LSC SOCCER

Lone Star Conference action continues with five league games and one non-conference contest this week. Angelo State has clinched a spot in the LSC Championship and tops the standings with a 6-1 league record.

Only two weeks of play remaining as teams compete for one of the remaining three berths in the LSC Championship to be hosted by the top seed November 8-10.

The women's teams are 38-31-14 overall this season. The squads are currently 5-6-3 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 4-4-1 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Jenny Kotowych, Angelo State University, FR, Forward, Humble, Texas, Atascocita HS

Kotowych recorded three goals against Texas Woman's in the Rambelles' 4-1 win last Friday before assisting on a goal in the 2-1 win over Texas A&M-Commerce on Sunday. Kotowych now has five goals this season which is second on the team behind Sierra Anderson's seven. She scored her first two goals of the year in ASU's 3-0 win over Wayland Baptist. Her assist of Anderson's first-half goal against the Lions was the first assist of her career.

DEFENSIVE

Dani Edwards, Angelo State University, SR, San Angelo, Texas, Lake View HS

Edwards continued her strong defensive work in goal for the Rambelles in a pair of Lone Star Conference wins last weekend at the ASU Soccer Field. Edwards allowed only one goal in 135 minutes of play and recorded three saves. She did not play in the second half against TWU after the Belles had established a 3-0 halftime lead. Edwards has five shutouts this season and has only allowed six goals in 13 games played.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Ashley Cottrell, Midwestern State University, notched her Lone Star Conference leading seventh goal of the season in the fourth minute of a 1-0 win over Texas Woman's Sunday afternoon at the MSU Soccer Field. Cottrell slipped in to knock in a cross from Emily Saville which was redirected by Tatyanny Griffiths for the lone score of the match against the Pioneers. It was the sophomore forward from Arlington's fifth game winning goal of the season as the Mustangs improved to 9-4-1.

Dominique Premac, West Texas A&M University, placed a substantial amount of pressure on Eastern New Mexico's defense in a scoreless tie in Canyon on Friday night. She led the Lady Buffs in shots (4) in 80 minutes of play. Premac nearly put in a game-winner in the 75th minute as she ripped a shot into the bottom of the crossbar. She currently leads the team in SOG percentage (.500).

Fabienne Wilson, Eastern New Mexico University, made four saves at West Texas A&M to register her first shutout of the season. The performance lifted the Zias to the fifth scoreless tie in team history and the first season-series win over the Lady Buffs for ENMU. Prior to the shutout, the Zias had given up 19 goals over five games in road matches against WT.

Yvette Bedoy, West Texas A&M University, recorded her seventh shutout of the season on Friday night in a scoreless tie against Eastern New Mexico. She tallied two saves in 110 minutes of action while not allowing a goal.

Angelo State

The Rambelles earned a 4-1 win over TWU last Friday and then a 2-1 victory on Sunday against Texas A&M-Commerce for their fourth straight win and ninth out of 10 games. ASU received three goals against TWU from Jenny Kotowych, while Sierra Anderson scored one goal against TWU and another on the Lions. Anderson now has seven goals in her sophomore season. The Rambelles continued playing strong defense and have not allowed more than two goals in a game all season. ASU has outscored its opponents 24-10 this season going into weekend road games at Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M.

Eastern New Mexico

Junior goalkeeper Fabienne Wilson made four saves to lift the Zias to a scoreless double-overtime tie at West Texas A&M. The game marked the ninth overtime contest of the season for the Zias, putting them within one of Newberry College's NCAA Division II record of 10, set during the 2007 season. It was the fifth time in team history the Zias played to a scoreless tie and the first time two have occurred in the same season. The contest also was the first tie in the series with West Texas A&M and the first non-loss for Eastern, after dropping the first five meetings in Canyon, Texas. Prior to today, the Lady Buffs had scored at least two goals against ENMU when playing at home. The Eastern New Mexico University women's soccer team will close out its home schedule this weekend, against Angelo State and Midwestern State.

TWU soccer team dropped both games on the road last week at Angelo State and Midwestern State. The Pioneers are now 4-9-2 on the season and 1-5-1 in the Lone Star Conference. TWU will close out the regular season with a three-game homestand against Texas A&M-Commerce, Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M.
