All-Lone Star Conference Softball Teams Announced;

Eastern New Mexico's Jennifer Doolittle and East Central's Cherene Hiesl Named LSC Players of the Year

RICHARDSON, TEXAS -- The 1998 All-Lone Star Conference Softball North and South Division Teams have been announced. LSC North Division champion Southeastern Oklahoma has landed five players on the first team and have the North Division Rookie of the Year In the South Division, regular season champion Tarleton placed four players on the first squad.

East Central University finished fifth (10-10) in the North Division race but have the Player of the Year in outfielder Cherene Hiesl, who hit .375 for the year with an .818 slugging percentage and a league high 10 home runs in just 88 official at bats. Hiesl was also walked a league high 29 times. ECU coach Ron Miller has been voted LSC North Division Coach of the Year after guiding the Tigers to a 24-16 record. The North Division Rookie of the year is Southeastern Oklahoma catcher Adrienne Stoops. Central Oklahoma pitcher Deanna Melson is the North Division Pitcher of the Year. She owns a 2.23 ERA and a 14-4 record for the season in 113 innings of work.

The South Division Player of the Year is Eastern New Mexico's **Jennifer Doolittle.** The first baseman ranks second in the LSC in hitting with a .470 average. She leads the conference in runs scored (51), hits (78), doubles (16), triples (8), and RBIs (72). Pitcher of the Year in the South is Abilene Christian's **Shelly Owen**. She has helped the Wildcats to a 31-22 record this season by working 295.2 innings on the mound and posting a 27-16 record. She leads the conference in strikeouts with 136. ACU outfielder **Veronica Villa** is the South Division Rookie of the Year. Tarleton (10-6) won the South Division championship and coach **Julie Mata** has been named South Division Coach of the Year after guiding the TexAnns to a 32-12-1 season record.

The North Division All-Conference First Team includes Southeastern Oklahoma's Summer Smith (third base), Adrienne Stoops (catcher), Kim Earickson (outfield), Susan Bilderback (designated player), and Mary Ann Thomason-McClain (utility).
