LSC FOOTBALL

Five games are scheduled for this week, with Abilene Christian at Delta State on Thursday night, and four Lone Star Conference match-ups on Saturday. The ACU-DSU game is part of the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, and will be shown on GSC-TV live.

West Texas A&M and Angelo State top the LSC standings after victories over Incarnate Word and Abilene Christian, respectively, last week.

LSC football teams are 16-17 overall this season. The squads are 2-3 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Keidrick Jackson, Midwestern State University, JR, RB, Arlington, Texas, Bowie HS

Jackson ran for 156 yards on 18 carries and scored four touchdowns in leading No. 15 Midwestern State to a 45-28 win at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Jackson's four touchdowns and 24 points against the Javelinas are the most for an NCAA Division II player this season. Jackson's 73-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter stymied a TAMUK comeback attempt and helped the Mustangs to the best team rushing game in the conference this season with 421 yards. Jackson, who leads the LSC with 82.7 yards a game, posted the eighth 100-plus rushing game of his career. He now stands eighth on the MSU career rushing list with 1,721 yards, and is third on the MSU career scoring list with 196 points.

DEFENSIVE

Rush Seaver, Angelo State University, SO, LB, Lampassas, Texas, Lampassas HS

Seaver led a Ram defense that pressured Abilene Christian quarterback Mitchell Gale into seven sacks on its way to an 28-23 upset victory over No. 19 ACU. The ASU defense limited the Wildcats to only nine yards rushing with Seaver accounting for 2.5 sacks and two tackles for loss. He was the Rams leading tackler with eight total tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Greg Saladino, Midwestern State University, JR, K, Kingwood, Texas, Kingwood HS

Saladino nailed a 27-yard field goal and connected on all six point-after-touchdown attempts as the No. 15 Midwestern State Mustangs beat Texas A&M-Kingsville 45-28. Saladino has connected on all 12 of his PATs this season and is 5-of-5 in field goals as well. Additionally, Saladino punted five times for a 39.4 average with a long punt of 46 yards and two punts inside the 20. Four of the five punts were fair caught. Saladino leads LSC kickers in scoring with 9.0 points a game and is second in the league in punting with a 41.1 yard average.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Vaughn Smith, Tarleton State University, averaged over 10 yards per carry on his way to a career-high 167-yard performance on the ground in Tarleton's 35-23 win over Eastern New Mexico in Stephenville on Saturday. The junior tailback needed just 16 carries to eclipse the 160-yard barrier and he tallied a pair of touchdowns in the process, which included a 69-yard scamper late in the fourth quarter to put the game on ice for the Texans. Smith also had three receptions for 19 yards in the contest as well.

Bryan Ehrlich, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, threw for 415 yards on 28-of-55 passing as he nearly led the team to a come-from-behind win in his first start. Ehrlich's yardage was tied for the second-best performance in school history. He threw for three TDs with tosses of 52 and 29 yards to Sherman Batiste and 35 yards to Joseph Vela.

Wesley Wood, Eastern New Mexico University, accounted for 286 yards of total offense and three touchdowns at Tarleton State and was sacked only once. He tossed a pair of touchdown passes, including an 80-yard strike to Dillon Metzger. He also sprinted 21 yards in the third quarter, to pull the Hounds within four points. For his career, Wood holds the ENMU records for total offense and touchdown passes, with 8,000 yards and 61 touchdowns, respectively.

FIRST DOWN

- A pair of LSC teams are ranked in AFCA poll (Sept. 24) with No. 14 Midwestern State and No. 23 West Texas A&M.
- Week four included four 100-yard rushing performances, one 400-yard and two 300-yard passing effort along with four 100-yard receiving performances.
- MSU (K. Jackson-156 yards, and J. Pipkin-113) and Tarleton (V. Smith-167 yards and Z. Henshaw-113) each had a pair of 100-yard rushers this week. The Texans duo marked the first time since the 2009 season.

Lance Ratliff, West Texas A&M University, had two catches for 68 yards and two touchdowns as the Buffaloes blanked Incarnate Word Saturday 24-0. Had a 45-yard catch for the first score of the game 30 seconds into the second quarter. Then tallied a 23-yard touchdown with 12:16 remaining in the third quarter for a 17-0 lead. He leads the team with six touchdown catches on 13 receptions for the season.

Jeremy Aguilar, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led all players with 14 tackles. The total is the high for the senior this year. He forced and recovered a fumble. His two tackles for loss resulted in a loss of six yards. Aguilar had a tackle to stop Midwestern on fourth and two in third quarter which helped set Javelina TD to make it a two TD game six seconds into fourth quarter.

Kyle Voss, West Texas A&M University, led the Buffaloes with a game-high 14 tackles (7,7) including two sacks for 11 yards and three tackles for loss for 15 yards as WT blanked Incarnate Word 24-0 on Saturday. He helped lead a defense that tallied a season-high eight sacks for 65 yards and a total of 13 tackles for loss for 81 yards. Voss and the Buffaloes held UIW to just 146 yards of offense on 131 passing yards and just 15 rushing yards. It was the first shutout win by the Buffaloes since blanking Texas A&M-Commerce 49-0 Nov. 12, 2011. It also was the first road shutout for the Buffs since a 27-0 win at Angelo State on Oct. 25, 2008.

Marc Martinez, Tarleton State University, led the Texan defense with nine tackles in Saturday's win over Eastern New Mexico. He tallied five solo tackles on the evening and had one and a half tackles-for-loss, which went for negative-two yards. He had a hand in the Texans holding a predominate wishbone running team to just 139 yards on the ground.

Donald Napoleon, Midwestern State University, led the defensive attack as No. 15 Midwestern State defeated Texas A&M-Kingsville 45-28 on the road. Napoleon posted eight total tackles, six solo, while tallying 2.0 tackles for losses of 12 yards. His tackle of Javelina quarterback Bryan Erlich at the MSU6 with 2:25 to play ended the final TAMUK drive to seal the victory for the Mustangs.

Willie Riley, Eastern New Mexico University, helped keep the Greyhounds within striking distance in Saturday's contest at Tarleton State, with a pair of interceptions. Both interceptions thwarted potential Texan scoring drives and came at the ENMU three and one-yard lines.

Sergio Castillo, Jr., West Texas A&M University, tallied six points on a perfect 3 for 3 in extra points and went 1 for 2 in field goals as WT blanked Incarnate Word Saturday 24-0. With the six points on Saturday, Castillo, Jr., moved into ninth all-time in scoring with 191 career points. He is 22 of 31 in field goals all-time and 124 of 126 all-time in extra-points.

Jayson Serda, Eastern New Mexico University, returned three kickoffs for 47 yards, with a 27-yard return in the second quarter. He also made 13 tackles in the game and deflected a pass.

LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

Abilene Christian

The ACU Wildcats will make their first venture into the Deep South for a football game since a 1989 game at Alcorn State (Lorman, Miss.) when they go to Cleveland, Miss., for Thursday's game at perennial NCAA Division II powerhouse Delta State. ... The Statesmen and Wildcats -- two perennial playoff teams -- are off to slow starts with the Wildcats carrying a 2-2 record into the game, while the Statesmen are 1-2 with both losses coming at home. ... Since joining the Lone Star Conference in 1973, ACU is 58-46-2 against non-conference opposition, including a 51-0 win over McMurry in the 2012 season-opener. ... The Wildcats are 18-44-2 all-time against teams from the Deep South (Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina and Florida). ... ACU's last victory against a team from the Deep South came in 1987 when the Wildcats upset Tennessee Tech in Abilene, 40-31. ... ACU is at the .500 mark (2-2) this late into the season for the first time since 2005 when ACU started 202, but found itself at 2-5 late in the year. ... ACU hasn't been 2-3 on the season five games deep into the schedule since that 2005 season. ... ACU's offensive woes through four games in 2012 can be traced back to an ineffective offensive line that has already allowed 16 sacks and hasn't been consistent in blocking for a running game averaging just 79.0 yards per game. ... The Wildcats, in fact, ran for just nine yards in Saturday night's 28-23 loss at Angelo State, the lowest output for an ACU offense since current head coach Ken Collums arrived in 2005 as the offensive coordinator. ... In fact, despite its reputation as a "passing offense," the Wildcats have had a successful running game in each season since 2006 when ACU's streak of NCAA Division II playoff appearances began. ... From 2005-11, the Wildcats averaged 176.7 rushing yards per game, including highs of 230.8 ypg in 2007 and 235.5 ypg in 2008 when current Cincinnati Bengals running back Bernard Scott was in ACU's backfield. ... And from 2005-08, ACU quarterbacks (mainly Billy Malone) were sacked only 48 times, including just eight times in 2007 and eight more times in 2008. ... But since 2009, ACU quarterbacks (mostly Mitchell Gale) have been sacked 97 times in 40 games. ... Gale has been dropped by opposing defenses 85 times in his 35 career games. ... Angelo State recorded seven sacks of Gale in last Saturday's upset win, the fourth time that he has been sacked seven times in his career (at Tarleton State in 2007, at Northwest Missouri State in the 2009 playoffs, at Washburn in 2011 playoffs and at Angelo State on Sept. 22, 2012). ... Prior to Saturday's loss at Angelo State, the Wildcats had just six "explosive plays" (plays of 25 yards or more), and one of those was a punt return. ... But in the game against Angelo State, the Wildcat offense produced five plays of 25 yards or more, and the special teams produced three more such plays. ... The Angelo State offense ran off 85 plays for 409 yards against the Wildcats last Saturday, the fourth straight opponent to reel off at least 82 offensive plays, and the third straight to gain at least 400 yards of offense. ... The ACU defense has allowed the opposition to run off a remarkable 341 plays (85.3 per game) through four games. ... By comparison, ACU's offense has run just 257 plays (64.3 per game) and has gained more than 335 yards of offense just once. ... The Wildcats have had trouble getting off the field on third down, having allowed opponents to convert third downs at a rate of 38 percent on the season (28 of 73). ... ACU, though, has only allowed seven touchdowns and only 75 points through four games (18.75 points per game).

Angelo State

In possibly the final meeting at San Angelo Stadium between Abilene Christian (2-2, 1-1) and Angelo State (2-2, 1-0), the Rams upset the No. 19 Wildcats 28-23 in Lone Star Conference play. The Rams won for the 28th time out of 51 meetings between the two rivals. ACU was held to nine yards rushing and the Rams collected seven sacks during the game ... In 15 games under defensive coordinator Mike Walton, the Ram defense has held



The Lone Star Conference and Gulf South Conference joined forces to create the GSC-LSC First and Ten Challenge, a regular-season series which debut in 2012 and matches up football teams from two of the best leagues in all of NCAA Division II.

The event includes a total of 10 inter-conference games involving all five of the GSC's football-playing members - Delta State, North Alabama, Valdosta State, West Alabama and West Georgia - and six of the LSC's nine - Abilene Christian, Angelo State, Midwestern State, Tarleton State, Texas A&M-Kingsville and West Texas A&M.

All five GSC teams will play one home game and one road game as part of the event, as will ACU, MSU, TSU and TAMUK from the LSC. LSC members ASU and WTAMU will play one game apiece.

The 10 contests include: Valdosta State at Angelo State (Sat, Sept. 15); Abilene Christian at Delta State (Thu, Sept. 27); Midwestern State at West Alabama (Thu, Oct. 4); Delta State at Tarleton State (Thu, Oct. 4); North Alabama at Texas A&M-Kingsville (Sat, Oct. 6); West Texas A&M at West Georgia (Sat, Oct. 27); Texas A&M-Kingsville at Valdosta State (Thu, Nov. 1); Tarleton State at North Alabama (Sat, Nov. 3); West Alabama at Abilene Christian (Sat, Nov. 3); and West Georgia at Midwestern State (Sat, Nov. 10).

Of the 10 games, four are scheduled for Thursday night and five of those are tentatively set to be televised live.



The 2012 Lone Star Football Festival presented by Firestone had 33,180 fans at the three-day, six-game event at Cowboys Stadium. On Thursday, a crowd of 3,426 saw Midwestern State top Texas A&M-Commerce, 65-14, in the Harvey Martin Classic, which was televised live on the CBS Sports Network as the NCAA Division II Football Game of the Week. Eastern New Mexico escaped Incarnate Word 34-24 and Southlake Carroll blanked Temple 34-0 in Friday's action in front of 10,620 fans. The event wrapped up Saturday with a tripleheader of games attended by 19,134, which included Valdosta State over Angelo State 43-10, Abilene Christian edging Tarleton State 34-31 and West Texas A&M defeating Texas A&M-Kingsville 40-10.

opponents under 100-yards rushing seven times. The nine rushing yards that Abilene Christian tallied is tied for the second lowest ... The Rams pressured the LSC's Preseason Offensive Player of the Year all game and produced seven sacks for a defense that came in with only two for the season. The seven sacks are the most under defensive coordinator Mike Walton and the most since recording seven against Texas A&M-Commerce back on Sept. 11, 2011 ... The Rams win over No. 19 Abilene Christian marks the first time Angelo State has defeated a ranked opponent since 2009. ASU beat No. 17 Midwestern State 20-17 on a last second field goal by Ryan Smith ... The fans are showing up to see the 2012 Rams. Through the first three home games of the season an average of 6,652 fans have come through the gates at San Angelo Stadium. The three game attendance is the highest since the Rams averaged 6,733 through three games back in 2007.

Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhounds turned in a strong performance at Tarleton State on Saturday, going score for score with the Texans for much of the game. Seth Bailey made a career-high 15 tackles, while Willie Riley grabbed a pair of interceptions. The Greyhounds seven interceptions for the season is one more than they had during the 2011 season. Wesley Wood accounted for 286 yards of total offense and three touchdowns and increased his ENMU records for total offensive yards and touchdown passes to 8,000 and 61, respectively. This week, Eastern will host Angelo State, at Greyhound Stadium, on Saturday afternoon.

Incarnate Word

An Unfortunate First The Cardinals suffered their first ever shutout on Saturday night against #25 West Texas A&M. The Buffaloes sacked UIW eight times and recorded 13 tackles for loss. The Cardinals reached the red zone only once in the game and missed a 43-yard field goal attempt. UIW gained a total of 146 yards and 10 first downs. The Cardinal defense held the Buffalos to 361 yards and 18 total first downs. Rios is Running While the Incarnate Word offense struggled last week against West Texas A&M, senior running back Trent Rios accumulated 133 yards from scrimmage while the team only had 146 yards. He rushed for 66 yards on 14 carries and caught six passes for 67 yards. The six catches were a career high and the 67 yards receiving were the second highest of his career. Rios averaged over 20 carries per game in 2010 and 2011, but is only averaging 13.5 carries per game this year. However, he is averaging a career high 4.4 yards per carry this year even though he has gone up against a few top defenses in West Texas A&M and Sam Houston State. He is averaging a career-high 2.8 receptions per game and 28.5 receiving yards per game this year. Rios is closing in on a milestone in his career for all-purpose yards. He is averaging 125.0 all-purpose yards per game this year and has 3,902 career all-purpose yards. He needs only 98 more all-purpose yards to become the first player in school history with 4,000 all-purpose yards. Passing Defense The Incarnate Word defense is proving to be very strong against the pass this year. The Cardinals had given up only 406 passing yards through the first three games of the season and then held West Texas A&M to nearly 150 fewer passing yards per game than their season average was. Overall, the Cards are giving up 165.5 passing yards per game. The Cardinals tied a school record with seven pass break ups against the Buffalos. Overall, the Cardinals have broken up 17 passes this year despite only facing 88 passes. That computes to the team breaking up 19.3 percent of

opposing passes. Last year the Cardinals had 35 pass breakups while facing 353 passes which is about a 10.0 rate. Avoiding Avery Senior cornerback Devan Avery is quietly putting together an exceptional season. The operative word is quiet since opponents are avoiding throwing the ball at him. In the first two weeks of the season he had eight tackles and broke up five passes. Over the last two weeks he has been avoided. He has not had to make a tackle and has a pair of pass break ups. Avery has been a key reason why the Cardinal pass defense has been so good this year. Overall, the team is allowing 145 fewer passing yards per game than they did in 2011.

Midwestern State

With the Mustangs win 45-28 win at Texas A&M-Kingsville, the Mustangs have now won seven of their last eight meetings and three of the last four games in Kingsville ... MSU was the first opponent to win on the new artificial surface at Javelina Stadium ... Keidrick Jackson's 156-yards against TAMUK was his eighth 100-plus yard rushing effort of his career which ranks as the fourth most in MSU history trailing Dominic Rhodes (14 from 1999-00), Daniel Polk (12 from 2004-07) and Ross Harrison (10 from 2003-06) ... Jackson's 73-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter was the second longest rush of his career. His longest run of 77 yards came against Javelinas in 2011 ... Backfield mate Jimmy Pipkin became the 15th rusher in program history to amass four career 100-yard games. Jackson (8), Pipkin (4) and quarterback Brandon Kelsey (5) have accounted for a combined 17 100-yard rushing performances ... Jackson (262-1721) moved past Phillip Boggs (386-1590 from 1999-03) into eighth place on MSU's all-time rushing list. He needs 62 yards to pass (7th) Derrick Wagoner (304-1781 from 1991-92) and 102 yards to pass (6th) Jerrold Fuqua (355-1822 from 2002-03) ... Kelsey (184-1448) moved past Lester Bush (289-1423 from 2008-11) into 11th on MSU's all-time rushing list. He needs 59 yards to pass Craig Pettigrew (338-1516) into the Top 10 ... Pipkin needs 139 yards to become the 17th career 1,000-yard rusher in school history ... - Jackson's second career 4-TD rushing game moved him past Rhodes (27 TD from 1999-00) and Ross Harrison (29 TD from 2003-06) into second place on the all-time rushing touchdowns list. He trails only Polk (44 TDs from 2004-07) ... Jackson matched Rhodes (vs. OPSU on 10/14/00 and at ENMU on 9/16/00) as the only MSU backs to score four rushing touchdowns in a game twice. Jackson also did it against A&M-Commerce on 9/17/11. Stephon Brockington had 5 touchdowns against Tarleton State on 9/9/95 and Ross Harrison scored four rushing TDs against Southwestern Oklahoma on 9/3/05 ... Pipkin's 89-yard touchdown in the second quarter Saturday at Texas A&M-Kingsville matched the second longest rushing play in program history as BeeJay Mathis also scored on a 89-yard run on 9/22/07 at East Central. Boggs' 95-yard run on 9/20/03 is the longest rush in program history. Pipkin also has career runs of 87 yards against A&M-C on 9/18/11 and 83 yards against TSU on 10/8/11. He has accounted for three of the 12 rushes of 80 yards or more in program history ... MSU's 616 yards of total offense was the 11th best offensive performance in school history and the most since the Mustangs rolled up a school record 740 yards of total offense against Abilene Christian last season (10/22/11) ... MSU's rushing outburst of 421 yards was the eighth best ground game in program history and yet the second most the Mustangs have posted at Javelina Stadium. MSU ran for 426 yards against TAMUK in Kingsville on 10/20/07

The Texans picked up its second win of the season to improve to 2-1 both overall and in LSC play... Tarleton downed the Greyhounds 35-23 on Saturday, despite scoring in the first or third quarters... Tarleton had two players rush for 100+ for the first time since the 2009 season as Vaughan Smith and Zach Henshaw each surpassed the 100-yard barrier... Both Smith (167 yds) and Henshaw (113) recorded career-highs in rushing and both rushers found the end zone on Saturday (Smith 2, Henshaw 1)... Aaron Doyle connected on 19 of his 34 passes for 240 yards and a pair of touchdowns... Clifton Rhodes III hauled in 10 catches for 111 yards and one touchdown... Marc Martinez led the defense with nine tackles and Marquis Wadley followed with seven tackles and one forced fumble... Tarleton recorded 500+ yards of total offense in back-to-back weeks, finishing with 564 yards Saturday... The Texan defense held ENMU's wishbone offense to just 139 yards on the ground, forcing the Greyhounds to beat them in the air... Blake Barnes went 0-for-1 in field goals, giving him his first miss of the 2012 season and his career... Tarleton returns to action this Saturday with its first official road game of the season as the Texans travel to Canyon to face West Texas A&M... Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

In his first start as a member of the Javelinas, quarterback Bryan Ehrlich became the third quarterback in school history to throw for 415 yards. Ehrlich finished with 415 yards on 28-of-55 passing and three touchdowns. He tied Billy Garza, who was the most recent to hit the 400-yard mark, for the second-most passing yards in a single game. Garza threw for 415 yards against Angelo State in 2008. Abel Gonzalez set the school record in 2001 in a playoff game with Cal-Davis tossing for 452 yards. A transfer from Newberry, Ehrlich threw for a career-high 515 yards against Tusculum as a sophomore in 2010. He also threw 400 for against Mars Hill that same season...Wide receiver Sherman Batiste continues to pick up the pace as a senior. After just 31 yards receiving on three catches in the season opener, Batiste has 24 catches for 380 yards since. He had 128 yards on 10 catches at Abilene Christian and six receptions for 86 yards against West Texas A&M in Cowboy Stadium Sept. 15. This week he had a career-high 166 yards receiving and two TD catches on 8 receptions. It was the most yards by a Javelina receiver since Robert Armstrong had 175 yards receiving against A&M-Commerce last year. With 411 yards receiving, Batiste has 1,835 in his career passing Jareko Taylor for seventh all-time. He is now fifth with 143 career receptions and seventh with 15 TD receptions...Batiste is second in the Lone Star Conference in both yards per game (102.8) and receptions per game (6.8)...With a little bit of tomfoolery, Joseph Vela not only caught a touchdown pass but threw for one as well. Vela threw 9-yard TD pass to Robert Armstrong in addition to a 35-yard TD reception...Armstrong moved to seventh in career receptions with 121 as he has 25 catches on the season. With three TD catches, he is sixth with 17 TD receptions...While he is still awaiting breakout game running the ball, Jonathan Woodson is still racking up the all-purpose yards. He has 450 all-purpose yards this season and now has 4,650 in his career to surpass Larry Williams for fourth all-time...After being stuck on nine tackles for the past two weeks,

senior linebacker broke free for 14 on Saturday night with eight solo tackles and two tackles for a loss. He is 11 tackles shy of moving into the top 20 in career tackles...Kicker Matt Stoll continues to lead the Lone Star in field goals with seven in four games. He is also tops with 1.75 field goals a contest...Kingsville leads the all-time series with Texas A&M-Commerce 37-21-1.

West Texas A&M

The Buffalo defense stymied Incarnate Word on Saturday as it tallied a season-high eight sacks for 65 yards and 13 tackles for loss for 81 yards. Of the 64 total tackles in the game, 20 percent were for lost yardage against the Cardinals. The Buff defense also forced a fumble, intercepted a pass and blocked a punt for a touchdown...The 24-0 win over Incarnate Word Saturday was the first shutout for the Buffs since Nov. 12, 2011, when WT blanked Texas A&M-Commerce 49-0. Moreover, it was the first shutout on the road since a 27-0 win at Angelo State on Oct. 25, 2008... Junior linebacker Kyle Voss was all over the field on Saturday as he led the team with 14 tackles including seven solo stops. He had two sacks for 11 yards and a team-high three tackles for loss for 15 yards...Junior wide receiver Lance Ratliff has had an impressive start to the season. He has 350 yards in four starts on 15 catches with a team-high six touchdowns as he is averaging 87.5 yards per game which is good for second on the team. More impressively, he is averaging a team-high 23.3 yards per catch...Senior running back Khiry Robinson has returned in a big way for the Buffs. In his two games this season, he leads the team in rushing with 168 yards and one touchdown. Robinson has carried the ball 30 times for a 5.6 average per carry and an 84.0 average per game. In addition, Robinson also is seeing action as a receiver as he has seven catches for 79 yards, while having a team-high 104 yards in punt returns. He also has 351 yards of all-purpose yardage for a 175.5 average per game which is tops on the team...In the three wins this season, the Buffs' defense is allowing just 10 points per game and allowed just 168 yards on the ground (56.0 ppg.) and 541 yards through the air (180.3 ppg.) for a total of 709 yards and a 236.3 average. More impressively is the offense has more than doubled the opponents during the three games in rushing yards (387), passing yards (1019) and total offense (1406). The defense has tallied 34 tackles for loss for 159 yards and 13 sacks for 101 yards along with three interceptions, three fumble recoveries, four forced fumbles, two blocks and two safeties...The Buffs are fifth nationally in passing offense at 371.25 yards per game. They are 13th in total offense at 486.75 per game and 24th in scoring offense at 38.75 points per game. Defensively, they are 39th in rushing defense at 108.25 yards per game, 33rd in total defense at 299.00 yards per game, 27th in scoring defense at 18.5 points per game...The Buffaloes have made a habit of living in the opposition's backfield this season as they rank eighth nationally in sacks at 4.0 per game and ninth in tackles for loss at 9.75 per game. Saturday the Buffs racked up a season-high eight sacks and 13 tackles for loss at Incarnate Word.
