LSC SOCCER

Lone Star Conference soccer season is in full swing. On the women's side, non-conference play has wrapped up and league games dominate the remainder of the schedule. West Texas A&M picked up an early LSC win to top the standings. The men's conference slate starts this week with WT at Incarnate Word. Midwestern State and WT are both unbeaten this season.

LSC men's soccer teams are 13-3-1 overall this season. The squads are currently 4-3-1 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 7-0 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

The women's teams are 9-20-2 overall this season. The squads are currently 2-9-1 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 2-4 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Dominic Furness, West Texas A&M University, SR, Midfield, Middlesbrough, England, St. David's

Scored two goals including the go-ahead goal in a 4-2 upset win at then-No. 11 Colorado Mines last Friday along with the equalizing assist early in the match. Then had his second assist on the equalizing goal at Regis on Sunday forcing a 2-2 tie. Had a team-high eight shots (.250) with five on goal (.625). Leads team with nine goals on the year, two assists and 20 points. Ranks eighth all-time in career goals with 23 and ninth all-time in points with 54.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Fernando Garza, Midwestern State University, SR, Garland, Texas, North Garland HS

Garza's solid play at left back keyed a pair of solid defensive efforts in 5th-ranked Midwestern State's victories over Newman (Kan.) and Colorado State-Pueblo last weekend. The senior from Garland helped organize a defense that allowed just five shots on frame in nearly 200 minutes of field play to produce a pair of positive results. The Mustangs rank 13th in team goals against average (0.31), 16th in shutout percentage (0.67) and 23rd in save percentage (0.857) in the latest NCAA Division II national statistical rankings.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Leslie Briggs, West Texas A&M University, SR, Forward, Carrollton, Texas, Dallas Parish Episcopal

Led the team with four goals and three assists in three games last week and a 2-1 record. Had two goals versus Texas-Permian Basin and an assist, while tallying the lone goal for the Lady Buffs versus then-No. 11 Dallas Baptist. She came back with a goal and two assists against Eastern New Mexico in WT's conference opening 3-0 win Tuesday. In just over a year for the Lady Buffs, Briggs has 19 career goals with seven assists and 45 points ranking her tied for eighth all-time in goals and 11th all-time in points.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Yvette Bedoy, West Texas A&M University, JR, Garland, Texas, South Garland HS

Between the posts, led the Lady Buffs to their first shutout win of the season. She didn't have to stop a shot in the match as the WT defense held ENMU to just two shots - one high and one wide. It was Bedoy's third career shutout.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Vincent Bailey, University of the Incarnate Word, led the Cardinals to a 2-0 week with a 5-0 win at Southern Nazarene and a 4-2 win at Oklahoma Christian. He had a goal and an assist in each game. He assisted on the team's first goal at SNU with a nice corner kick and then scored the team's third goal. He tied the OCU game with his first half goal and then assisted on the go-ahead goal in the second half. He finished the week with six points and leads the team with three goals on the season.

Aaron Douthit, Midwestern State University, scored his first goal and was credited with his first MSU assist to lead the 16th-ranked Mustangs to a 3-1 win over Colorado State-Pueblo Sunday afternoon at the MSU Soccer Field. The senior transfer midfielder from Oral Roberts controlled a loose ball in the box and found an open teammate for Midwestern's first tally in the eight minute. Then he rushed in from the right wing to score off of a David Freeland cross in the 15th minute to give MSU an early 2-0 lead. His early activity helped the Mustangs extended their home field unbeaten streak to 45 matches while improving to 3-0 on the season.

Abayneh Crosby, Eastern New Mexico University, tallied the game-winning goal in the Greyhounds victory over Adams State. He took four shots for the week, with two on goal.

Josh Ferona, University of the Incarnate Word, provided both and offensive and defensive spark for the Cardinals in their wins at Southern Nazarene and Oklahoma Christian. He scored the game-winning goal against SNU when found he got to a corner kick and put it in the net. He also was key to the team's shutout by limiting SNU to only 11 shots and two on goal. He scored his second game-winning goal against OCU with his score in the 68th minute of a 4-2 win. He played all 90 minutes in a game that the defense allowed only nine shots.

Michael Stewart, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in a stellar defensive performance, last week, to help Eastern post a 0.96 goals against average. His play helped limit the opposition to just four shots on goal per game, with only one coming in overtime against Colorado State-Pueblo. Stewart also tallied his third goal

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University men's soccer split a pair of home games, last week. On Friday, the Hounds dropped a heartbreaker, 1-0, to CSU-Pueblo in overtime, with the Thunderwolves scoring on their only shot on goal of the game. On Sunday, Eastern scored the first three goals of the game, en-route to a 5-1 win. This Wednesday, the Hounds will visit University of the Southwest.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals bounced back this week with a pair of nice road wins. First, they blew out Southern Nazarene, 5-0 and then they defeated Oklahoma Christian, 4-2. Vincent Bailey had a goal and an assist in each game. He assisted on the team's first goal at SNU with a nice corner kick and then scored the team's third goal. He tied the OCU game with his first half goal and then assisted on the go-ahead goal in the second half. He finished the week with six points and leads the team with three goals on the season. Josh Ferona provided both an offensive and defensive spark for the Cardinals in their wins at Southern Nazarene and Oklahoma Christian. He scored the game-winning goal against SNU when found he got to a corner kick and put it in the net. He also was key to the team's shutout by limiting SNU to only 11 shots and two on goal. He scored his second game-winning goal against OCU with his score in the 68th minute of a 4-2 win. He played all 90 minutes in a game that the defense allowed only nine shots. Junior GK Jarred Kahan picked up his first shutout of the season with two saves against SNU. The Cardinals had seven different goal scorers last week, including a number players who had their first career goals. Robin Nicholls had a goal and an assist against SNU and then assisted on Ferona's game-winning goal at OCU. The team opens their home schedule this week with a match against West Texas A&M on Friday.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State surged 11 spots in the latest NSCAA/Continental Tire Division II Poll after claiming wins over Newman (Kan.) and Colorado State-Pueblo last weekend... The Mustangs are the lone unbeaten and untied team remaining in the South Central Region... MSU has carried a national ranking in each of the last 69 NSCAA poll in which it was eligible including 45 of those weeks ranked in the Top 10... Midwestern has won its last six regular season contests and are 9-0-1 over their last 10 dating back to last season... The Mustangs extended the longest home field unbeaten streak in NCAA Division II to 45 matches with a 3-1 win over Colorado State-Pueblo Sunday afternoon at the MSU Soccer Field... During the streak, the Mustangs have notched 31 shutouts and are outscoring the opposition by a 137-15 margin... MSU coach Doug Elder remains the winningest active coach in all of NCAA Division II with a 187-41-19 mark (.796) since taking over the program in 2000... MSU junior goalkeeper Ray Clark ranks first in NCAA Division II with a 1.000 save percentage and a 0.00 goals against average but has had to make just three saves over two starts and 199:28 minutes this season... The Mustangs rank 13th in team goals against average (0.31), 16th in shutout percentage (0.67) and 23rd in save percentage (0.857) in the latest NCAA Division II national statistical rankings... Junior midfielder B.A. Catney scored off of a header on a corner kick in the 110th minute of MSU's 1-0 double overtime victory Friday night at Newman (Kan.)... Midwestern State outshot the Jets 35-4 with a 17-0 edge on corner kicks... Senior transfer Aaron Douthit tallied a goal and an assist to help the Mustangs to a 3-1 win over Colorado State-Pueblo Sunday afternoon at the MSU Soccer Field... Senior forward David Freeland notched an assist Sunday against Colorado State-Pueblo to give him 44 career points. He has scored 18 goals and dished out eight assists in his three seasons as a Mustang...

West Texas A&M

The West Texas A&M men's soccer team is ranked 13th this week with a 4-0-1 record. It's the highest ranking since 2007. Dominic Furness' nine goals ranks him second nationally behind Kenny Hogg of Palm Beach Atlantic who has 10 scores. No Buffalo player had more than eight goals all of last season. The Buffs have battled back in their last three matches to go 2-0-1. In each match they were down, but found a way to get the equalizer and/or game winner. Furness is eighth in school history in goals with 23 and ninth in points with 54. The 4-0-1 start is the best start by the team since going 5-0 to begin 2007. That year, the Buffs went 17-3 with a co-conference championship (SSC) and earned a berth in the NCAA Division II Regional Finals. The Buffs sure have spread the wealth this season as nine different players have scored goals and 11 have assists. As team, the Buffs have scored 19 goals 19 assists and have 57 points. Last season the team had 25 goals, 12 assists and 62 points.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Brittany Martin, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to 1-0-1 record with four goals and one assists for nine points. She got off five shots on goal and found the back of the net four times in the two games. After scoring a goal in a 2-2 tie at East Central, Martin recorded a hat-trick and an assist in a 6-0 win at Northwestern Oklahoma State. She also helped the team snap an eight game losing streak dating back to Oct. 9, 2011. On the season she leads the team with 10 points (4 goals and 2 assists) and is one point away from matching her season total from 2011.

Krysta Grimm, Abilene Christian University, scored both of ACU's goals Sunday in the Wildcats win over Missouri Southern of The MIAA. The victory was ACU's first over the Lions in three chances. For Grimm, the goals were her first of the season and 16th and 17th of her four-year career. She currently ranks fifth on ACU's all-time goals list and needs one more to tie Lyndsey Womack for fourth place. Grimm's multi-goal match also was the third of her career. She had two last season against Texas A&M-International and Angelo State. Grimm

Angela Sandoval, Eastern New Mexico University, helped the offense get going this week with their first two goals of the season in a 2-0 win over Adams State. Midfielder Angela Sandoval recorded the first goal of the season in the 40th minute of play. Her goal was good for the game winning goal.

Erin Bolinger, Texas Woman's University, was the leader on defense for the Pioneers and helped the team snap an eight-game losing streak with an 1-0-1 record over the weekend. She helped team to a 2-2 tie at East Central and a 6-0 win at Northwestern Oklahoma State. Bolinger helped TWU post a shutout for the first time since Oct. 15, 2010, when the Pioneers played Northeastern State to a 0-0 tie. The freshman defender started all four games this season and matched up against the top scorers.

Xan Ortiz, Eastern New Mexico University, collected her first win and shutout of the season last week. The Zias hosted Adams State University and collected a 2-0 victory. With the win, Ortiz made five saves cleared the ball during multiple scoring threats. In three games, Ortiz played 225 minutes, made 14 saves and picked up a shutout.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats posted their second straight 1-1 weekend and are off to their first 2-2 start since 2009. ACU began its trip to Joplin, Mo., with a 2-0 neutral-site loss to Nebraska-Kearney, but responded well with a 2-0 win over Missouri Southern Sunday. Senior forward Krysta Grimm scored both goals while the defensive effort was led by senior Arielle Moncure's six saves. Junior Ashley Craig assisted on Grimm's insurance goal in the second half vs. the Lions. ACU begins its 2012 Lone Star Conference season on the road at Incarnate Word and Angelo State.

Angelo State

The Rambelles evened their overall record with a pair of losses in Colorado last weekend. ASU (2-2-0) dropped its first game in a 0-2 decision to Colorado Mesa and then a 0-3 final to No. 5 Fort Lewis. The Rambelles attempted 16 shots in the games but were unable to find the back of the nets. ASU returns to action this weekend with a 5 p.m. game on Friday against Midwestern State before hosting Abilene Christian at 1 p.m. on Sunday.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-2 on the week and picked up their first win of the season against Adams State University before falling in LSC play. In the victory over Adams State, the Zias collected their first two goals of the season off the boots of sophomore Angela Sandoval and senior Danielle Thurman. Following their win at home, the Zias traveled to Canyon, Texas and fell in their LSC opener to West Texas A&M.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals opened the season with a pair of 1-goal losses to Regis and Metro State at the St. Edward's Tournament. In the opener against Regis, Sydney Solomon tied the game with her goal in the 84th minute. Unfortunately, Regis won the game on a goal with 35 seconds remaining. In the second game, the Cardinals trailed by two goals on two occasions, but kept fighting back. Amber Guenther's goal with two

minutes remaining made it 3-2, Metro State, but the Cards could not get the tying goal. Freshmen Heather Kowalik and Karly Brightwell each were given a chance to start one game. Kowalik allowed two goals and made six saves while Brightwell allowed three goals and made two saves. The Cardinals are at home this week on Friday against Abilene Christian and Sunday against Midwestern State.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State suffered a pair of defeats to No. 15 Central Oklahoma (3-1) and Southwestern Oklahoma (2-0) last weekend in the Fischer Classic in Edmond... The Mustangs are 0-4 for the first time in program and have only winless at 0-2-1 through three matches just one other time in school history in 2005. That team rallied to go 6-3 in LSC play advancing all the way to the tournament championship game... Midwestern had never lost four consecutive matches prior to this season... The longest winless stretch in program came in an 0-4-1 stretch from Sep. 14-23, 2001... Southwestern Oklahoma defeated the Mustangs for the first time in 14 tries in a series dominated by MSU since 1998. The Mustangs had outscored SWOSU 44-4 with nine shutouts in the previous 13 meetings... Midwestern has let in 11 goals during a four-game stretch for the first time since allowing 18 goals in the first four matches of the 2000 season. The Mustangs had allowed just 16 goals in 2011, 15 in 2010 and 12 in 2009... Senior midfielder Megan Barnhart banged in her second career goal in Friday's 3-1 loss at No. 15 Central Oklahoma. It was her first tally since scoring in a 5-0 win over West Texas A&M on Oct. 7, 2011... Senior goalkeeper Mallory Whitworth became just the fifth goalkeeper in MSU history to mass 200 career saves Friday night against Central Oklahoma and now has 206...

The TWU soccer team tied at East Central, 2-2, on Friday and then captured a 6-0 win at Northwestern Oklahoma State on Sunday. The victory against NWOS also snapped a nine-game winless streak for the Pioneers dating back to Oct. 9, 2011. The six goals scored were the most for TWU since Sept. 11, 2005 when the Pioneers netted a school-record 14 goals against Texas Southern. TWU's last shutout came on Oct. 15, 2010, when the Pioneers played Northeastern State to a 0-0 tie and the team's last shutout win came on Oct. 1, 2010, at Eastern New Mexico in a 1-0 decision. Senior Brittany Martin recorded four goals and an assist for nine points in the two games. She got off five shots on goal and found the back of the net four times. After scoring a goal in a 2-2 tie at ECU, Martin recorded a hat-trick and an assist in a 6-0 win at NWOS. Senior Katy Black also recorded four points against Northwestern Oklahoma State with a goal and two assists. The Pioneers will head to New Mexico to open their Lone Star Conference schedule on Friday, Sept. 14. TWU will face Eastern New Mexico at 5:00 p.m. (CST) on Friday.

West Texas A&M

Graduate Leslie Briggs continues her impressive start this season as she scored four goals and tallied three assists this past week at the Lady Buffs went 2-1. The Lady Buff defense stood tall against Texas-Permian Basin and Eastern New Mexico as it held both teams to just two shots. The 3-0 win over ENMU Tuesday was the first shutout win for the Lady Buffs this

season. The 3-0 win over ENMU was the first time since 2010 that the Lady Buffs have began conference play with a win. Last season ENMU snapped a seven-match skid with a 2-1 win in the opener versus WT.
