#### LSC FOOTBALL

This week's Lone Star Conference football schedule includes two league contests - Midwestern State at Tarleton State and Texas A&M-Kingsville at Abilene Christian - along with five non-conference match-ups. There is one Top 25 match-up as the No. 9 Wildcats and No. 24 Javelinas square off in Abilene, Texas.

ACU, Angelo State, TAMUK and Incarnate Word each started the 2012 season with wins.

LSC football teams are 4-3 overall this season. The squads are 1-2 combined versus the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Great Lakes Valley Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, which are also in NCAA Super Regional Four.

### LONE STAR FOOTBALL FESTIVAL

The Lone Star Football Festival, a three-day, six-game affair which includes all nine LSC football teams, is set for September 13-14-15 at Cowboys Stadium. The event starts on Thursday with Midwestern State versus Texas A&M-Commerce at 7 p.m. The game will be televised live on the CBS Sports Network.

Friday's lineup includes one LSC game and a high school contest, with Incarnate Word versus Eastern New Mexico at 3:30 p.m., followed by defending 5A state champion Southlake Carroll against Temple at 7:30 p.m.

On Saturday, the action starts at Noon with Angelo State in opposition to two-time NCAA Division II national champion Valdosta State from the Gulf South Conference, followed by a pair of conference clashes with Tarleton State against Abilene Christian at 4 p.m. and Texas A&M-Kingsville versus West Texas A&M at 8 p.m.

Admission to the event will be offered in daily tickets for Thursday, Friday or Saturday's games along with an option for a three-day festival pass.

A daily ticket for Thursday or Friday is \$20 for adults and \$10 for students. Tickets for Saturday are \$25 for adults and \$10 for students. The festival pass, which is good for admission all three days, is \$35 for adults and \$15 for students. Seating will be general admission with children 1-year and older requiring a ticket. To be admitted with a student ticket, bearer must be between 1 and 18 years old or present valid college ID.

The 2011 Lone Star Football Festival drew an LSC attendance record 24,837 fans to a tripleheader of games, which included Midwestern State defeating Texas A&M-Commerce 63-17 in the Harvey Martin Classic, North Alabama stopping Abilene Christian 23-17, and West Texas A&M using a quick start to top Texas A&M-Kingsville

#### **OFFENSIVE**

## Torrence Allen, West Texas A&M University, JR, WR, Meridian, Texas, Meridian HS

Allen had a career day with a career and team-high nine receptions for 164 yards and one touchdown. Allen had career-long 75-yard touchdown pass from Dustin Vaughan to bring the Buffs within 37-27 early in the fourth quarter. He also had one solo tackle and one assisted tackle on the day. His previous best number of catches was four set twice, once last year and one the year before.

## Nick Richardson, Abilene Christian University, SO, DE, Waco, Texas, Waco HS

Richardson -- in his first start at defensive end after playing linebacker last season as a redshirt freshman -- tied the school record for sacks in a game with six in ACU's season-opening 51-0 win over McMurry. ... Richardson had three sacks in the first quarter and then had one in each of the next three quarters as he tied the record set originally in 1997 when James Henderson had six sacks in a game against Texas A&M-Commerce. ... Richardson finished the game with 10 tackles as the new-look ACU defense stymied an offense that was one of the best in NCAA Division III football in 2011. ... But McMurry -- new to NCAA Division II football in 2012 -- had just 301 total yards, including just 12 on the ground.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

#### Nathan Slaughter, West Texas A&M University, JR, PR/KR, Lubbock, Texas, Lubbock HS

Slaughter had an impressive debut as the starting return man for the Buffs. He had six returns for 192 yards for a 32.0 average per return. He had a career-high 62-yard return to begin the second half. Slaughter led the team with 203 all-purpose yards as he had four receptions for 21 yards and two carries, too.

#### **OTHER TOP PERFORMERS**

**De'Coreyon Thomas, Eastern New Mexico University**, paced the Greyhounds at New Mexico Highlands, with 83 yards of total offense. He rushed for 28 yards and hauled in four receptions for 55 additional yards.

**Jonathan Woodson, Texas A&M University - Kingsville**, rushed for a pair of 14 yard touchdowns. His second touchdown of the game sparked a half in which the Javelinas outscored Central Washington 23-0.

**Joey Knight, Angelo State University,** scored the Rams first touchdown of the season on a 20-yard pass from Blake Hamblin in the first quarter against Western State. The junior from Cornith caught five balls for 111 yards to help the Rams to a 42-14 victory.

Mitchell Gale, Abilene Christian University, directed an efficient ACU offensive attack Saturday night, leading the Wildcats to 44 of their 51 points as the country's 10th-ranked team opened the season with a 51-0 win over NCAA Division II newcomer McMurry. ... Gale -- the LSC Pre-Season Player of the Year and a pre-season all-America selection -- completed 68 percent of his passes (19 of 28) while throwing for 290 yards. ... Gale's 290-yard effort gives him more than 9,400 passing yards for his career and his one TD pass give him 77 career touchdown passes.

Danny Mason, Texas A&M University - Commerce, had his best night in a Lion uniform despite A&M-Commerce's 31-6 defeat on opening weekend. Mason notched a career-best 16 tackles against Southeastern Oklahoma State, nine of which were unassisted. He also had a pair of tackles for loss, including a seven-yard sack, while taking over as captain of the A&M-Commerce defensive unit.

**Rush Seaver, Angelo State University,** was a part of a defense that held Western State to only 29 yards rushing. His 14 total tackles not only led the Rams but is a career high for the sophomore.

**Steve Harris, Texas A&M University - Kingsville**, tied for the team lead with eight tackles including one for a loss in his debut for the Javelinas. He also intercepted one pass and returned it 51 yards. On special teams, he threw one pass for 32 yards on fourth down from his upback position on fourth down.

**Noah Brown, Eastern New Mexico University**, made eight tackles against New Mexico Highlands, with three for a loss and had 1.5 sacks for the game. He forced two second-quarter punts, with third-down sacks.

**Devan Avery, University of the Incarnate Word**, did something that very few college players can claim on Saturday. He played a number of snaps on both offense and defense. He was credited as a starter on both sides of the ball after being on the field for the first drive of the game on offense and defense. Avery played the majority of his snaps on the defensive side of the ball and did well. He had five tackles, two pass breakups and a tackle for loss. He played a key role in the defensive effort that limited Texas College to only 256 total yards of offense and only 120 through the air. However, Avery may have had the biggest impact upon the offense. On the second offensive play of the game for the Cardinals he was able to get behind the TC defense and snagged a 48-yard reception setting up the team's first touchdown. Then, in the third quarter he caught a 51-yard bomb that got the team out of a third-and-12 situation deep in their own territory.

Joseph Sadler, University of the Incarnate Word, had a successful first experience at the collegiate level averaging 45.0 yards per kick. He also put all three kicks inside the 20-yard line pinning the Steers back deep on each occasion. His best boot came in the final 30 seconds of the game when he pinned Texas College back at their own 9-yard line after a 48-yard punt.

**Joseph Pickett, Angelo State University,** appearing in his first collegiate game, averaged 50.5 yard per punt last night. He boomed a career long 57 yard punt to keep Western State at bay.

## LSC NOTES (Submitted by LSC SID's)

### **Abilene Christian**

ACU opened its 2012 season Saturday night with a 51-0 win over McMurry, which was playing in its first game as an NCAA Division II institution. ... The Wildcats' 51 points were the most they've scored in a season-opener since opening the 1971 season with a 53-10 win over McMurry. ... Saturday night's game against the War Hawks was the first between the two teams since 1971, although they are less than 10 miles apart inside the city of Abilene. ... ACU's win was its fifth straight season-opening victory and sixth in the last seven seasons. ... The win was also the first in the career of first-year ACU head coach Ken Collums, who had served as the offensive coordinator from 2005-11. ... Sophomore defensive end Nick Richardson tied the ACU single-game record for sacks in a game with 6, quailing the mark set in 1997 by James Henderson in a game against Texas A&M-Commerce. ... Richardson finished one sack short of the NCAA Division II single-game mark of seven set by Catawba's Ron Ellington vs. Mars Hill on Oct. 1, 2005. ... ACU finished the game with 9.0 sacks, six by Richardson and one each for Ryan Smith, Brandon Dornak and Kolby Rowe. ... The Wildcats kicked off nine times in the game with eight of them going for touchbacks. ... Transfer running back Marcel Threat is the Wildcats' third-string back, but he led all ball carriers with 88 yards and two scores on 14 carries. ... Junior wide receiver Taylor Gabriel -- a pre-season all-America -- finished the night with seven catches for 108 yards and one score and one carry for a 7-yard touchdown. ... ACU had just 21 rushing touchdowns in 11 games in 2011, but finished the win over McMurry with six rushing touchdowns (two by Threat, one by Charcandrick West, two by redshirt freshman Travis Tarver and one for Gabriel). ... Mitchell Gale threw a 9-yard TD pass to Gabriel in the second quarter, the 24th straight game in which Gale has thrown a touchdown pass. ... Gale has thrown a touchdown pass in 29 of his 32 career starts. ... The Wildcats are 24-8 in Gale's 32 starts. ... ACU is now 58-46-2 against non-Lone Star Conference opponents since joining the league in 1973. ... Saturday night's 51-point effort marks the 20th time since 2006 that the Wildcats have scored at least 50 points in a game, ACU is 19-1 in those games. ... ACU's 51-0 win marks the first shutout pitched by a Wildcat defense since a 21-0 win over Eastern New Mexico on Sept. 30, 2006. ... It's the first time ACU has shut out an opponent at Shotwell Stadium since Sept. 23, 2006, when the Wildcats beat Southwestern Oklahoma State, 31-0. ... ACU is now 44-43-4 alltime in 91 season-opening games.

#### Angelo State

The Rams scored 28 unanswered points after being down by a touchdown and rolled to a 42 to 14 victory over Western State. The offense racked up 437 yards of offense while the defense held the Mountaineers to 175 total yards and only 29 rushing yards. -The Rams defense held Western State to 175 total yards in its season opening 42-14 win. The 175 yards is the fewest yards allowed by an Angelo State defense since Sept. 19, 2009 when

Central Oklahoma only mustered 172 total yards. -Fans got to see something that the Rams haven't done in quite a while. The first quarter blocked punt by Jared Ross and the scoop and score by Courtney Moore were both something the Rams haven't accomplished in a while. The last time the Rams blocked a punt was against Texas A&M-Commerce in 2008. Ram fans haven't seen a blocked punt returned for a touchdown since prior to 1999. - Blake Hamblin and Dakarai Pecikonis had celebrated returns after being injured during 2011. Hamblin threw for 320 yards and four touchdowns while Pecikonis hauled in his first touchdown since the Southeastern Oklahoma game in 2010.

#### Eastern New Mexico

The Greyhound defense limited New Mexico Highlands to three yards of offense in the first quarter, but Eastern dropped a 42-14 decision after a second-half explosion by the Cowboys. The Greyhounds won the turnover battle, 4-2, and registered four sacks on the road, for the first time since the 2009 season. This week, the Eastern New Mexico University football team will host Sul Ross State, for the first time since the 1978 season.

#### **Incarnate Word**

Season Openers The Cardinals improved to 2-2 alltime in season openers after their 19-12 win over Texas College. It was the fourth straight season the team has opened at Benson Stadium. The attendance for the game was 4,522 which is the fourth highest in school history behind the first game in school history (6,325) and a pair of games against Texas A&M-Kingsville (5,412 in 2010 and 5,667 in 2011). In 2009, they defeated Monterrey Tech, 42-39 in the program's first game. The past two years, the Cardinals have lost to Langston, 28-20 in 2010 and to East Central, 31-21 in 2011 in the season openers. The New Deion Sanders Senior Devan Avery did something that very few college players can claim on Saturday. He played a number of snaps on both offense and defense. He was credited as a starter on both sides of the ball after being on the field for the first drive of the game on offense and defense. Avery played the majority of his snaps on the defensive side of the ball and did well. He had five tackles. two pass breakups and a tackle for loss. He played a key role in the defensive effort that limited Texas College to only 256 total yards of offense and only 120 through the air. However, Avery may have had the biggest impact upon the offense. On the second offensive play of the game for the Cardinals he was able to get behind the TC defense and snagged a 48yard reception setting up the team's first touchdown. Then, in the third quarter he caught a 51-yard bomb that got the team out of a third-and-12 situation deep in their own territory. Avery spent his first three years with the team playing strictly on defense, but he has a lot of experience on the offensive side of the ball. He played wide receiver in high school up through his junior year and did not actually play defense until his senior season. Closing in on a Milestone Senior running back Trent Rios has been the face of the franchise for the Cardinals ever since he stepped on campus in 2008 and is now closing in on some career milestones. He had 52 yards rushing and caught two passes for 12 yards while scoring two touchdowns in the win over Texas College. Rios now has 1,983 career yards rushing and should become the first Cardinal to surpass 2,000 rushing yards in the game against Sam Houston State. He has led the Cardinals in rushing in each of his three previous seasons. He is also closing in on 3,500 career all-purpose yards

needing only 27 more to reach that mark. Rios moved into first place on the school's career scoring list with his two touchdowns on Saturday. He moved past former kicker Thomas Rebold with 158 points while Rebold has 152. The two touchdowns give him 26 in his career, 13 more than the next closest player.

#### **Midwestern State**

The defending Lone Star Conference Champion Mustangs began the season with an open week and celebrates the silver anniversary season of football returning to MSU when they meet Tarleton State in Stephenville on Saturday. This is the 25th season since Midwestern beat Howard Payne 23-7 at Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls on Sept. 3, 1988 in its first game in 32 years since losing to West Texas A&M 41-14 on Dec. 1. 1956 in Wichita Falls ... standing fourth in the AFCA Division II Poll, Midwestern it at its highest preseason ranking in history ... MSU returns 84.3 percent of it's rushing offense or 3,000 of its 3,558 yards on the ground from a team that led the LSC and was second in Division II in rushing with 323.5 yards per game ... The Mustangs have four returning offensive All-Americans in quarterback Brandon Kelsey (3rd team Hansen), running back Keidrick Jackson (HM D2Football.com), offensive guard Ken van Heule (2nd team Hansen) and center Justen Tyler (HM Hansen) ... The Mustangs led NCAA Division II in total offense (531.9 yards a game) and scoring offense (48.6 points per game) in 2011 ... Jackson led the LSC in rushing and scoring as a sophomore with 94.9 yards a contest and 10.4 points a game, while Kelsey was third in rushing (87.9 ypg) and LSC Freshman of the Year Jimmy Pipkin was seventh in rushing (66.5 ypg) ... Midwestern was third in the LSC in total defense a season ago, but returns only four starters from that squad ... However, MSU returns four All-Lone Star Conference defenders including safety Pat Gardner (first team), linebacker Donald Napoleon (second team - not a starter), cornerback Neiko Conway (second team - not a starter) and linebacker Matt Ellerbrock (HM) ... Gardner was the number two tackler for the Mustangs in 2011 with 56 total stops (38 solo), including 1.5 tackles for losses (-2 yards) ... Conway led the team with and tied for fifth in the LSC with three interceptions ... MSU does have another All-American returnee in deep snapper Randall Arbuckle (1st team BSCN and 1st team All-LSC) and kicker Greg Saladino was second-team All-LSC ... Midwestern has won 11 straight regular season games dating back to a 27-7 loss at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Nov. 6, 2010 ... MSU has started the season with a bang in the Bill Maskill era, winning all 10 of the season openers under the dean of coaches in the LSC ... MSU has won 11 straight season openers and is 16-8 to open since 1988 ... its the first time since 2008 that MSU has opened the season against an LSC opponent ... its the third straight year that MSU has opened its season on the road ... the MSU schedule features three teams that opened the season in the AFCA Top 25 (No. 10 ACU, No. 15 West Alabama, No. 24 West Texas A&M) and three others (Texas A&M-Kingsville, Tarleton State and West Georgia) that received votes in the poll ...

#### **Tarleton State**

The 2012 season is about to get underway when Tarleton hosts No. 4 Midwestern State at 7 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 8 at Tarleton Memorial Stadium.

### Texas A&M-Commerce

Little went right for A&M-Commerce in its season-opening 31-6 loss to Southeastern Oklahoma State.

The Savage Storm opened up the scoring with a 79-yard interception return in the first quarter as the Lion offense struggled all night. Tyler Rawlings led the way with five catches for 60 yards offensively while Danny Mason recorded a career-best 16 tackles on defense for A&M-Commerce. SEOSU held a 2-1 advantage in time of possession, including a 16-play, 99-yard drive that chewed up 12 minutes in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. The Lions have now lost two straight season-openers and are 2-9 in their last 11.

#### Texas A&M-Kingsville

Senior running back Jonathan Woodson didn't skip a beat as his senior season on the gridiron began with a two touchdown performance. He finished with 71 yards on the ground and another 21 receiving. His two scores while both 14-yard jaunts showed different elements of his game. His first showed his elusiveness as he lost yardage to near the 30 before cutting back against the grain and streaking to the end zone. His second score took a more direct route as he took the ball off tackle...The Javelinas were picked to finish fourth in this year's Lone Star Conference preseason poll. Over the next three weeks they will find out if the voters were right as they face Abilene Christian, West Texas A&M, and Midwestern State. All three were picked to finish the season ahead of the Javs in the LSC. Those three teams all began the ranked nationally and combined for a 26-7 record a year ago. The Javelinas will also play a pair of Gulf South Conference powers this year as part of the LSC-GSC Challenge. They take on North Alabama at home in the sixth week of the season and travel to Valdosta State for the 10th week of the season. Both teams are ranked in the top 12 in the country this year... With Saturday's win, the Javelinas have won fourstraight season-opening games. The team is 4-2 in openers under head coach Bo Atterberry. Since 2000, the team is 7-6 in season debuts...The Javelinas hold a 31-15-1 lead in the all-time series with this week's opponent Abilene Christian. However, Kingsville has lost eight straight contests to the Wildcats. The last win for the Javelinas was a 10-7 decision in 2003 under former coach Richard Cundiff...The Javelina defense bent but did not break on Saturday in the team's 35-7 win. The visiting Wildcats out-gained the hosts 352-309 but were held to just seven points. The Kingsville defense forced and recovered a pair of fumbles and intercepted a pair of passes. The turnovers led directly to 20 TAMUK points...Robert Williams is no stranger to the Lone Star Conference. The senior defensive end is in his first season with the football team. The newcomer to the gridiron had three total tackles with a sack, another tackle for a loss and recovered a fumble that resulted in a Kingsville touchdown...He recently completed a 2-year career on the hardwood. He averaged over 13 points and seven rebounds a game. The hoops team appeared in the conference tournament both years and made one NCAA regional appearance...The Javelinas received a boost on defense from a transfer who is no stranger to the LSC. Steve Harris, a former first-team selection in the LSC, tied for the team lead with eight tackles including a team-best five solo, and also had an interception that he returned 51 yards. On special teams, he completed a 32-yard pass on fourth down from his up-back position on the punting unit.

## West Texas A&M

RECAPPING COLORADO STATE-PUEBLO - The Buffs outgained CSUP 541-493 in total yardage for the second year in a row, but were unable to come up with the victory. A fumble at the goal line and another

trip into the red zone resulting in no points proved costly for WT. Buffalo junior quarterback Dustin Vaughan threw for three scores and a game-high 398 yards on 29 of 46 passing with one interception. Junior wide receivers Torrence Allen and Lance Ratliff had 164 and 153 yards, respectively, as Ratliff had two long touchdown catches. The ground game for the Buffs never got going as junior Aaron Harris led the way with 28 yards on the ground. Conversely, CSUP had 271 yards on the ground with two rushes with 100 yards or more as J.B. Matthews had 153 vards and a score and Chris Ashe had 103 yards on the ground and a score. Matthews also caught a touchdown as CSUP's quarterback Ross Dausin was 20 of 26 for 222 yards and two scores. 9X3 - Thee Buffs led the team with nine tackles each as Taylor McCuller, Kyler Gregory and Jordan Smith led the team. McCuller had the most solo stops with four, while Gregory and Smith each assisted six tackles. THANK YOU MR. SMITH - Senior defensive back Jordan Smith stripped and recovered the ball from CSUP wide receiver Trent Thompson on the very first play from scrimmage. The Buffs were unable to punch it in after that. Smith had a co-team-high nine tackles, the forced fumble and fumble recovery. TWO OVER 150 - Junior wide receivers Torrence Allen and Lance Ratliff had outstanding season-opening games as they both combined for 17 receptions, 317 yards and three scores. Allen led the team with nine catches for 164 yards and a score, while Ratliff had 153 yards and two scores. It was the first time since Oct. 2, 2010, at Northeastern State (Okla.). Ratliff was involved in that record as well as was now-junior Trevor Hammargren. MCCLUSKEY HAVOC - Junior linebacker Kevin McCluskey had the lone sack in the season-opening loss at CSUP last week for the Buffs and led the team with two tackles for loss. McCluskey dropped the quarterback for eight yards and then had a tackle for loss for two yards. OPEN WITH THE RMAC - The Buffs open the 2012 slate facing back-to-back teams from the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference in a road game at CSU-Pueblo (Aug. 30) and then at home versus Western State Colorado University (Sept. 8). WT is 25-7 all-time against current RMAC football schools.
