Lone Star Conference play rolls on this week, including a match between the last two unbeaten teams as Angelo State plays at West Texas A&M on Saturday. The victor gets the early edge in the conference race.

LSC volleyball teams are 78-59 overall this season. The squads are currently 10-16 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 8-7 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Shelbi Goode, Angelo State University, JR, Georgetown, Texas, Georgetown HS

Goode continued her strong start to the season last week to help the No. 11 Belles sweep their three matches. Goode, who leads the conference in kills and kills per set, finished last week with 42 kills and 5.25 kills per set. The transfer from Alabama hit for a .378 percentage and now has 166 kills on the season. Goode led the Belles with 17 kills in their 3-0 sweep of Tarleton State last Tuesday before adding 11 more versus McMurry, and another 14 at Abilene Christian on Saturday. Goode also had nine digs in the win over the Wildcats.

Chetina Chavis, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, Houston, Texas, Bush HS

Chavis led Incarnate Word to a perfect 2-0 week in conference play. She was the only player on the team to reach double digit kills in each match. She led the team with 14 kills and a .423 attack in a four-set win at Midwestern State. She came back with 10 kills, a .333 attack and three blocks in a three-set win at Cameron. She averaged 3.4 kills per set with a .383 attack for the week.

DEFENSIVE

Morgan Wilson, Texas Woman's University, SO, White Oak, Texas, White Oak HS

Wilson helped the Pioneers to 2-1 record last week including sweeps at Texas A&M-Commerce and over Eastern New Mexico. She was the leader on defense with a team-best 56 digs including a game-high 20 against ENMU and a game-high 28 against No. 6 West Texas A&M. On the season she has 183 digs and currently ranked 8th in the Lone Star Conference.

Casey Fletcher, Midwestern State University, SO, Eddy, Texas, Moody HS

Fletcher enjoyed two her best performances of the season while helping Midwestern to a weekend split with conference foes Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The sophomore from Eddy averaged 5.33 digs per set while posting back-to-back 20-dig efforts for the first time this season. Fletcher totalled 23 digs Friday against Incarnate Word before notching 25 digs in Saturday's 3-2 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville.

SETTER

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, SR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair HS

Hayes dished out 82 assists for an average of 11.7 per set to go along with 30 digs and five kills this past weekend as the No. 6 Lady Buffs remained perfect in LSC play with road wins at Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's. Hayes registered a double-double in both matches to improve her total to seven on the season. Her 82 assists this past weekend moves her to 10th all-time in school history with 1,964 career assists in just her second season at WT.

Danielle Suarez, University of the Incarnate Word, JR, San Antonio, Texas, Antonian Prep HS

Suarez directed a strong Incarnate Word attack that picked up a pair of road victories in conference play last week. She had her best match of the season in a four-set win at Midwestern State when she dished out 26 assists and led the team with 20 digs. She came back with 17 assists, six digs and three aces in a sweep of Cameron. She averaged 6.1 assists per set despite playing in a 6-2 formation.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kathryn Evans, Cameron University, put together a strong week with an overall .204 hitting percentage with 46 kills over three matches for the Aggies. Against Dallas Baptist she had 19 kills on 43 attempts hitting .372 leading her team. Evans' then had 18 kills vs. Texas A&M Kingsville helping Cameron get the win Friday night.

Halie Harton, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the Lady Buff offensively as the junior tallied 28 kills for an average of 4.00 per set to hit .256 on the weekend to go along with six block assists and 18 digs. The Goddard, New Mexico native tallied her fourth double-double of the season on Saturday afternoon as she tallied 14 kills and 10 digs as the No. 6 Lady Buffs remained unbeaten in LSC play with a four set win over Texas Woman's in Denton.

Dedra Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, continues to be one of the biggest offensive threats for the Javelinas. The junior led the team in kills on the weekend with 33 kills. She hit .236 on the weekend with 3.67 kills. Her 19 kills led all players at Midwestern State and continued her string of games with double-digit kills at seven.

Lindsey Barron, Eastern New Mexico University, paced all ENMU hitters in their three matches last week. In 10 sets, Barron pounded out 36 kills and 3.60 kills per set. In her most productive match of the week, Barron collected 20 kills and 11 digs against New Mexico Highlands University for her second 20-kill match and second double-double of the season.

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, was a dominant force for the TexAnns on their first LSC road trip - at Angelo State and Abilene Christian - of the season last week. The senior middle blocker led the team in kills (21), kills per set (3.50), hitting percentage (.475), total blocks (9) and points (27.5) in six sets.

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to 2-1 record last week including a 3-0 win at Texas A&M-Commerce and a 3-0 win over Eastern New Mexico. She led the team on offense with 34 kills, .338 hitting percentage and 39.5 points. Jablonska also added 20 assists, 16 digs and five total blocks and continues to be an all-around player on the court for TWU. She is currently ranked in the top-10 in five LSC statistical categories including kills (4th) and points (3rd).

Caitlin Wallace, Midwestern State University, notched consecutive 10-kill performance to help Midwestern State to a split last week against Lone Star Conference foes Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The junior middle blocker from Amarillo boasted a .340 attack percentage while averaging 2.56 kills per set. She notched a team-high 13 kills while committing just three errors for a .385 hitting percentage Friday against Incarnate Word. Wallace ended the weekend with a 10-kill performance (.292) in a five-set win over Texas A&M-Kingsville.

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the Lady Buffs on defense as she tallied 39 digs for an average of 5.57 per set to lead the No. 6 Lady Buffs to a perfect 2-0 weekend on the road in LSC play. The Hereford, Texas native moved within 178 digs of second place all-time in career digs at WT (Brittani Bell-2,150) and 276 away from first (Sara Contreras-2,248).

Emily Klein, Tarleton State University, was the top defender for the TexAnns, leading Tarleton with 32 digs over six sets on the road at Angelo and Abilene Christian.

Lydia Werchan, University of the Incarnate Word, had another strong week as the anchor of the Incarnate Word back line. She had 19 digs, three aces and five assists in the four-set win over Midwestern State and came back with 15 digs and two assists in the three-set win at Cameron. She averaged 4.9 digs per set for the week and committed only one reception error in 46 chances.

Haley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, continues to lead the Zia defense, in three matches Couch collected a team-high 47 digs and 4.70 digs per set. In 81 reception attempts Couch had minimal errors and posted a .951 reception percentage.

Bethany Friesenhahn, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, showed off remarkable diversity at the net and in the back row. In a tough five-set match with at Midwestern State, the junior had a career-high 26 assists to lead the team. She also had eight total blocks in the match, which is a season high. The middle blocker added seven kills in the match. Against Cameron, Friesenhahn had nine kills, two blocks and six digs.

Emily Booth, Angelo State University, showcased her blocking ability last week by finishing with eight blocks in the three-match week for the Belles. Booth completed the week with a 1.33 blocks per set average with seven block assists and a solo block. The senior showed her dominance against McMurry with six block assists and adding a block solo.

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, continued her consistent play for the Belles last week in ASU's three sweeps at the setter position. Woolsey completed the week with 112 assists for a 12.44 assists per set average and also added 3.67 digs per set (33 total). Woolsey had 43 assists against Tarleton State and 35 against Abilene Christian. The senior leads the conference in assists per set and now has 454 assists this season and 4,145 for her career at ASU.

Giselle Carreon, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, filling in for Sarah Fountain, Carreon had 88 assists in two matches. In her first career start she had 32 assists in three sets at Cameron. She had 56 against Midwestern State which is the second-highest total in for the Javelinas this fall.

Courtney Haney, Midwestern State University, delivered a solid all-around performance while averaging 6.33 assists per set out of the 6-2 system while helping Midwestern State to a split with conference foes Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The junior from Peaster logged 24 assists with a .400 set percentage to lead the Mustangs to a season-best .237 team hitting percentage Thursday against Incarnate Word. Haney then notched a season-best 33 assists in a 3-2 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday. She added 2.67 digs and 1.67 kills per set.

Kennedi Catano, Eastern New Mexico University, played strong all the way around the court this week as she collected 65 assists, 26 digs, and seven service aces. Against New Mexico Highlands University, Catano picked up 28 assists, 13 digs, and four aces, and her second double-double of the season.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, led the team in assists with 34 over six sets as she helped Tarleton to their first win at Abilene Christian since the 1998 season.

Angelo State

Angelo State cruised to three wins last week with sweeps of Tarleton State, McMurry and Abilene Christian. The Belles had a team hitting percentage of .306 while limiting opponents to a .063 percentage. The Belles (11-2, 4-0 LSC) enter this week having won six straight matches and have won 18 straight sets. Angelo State head coach Chuck Waddington earned his career's 100th win on Saturday with the win at Abilene Christian. ASU hosts Texas A&M-Kingsville on Tuesday at the Junell Center before traveling to play Eastern New Mexico Friday and West Texas A&M on Saturday.

Cameron

Cameron finished the week 1-2 at home hosting Dallas Baptist, Texas A&M Kingsville, and Incarnate Word. Over the last three matches Cameron has relied on 46 kills from freshman, Kathryn Evans and freshman, Shannon Dulaney who had her fifth double-double (12 kills and 12 digs) against Texas A&M Kingsville on Sept. 21. Cameron got stronger defensively with the return of Julisa Ocasio this last weekend. Her 596 digs last season was a program best and Ocasio was named Second Team All-Conference by the Lone Star Conference. The Aggies will host Texas Woman's, St. Mary's (TX.), Texas A&M Commerce, and Midwestern State this next week.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias opened the week with a match against in-state rival New Mexico Highlands University and then continued Lone Star Conference play with matchups against Texas Woman's University and Texas A&M University-Commerce. On the week the Zias fell 3-1 to the Cowgirls before falling 3-0 to both TWU and A&M-Commerce. Lindsey Barron and Courtney Bolton led the offensive charge as Barron picked up her second 20-kill game of the season and Bolton swung .312 for the week. In the backcourt Eastern was led by Hayley Couch who collected 4.70 digs per set. The Zias will be back in action Tuesday, September 25th as they host Cameron University and kick off the start of Eastern New Mexico's homecoming week.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals went 2-0 during the week with wins at Midwestern State and at Cameron to even up their LSC record on the season. Chetina Chavis was the only player on the team to reach double digit kills in each match. She led the team with 14 kills and a .423 attack against Midwestern State. She came back with 10 kills, a .333 attack and three blocks against Cameron. She averaged 3.4 kills per set with a .383 attack for the week. She leads the team with a .286 attack for the season. Danielle Suarez had her best match of the season in a four-set win at Midwestern State when she dished out 26 assists and led the team with 20 digs. She came back with 17 assists, six digs and three aces in a sweep of Cameron. She averaged 6.1 assists per set despite playing in a 6-2 formation. She is currently sixth all-time in school history with 1,292 career assists. Lydia Werchan had another strong week as the anchor of the Incarnate Word back line. She had 19 digs, three aces and five assists in win over Midwestern State and came back with 15 digs and two assists in the win at Cameron. She averaged 4.9 digs per set for the week and committed only one

reception error in 46 chances. She is quickly moving up the all-time charts at UIW in digs with 1,107. She is currently ninth all-time, but needs only 32 to move into seventh place.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State split a pair of Lone Star Conference matches at home last weekend falling to Incarnate Word 3-1 Thursday night before rallying for a five-set win over Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday... The win over the Javelinas snapped five-match slide for the Mustangs which was the longest losing streak since MSU dropped the final seven matches of the 2011 campaign... The Mustangs snapped a 12-set losing streak by taking the first set 25-18 over Incarnate Word Thursday night. MSU last dropped 12 consecutive sets over the final four matches last season... The Mustangs enjoyed just their second match with a .200 hitting percentage by hitting .237 Thursday against Incarnate Word. It was just the second .200 team hitting percentage performance of the season with the other coming in a 3-0 win over Southeastern Oklahoma on Sep. 1 (.246)... The Mustangs logged a season-best 12 total teams blocks in Saturday's 3-2 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville led by junior middle blockers Michelle Blount and Caitlin Wallace who were each in on six blocks... Junior setter/outside hitter Courtney Haney enjoyed a solid setting weekend averaging 6.33 assists per set out of the 6-2 system with an impressive .343 set percentage... Haney enjoyed her fourth and fifth double-doubles of the season with 24 assists and 12 digs against Incarnate Word before notching a season-high 33 assists to go along with 12 digs versus Texas A&M-Kingsville... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell competed her second double-double of the season with 21 assists and a season-high 15 digs against Incarnate Word... Junior outside hitter Beatriz Villalba returned from injury to notch 11 kills in each of MSU's matches against Incarnate Word and Texas A&M-Kingsville... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart enjoyed a solid all-around weekend averaging 1.78 kills, 3.78 digs and 0.33 blocks per set while recording her fourth double-double of the season with 10 kills and 23 digs to go along with three total blocks Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher tallied 20 digs in consecutive matches for the first time this season to average 5.33 digs per set... Junior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace hit .340 with a team-best 2.56 kills per set...

Tarleton State

Tarleton hit the road for its first conference road trip of the season last week with stops in Angelo and Abilene. After dropping the match against ASU, the TexAnns swept ACU to earn their first win in Abilene since 1998.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Sophomore setter Giselle Carreon made the first two starts of her career at setter over the weekend replacing Sarah Fountain who sat out due to an injury. In her first start, the sophomore had a career-high 32 assists in a four-set loss. In a tough 5-set match with Midwestern State, Carreon averaged over 10 assists per game finishing with 56. It was the second highest total by Javelina this fall as Fountain had 61 assists in a five-set victory over Southwest Baptist... Junior middle blocker Bethany Friesenhahn had a career match against Midwestern State. She had a

personal-best 26 digs against the Mustangs. She also added a block solo and seven block assists to match her season high. Her eight total blocks are a team-best this season surpassing the seven she had against Southwest Baptist. The 26 digs by Friesenhahn are the second most by A&M-Kingsville this season... Junior outside hitter Dedra Brown continues to be Kingsville's biggest threat on offense. She has six straight matches with at least 10 kills and recorded double-digit kills in each 9-of-12 matches she's played... In three, five-set matches the Brown has recorded 25, 22 and 19 kills... Sophomore outside hitter Kelsey Washington had her fourth double-double of the season on Saturday at Midwestern State. She had 18 kills on offense and 14 digs defensively... Sophomore outside hitter Stephanie Johns had a career-best 12 kills against Midwestern State... The Javelinas missed their season-high in kills as a team by four on Saturday finishing with 68. Earlier this season they had 72 against Southwest Baptist... The loss to Midwestern State was the Javelinas first 5-set loss this season after winning their first two.

Texas Woman's

The TWU volleyball team posted a 2-1 record last week including a 3-0 win at Texas A&M-Commerce on Tuesday and a 3-0 win over Eastern New Mexico on Friday. The Pioneers also battled hard against No. 6 West Texas in a 3-1 loss. TWU matched the Lady Buffs in kills and digs as they recorded just one less kill (54-55) and five more digs (84-79). Senior Viktorija Jablonska led the Pioneers on offense with 34 kills while sophomore Morgan Wilson was the leader on defense with 56 digs. TWU also got contributions from numerous other players. Junior Chloe' Tate had 27 kills and nine total blocks, junior Josie Santos posted 23 kills and 35 digs, junior Courtnee Davis recorded 21 kills and 28 digs and junior Marcela Alves finished with 21 kills and eight total blocks. Sophomore Kayla Rivero and Hannah Marshall had 62 and 40 assists respectively. The Pioneers will play their next five games and seven out of nine on the road starting at Abilene Christian on Tuesday, Sept. 25.

West Texas A&M
