will be ACU's first conference opponent of 2012 this Friday in Canyon at 7 p.m. ACU's freshmen and sophomores again led in every statistical category for the second straight weekend. Rookie Jennie Loerch recorded the most kills with 44 and had the highest hitting percentage of .138, while Sara Oxford was second with 43 kills. Freshman setter Sarah Siemens tossed up 112 assists, an average of 7.47 per set, and her classmate Corrie Reeder totaled the most blocks with 11. Rookie libero Madison Hoover came up with the most digs with a per set average of 2.87. The Wildcats will face Eastern New Mexico Saturday at 7 p.m. (MT) / 8 p.m. (CT) .

Angelo State

Angelo State split its four matches last weekend at the Colorado Premiere Challenge, including going 2-1 against top-25 ranked opponents. The Belles (6-2) hit for a .165 percentage and opened the tournament with a sweep of No. 11 ranked Cal-State San Bernardino before topping No. 17 Lewis University in their final match of the tournament. ASU opens LSC play this week with home matches against Cameron and then Midwestern State at the Junell Center where it went 13-1 last season.

Cameron

The Aggies split four matches at the CSU-Pueblo ThunderWolves Classic beating Wayland Baptist, CSU-Pueblo, and fell to Adams State and New Haven. Cameron enters Lone Star Conference play with an overall record at 4-4. CU's win over CSU-Pueblo was the third time this season that has gone five sets and it was the first loss of the season for the ThunderWolves who entered the match at 6-0. In the CSU-Pueblo match, several Aggies put together

season and career marks. Rebecca Green had a career high 26 kills, Jenna Risoli had 55 assists, three short of her career high, and Lauren Acuna in her first collegiate start gave Cameron a season high 23 digs. Additionally, freshman, Shannon Dulaney earned her third double-double against CSU-Pueblo (18 kills, 12 digs). The match against Wayland Baptist was the second time Cameron swept at team 3-0 this season (last against Kentucky Wesleyan on 9/1). Freshman, Kathryn Evans headlined CU with a career high .480 with 13 kills on 25 attempts, and Green put together nine kills. Jenna Risoli over the course of the classic surpassed the 2,000 career assist mark as an Aggie. For the season she has 290 assists and is 14 back of the conference leader. Cameron will travel to this weekend to Angelo State and Tarleton state.

Eastern New Mexico

After starting off hot in week one, the Eastern New Mexico University Zias met up with some tough opponents in week two. The Zias traveled to Pueblo, Colo. where they played in the ThunderWolves Classic and posted a 1-3 record. On day one, the Zias fell to Adams State University before picking up a five-set win over Wayland Baptist University. Eastern fell in their final two matches to Montana State University-Billings and host Colorado State University-Pueblo. Senior outside hitter Evelyn Escobar averaged 3.13 kills per set for the weekend while also notching two double-doubles. Senior defensive specialist Emily Lubbers collected 38 digs against WBU for the Zias season-high and the first time a player achieved 38 digs since 2008. The Zias are set for their first conference match of the year as the Zias will host Abilene Christian University on Saturday, September 15th.

Midwestern State posted a 1-3 mark at last weekend's Colorado-Colorado Springs Invitational claiming a win over Franklin Pierce (N.H.) while falling to Fort Lewis (Colo.), No. 12 Wayne State (Neb.) and host UCCS... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart was named UCCS Invitational MVP after posting 3.27 kills and 2.58 digs per set with a .255 hitting percentage... Stewart has posted double-figure kills in each of her last five matches and in six of her last seven... Stewart now has 833 kills and need 66 more to enter the program's Top 10 total kills list... Stewart posted her first two double-doubles of the season with 14 kills and 10 digs against Franklin Pierce and 10 kills and 10 digs at UC-Colorado Springs... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace hit a stellar .303 with 2.58 kills per set and was strong at the net with 0.83 blocks per set... Stewart ranks sixth in the LSC in both hitting percentage (.310) and kills per set (3.27)... Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas moved to 6-2 on the season after splitting for matches at the 2012 Bear Clash hosted by Southwest Baptist in Bolivar, Mo. The 6-2 start is the second-best mark after eight games ... After going 3-7 in 5-set matches, the Javelinas have won their first two contests to go the distance ... One key to the Javelina success has been the team's defense. Last year, Ali Insell averaged over four digs a game – much like this season, but only one other player – Kalinda Graves – recorded over two digs a game. This season four players aside from Insell are recording at least two digs a game – Bethany Friesenhahn, Kelsey Washington, and Sarah Fountain...JUCO Transfer Dedra Brown continues to bring the hammer. In her second tournament with the Javelinas, Brown posted 55 kills with 3.61 kills a set. She hit .298 with just 16 errors on 131 total attacks. In eight matches, Brown has posted double-digit kills five times with two matches with 22-or-more kills. She has hit .300 or better five times and .450 once ... Setter Sarah Fountain has been another pleasant surprise for the Javelinas ... Last season, the sophomore played in just seven sets. This year she has moved into starting role and is averaging 9.17 kills a set. If continues that pace she will post the third-highest total in Javelina history. She just missed a school record with 61 assists in the five-set win over Southwest Baptist. The record was 66 by Sara Streets ... Senior libero Ali Insell continues her run at the record books climbing to seventh in career digs with 1,049, After recording a record 4.87 digs a ago, she is averaging 4.17 which ranks as the third highest total of all-time.

Texas Woman's

The TWU volleyball team posted a 2-2 record at the Holiday Inn Crossroads Classic in Grand Junction, Colorado. After defeating Fort Hays State (3-2) and Western State Colorado (3-0) the Pioneers fell to #24 Grand Canyon (3-0) and the host Colorado Mesa

(3-1). TWU's 6-0 mark to open the season is the best start under head coach Shelly Barberee. Senior Viktorija Jablonska recorded 57 kills, 51 assists, 28 digs, six service aces and six total blocks while posting two triple-doubles. The triple-doubles are first in TWU volleyball history since Carley Messmer ('05), recorded 13 kills, 42 assists and 11 digs against Texas A&M-Commerce on Nov. 4, 2004. She had 22 kills, 13 assists and 14 digs against Fort Hays State on Friday and 16 kills, 18 assists and 15 digs against the host Colorado Mesa on Saturday. Jablonska was selected to the all-tournament team after posting a game-high in kills in three of the four games. On the season she has 95 kills, 54 assists, 51 digs and 14 total blocks. Sophomore Kayla Rivero has a team-best 184 assists while sophomore Morgan Wilson leads the team with 97 digs. Juniors Marcela Alves and Chloe' Tate has 25 and 22 total blocks respectively while junior Courtnee Davis has 48 kills and 88 digs on the season.
