LSC VOLLEYBALL

Lone Star Conference volleyball teams started league play last week, and continue LSC matches this week. Five teams jumped out to unbeaten starts, with Texas A&M-Commerce, Angelo State, Texas Woman's, Tarleton State and West Texas A&M posting wins. Action among those teams this week includes Tarleton at ASU and TWU facing A&M-C on Tuesday; WT at A&M-C Friday and WT at TWU Saturday.

LSC volleyball teams are 65-45 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-15 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 7-6 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Halie Harton, West Texas A&M University, JR, Roswell, N.M., Goddard HS

Harton continued to lead the injury ridden No. 7 Lady Buffs' offense this past weekend as WT swept rival Abilene Christian to open up LSC play before registering sweeps of Southwestern Oklahoma State and St. Edward's on Saturday in Canyon. Harton registered 53 kills for an average of 5.89 per set for an attack percentage of .321 to go along with 21 digs and five block assists. Harton registered a career high 21 kills against SWOSU on Saturday afternoon, hitting an incredible .472 for the match.

Katie Covell, Tarleton State University, SO, Lytle, Texas, Lytle HS

Covell led the TexAnns in points this weekend as Tarleton swept Midwestern State and Cameron to extend their winning streak to five - including four straight sweeps. The sophomore from Lytle led Tarleton with 26 kills (4.33 per set) and 29.5 points (4.92 per set). In addition to leading the team in kills, Covell only committed eight hitting errors in six sets for a .300 hitting percentage.

DEFENSIVE

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, SR, Hereford, Texas, Hereford HS

Beville continued to be a force on the back row for the No. 7 Lady Buffs this past weekend as they went 3-0 with sweeps of Abilene Christian, Southwestern Oklahoma State and St. Edward's in Canyon. Beville registered 55 digs for an average of 6.11 per set. With her 55 digs in this past weekend, Beville sits in 3rd place all-time with 1,933 career digs to move past former Lady Buff great Shannon Stroud (1,801). Beville is just 217 digs away from 2nd place (Brittani Bell - 2,150) and 315 away from first (Sara Contreras - 2,248).

Chloe' Tate, Texas Woman's University, JR, Denton, Texas, Billy Ryan HS

Tate recorded a team-best 12 total blocks and 32.5 points to lead the Pioneers to 2-0 record on the road over the weekend. She had 13 kills and four total blocks in a sweep at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Friday and then added 11 kills and eight total blocks in a four-set win at Incarnate Word on Saturday. On the season Tate leads the Pioneers with 34 total blocks. She currently ranked fourth in the conference in blocks, seventh in hitting percentage and 10th in points.

SETTER

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, SR, Plano, Texas, Plano East HS

Woolsey had a milestone weekend for the Belles as she passed the 4,000 assists mark in her career in last Friday's win over Cameron. The senior setter continued her strong play on Saturday to help the Belles sweep Midwestern State and finished the weekend with 68 assists to direct ASU which hit .307 as a team. She had 11.33 assists per set and also had 11 digs.

Jordan Neal, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Joshua, Texas, Joshua HS

Jordan played a key role in helping A&M-Commerce to a 2-0 start in Lone Star Conference play, finishing with 63 assists (10.5 per set), seven aces, 23 digs and five blocks in helping the Lions to 3-0 road sweeps over Incarnate Word and A&M-Kingsville. Neal was solid all week, pacing the Lions to a .217 hitting percentage, dishing out

29 assists, five aces and 12 digs against the Cardinals, followed the next afternoon with 34 digs, 2 aces and 11 digs against the Javelinas. On the year she is averaging 10.5 assists per set, helping pace A&M-Commerce to its best start since 2002.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, paced all hitters in their one match against ACU last week. In five sets, Barron pounded out a game-high, and season-high, 20 kills and 4.00 kills per set. Barron's 20 kills were good for only the third 20 kill match this season. In addition, Barron played all the way around for the Zias and posted six digs, two blocks, and a service ace.

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, recorded her third triple-double of the season to lead the Pioneers to 2-0 record on the road over the weekend. She posted nine kills, 15 assists and five digs in a sweep at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Friday and then added 16 kills, 12 assists and a career-high 19 digs in a four-set win at Incarnate Word. Jablonska also posted seven total blocks and compiled 30 points. On the season she has 120 kills, 81 assists, 12 service aces, 75 digs and 21 total blocks. Jablonska is currently ranked third in the conference in kills and second in points (143.0).

Chelsea Gibson, Angelo State University, led the Belles with 10 kills in wins over Cameron and Midwestern State last weekend to finish with 20 kills in the LSC opening weekend. Gibson finished with a .472 hitting percentage and with 3.33 kills per set and also added eight digs and six block assists for the Belles. She enters Tuesday night's match against Tarleton State with 999 kills in her career at Angelo State.

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, helped lead the Belles to two sweep in the Lone Star Conference opening weekend with 25 digs and four aces. The sophomore finished with 5.00 digs per set as the Belles improved to 2-0 in LSC play leading into Tuesday's match against Tarleton State.

Kelsey Raglin, Tarleton State University, was a defensive force in her Lone Star Conference debut as she posted 29 digs in two games, including 18 in the sweep against Midwestern State Friday night. The freshman from San Antonio also had 11.0 points and 10 kills.

Kaitlyn Maddams, Eastern New Mexico University, put up a great performance for the Zias. In a heartbreaking 3-2 loss to ACU, Maddams collected a team-high three blocks which accounted for half of the Zia blocks. In addition, she collected 14 kills while only making two errors for a .480 hitting percentage. Maddams was also a threat behind the service line as she collected two aces in the match.

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, continued to be a force for the No. 7 Lady Buffs as they went 3-0 this past weekend with sweeps of Abilene Christian, Southwestern Oklahoma State and St. Edward's at The Box in Canyon. Hayes dished out 115 assists for an incredible average of 12.7 per set to go along with 32 digs and eight block assists. The Clemson transfer tallied a double-double against Abilene Christian (37 assists, 12 digs) and St. Edward's (42 assists, 11 digs) to run her total to five on the season.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, recorded 74 sets in six sets as the junior setter from Amarillo led the TexAnnas to a pair of sweeps to open Lone Star Conference play. Barker played every point of the six sets and averaged 12.3 assists per set as well as adding two service aces and 18 digs.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in what proved to be her best all around performance of the season. In five sets, Catano collected a season-high 45 assists, 9.00 assists per set, while also scooping up 10 digs for her first double-double of the season.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, averaged 8.0 assists per set in a 6-2 offense and helped the Pioneers to 2-0 record on the road over the weekend. She had 28 assists and seven digs in a sweep at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Friday and then added 28 assists and 11 digs in a four-set win at Incarnate Word on Saturday. The Pioneers posted a .211 hitting percentage with Rivero running the offense. On the season she leads the team with 240 assists.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

The 4-6 Wildcats went 1-1 on the road last week, first losing 3-0 at No. 7 West Texas A&M and then rebounding to win a five-set thriller at Eastern New Mexico. ACU is now 9-0 vs. the Zias since head coach Kellen Mock took over in 2006. The Wildcats outthit their opponents by a slim margin of .190 to .186 and were led offensively by sophomore Sara Oxford (28K, .143) and freshmen Corrie Reeder (20K, .279) and Jennie Loerch (18K). Oxford also was the team's leading blocker with nine block assists. Freshman Sarah Siemens finished with 83 assists and averaged 10.38 assists per set. Rookie Madison Hoover had the most digs with 42 (5.25 per set). ACU makes its 2012 home debut this weekend with Friday and Saturday matches vs. Tarleton State and Angelo State.

Angelo State

The Belles took care of business on their home court last weekend, sweeping Cameron on Friday before taking Midwestern State in straight sets on Saturday. ASU finished the weekend with a .307 team hitting percentage and had four players with double-digit kills for the weekend. The Belles made only 24 errors the entire weekend and compiled 15 aces. ASU returns to action at 7 p.m. at home on Tuesday against Tarleton State before hosting McMurry on Thursday in a non-conference match. ASU completes its second week of LSC play with a road match on Saturday at Abilene Christian.

Cameron

The Cameron University volleyball team fell to Angelo State and Tarleton this past weekend. In the match against Angelo State, Cameron University's Kathryn Evans and Shannon Dulaney combined for 20 kills but it was not enough as the Rambelles swept CU (21-25, 17-25, 16-25). Rebecca Green had six kills. Mariah Westlake led the Aggie defense with 11 digs and freshman Lauren Acuna had 9 digs. Jenna Risoli put together 29 assists for CU tonight. Against Tarleton, Jenna Risoli and Shannon Dulaney both put together double-doubles but it would not be enough as the Aggies lost 3-0 (23-25, 13-25, 16-25). Leading the Aggies offensively was freshman, Shannon Dulaney who had her fourth career double-double with 10 kills and 10 digs. Jenna Risoli had 25

assists and 11 digs. Rebecca Green also had 6 kills for CU. The sweep this weekend drops Cameron's overall record to 4-6 with a Lone Star Conference record of 0-2. CU will return home for the first time this season to host Dallas Baptist in non-conference action at the Aggie Gym on Tuesday, Sept. 18 at 7 p.m.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias opened up Lone Star Conference play with a single matchup against Abilene Christian University. The Zias fell in a 3-2 heartbreaker which ended 15-13 in the fifth and final set. Lindsey Barron and Kaitlyn Maddams led the offensive charge with a combined 34 kills. The duo also contributed defensively with seven digs and five of the seven Zia blocks. In the backcourt Eastern was led by Hayley Couch and Emily Lubbers who both collected double digit digs. The Zias will be back in action Tuesday, September 18th as they face in-state rival New Mexico Highlands University.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 0-2 last week dropping a pair of home matches against LSC rivals Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's. The Cardinals have been a streaky team this year losing their first four matches, winning their next three and now they are currently on a three match losing streak. They hope to get back on track this week when they travel to Midwestern State on Thursday and Cameron on Saturday. Setters Danielle Suarez and Sarah Cardenas each had one of the best matches of the year in the four-set loss to TWU. Suarez led the team with 21 assists and added nine digs while Cardenas posted a double-double with 16 assists and 14 digs. Senior Lydia Werchan continues to lead the conference with 5.45 digs per set. The next closest person is West Texas A&M's Lauren Beville who is averaging 5.06 digs per set this year. Werchan had 12 digs in three sets against A&M-Commerce and 18 digs against TWU. She has reached double digits in digs in each of her last nine matches after picking up only eight in the season opener at Colorado Mines. Sophomore Baleigh Schaeffer had a strong week on defense. She led the Cardinals with four blocks against A&M-Commerce and six against TWU. Her six blocks were a season high and gives her 25 for the season, tops on the squad.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State opened Lone Star Conference play with road losses at Tarleton State and Angelo State... The Mustangs are now 1-7 in three-set matches and have dropped their last 12 sets for the first since losing 12 consecutive sets to close the 2011 season... MSU is 0-2 against nationally ranked opponents this season... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart extended her streak with 10-or-more kills to six with 11 kills Friday at Tarleton State. The string was snapped Saturday at Angelo State when she finished with five kills... Stewart posted a season-high 16 digs Friday at Tarleton State... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace posted a solid attack percentage of .274 last weekend finishing with eight kills and one error against Tarleton State and had four kills and one error in six total attacks at Angelo State...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State swept Midwestern State and Cameron over the weekend to extend their current winning streak to five games, including four straight sweeps. This marks the first time since 2008 Tarleton has swept four straight games and the first time since

1998 that Tarleton has started conference play 2-0.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce continued to match its best start since the 2002 season, earning a pair of road sweeps at Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville this past weekend. The Lions have started 9-1 on the year, which is tied for the second-best start in program history through 10 matches with seven of their nine victories coming in 3-0 sweeps. Rachel Robertson moved into fourth all-time in program history in kills (1,084) and continues to hit at a blistering .408 through the first three weeks of the season.

The TWU volleyball team posted a 2-0 record on the road to improve its record to 8-2 on the season. The Pioneers swept Texas A&M-Kingsville on Friday and then captured a four-set win at Incarnate Word. Senior Viktorija Jablonska posted 25 kills, 27 assists, 24 digs and seven total blocks. She also recorded her third triple-double of the season with 16 kills, 12 assists and a career-high 19 digs at UIW. Junior Josie Santos posted a team-best 26 kills while junior Chloe Tate had a team-best 12 total blocks and 32.5 points. Sophomore Kayla Rivero led the team with 56 assists and sophomore Morgan Wilson was the leader on defense with 30 digs.

West Texas A&M

The No. 7 Lady Buffs went 3-0 this past weekend to extend their win streak to 10 matches as they swept rival Abilene Christian in both teams' LSC opener on Friday night before routing Southwestern Oklahoma State and St. Edward's in non-conference action at the WTAMU Fieldhouse "The Box" on Saturday. WT hits the road this weekend to face off with Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's who both enter the week with perfect records in the LSC.
