LSC SOCCER

Lone Star Conference action continues for both the men and women. Incarnate Word is leading the men's standings after a shutout win over West Texas A&M. On the women's side, WT has six points to top the league, followed by Angelo State and Midwestern State who have a win and tie versus each other for four points.

LSC men's soccer teams are 19-5-3 overall this season. The squads are currently 4-3-1 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 8-2-1 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

The women's teams are 16-27-4 overall this season. The squads are currently 2-9-1 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 2-4 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Julian Brown-Latham, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, F, Toronto, Ont., St. Edmunds Champion

Brown-Latham provided a spark off the bench for the Cardinals last week. He came through with his best performance of the season in a 4-0 win over then No. 13 West Texas A&M. He subbed on in the 37th minute and scored 1:30 later when he headed in a crossing pass from Wylie Rea to give the team a 1-0 lead. He stayed on to start the second half and took advantage of a WT mistake on a pass back to the goalie that he intercepted and then put into the back of the net in the 49th minute. He was also a strong threat to score in the team's 4-0 win over Our Lady of the Lake. He finished the week with two goals, a game-winning goal and five shots.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

James Nero, University of the Incarnate Word, JR, Charlotte, NC, Olympic

Nero was part of a UIW back line that allowed just two shots on goal in two 4-0 wins last week. He headlined the defensive effort against No. 13 West Texas A&M as they handcuffed the LSC's leading scorer Dominic Furness. Furness came into the game with nine goals and was limited to just three shots with none on goal. Nero played 174 of the 180 minutes last week. He was a key reason why Our Lady of the Lake managed only one shot and he nearly scored on a header in the second half.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Samantha Johnson, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, M, Austin, Texas, Home School

Johnson played a key role in the Cardinals' win over visiting Abilene Christian in the LSC opener on Friday. She scored the first goal of the game in 52nd minute and then assisted on the team's third goal in a 3-1 victory. She played all 90 minutes in the ACU win and in the 1-0 loss to Midwestern State on Sunday.

CO-WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Anna Molen, Midwestern State University, JR, Flower Mound, Texas, Marcus HS

Molen played a key role at center back to help Midwestern State turn the tide on the back row last week in earning a draw Friday against Angelo State before claiming its first win Sunday at Incarnate Word. With assistance from senior outside back Berklee Dressler, the junior from Flower Mound led a back row featuring a pair of freshmen making their first starts limit the opposition to one goal in 200 minutes of field time. The Mustangs had permitted 11 goals over the previous four matches.

Kara Edwards, Angelo State University, JR, Bastrop, Texas, Bastrop HS

Edwards was instrumental in helping the Rambelles limit opponents to only one goal in 200 minutes of action last weekend. Edwards, a strong defender from Bastrop, also assisted in ASU's goal in its 1-1 tie against Midwestern State. Along with her fellow defenders, Edwards limited ACU to few scoring chances and helped the Rambelles to their second shutout of the season.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Cantu Palombo, Eastern New Mexico University, tallied three goals and dished out two assists last week, to lead the Greyhounds to a 2-1 record. He tallied a goal and an assist on Saturday, at Dallas Baptist and followed with a five-point game at Southern Nazarene.

Dominic Furness, West Texas A&M University, scored his team-leading 10th and 11th goals this week and added an assist. He helped lead the Buffs as they downed then-No. 11 Fort Hays State 2-0 on Sunday. It was the first time FHSU had been held scoreless all season and the first time FHSU hadn't scored two or more goals. Furness leads the team with 25 points on 11 goals and three assists for the year. He has a team-high 40 shots with 26 on goal, two game winners and is 1 for 1 in penalty kicks.

Ray Clark, Midwestern State University, posted consecutive shutouts to help No. 5 Midwestern State post scoreless draws last weekend on the road. The junior from Norman, Okla. made three saves Friday night at Texas A&M International before making another save Sunday against St. Edward's to post his third and fourth clean sheets of the season. Clark is one just three goalkeepers in all of NCAA Division II still maintaining a perfect goals against average and save percentage.

Fredrik Widfeldt, Eastern New Mexico University, made 15 saves last week and posted a 2-1 record, along with a 1.33 goals against average. The performance vaulted him into a tie for fourth on the ENMU career wins list.

William Garrett Cooper, West Texas A&M University, Rheld then-No. 11 Fort Hays State to zero goals in a 2-0 win Sunday. It was the first time all season FHSU had been held scoreless and the first time it had scored less than two goals. Cooper tallied 10 saves for the week and went 2-1 including a 3-1 win over University of the Southwest Tuesday. In that match, he made a number of key saves in the second half for the Buffs. Played all 270 minutes and has played and started all eight matches this season, logging 713:34 minutes with a 1.22 goals against average as he has allowed 10 goals and tallied 22 saves. He is 6-1-1 on the year with three shutouts.

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds posted a 2-1 record last week and outscored the opposition by a 10-4 margin, while enjoying a 65-43 advantage in shots. The Hounds posted dominant victories over Dallas Baptist and Southern Nazarene, which allowed Fredrik Widfeldt to move into a tie for fourth in single-season wins. This week, ENMU will host Wayland Baptist.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals extended their winning streak to four games with a 4-0 win over No. 13 West Texas A&M and a 4-0 win over cross town rival Our Lady of the Lake. Julian Brown-Latham provided a spark off the bench for the Cardinals last week. He came through with his best performance of the season in a 4-0 win over then No. 13 West Texas A&M. He subbed on in the 37th minute and scored 1:30 later when he headed in a crossing pass from Wylie Rea to give the team a 1-0 lead. Midwestern State

Midwestern State battled to consecutive scoreless draws on the road against Texas A&M International and St. Edward's (Texas) last week to move to 3-0-2 on the season... The Mustangs dipped eight places to No. 13 in this week's NSCAA Division II Poll... MSU has carried a national ranking in each of the last 70 NSCAA polls in which it was eligible including 45 of those weeks in the Top 10... The Mustangs have posted shutouts in four of its first five games this season and rank second in all of NCAA Division II with a 0.80 shutout percentage... MSU also rates second in the nation with a team goals against average of 0.19... Midwestern suffered consecutive shutouts for the first time since posting back-to-back scoreless draws on the road against Incarnate Word (10/22/10) and St. Edward's (10/24/10) during the 2010 season... MSU coach Doug Elder remains the winningest active coach in all of NCAA Division II with a 187-41-21 mark (.793) since taking over the program in 2000... Junior goalkeeper Ray Clark is one of three goalkeepers in NCAA Division II maintaining a perfect goals against average and save percentage. The others are Lynn's Matt DeCervo and South Carolina-Aiken's Joshua Poissant... The Mustangs put their 45-match home unbeaten streak on the line this weekend against rival Incarnate Word on Friday and versus Ouachita Baptist on Sunday...

West Texas A&M

The 23rd-ranked Buffs love playing lucky number 11 as they have defeated two teams ranked No. 11 this season. The first being a 4-2 win at No. 11 Colorado School of Mines and the latter being a 2-0 win over No. 11 Fort Hays State Sunday...Only once this season have the Buffs not scored two goals or more which was last Friday at Incarnate Word L, 4-0...The Buff "D" stood tall on Sunday holding FHSU to its first loss, first shutout and first match of scoring less than two goals this season...The Buffs have spread the wealth when it comes to goals this season as 10 different players have scored and same with assists as 13 different players have recorded assists.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Ashley Cottrell's, Midwestern State University, first collegiate goal came in the final second of a 1-1 draw Friday night at Angelo State to snap Midwestern State's four-game skid. The freshman from Arlington hustled to a loose ball in the box that had been deflected or missed by two teammates and slammed it into the back of the net to send the match into overtime.

Katy Black, Texas Woman's University, assisted on both TWU goals in a 2-1 road victory over Eastern New Mexico in the conference opener on Friday. She assisted on the first goal in the 29th minute and then set up a cross on the eventual game-winner in the 64th minute. The Pioneers won the conference opener for the first time since 2005 and picked up their second consecutive victory this season. On the season Black leads the team in assists (4) and second in scoring with six points.

Lindsay McHorse, West Texas A&M University, scored her first goal of the season and the game winner in a 2-1 win over Texas Woman's University over the weekend. It was McHorse's 33rd career goal. The goal gave WT a 2-0 lead in the 69th minute, but a late goal by TWU made her's the game winner. She is third all-time in goals and third in points with 83.

Victoria Perez, Eastern New Mexico University, after falling in their first two LSC matches, ENMU picked up a 1-0 win over Texas A&M University- Commerce. Leading the charge was Perez who recorded her first goal of the season in the 36th minute of play. Her goal was good for the game winning goal.

Hanna Horeis, Angelo State University, was on constant attack mode last weekend for the Rambelles against Midwestern State and Abilene Christian. The senior midfielder led ASU with 11 shots during the two games with seven being on goal. Her offensive attack did not result in a goal, but she came up with the assist in the Rambelles' 1-0 win over Abilene Christian on Sunday.

Xan Ortiz, Eastern New Mexico University, collected her second win and second shutout of the season, last week. The Zias hosted Texas Woman's and A&M-Commerce and went 1-1 on the week. In two games, Ortiz played 180 minutes, made 9 saves and picked up a shutout.

Sara Deeb, Texas Woman's University, has been a the leader on defense for TWU in her rookie season. She matched up against the top scorers from Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M and limited them to zero goals. Deeb also matched up against WT's leading scorer Leslie Briggs allowing her to take just one shot on goal. Briggs came into the game leading the conference with nine goals and 21 points and has scored at least a goal in all six games for the Lady Buffs prior to Sunday. Deeb helped the Pioneers win their conference opener for the first time since 2005 and picked up their second consecutive victory this season.

Yvette Bedoy, West Texas A&M University, went 1-1 on the week with 15 saves as the Lady Buffs split two conference matches. Had a 1.50 goals against average for the week and with her 15 saves she ranks fifth all-time in school history in saves with 116.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats dropped to 2-4 on the season after losing 3-1 at Incarnate Word and 1-0 at Angelo State to start Lone Star Conference play. ACU received its lone goal of the weekend from junior Andrea Carpenter in the 80th minute vs. the Cardinals. It was the 39th goal of her career. Overall, the Wildcats were outshot in both games, 26-15, and placed eight of their shots on goal. Arielle Moncure made 10 saves, while the team was credited with one.

Angelo State

The Rambelles opened Lone Star Conference play against the preseason's top two teams and showed that they will be contenders this season. ASU opened with a 1-1 tie against Midwestern State after the Mustangs were able to tie the game with a last second shot to match an Ashley Exford goal in the 49th minute. ASU held steady on Sunday, shutting out Abilene Christian and earning the win with a Katie Squires goal in the 79th minute of play. ASU travels to Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's this week.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-1 on the week and picked up their first LSC victory of the season against Texas A&M University-Commerce. In the victory, the Zias won 1-0 off the score of Victoria Perez. Prior to their win, the Zias fell 2-1 to Texas Woman's and Brook Soriano collected her first goal of the season. This weekend the Zias will be facing off against Abilene Christian University and Midwestern State University.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 1-1 in the opening weekend of Lone Star Conference play last week. They defeated Abilene Christian, 3-1 on Friday night and lost, 1-0

to Midwestern State on Sunday afternoon. Senior midfielder Samantha Johnson had an outstanding game against ACU. First, she scored the team's opening goal of the game in the 52nd minute on a penalty kick. Then, she helped cap off the win by assisting on Jazma Latu's goal in the 80th minute that gave the team a 3-0 lead. Freshman Heather Kowalik appears to have locked down the starting goalkeeper role after getting the nod in both games last week. She allowed just two goals and made seven saves. For the season she has a 1.33 GAA and 13 saves in three games. Katie Miller continues to be the team's most dangerous offensive player. She fired off five shots last week and leads the team with 13 for the season. She scored her first goal of the season against ACU picking up the game-winning goal at 64:55 on a 20-yard strike. The Cardinals travel to Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce this week.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State kicked off Lone Star Conference play by posting a draw at Angelo State before earning its first positive result of the campaign at Incarnate Word to improve to 1-4-1 on the season.... Freshman forward Ashley Cottrell helped MSU avoid tying the longest losing streak in program history with a goal at the 89:59 mark Friday night at Angelo State then the Mustangs battled the Rambelles to a pair of scoreless overtime frames for a 1-1 draw. Midwestern also posted an 0-4-1 run from Sep. 14-23, 2001... Sophomore forward Payton Fookes blasted in a free kick from just outside the 18-yard box to tally the lone goal of the game in a 1-0 victory in the rain over Incarnate Word Sunday afternoon in San Antonio. It was her first goal of the season and first since notching an equalizing goal against West Texas A&M in the 2011 LSC semifinals... An MSU back line bolstered by senior Berklee Dressler and freshman Alex Edwards on the outside and junior Anna Molen and freshman Alexandra Copp in the middle keyed a pair of strong defensive performances as the Mustangs allowed one goal in 200 minutes last weekend after letting in 11 goals over the four previous outings... After a slow start, Midwestern can grasp a claim to the top of the LSC standings with home wins this weekend against tough West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico squads...
