GOLFERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S

Devin Montague, West Texas A&M University, SR, Liberty, Mo., Johnson County CC

Devin finished tied for third with a team-best 216 (73-69-74) at the Bruce Williams Memorial Invitational this week. It was his best finish of his WT career and lowest 54-hole score of his career...The Buffs finished third in the tournament.

WOMEN'S

Isabel Jimenez-Perea, Tarleton State University, SO, Cobena, Spain

Jimenez-Perea won her first event of the 2013-14 season as she recorded a 1-under total of 143 at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate for Women in Lawton, Okla. She was the only player under par for the tournament and her first round score of three-under 69 was a season-low for her. Jimenez-Perea has finished among the top-five in all three tournaments that she has competed in.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

C.J. Clem, Texas A&M University - Commerce, finished seventh at the Bruce Williams Memorial Invitational in San Antonio, shooting a 3-over 219 for the 54-hole tournament. Clem started off the week with a 2-under 70 in round one, followed by an even-par 72 in the second round. It is Clem's fifth top-10 finish during his A&M-Commerce career as he continues to lead the Lions with a 74.20 scoring average through the first four events of the fall.

Glory Jangthongsiri, West Texas A&M University, continued her impressive start to her sophomore year as she finished third at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate hosted by Cameron University...Jangthongsiri posted rounds of 77 and 70 for a 147. She fired the 70 on the second day when the Lady Buffs, as a team, had the low-round of the tournament with a 294. She began the second round tied for 12th and moved to third. She has finished in the top three in each of the four tournaments this fall season with one win at the Concho River Classic.

Chelsea McCoy, Texas A&M University - Commerce, placed ninth at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate, finishing with a 7-over 151. It marks the second-straight week that McCoy has notched a top-20 finish after tying for 17th at the Dallas Baptist Golf Classic, notching the third top-10 showing of her A&M-Commerce career. The senior from Georgetown has posted a 78.90 scoring average on the season with one top-10 and an additional two top-20 showings.

Cameron

The Cameron women's golf team placed fourth this past week when they hosted the Oklahoma Intercollegiate. The Aggies shot a 310 the first day and improved by three strokes the second day to shoot 617 overall. Lindsey Alexander led the team after carding a 152 (79,73) to finish tied for 10th. Teammates Jaqueline Strickland (75,78) and Alexis Thompson (77,76) both finished tied for 14th with a score of 153. The CU women's next event will be in the spring at the World Golf Invitation in St. Augustine, Fla., Feb. 9-10. The Aggie Men were off this week and will be back in action at the Classic at the Tribute in The Colony, Texas, Oct. 27-29.

Tarleton State

The TexAnns won its first tournament of the 2013-14 season, carding a two-day total of 19-over 595 at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate in Lawton, Okla... Tarleton scored below 300 on both days of the tournament and has now carded below a 300 in three consecutive rounds... With the victory, Tarleton has claimed first place in the previous six tournaments hosted by Cameron... The TexAnns have captured 10 tournament titles over the past three years and 17 titles in the past four years, which includes three LSC Championships and three West Region Championships... Isabel Jimenez-Perea won her first event of the season on Tuesday, carding a two-day score of 1-under 143... She now has four individual titles in her career... Batriz Prados finished in eighth place with a 6-over 150, giving her two top-10 finishes in her first season with the TexAnns... Jessica Pickwick entered Tuesday's final round tied for 27th place, but then carded a season-low 1-over 73 to finish in a tie for 14th with a two-day total of 9-over 153... The TexAnns will close the fall season next week at the Barn Rock Collegiate Invitational, hosted by Lenoir Rhyne University and held at Rock Barn Golf & Spa in Conover, N.C.

Texas A&M-Commerce

Both the A&M-Commerce men's and women's golf teams recorded fifth-place finishes over the week as the men competed at the Bruce Williams Memorial Invitational in San Antonio while the women took to the course at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate in Lawton, Okla. ... On the men's side, senior C.J. Clem finished seventh with a 3-over 291, highlighted by a 2-under 70 in round one and an even-par 72 in round two ... Clem now has five top-10 finishes for his career including a pair this fall season ... Sophomore Seth Maxwell continued his strong play, tying for 17th overall with a 6-over 222, the lowest 54-hole total of his career ... It marks the second-straight

week Maxwell recorded a top-20 finish ... For the Lion women, Chelsea McCoy led the way in Oklahoma with a 7-over 151 to finish ninth overall, her second-straight top-20 finish and the third of her A&M-Commerce career ... Senior Chantry McMahan tied for 17th overall with a 10-over 154, logging the 22nd top-20 showing of her Lion career ... The women have completed the fall portion of their 2013-14 schedule ... The men have one tournament remaining, hosting The Classic at The Tribute this Monday and Tuesday, October 28th and 29th at The Tribute Golf Club in The Colony, Texas ... It is the first of two host tournaments for the A&M-Commerce men on the season.

The West Texas A&M men's and women's golf teams ended the fall season on a high note as the women moved up seven spots to finish second at the Oklahoma Intercollegiate hosted by Cameron University this week... Following a disappointing first round of 318, the Lady Buffs carded the best team round score in the tournament field with a 294 on Tuesday...It, by all accounts, is the best round in WT Lady Buff history...Sophomore Glory Jangthongsiri finished third after opening the tournament tied for 12th...She fired a final round 70, while junior Judy Papenfus carded a final round 69 and finished tied for fourth...The 13-team field had only six rounds under par and the Lady Buffs had two of them...The men's team was equally impressive as the Buffs finished third at the Bruce Williams Intercollegiate hosted by St. Mary's University...The Buffs fired rounds of 290, 292 and 300 for the tournament...WT senior Devin Montague finished a career-best even par 216 on rounds of 73, 69, 74 and tied for third.
