LSC FOOTBALL

This week features four Lone Star Conference games including the first of five games to be web streamed live on FoxSportsSouthwest.com. The league will show Midwestern State at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sept. 22) live on the FSW website. Upcoming broadcasts include: Texas A&M-Commerce at Incarnate Word (Oct. 6); Abilene Christian at West Texas A&M (Oct. 13); Eastern New Mexico at Midwestern State (Oct. 27); and Angelo State at Tarleton State (Nov. 10).

The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

WTAMU and ENMU top the LSC standings after victories over TAMUK and UIW, respectively, last week.

LSC football teams are 12-13 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Taylor Gabriel, Abilene Christian University, JR, WR, Mesquite, Texas, Horn HS

Gabriel's day spurred the Wildcats to a 34-31 come-from-behind win over Tarleton State at Cowboys Stadium on Saturday in what could be the final meeting between the two long-time rivals. Gabriel had just five catches for 50 yards, but he had three catches for 27 yards and two touchdowns in the second half, including a 16-yard TD catch on third-and-goal in the fourth quarter that gave the Wildcats the lead for good. His first big play of the second half came when he returned the Texans' second punt of the half 54 yards, setting the Wildcats for the go-ahead score. Gabriel capped the go-ahead scoring drive with a 4-yard TD reception with 4:03 left in the third quarter to give the Wildcats a 24-20 lead.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Taylor McCuller, West Texas A&M University, JR, LB, Red Oak, Texas, Red Oak HS

Had a game-high 15 tackles including eight solo stops in a 40-10 win over No. 14 Texas A&M-Kingsville Saturday. He had a half of a sack for four yards and 1.5 tackles for loss for seven yards. He and the Buff defense had 13 tackles for loss for 40 yards and two total sacks for 13 yards. The Buffs' D stymied TAMUK all night as it held the Javelinas to 285 yards of offense, well below their 365 yard average coming into the game.

Neiko Conway, Midwestern State University, JR, CB, Houston, Texas, Lamar

Collected three of the seven turnovers taken by the No. 16 Mustangs in the 65-14 win over Texas A&M-Commerce. Conway intercepted a pass on the first play of the second half and returned it 32-yards for a touchdown that started a 35-point third quarter for MSU. It was MSU's first interception return for a touchdown since Oct. 23, 2010 when Zak Bracken had a 20-yard scoring return at West Texas A&M. The interception return moved him to 182 career interception return yardage to set a new MSU record. Conway moved to fifth on the MSU career interception list with his seventh career pickoff. Additionally, he recovered two fumbles that led to MSU points. His two fumble recoveries are more than anyone in the LSC this season. Conway recorded two solo tackles and added a pass breakup to the interception for a touchdown and fumble recoveries.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Marcus Wright, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, PR/KR, San Antonio, Texas, Reagan HS

Wright returned the opening kickoff 83 yards for a touchdown against Eastern New Mexico. It was the first UIW kickoff return for a touchdown in the program's history. Wright also set the school record for longest kick return beating Jacob Love's 66-yard return.

- Three LSC teams are ranked in AFCA poll (Sept. 15) with No. 15 Midwestern State, No. 19 Abilene Christian and No. 25 West Texas A&M.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Khiry Robinson, West Texas A&M University, in his first game of the season, Robinson led the team on the ground with 110 yards and a score for a 6.5 average. He also had three catches for 28 yards. The Buffs racked up 112 total rushing yards on the league's second-best rushing defense and 14th-ranked team in the country. He led with a game-high 228 all-purpose yards as he had 90 punt return yards.

De'Coreyon Thomas, Eastern New Mexico University, posted career-highs in rushing yards (115) and all-purpose yards (139), in leading the Greyhounds to a win over Incarnate Word. On the game-winning drive, he had three carries for 39 yards, with a five-yard touchdown run, to put ENMU ahead, 28-24. Thomas's broke his longest run of the game on that possession, for 30 yards, in addition to hauling in a 24-yard reception, two plays later.

Chauncey Harris, Midwestern State University, the fourth running back for the 16th ranked Mustangs used four only carries to amass 148 yards to lead Midwestern's 376-yard rushing attack in the 65-14 win over Texas A&M-Commerce in the Lone Star Football Festival at Cowboys Stadium. Harris led all collegiate rushers at the Lone Star Football Festival and broke off touchdown runs of 55 and 59 yards in the third quarter to go with his runs of 16 and 18 yards that set up an end-of-half field goal in the second quarter. His 148 yards puts him at the top of the MSU rushing list with the sixth most rushing yards gained in the conference.

Aaron Doyle, Tarleton State University, amassed over 400 yards on Saturday, completing 39 of his passes for 377 yards and rushing for 35 yards on nine carries. The Evant native scored Tarleton's lone touchdown on the ground and had a pair of TD passes in the contest as well. Doyle stayed poised in the pocket as he was held without a sack on the day and just one interception.

Sherman Batiste, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas with 86 yards receiving on Saturday and now has 214 yards in the last two games. He caught a 6-yard TD pass early in the fourth quarter and also had a 30-yard reception.

C.J. Akins, Angelo State University, eclipsed the 100-yard receiving yard mark for the first time this season against No. 18 Valdosta State. He caught six passes for 114 yards and one touchdown. He led all receivers with 114 yards and averaged 19 yards per catch.

L.B. Suggs, Abilene Christian University, finished with a game-high 11 tackles in Saturday's 34-31 come-from-behind win over Tarleton State. But it wasn't a tackle from Suggs that turned the game in ACU's favor, but a tipped ball. Late in the first half with the Wildcats trailing 20-10 after a field goal, Tarleton was driving back down the field looking to extend its lead before the break. But near the goal line, Suggs tipped an Aaron Doyle pass near the goal line, knocking it up in the air and allowing teammate Thor Woerner to pick it off and keeping ACU's halftime deficit at 10 points. The Wildcats outscored the Texans 24-11 in the second half to pull out the win.

Jayson Serda, Eastern New Mexico University, made nine tackles in the Greyhounds' 34-24 win over Incarnate Word at the Lone Star Conference Football Festival. He also stepped in front of a third-down pass, late in the game and made a game-saving interception, which he returned 81 yards for the touchdown. He also returned a punt, two kickoffs and deflected a pass attempt. For the game, Serda posed 114 all-purpose yards.

Jeremy Aguilar, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelina defense in tackles for the second straight week and added his first sack of the season.

Rufus Johnson, Tarleton State University, gave the ACU O-line fits on Saturday, sacking Wildcats quarterback Gale Mitchell three times on the afternoon for a total loss of 13 yards. He sacked the QB on the first play from scrimmage for ACU and then followed with a pair of sacks in the second half. Johnson had four tackles on the day - all of the solo variety.

Khiry Robinson, West Texas A&M University, had three punt returns for 90 yards, including a 61-yard return setting up a field goal for a 10-3 lead in the second quarter.

Blake Barnes, Tarleton State University, just a freshman, on one of the biggest stages in the country, he nailed all three of his field goal attempts on Saturday. He went a perfect 3-for-3 while netting field goals from distances of 25, 28 and a career-high 41 yards. The Stephenville native was perfect in PAT's as well, collecting both extra-point attempts and scoring 11 points on the day for the Texans.

Greg Saladino, Midwestern State University, tied the school record for 16th ranked Midwestern State for field goals in a game with his three against Texas A&M-Commerce in the Lone Star Football Festival at Cowboys Stadium. Saladino was perfect on kicks from 29, 25 and 37 yards (all in the first half) and added four point-after-touchdown kicks to total 13 kicking points, the most in the LSC this season and one shy of a school record he already owns. He handled the place kicking duties through first two minutes of the third quarter, including kickoffs. Of his six kickoffs, two were touchbacks and only one of the other four were returned beyond the 20, and that to the 21. Saladino also punted for the Mustangs, with two punts for a 40.5 average with a long of 43 and one inside the 20.

Dylan Baca, Eastern New Mexico University, averaged 43.5 yards on four punts, with three being downed inside the Incarnate Word 20-yard line. He also had one touchback on his kickoffs.

Abilene Christian

Mitchell Gale rallied the Wildcats on Saturday to a 34-31 come-from behind win over Tarleton State at Cowboys Stadium in what could be the final meeting ever between these two long-time Lone Star Conference rivals. ... After a rough first half (12 of 22 for 122 yards), Gale was on target throughout the game's final 30 minutes, finishing the second 15 of 20 for 157 yards and two scores. ... He directed the Wildcats to 24 second-half points as they scored on four straight drives in the second half. Gale hooked up with his favorite target, junior wide receiver Taylor Gabriel, for a pair of second-half touchdown passes. ... Those two have connected for touchdowns four times in two games at Cowboys Stadium, more than any other QB-WR duo in college football. ... Gale recorded the sixth second-half comeback of his career on Saturday as he led the Wildcats back from a 10-point deficit to the three-point win. ... He's also led second-half comebacks at Midwestern State (2009 playoffs), vs. Midwestern State (2010 regular season), at West Texas A&M (2010 regular season), at Tarleton State (2011 regular season) and at Texas A&M-Kingsville (2011 regular season). ... Gabriel's day spurred the Wildcats to a 34-31 come-from-behind win over Tarleton State at Cowboys Stadium on Saturday in what

Late in the first half with the Wildcats trailing 20-10 after a field goal, Tarleton was driving back down the field looking to extend its lead before the break. But near the goal line, Suggs tipped an Aaron Doyle pass near the goal line, knocking it up in the air and allowing teammate Thor Woerner to pick it off and keeping ACU's halftime deficit at 10 points. The Wildcats outscored the Texans 24-11 in the second half to pull out the win. ... The ACU defense has been on the field for 95 minutes, 40 seconds of a possible 180 minutes of game time through three games and opponents have already run off 256 plays for 1,277 yards (425.7 yards per game or 5.0 yards per play). ... Opponents are converting 36.4 percent of third-down plays (20 of 55), although that number grows to 47.2 percent (17 of 36) over the last two weeks against Texas A&M-Kingsville (8 of 20) and Tarleton State (9 of 16). ... However, in Saturday's win over Tarleton State, the defense shut that down in the second half. ... The Texans were 7 of 10 on third downs in the first half, but only 2 of 6 converting those plays in the second half. ... With Saturday's 34-31 win over Tarleton State, Abilene Christian became just the sixth college football program in the state to win games at both Cowboys Stadium and the Cotton Bowl. ... ACU beat Texas A&M-Commerce, 20-14, in overtime in 2009 and then won Saturday's game to join Texas, Baylor, Texas Tech and TCU as the only programs in Texas to have won a game in both venues. ... For the second straight season the Wildcats had to rally from a halftime deficit to beat Tarleton State. ... Last year the Wildcats 14-10 at halftime and 24-20 late in the game before a Mitchell Gale-to-Daryl Richardson touchdown pass gave the Wildcats the 27-24 victory. ... After two games at Cowboys Stadium, the Wildcats hold several stadium records for collegiate football, including team pass attempts (101), completions (62) and passing yards (669) and offensive plays (155). ... Gale holds stadium collegiate records for attempts (101), completions (62), yards (669), total offensive plays (120) and total yards (697). ... Taylor Gabriel is the collegiate stadium leader in points by a receiver (24), and he's tied for the most receiving touchdowns (four). ... Senior placekicker Morgan Lineberry is the leader in points by a kicker (15).

Angelo State

The Rams marched 73 yards in 13 plays to score on a 24-yard field goal from Jarred Martin against No. 18 Valdosta State. It is the first time this season the Rams have scored on an opening drive. The Rams are also outscoring opponents 17-7 in the first quarter this season ... Senior C.J. Akins made some athletic catches against a talented Valdosta State defense. He hauled in six catches and led all receivers with 114 yards. His one touchdown came on a 19-yard pass from Blake Hamlin on the first drive of the third quarter. He is the second Ram to top the century mark in receiving yards as Joey Knight had 111 yards

against Western State ... Dakarai Pecikonis caught his 100th reception on a 29 yard drag route late in the fourth quarter against Valdosta State. The junior has 17 catches this season and is now 83 behind Ram all-time leader Don Burrell ... Sophomore Rush Seaver is averaging 11.67 tackles per game and is the Lone Star Conference's leading tackler through three weeks. He is tied for 13th nationally. His career high for tackles is 14 set against Western State earlier this year. ... Blake Hamlin has thrown for 2,212 passing yards so far in his career. He passed Mark Embry during the Valdosta State game and is now No. 14 on the Ram all-time career passing yard list. Hamlin is only 38 yards from moving up to No. 13 and has the chance to move up to No. 11 by the end of the season.

Eastern New Mexico

After giving up a game-opening kickoff return for a score, the Greyhounds rallied to claim a 34-24 win over Incarnate Word as part of the Lone Star Conference Football Festival at Cowboys Stadium. De'Coreyon Thomas rushed for a career-best 115 yards and 39 yards on the game-winning drive. With Incarnate Word in scoring territory at the end of the game, poised to take the lead, Jayson Serda stepped in front of a third-down pass and returned the interception 81 yards for the Greyhound touchdown. Linvel Mosby paced the defense with 10 tackles, while Willie Grant came up with two interceptions. In the game, the Hounds were a season-best +3 on turnover differential. This week, the Greyhounds will visit Tarleton State.

Incarnate Word

A Heartbreaker The Cardinals played a back-and-forth game against Eastern New Mexico at Cowboys Stadium last week that ended in heartbreak. Trailing 28-24 with 30 seconds remaining in the game they faced a third-and-8 at the ENMU 21-yard line. Quarterback Zach Rhodes went to pass toward the sideline, but it was picked off by Jayson Serda and returned 81 yards for a clinching touchdown for the Greyhounds. The loss dropped the Cards to 1-2 all-time against the Hounds. Playing the Buffs West Texas A&M is 2-1 on the season and coming off a 40-10 win over #14 Texas A&M-Kingsville last week. They have a high-powered offense directed by quarterback Dustin Vaughn. He is averaging 352.3 passing yards per game while completing over 65 percent of his passes. He has an 11-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio. The Buffs are 2-0 all-time against the Cardinals winning 49-10 in 2010 in San Antonio and 52-7 last year in Canyon. The Buffs have a pair of wide receivers, Torrance Allen and Lance Ratliff, who combine for over 200 yards per game and they just got back starting running back Khiry Robinson back from suspension. He ran for 110 yards in his first game back. Setting a Record The Cardinals set a pair of offensive team records in their loss to Eastern New Mexico. The first one happened on the opening kickoff when Marcus Wright returned the kick 83 yards for a touchdown. It was the first UIW kickoff return for a touchdown in the program's history. Wright also set the school record for longest kick return beating Jacob Love's 66-yard return. The second record the Cardinals set took the entire game to fulfill. The team carried the ball 35 teams for 270 yards. That computes to a 7.7 yards per carry average and shattered the previous record set on October 24, 2009 in a game at Southwest Assemblies of God when the Cards averaged 6.4 yards per carry. Running Past Two Grand Senior running back Trent Rios had a big game on Friday rushing 20 times for 121 yards. It was the seventh time in his career that he surpassed 100 rushing yards in a game and first time this season.

It was the second time he has gone over 100 yards against the Greyhounds. He also rushed for 202 yards against ENMU last year in the only other game he has played against them. However, the big news was that on his second carry of the game, a 36-yard gain, he went over 2,000 career rushing yards. Rios is the first player in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and now has 2,102 career yards rushing. This year he is averaging a career high 4.3 yards per carry. He is also nearing 4,000 career all-purpose yards. He had a season high 187 on Friday and now has 3,769 for his career.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State never trailed in beating A&M-Commerce 65-14 to open the Lone Star Football Festival in front of a CBS Sports Network national TV audience on Thursday at Cowboys Stadium ... the 65 points by MSU are the most by an LSC team this season ... MSU rushed for 376 yards as a team to lead all teams at the LSFF ... Chauncey Harris, MSU's fourth running back, led all collegiate rushers at the LSFF with 148 yards on just four carries with runs of 16 and 18 yards before scoring runs of 55 and 59 yards. Those were his first carries since Nov. 13, 2010 ... MSU is now 2-0 at Cowboys Stadium and is averaging 64.0 points a game at Jerry World ... Junior Brad Dittmar caught the first pass of his career for a 7-yard touchdown against A&M-C. Dittmar moved to tight end this season after coming back from a season-ending knee injury in Sep. 2010 and rehabbing in 2011 ... MSU has scored 10 of the 11 times its hit the red zone (91 percent), with six touchdowns and four field goals ... Neiko Conway's 32-yard interception return for a touchdown gave the Houston junior the MSU record for career interception return yardage. Conway now has 182 interception return yards on seven interceptions (the seven picks are fifth all-time) ... Ricardo Riascos 12-yard interception return for a touchdown, his first collegiate score. He now has two on the season in two games to lead the LSC at 1.0 per game ... The two interception returns for touchdowns against A&M-C mark the first time since resuming football in 1988 that MSU has returned two picks in the same game ... the Mustangs also have already tied their season record for interception touchdowns in a season joining the 1990, 2000, 2005 and 2010 teams ... The four interceptions against the Lions also is the most in a game since MSU snared five passes at Eastern New Mexico on Sep. 11, 2010 ... Saturday's game against Texas A&M-Kingsville is the 14th game between the schools with MSU holding a 7-6 series lead ... Midwestern has won six of the last seven meetings ... With the new artificial turf at Kingsville, Midwestern will not play a regular season game on a grass field in 2012 ...

Tarleton State

For the second-straight season, the Tarleton Texans took a lead into the locker room against ACU, but just like the 2011 season - the Wildcats got the best of the Texans in the second half... Tarleton took a

could be the final meeting between the two long-time rivals. ... Gabriel had just five catches for 50 yards, but he had three catches for 27 yards and two touchdowns in the second half, including a 16-yard TD catch on third-and-goal in the fourth quarter that gave the Wildcats the lead for good. ... His first big play of the second half came when he returned the Texans' second punt of the half 54 yards, setting the Wildcats for the go-ahead score. ... Gabriel capped the go-ahead scoring drive with a 4-yard TD reception with 4:03 left in the third quarter to give the Wildcats a 24-20 lead. ... ACU safety L.B. Suggs finished with a game-high 11 tackles in Saturday's 34-31 come-from-behind win over Tarleton State. But it wasn't a tackle from Suggs that turned the game in ACU's favor, but a tipped ball. ... Late in the first half with the Wildcats trailing 20-10 after a field goal, Tarleton was driving back down the field looking to extend its lead before the break. But near the goal line, Suggs tipped an Aaron Doyle pass near the goal line, knocking it up in the air and allowing teammate Thor Woerner to pick it off and keeping ACU's halftime deficit at 10 points. The Wildcats outscored the Texans 24-11 in the second half to pull out the win. ... The ACU defense has been on the field for 95 minutes, 40 seconds of a possible 180 minutes of game time through three games and opponents have already run off 256 plays for 1,277 yards (425.7 yards per game or 5.0 yards per play). ... Opponents are converting 36.4 percent of third-down plays (20 of 55), although that number grows to 47.2 percent (17 of 36) over the last two weeks against Texas A&M-Kingsville (8 of 20) and Tarleton State (9 of 16). ... However, in Saturday's win over Tarleton State, the defense shut that down in the second half. ... The Texans were 7 of 10 on third downs in the first half, but only 2 of 6 converting those plays in the second half. ... With Saturday's 34-31 win over Tarleton State, Abilene Christian became just the sixth college football program in the state to win games at both Cowboys Stadium and the Cotton Bowl. ... ACU beat Texas A&M-Commerce, 20-14, in overtime in 2009 and then won Saturday's game to join Texas, Baylor, Texas Tech and TCU as the only programs in Texas to have won a game in both venues. ... For the second straight season the Wildcats had to rally from a halftime deficit to beat Tarleton State. ... Last year the Wildcats 14-10 at halftime and 24-20 late in the game before a Mitchell Gale-to-Daryl Richardson touchdown pass gave the Wildcats the 27-24 victory. ... After two games at Cowboys Stadium, the Wildcats hold several stadium records for collegiate football, including team pass attempts (101), completions (62) and passing yards (669) and offensive plays (155). ... Gale holds stadium collegiate records for attempts (101), completions (62), yards (669), total offensive plays (120) and total yards (697). ... Taylor Gabriel is the collegiate stadium leader in points by a receiver (24), and he's tied for the most receiving touchdowns (four). ... Senior placekicker Morgan Lineberry is the leader in points by a kicker (15).

Angelo State

The Rams marched 73 yards in 13 plays to score on a 24-yard field goal from Jarred Martin against No. 18 Valdosta State. It is the first time this season the Rams have scored on an opening drive. The Rams are also outscoring opponents 17-7 in the first quarter this season ... Senior C.J. Akins made some athletic catches against a talented Valdosta State defense. He hauled in six catches and led all receivers with 114 yards. His one touchdown came on a 19-yard pass from Blake Hamlin on the first drive of the third quarter. He is the second Ram to top the century mark in receiving yards as Joey Knight had 111 yards

against Western State ... Dakarai Pecikonis caught his 100th reception on a 29 yard drag route late in the fourth quarter against Valdosta State. The junior has 17 catches this season and is now 83 behind Ram all-time leader Don Burrell ... Sophomore Rush Seaver is averaging 11.67 tackles per game and is the Lone Star Conference's leading tackler through three weeks. He is tied for 13th nationally. His career high for tackles is 14 set against Western State earlier this year. ... Blake Hamlin has thrown for 2,212 passing yards so far in his career. He passed Mark Embry during the Valdosta State game and is now No. 14 on the Ram all-time career passing yard list. Hamlin is only 38 yards from moving up to No. 13 and has the chance to move up to No. 11 by the end of the season.

Eastern New Mexico

After giving up a game-opening kickoff return for a score, the Greyhounds rallied to claim a 34-24 win over Incarnate Word as part of the Lone Star Conference Football Festival at Cowboys Stadium. De'Coreyon Thomas rushed for a career-best 115 yards and 39 yards on the game-winning drive. With Incarnate Word in scoring territory at the end of the game, poised to take the lead, Jayson Serda stepped in front of a third-down pass and returned the interception 81 yards for the Greyhound touchdown. Linvel Mosby paced the defense with 10 tackles, while Willie Grant came up with two interceptions. In the game, the Hounds were a season-best +3 on turnover differential. This week, the Greyhounds will visit Tarleton State.

Incarnate Word

A Heartbreaker The Cardinals played a back-and-forth game against Eastern New Mexico at Cowboys Stadium last week that ended in heartbreak. Trailing 28-24 with 30 seconds remaining in the game they faced a third-and-8 at the ENMU 21-yard line. Quarterback Zach Rhodes went to pass toward the sideline, but it was picked off by Jayson Serda and returned 81 yards for a clinching touchdown for the Greyhounds. The loss dropped the Cards to 1-2 all-time against the Hounds. Playing the Buffs West Texas A&M is 2-1 on the season and coming off a 40-10 win over #14 Texas A&M-Kingsville last week. They have a high-powered offense directed by quarterback Dustin Vaughn. He is averaging 352.3 passing yards per game while completing over 65 percent of his passes. He has an 11-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio. The Buffs are 2-0 all-time against the Cardinals winning 49-10 in 2010 in San Antonio and 52-7 last year in Canyon. The Buffs have a pair of wide receivers, Torrance Allen and Lance Ratliff, who combine for over 200 yards per game and they just got back starting running back Khiry Robinson back from suspension. He ran for 110 yards in his first game back. Setting a Record The Cardinals set a pair of offensive team records in their loss to Eastern New Mexico. The first one happened on the opening kickoff when Marcus Wright returned the kick 83 yards for a touchdown. It was the first UIW kickoff return for a touchdown in the program's history. Wright also set the school record for longest kick return beating Jacob Love's 66-yard return. The second record the Cardinals set took the entire game to fulfill. The team carried the ball 35 teams for 270 yards. That computes to a 7.7 yards per carry average and shattered the previous record set on October 24, 2009 in a game at Southwest Assemblies of God when the Cards averaged 6.4 yards per carry. Running Past Two Grand Senior running back Trent Rios had a big game on Friday rushing 20 times for 121 yards. It was the seventh time in his career that he surpassed 100 rushing yards in a game and first time this season.

It was the second time he has gone over 100 yards against the Greyhounds. He also rushed for 202 yards against ENMU last year in the only other game he has played against them. However, the big news was that on his second carry of the game, a 36-yard gain, he went over 2,000 career rushing yards. Rios is the first player in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and now has 2,102 career yards rushing. This year he is averaging a career high 4.3 yards per carry. He is also nearing 4,000 career all-purpose yards. He had a season high 187 on Friday and now has 3,769 for his career.

Junior Brad Dittmar caught the first pass of his career for a 7-yard touchdown against A&M-C. Dittmar moved to tight end this season after coming back from a season-ending knee injury in Sep. 2010 and rehabbing in 2011 ... MSU has scored 10 of the 11 times its hit the red zone (91 percent), with six touchdowns and four field goals ... Neiko Conway's 32-yard interception return for a touchdown gave the Houston junior the MSU record for career interception return yardage. Conway now has 182 interception return yards on seven interceptions (the seven picks are fifth all-time) ... Ricardo Riascos 12-yard interception return for a touchdown, his first collegiate score. He now has two on the season in two games to lead the LSC at 1.0 per game ... He now has 1,708 yards receiving becoming the eighth play in program history to reach the mark. Batiste is on pace to become the sixth-member of the 2,000-yard receiving club. With 19 catches this season he has 135 in his career to tie him with David Hill for fifth most receptions in school history. Teammate Robert Armstrong – a junior – has 17 receptions and is eighth on the list with 135 catches in just over two seasons. With two receiving TDs the receiver is tied for eighth with Maurice Washington in TD catches with 16... West Texas A&M ended the Javelina season-opening winning streak at two games for the second straight year at the Lone Star Conference Football Festival. Last year, the Javelinas were nipped by Midwestern State in the following game 44-38 in Wichita Falls a loss the team will be out to avenge this weekend...The Javelinas will be finishing their run of three straight games against teams picked ahead of them in the Lone Star Conference preseason poll. They are 1-1 in the stretch thus far with a win over Abilene Christian and a loss to West Texas A&M...In the first two games of the season, the Javelinas forced four more turnovers than their opponents. Saturday in Arlington the turnover margin was in favor of the Buffaloes. The turnovers led directly to 16 points for West Texas... Jonathan Woodson had 94 yards in kickoff returns Saturday and finished with 171 yards of total offense. He also had 36 yards rushing and 38 receiving. With 318 all-purpose yards in the first three games of the season, Woodson now has 4,518 career all-purpose yards to become the fourth player in Javelina history to break 4,500...Ten different players have posted a sack this season with Marquise Singleton the lone Javelina with two. With 3.5 tackles for a loss Singleton is second to newcomer Cornelius Shackelford in tackles for a loss...Jeremy Aguilar continues to be a force to be reckoned with in the Javelina defense. He is tops on the team in tackles with 22, has one of the team's three INTs, forced and recovered a fumble at Abilene Christian, has one sack and 1.5 tackles for a loss. He now has 113 career tackles.

West Texas A&M

Don Carthel won his 69th game Saturday as the head coach of the Buffaloes versus Texas A&M-Kingsville

breaking the all-time school record for wins by a coach set by Joe Kerbel with 68...For the second consecutive year the Buffs have played spoilers to TAMUK as they upset the then-No. 5 ranked Javelinas last season and 14th-ranked TAMUK this season...In addition, in both games in 2011 and 2012, the Buffs put 40 or more points on TAMUK...Senior running back Khiry Robinson saw his first action of the season with 110 yards rushing, a touchdown and 90 yards in three punt returns...TAMUK is the first ranked team the Buffs have beaten since knocking off Central Missouri in the Kanza Bowl last season and the highest ranked team since beating the Javelinas (then-No. 5) last season...The Buff defense dominated the game against TAMUK as it held the fourth-best scoring offense in the league (25.5) to 10 points and held the third-best total offense in the league (365.0) to just 285 yards...The defense also stymied quarterback Nate Poppell who entered ranked second in the league in passing at 265.5 yards per game as the Buffs held him to 188 yards a touchdown and a pick...Conversely, the Buff offense had 112 yards on the ground as TAMUK entered with the second-best rush defense at 92.5 yards per game...No drive for the Buffs lasted longer than four minutes in the game as the longest was a 3:32 drive for a touchdown in the fourth quarter, while the shortest scoring drive was a 32 second drive on three plays for 44 yards and a touchdown after a TAMUK fumble...The Buff D had 13 tackles for loss for 40 yards which was a season-high.
