LSC CROSS COUNTRY RUNNERS OF THE WEEK

CO-MALE

Dylan Doss, West Texas A&M University, JR, Carlsbad, Texas, Water Valley HS

Doss led the No. 11 Buffs to a second-place overall finish in the college division at the 25th annual Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville, Ark. The junior crossed the line first for WT in eighth place (37th overall) in the 8K with a time of 25:30.8.

Mikey Davila, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Moreno Valley, Calif, Riverside CC

Davila paced the Greyhounds to a second-place finish at the South Plains College Collegiate Cross Country Festival, by finishing the 8k run with a time of 25:01.22. His second-place finish was the top performance by a runner attached to a school. Davila's time put him more than four seconds ahead of the third-place finisher.

CO-FEMALE

Mireia Guarner, West Texas A&M University, SO, Catalonia, Spain, Collegi Diocesa` Sagrada Familia

Guarner led the now-No.20 Lady Buffs to a second place finish in the college division at the 25th annual Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville, Ark. The sophomore crossed the line first for WT in the 5K event in sixth-place (37th overall) with a time of 18:23.7.

Amber Saiz, Eastern New Mexico University, SO, Belen, N.M., Belen HS

Saiz turned in a first-place performance at the South Plains College Collegiate Cross Country Festival, completing the 5k run in an ENMU-record time of 18:37:05. Her performance paced the Zias to a first-place finish. Prior to Saturday, the Zias had just one sub-19 minute 5k run in team history.

OTHER TOP RUNNERS

Thomas Toth, Cameron University, placed 46th out of over 350 runners at the Chile Pepper Festival last Saturday with a time of 25:44. This was the second week Toth had to battle tough race conditions. In each 8K race this season, Toth has kept his times steady between, 24:51 and 25:44.

Jamin Goecker, Angelo State University, helped lead the Rams to their second straight team title this past weekend at the Alamo City Duals in San Antonio. Goecker finished second overall with a time of 26:18.65. The 2012 All-Conference runner has placed in the top 3 twice this season and in the top 10 all three meets of this season.

Tye Doty, Tarleton State University, led all runners for the Texan cross country team last weekend at the Chile Pepper Festival at the University of Arkansas. Doty ran the 8K race in 26:05.6 for 65th place overall and 19th place in the College Division.

Brittany Adams, Midwestern State University, paced a season 5K best time of 19:40.11 to lead 17th-ranked Midwestern State to a third-place showing at the South Plains Collegiate Cross Country Festival Saturday in Levelland. The Mustangs amassed 71 points to finish behind Eastern New Mexico's full squad (19 points) and South Plains College (47).

Audrey Shelton, Tarleton State University, led the Tarleton TexAnns to a third-place finish in the College Division of the Chile Pepper Festival at the University of Arkansas in just the second race of her collegiate career. The freshman from Clarendon ran the 5K race in 18:44.2 to finish 46th overall among all runners and in seventh place among the College Division runners.

Angelo State

The Rams have competed in three meets so far in the season and have won two of the three. Jamin Goecker and Dylan Littlejohn Are the two leading runners for the Rams so far. The Rams have four returners from last years fifth place at the LSC Championships.

The Rambelles are staying consistent and having a different top runner in each of the three meets. Candida Chairez, Jaylen Rodgers and Annifer Flores all lead this year respectively. Annifer and Chastity King are the only two returns from last year's fourth place team at the LSC Championships.

Cameron

Cameron will off until the Lone Star Conference Championships. They last raced on Oct. 5 at the Chile Pepper Festival in Arkansas. The Aggies placed seventh in the college section of the race. In the latest regional rankings Cameron moved up from ninth to eighth.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University women's cross country team entered the weekend ranked seventh in the USTFCCCA South Central region and had one of the best meets in team history at the South Plains College Collegiate Cross Country Festival. Prior to the event, the team had just one sub-19 minute 5k run. On Saturday, the Zias posted five such times and had five of the top six finishers in the race. Amber Saiz set a new ENMU record, with a first-place finish and a time of 18:37.05. Mikey Davila posted the seventh best time in Greyhound history, finishing the 8k run at 25:01.22. He was the first runner attached to a school to finish and paced the Hounds to a second-place finish.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State claimed a third-place showing with its No. 2 group Saturday at the South Plains College Collegiate Cross Country Festival in Levelland... Sophomore Brittany Adams led the way by taking 11th in the 5K race with a season-best time of 19:40.11... Junior Lucia Trejo (20:08.01) and redshirt-freshman C.J. Frizzell (20:15.45) clocked personal 5K bests... Midwestern State remained at No. 17 nationally and No. 5 in the South Central Region in the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches' Association

Tarleton State

Tarleton State cross country traveled to the Chile Pepper Festival at the University of Arkansas last weekend. The women's team finished third in the College Division while the men finished ninth in their 8K race. Freshman Audrey Shelton highlighted the afternoon by leading all TexAnn runners with a seventh-place finish among College Division runners and a 46th place finish overall. She finished the 5K in 18:44.2.

The No. 11 Buffs and No. 20 Lady Buffs competed in the 25th annual Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville, Ark. on Saturday. Both teams placed second overall in the event's college division. The men's 8K and women's 5K took place in very poor conditions after an hour and a half of lightning delays. The men finished with a total of 80 points as they outran then-No. 9 Missouri Southern and then-No. 11 New Mexico Highlands. They were led by juniors Dylan Doss, Anthony Baupal and Baptiste Moreu who all finished in the top-50 overall. Doss crossed the line first for the Buffs in eighth-place (37th overall) with a time of 25:30.8. Baupal followed in ninth (41st overall) with a time of 25:35.0. Moreu completed the course at 25:43.9 which was good for eleventh (45th overall). The Buffs collected their highest ranking in program history yesterday as they were tabbed 11th in the country in the latest USTFCCA national poll. The Lady Buffs finished the run with a total of 73 points, just 14 points behind first-place No. 3 Augustana College (S.D.). Sophomore Mireia Guarner completed the race first among the Lady Buffs in sixth-place (37th overall) with a time of 18:23.7. Junior Haley Sparks crossed next in eighth-place (47th overall) at 18:44.4. Senior Amber Moore, sophomore Emma Love and freshman Carley Glass also finished in the top-25 in the field at 14th, 22nd and 23rd, respectively. The Lady Buffs' top-six runners all finished in the top-35. WT will return to action on Tuesday, October 15th when it travels to Portales, N.M. to compete in the Eastern New Mexico Dual. The event is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. (CT).
