LSC VOLLEYBALL

The Lone Star Conference volleyball season is underway with all 11 teams taking part in tournament play. Angelo State, West Texas A&M and Abilene Christian will play in the Colorado Premier Challenge this week, which includes nine teams ranked in the current AVCA Coaches Top 25 Poll.

After one week of action, four teams - ASU, A&M-Commerce, Texas A&M-Kingsville and Texas Woman's - are each undefeated at 4-0. ASU, A&M-C and TWU won all of their matches in three sets.

LSC volleyball teams are 28-17 overall this season. The squads are currently 3-6 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 6-6 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Shelbi Goode, Angelo State University, JR, Georgetown, Texas, Georgetown HS

Goode led the Angelo State volleyball team with 56 kills, including double-digit put downs in each game, as the Belles started the season with a 4-0 record. Goode, a transfer from the University of Alabama, recorded 4.67 kills per set while hitting .333 to help ASU not lose a single set in the Hilltopper/Rattler Classic. Goode also contributed 32 digs and assisted on six blocks.

Rachel Robertson, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SR, Princeton, Texas, Princeton HS

Robertson was key in helping the Lions to a perfect weekend at the Henderson State Invitational as A&M-Commerce notched four 3-0 sweeps. Robertson finished with 47 kills, a .500 hitting percentage, 10 service aces and 13 blocks in leading the Lions to their first 4-0 start since 2003. She was named to the All-Tournament team and upped her career kill total to 999, moving into a tie for ninth all-time in program history.

DEFENSIVE

Hayley Couch, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Santa Fe, Texas, Santa Fe HS

Couch led the Zias in both digs and reception attempts for the week. In four matches, Couch attempted 110 receptions while only committing two errors for a .982 reception percentage. Over 15 total sets played, she averaged 5.60 digs per set and scooped up 84 total digs, twice as many as any other Zia. In the Zias first win against Texas Permian Basin, Couch led the dig count with 31 and was the first Zia to scoop up more than 30 digs in a single game since the 2008 season. Her 31 dig feat is good for seventh overall on ENMU's single-game dig career list.

Shelby Wilt, Angelo State University, SO, Dalhart, Texas, Dalhart HS

Wilt led Angelo State with 65 digs in its four-match sweep at the Hilltopper/Rattler Classic against Southeastern Oklahoma, St. Mary's, Southwestern Oklahoma and St. Edward's. Wilt also added nine assists to her 5.42 digs per set average.

SETTER

Alex Woolsey, Angelo State University, SR, Plano, Texas, Plano East HS

Woolsey averaged 13.17 assists per set to help lead the Angelo State volleyball team to four wins, while hitting .295, to open the season. Woolsey, who is within striking distance of the all-time ASU assists record this season, finished the first weekend of action with 158 as the Belles did not drop a single set.

Jordan Neal, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Joshua, Texas, Joshua HS

Neal was named to the Henderson State Invitational All-Tournament team after helping the Lions to a perfect 4-0 mark over the weekend with four 3-0 sweeps. Neal dished out 141 assists, averaging 11.75 per set, including a season-best 42 against West Alabama as the Lions hit .310. She also notched her first double-double of the season against host Henderson State, finishing with 35 assists and 11 digs.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Amber Durand, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in four strong performances last week. In four matches, the Zias collected three wins while Durand picked up 64 kills, 4.27 kills per set and three double-doubles. In the Zias first game of the season, Durand picked up 20 kills and 17 digs en route to Eastern New Mexico's first season opening win since 2002. Two matches later, she collected a new season-high with 21 kills against Western State. In addition to her stellar offensive numbers, she scooped up 44 digs, eight blocks, and collected a career-high five blocks against University of North Alabama.

Dedra Brown, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led Javelinas to the title at the Super 9 Javelina Invitational. She finished with a team-best 46 kills and had a .308 hitting percentage. Her best match came against McMurry when she had a match-high 22 kills in the win. In that match she had nine digs just missing what would have been the first double-double by a Javelina this season.

Viktorija Jablonska, Texas Woman's University, led the team on offense with 38 kills, 47 points and .349 hitting percentage in four games and was named to the all-tournament team at the 2012 Holiday Inn Express & Suites Classic. She also posted 13 digs, eight total blocks and a team-best five service aces. The Pioneers went 4-0 without dropping a set over the weekend and off to a best start since 1996 season when they started the season 11-0.

Rachel Riley, Abilene Christian University, led the Wildcats with a .365 hitting percentage and scored 51 points on the strength of 47 kills and six block assists during a 2-2 weekend at the Hilltopper / St. Mary's Classic. Riley started only eight matches as a freshman, but appears to be on her way to filling the void left behind by Jennie Hutt as evident by a career best 18 kills and .607 hitting percentage in ACU's three-game sweep of Southeastern Oklahoma. Riley began her year with nine kills in a season opening loss to St. Edwards, and then had 10 in back-to-back matches vs. Southwestern Oklahoma and Colorado State-Pueblo.

Shelbi Stewart, Midwestern State University, posted the program's fourth most efficient attacking game in school history Saturday against Southwestern Oklahoma State putting down 16 kills in 24 attempts without an error for a .667 attack percentage. It was also the most attacks without an error in school history. The senior outside hitter from Pflugerville paced the Mustangs with 2.71 kills per set while posting a .392 attack percentage during the four-match Rattler/Hilltopper Classic. Stewart was also errorless in 19 attacks with 10 kills Friday in a 3-1 win over Southeastern Oklahoma.

Nikki McNorton, Tarleton State University, was named to the Colorado Mines All-Tournament team after leading the TexAnns to a pair of wins over St. Joseph's and No. 12 Wayne State. The senior middle blocker led the team with 37 kills in 15 sets as well as 24 total blocks.

Emily Klein, Tarleton State University, was a defensive force for the TexAnns during the Colorado Mines tournament last weekend, helping Tarleton to wins over St. Joseph's and No. 12 Wayne State. The junior libero led the team with 73 digs to go along with four service aces.

Ali Insell, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the team from her libero position averaging 4.14 a game. She is now just 14 digs from recording 1,000 in her career. She had double-digit digs in three of four matches. She had 22 digs against McMurry in five sets and followed that up with 20 in the finale with Wayland Baptist.

Lauren Beville, West Texas A&M University, moved from sixth to third on the WT Career Digs list this past weekend as the #9 Lady Buffs went 3-1 at the BritKare Lady Buff Classic in Canyon. The Hereford, Texas native registered 52 digs for an average of 4.00 per set while also tallying three service aces.

Morgan Wilson, Texas Woman's University, led the Pioneers' defense with 45 digs and 3.75 digs per set as the starting libero. She also posted a team best five service aces. The Pioneers went 4-0 without dropping a set over the weekend and off to a best start since 1996 season when they started the season 11-0.

Sarah Siemens, Abilene Christian University, a 6-foot-1 freshman setter, not only set ACU's offense in motion all weekend long by averaging 11.0 assists per match, but she also was a force at the net in collecting 11 block assists, which were one behind team leader Corrie Reeder. Siemens offensively also delivered five kills and five service aces as the Wildcats went 2-2 at the St. Mary's / Hilltopper Classic. Defensively, Siemens added 38 digs for a 2.53 per match average.

Lacy Hayes, West Texas A&M University, proved why she was named the 2012 LSC Preseason Setter of the Year this past weekend as the #9 Lady Buffs went 3-1 to open the season at the BritKare Lady Buff Classic in Canyon. Hayes registered 129 assists for an incredible average of 9.92 per set while also tallying 4 service aces and nine kills for the Lady Buffs.

Gabby Clark, Eastern New Mexico University, turned in strong showings in her first appearances as a Zia. In three matches she averaged 9.33 assists per set and had 112 assists overall. Against Western State, Clark had a career-high 52 assists, and helped offensive player of the week nominee Amber Durand reach 21 kills for the match. Clark also picked up 16 digs, five kills, three blocks, and a service ace for the week.

Jenna Risoli, Cameron University, recorded 156 assists in four matches, for an average of 9.18. Had 50 assists (highest total since early last season) and 16 digs against Newman which was her 12th career double-double for the Aggies. She also recorded 13 kills over the weekend where Cameron split 2-2.

Sarah Fountain, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, after playing in just seven sets a season ago, Fountain played in 14 this week. She had 25 or more assists in three matches including 49 against McMurry in a 5-set match. She had 29 in her first start against Our Lady of the Lake and 25 against Schreiner. The Javelinas hit nearly 80 points better over the weekend than they did a year ago.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, recorded 104 assists in the season opening tournament at Colorado Mines last weekend, including a season-high 38 against Arkansas Fort-Smith in the first game. She also recorded at least 20 assists in every game of the tournament, including 21 against No. 12 Wayne State and 25 against No. 25 Colorado Mines.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, led the team with 79 assists and 6.58 assists per set as the starting setter in a 6-2 offense. She also posted 26 digs on defense and three block assists. With Rivero running the offense the Pioneers went 4-0 without dropping a set over the weekend and off to a best start since 1996 season when they started the season 11-0.

qualifier St. Edward's, 3-1, and regional foe, Colorado State-Pueblo, 3-2, but defeated both Southwestern and Southeastern Oklahoma by matching 3-0 scores. The Wildcats are a combined 15-0 against both Oklahoma schools. ACU received solid performances from its sophomore and freshmen classes. Sophomore Rachel Riley and Sara Oxford tied for the team lead with 47 kills and combined for 103 of the squad's 237 points. Riley also led the way with a .365 hitting percentage. Freshman setter Sarah Siemens contributed 11 assists per set, five service aces, and 11 block assists, which put her one behind classmate Corrie Reeder who totaled 12 blocks (1 solo, 11 assists). Another freshman Jennie Loercher hammered home 40 kills, while another, Madison Hoover, was among the team's leaders with 43 digs. Junior Madelyn Robinette led all Wildcats with 53 digs and a 3.79 per match average, as well as 10 service aces. ACU remains on the road next weekend in Denver for the Colorado Premier Challenge. Opponents include #2 Tampa and #25 Colorado School of Mines.

Angelo State

The Angelo State volleyball team opened its season with four wins - all coming by way of sweeps. The No. 15 Belles took care of business against Southeastern Oklahoma, St. Mary's, Southwestern Oklahoma and St. Edward's at the Hilltopper/Rattler Classic. ASU out blocked its opponents 24.5-17 on the weekend and finished with 16.1 kills per set. The Belles return to action this weekend in the Colorado Premiere Classic and open against No. 3 Cal-State Bernadino.

Cameron

Cameron opened the season with the Drury University Tournament in Springfield, Mo. where they split four matches. In day one of the tournament the Aggies pushed matches to a decisive set five times, something that has not happened in the past decade. With an early turnaround the Aggies were able to sweep the day two beating Kentucky Wesleyan 3-0 (25-18, 25-21, 25-19) and defeating Newnan University 3-1 (28-26, 25-18, 24-26, 25-21). Freshman Shannon Dulaney had her second double-double vs. Newnan the weekend with 26 kills and 18 digs. This was highest mark for kills since Kelle Carver had 30 kills against UT-Permian Basin on 10/1/11. Jenna Risoli recorded her 12th career double-double after providing Cameron solid support with 16 digs and 50 assists vs. Newman as well. She also tied her fourth highest career total in a match for assists. The Aggies will travel next to Pueblo, Colo. for the CSU-Pueblo Tournament on Sept. 7 and 8 to face New Haven, Wayland Baptist, Adams State, and host CSU-Pueblo.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University Zias are off to their best start since the 2002 season. In the opening week, Eastern New Mexico picked up three victories which included a season opening victory against University of Texas of the Permian Basin. Senior outside hitter Amber Durand averaged 4.27 kills per set for the weekend while also notching two 20 kill games, and newcomer Hayley Couch collected 31 digs against Western State for the most digs in a single match since 2008. The Zias will look to extend their two-game win streak as they head to Pueblo, Colo. this weekend for the CSU-Pueblo ThunderWolves Classic.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals struggled in their season opening tournament hosted by Colorado Mines going 0-4. They lost to the host, Dallas Baptist, Arkansas-Fort Smith and Colorado Mesa. Angelique Vidaurri was one of

the few bright spots for the team averaging 4.00 kills and 2.23 digs per set in the four matches. She also led the team with a .265 attack. Lydia Werchan was her normal self on the back line averaging 4.38 digs per set. Meaghan Patterson led the team with nine blocks for the weekend.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State posted a 1-3 mark at the season opening Hilltopper/Rattler Classic... Junior transfer outside hitter/setter Courtney Haney narrowly missed a triple-double finishing with nine kills, 24 set assists and 13 digs in a 3-1 win over Southeastern Oklahoma State on Aug. 31... Haney posted three consecutive double-doubles at St. Mary's (10 set assists, 10 digs), against Southeastern Oklahoma (24 set assists, 13 digs) and at St. Edward's (15 set assists, 10 digs)... Senior outside hitter Shelbi Stewart posted the fourth best single-match hitting efficiency performance in school history putting down 16 kills in 24 attack attempts without an error Saturday against Southwestern Oklahoma. It was the best errorless match in school history with a minimum of 14 attacks and trailed only Sydney Haisler (.766 vs. Harding on 9/22/00), LaToya Terry (.714 (11-1-14) vs. Southeastern Oklahoma on 11/4/04) and Abbi Meyer (.692 (19-1-26) at Wayland Baptist on 9/4/04) in single match hitting percentage... Sophomore libero Casey Fletcher notched a collegiate career best 28 digs Friday against Southeastern Oklahoma before recording 16 digs against St. Edward's and 17 against Southwestern Oklahoma to finish the weekend with a 4.50 digs per set average... Sophomore setter Kristan Aduddell closed the weekend with a solid .375 set percentage while averaging a team-best 6.00 set assists out of the 6-2 system... Haney recorded a solid .365 set percentage while averaging 1.50 kills and 2.79 digs per set as an all-around performer... The Mustangs hit the road to compete in the Colorado-Colorado Springs Invitational next weekend. MSU takes on Wayne State (Neb.) and Franklin Pierce (N.H.) on Friday before closing the tourney against Fort Lewis (Colo.) and host UCCS on Saturday...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State competed in the Courtyard and Residence Inn by Marriott Oredigger Volleyball Classic at Colorado Mines last weekend and went 2-2, including a win over No. 12 Wayne State on Saturday. Nikki McNorton was named to the all-tournament team.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce got off to a fast start in 2012, playing just 12 matches at the Henderson State Invitational and winning each of them. The Lions dominated, posted 3-0 decisions over Alabama-Huntsville, West Alabama, LeMoyne-Owen and Henderson State, despite having to play back-to-back matches on both Friday and Saturday. Rachel Robertson and Jordan Neal were named to the All-Tournament team as A&M-Commerce started the season 4-0 for the first time since 2003.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Javelinas Get Off To Fast Start In Home Tourney The Javelinas went 4-0 in hosting the Super 8 Javelinas Tournament to open the season this past season. A&M Kingsville swept three of their first four opponents. It was the first time since the 2009 season that the team won its first four matches of the season and is the second-best start ever by the volleyball program. The 2009 team opened the season with six straight victories to open the year.. Insell Closing In On 1,000-Dig Plateau Senior Ali Insell continues her climb up the

all-time dig list and is closing in on 1,000 for her career. With 58 digs in the first four matches of the season, Insell has 986 digs in her career. She is currently eighth all-time in digs and would become the seventh Javelina player to surpass the 1,000-dig mark. Last year, she had 530 digs which was the fourth-highest total in a single-season by a Kingsville player. Brown Makes Powerful First Impression Junior college transfer Dedra Brown made a stellar first impression at the Division II level. The transfer from Ranger Junior College had a team-high 46 kills over the weekend in four matches. She had a career-high 22 kills in the team's 5-set win over McMurry. In the victory over the Warhawks, the outside hitter had 15 kills in the first two sets as the Javs jumped out to 2-0 advantage. Brown just missed her first double-double as a member of the Javelinas in the match as she collected nine digs. Brown averaged over 3.5 kills per set and had a .309 hitting percentage. Fountain Enjoying Breakout Season As Setter If the opening tournament is any gauge, sophomore Sarah Fountain has made tremendous improvement in her ability to run the Hogs offense. After seeing action in just seven sets a year ago when she collected just 33, Fountain has seized control of the reins of the Javelina offense. Rewarded with her first four starts of her career, Fountain finished the weekend with 121 assists. She averaged 8.64 assists a set which would be the ninth-best mark for a season if she maintains the pace. Javelinas Get Off To Fast Start In Home Tourney The Javelinas will have a tough task this week to keep the success they had opening weekend as they head to Bolivar, Mo. for another tournament. They will be facing tournament host Southwest Baptist along with Rockhurst, Harding and Washburn this week. Washburn is ranked No. 7 in the nation and opened the season 4-0 as did Rockhurst. Harding, who lost to Rockhurst in its opening match of the season, is 2-2. Southwest Baptist won its final two matches at the Saint Leo Classic to move to 2-2 on the season.

Texas Woman's

The TWU volleyball team opened the season with a bang. The Pioneers hosted their annual Holiday Inn Express & Suites Classic and won all four games in three sets and off to a best start since 1996 season when they started the season 11-0. Senior Viktorija Jablonska led the Pioneers' offense with 38 kills, .349 hitting percentage and 47 points. Junior Marcela Alves made her debut with TWU and recorded 27 kills, .242 hitting percentage and 34.5 points. She also led the team with 12 total blocks. Both Jablonska and Alves were named to the all-tournament team. Junior Courtnee Davis also made her debut with TWU and posted 23 kills and 37 digs. Sophomore Morgan Wilson was the leader on defense with 45 digs while sophomore Kayla Rivero led the team with 79 assists in a 6-2 offense. Next up for the Pioneers will be a road trip to Grand Junction, Colorado, to play in the Holiday Inn Crossroads Classic hosted by Colorado Mesa. TWU will face Fort Hays State and Western State College on Friday, Sept. 7, and then take on Grand Canyon and Colorado Mesa on Saturday, Sept. 8.

West Texas A&M

The #9 Lady Buffs stumbled early but rebounded to finish the 2012 BritKare Lady Buff Classic with a 3-1 record to start off the season.
