LSC VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The teams are set for the annual Lone Star Conference Volleyball Championship Tournament, which begins Thursday in Canyon, Texas.

West Texas A&M earned the right to host the event with the program's 18th LSC Championship amid a perfect 16-0 record to mark the 15th time that the Lady Buffs have finished the conference season unbeaten since 1986. WT has won 22 straight including taking their last 23 league matches dating back to last season.

The eight-team, single-elimination tournament consists of four first-round matches on Thursday, followed by two semifinal games on Friday evening and the championship match on Saturday afternoon.

The top eight teams in the LSC will compete for the 2013 tournament championship. In addition to winning the title, the LSC tournament winner will receive the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division II Volleyball Championship.

All the championship games will be aired live via internet video streaming at www.FoxSportsSouthwest.com. The webcasts are available free of charge. Each webcast includes both video and audio, with viewers needing only a computer with a high-speed DSL or cable modem connection to the internet. Veteran broadcaster Chris Needham has the call for all the games.

Action starts on Thursday at 12 p.m. with No. 3 Angelo State against No. 6 Midwestern State followed by No. 2 Texas Woman's versus No. 7 Texas A&M-Kingsville at 2:30 p.m., No. 4 Texas A&M-Commerce against No. 5 Tarleton State at 5 p.m. and No. 1 WT versus No. 8 Eastern New Mexico at 7:30 p.m.

WTAMU won the 2012 LSC volleyball tournament title with a 3-2 victory over ASU in San Angelo, Texas.

LSC VOLLEYBALL

LSC volleyball teams are 154-113 overall this season. The squads are currently 13-8 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 24-9 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other leagues in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Marcela Alves, Texas Woman's University, SR, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Pinheiro Guimaraes

Alves helped the Pioneers to a second place finish in the Lone Star Conference Standings with 2-1 record last week. She posted 41 kills, .360 hitting percentage and 19 total blocks. Alves had nine kills and four blocks in a non-conference game against Southeastern Oklahoma State, 16 kills and seven blocks against West Texas A&M and 16 kills and eight blocks against Eastern New Mexico. She helped the Pioneers out block the nation's top team West Texas A&M 14.0-8.0. On the season Alves leads the team with 267 kills, .287 hitting percentage and 144 total blocks.

Jazmine Green, Tarleton State University, SR, Houston, Texas, Cypress Falls HS

In her final home game, Green's career-high 20 kills sparked a furious TexAnn comeback to give Tarleton its first win over No. 17 Angelo State since 2006. After falling behind 0-2 in the match, Green's offensive power answered the call to lead the TexAnns to a five-set thrilling victory on senior day in Wisdom Gym. For the week, Green had 27 kills with a team-high .328 hitting percentage and was second on the team with 27.5 points scored. She added four digs and an assisted block.

DEFENSIVE

Michaela Spicer, Texas A&M University - Commerce, JR, Katy, Texas, Katy HS

Spicer continued her good defensive play for the Lions last week, posting a 5.5 digs per set average. The average is two full digs over her season average. The 24 digs versus TSU was the second time in five matches that Spicer had recorded 20 digs in a match.

Kelsey Raglin, Tarleton State University, SO, San Antonio, Texas, Churchill HS

Raglin was a defensive force for the TexAnns, helping Tarleton to its first victory over Angelo State since 2006. Last week, the sophomore posted back-to-back 20-dig performances with 24 against Commerce and 21 Saturday against Angelo State. Raglin went the entire week with no service receiving errors in 49 opportunities. She recorded the second double-double of the season Tuesday against Angelo State with 11 kills and 24 digs.

Kayla Rivero, Texas Woman's University, JR, McKinney, Texas, McKinney

Rivero helped the Pioneers to a second place finish in the Lone Star Conference Standings with 2-1 record last week. She ran a 6-2 offense and led the team with 68 assists (6.18 per set). Rivero posted 25 assists and 11 digs against both West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico to record her 11th and 12th double-double of the season. She leads the Pioneers with 592 assists on the season and second in digs with 252.

Kameryn Hayes, West Texas A&M University, JR, Cypress, Texas, Cy-Fair

Hayes continued to guide the powerful WT offense this past week as the Cypress, Texas native dished out 98 assists to average 9.80 per set to go along with 13 kills on 44 attempts to hit .205 with 22 digs and 8 total blocks as the #6 Lady Buffs moved to 28-3 overall with a perfect 16-0 mark in the LSC to end the regular season. Hayes had a big match on Friday night as the junior dished out 47 assists while tallying three kills and nine digs in a four set win over Texas Woman's in a huge regional win to keep WT's win streak alive at 22 matches.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Arielle Bond, Angelo State University, continued her strong play this season with 32 kills last week. The sophomore had 22 kills against Tarleton State in a five-set loss to end the regular season after supplying 10 kills against Incarnate Word in the regular-season finale. Bond finished the regular season with 307 kills.

Kelsey Washington, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, with 20 kills and 20 digs on Saturday at Cameron, posted her 17th double-double of the season. The 20 kills are a season high for the junior while 20 digs marked the fifth time this season she had 20-or-more. With 20 kills, the junior now has 1,001 kills in her career. She is the seventh Javelina all-time to reach 1,000 kills. Washington averaged 3.86 digs a set on the week and added four blocks in the contest with Cameron. She added two aces

Kayla Bond, Texas A&M University - Commerce, continues to raise her hitting percentage in the final weeks of the regular season. Bond is now hitting .320 on the season after her .373 clip last week. In the loss to West Texas Bond hit .409, which is the third time in three weeks she has hit over .400 in a match. The 2.90 kills per set is higher than her 2.76 season average heading into the postseason.

Lauren Frye, Eastern New Mexico University, averaged 2.82 kills/set, 31 total, with a team-best .190 attack percentage in three matches for Eastern New Mexico. She also added eight blocks, one being solo, as well. In the home finale versus New Mexico Highlands, Frye had 18 kills with a .286 attack percentage and three blocks in the four-set victory. At Texas A&M-Commerce, her .375 attack percentage and eight kills were the best on the team as she added three blocks. Frye finished the regular season with five kills, two blocks and an assist at Texas Woman's

Lauren Bevan, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the offensive charge for the #6 Lady Buffs this past week as they finished their regular season with wins against Lubbock Christian, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce to move to 28-3 with a perfect 16-0 mark in the LSC. Bevan registered 28 kills on the week to hit .264 to go along with four digs and 6.0 total blocks in the three wins for the Lady Buffs. Bevan had a standout match against A&M-Commerce in the regular season finale as they tallied 13 kills on 25 swings to hit .520 in the sweep.

Morgan Wilson, Texas Woman's University, was the leader on defense and helped the Pioneers to a second place finish in the Lone Star Conference Standings with 2-1 record last week. She led the team with 59 digs including 5.36 digs per set. Wilson posted 17 or more digs in all three games and has team-best 519 digs (4.63 per set) on the season.

Kaelen Valdez, Angelo State University, recorded a 5.25 digs per set average in the final week of the regular season, including 28 in the final match which came in a five-set loss at Tarleton State. Valdez had 42 digs during the week and finished the regular season with 380 digs (3.73 per set).

Caitlin Wallace, Midwestern State University, play at the net spurred Midwestern State to a pair of regular season ending wins over Texas A&M-Kingsville and Southwestern Oklahoma State. The senior middle blocker averaged 1.10 blocks per set as the Mustangs limited the opposition to a .122 team attack percentage for the week. Wallace put down a match-high 13 kills to go along with four blocks in a loss Tuesday at Dallas Baptist before turning in a pair of sterling efforts over the weekend. The Amarillo High product had nine kills, three digs and a block in a sweep of Texas A&M-Kingsville Thursday then put down six kills without a miscue to go along with five blocks in another Mustangs' sweep Saturday at Southwestern Oklahoma. Wallace ranks third in MSU history with 298 total blocks.

Bree Anna Lucero, Eastern New Mexico University, had 15 blocks, a 1.36 b/s average, in three matches to lead Eastern New Mexico. She also totaled 17 kills, three digs and a service ace. Against New Mexico Highlands, Lucero had nine kills on a .286 attack percentage and six blocks. She had six more blocks at Texas A&M-Commerce along with two kills. Lucero ended the week with three blocks and six kills at Texas Woman's in the Zias' regular season finale.

Laura Iwuchukwu, West Texas A&M University, and the dominant WT defense gave the Lady Buffs their perfect 16-0 LSC record this past week with wins over Lubbock Christian, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce to move to 28-3 overall on the season. Iwuchukwu tallied 30 kills on 64 attempts to hit an impressive .422 to go along with 11 total blocks (1 solo, 10 assisted) as the #6 Lady Buffs carry a 22 match win streak into the LSC Tournament this weekend in Canvon.

Maggi Jo Keffury, Angelo State University, finished the regular season with 1,159 assists (11.14 per set) after supplying 87 during the final week of the season. She had 40 assists in a three-set win before having 47 in a five-set loss to Tarleton State.

Jordan Neal, Texas A&M University - Commerce, raised her assist per set average to 11.66 after posting 12.3 per set this past week. With her 123 assists last week Neal pasted the 1200 assist plateau in 2013. She is one of just four setter's in DII to get to that mark this season. The Joshua native was also fourth on Lions in digs with 34 last week.

Danielle Barker, Tarleton State University, led the team once again with 84 assists over the last two games,

Angelo State

The Belles come into the LSC Championship as the No. 3 seed after going 11-5 this season in conference play following a five-set loss to Tarleton State last Saturday in the regular-season finale. ASU mixed in a non-conference win over Incarnate Word last Wednesday to finish the season with a 13-1 home record. Maddie Huth recorded 332 kills to lead the Belles in the regular season, while Shelby Wilt led in digs with 517 and Maggi Jo Keffury in assists with 1159.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-2 to end the regular season. They won in four sets in the home finale against in-state rival New Mexico Highlands. The Zias finished Lone Star Conference play with a three- and four-set defeats at Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's. Freshmen Lauren Frye (2.82 k/s) and Courtney Lawson (2.18 k/s) both averaged more than two kills a set. Bree Anna Lucero led the squad with 15 kills while Agatha Gibbons added 11 with five of them being solo. Hayley Couch had 55 digs (5.00 d/s) over the three matches and is 15th in the nation in digs per set at 5.58. ENMU will be playing in the LSC Tournament for the first time since 2004. They enter as the No. 8 seed and will face No. 1 seed, 6th-ranked and host of the tournament. West Texas A&M on Thursday in the opening round.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State recovered from a loss at Dallas Baptist to claim wins over Texas A&M-Kingsville and Southwestern Oklahoma State to complete the regular season with a 17-12 mark... The 17 wins are the most since the 2008 squad won 25 matches... MSU heads into the LSC Postseason Tournament as the No. 6 and opens with Angelo State Thursday at noon in Canyon... Angelo State survived the Mustangs in five sets in the first meeting between the teams this season in San Angelo then took a 3-1 win last month in Wichita Falls... Midwestern makes its seventh appearance in the LSC Postseason Tournament dropping first round matches in each showing in 2005 (WT, 3-1), 2007 (WT, 3-1), 2008 (TWU, 3-1), 2009 (WT, 3-0), 2010 (TSU, 3-2) and 2011 (ASU, 3-0)... Senior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace finished the season ranked second in the LSC and 52nd in NCAA Division II with a .336 hitting percentage... Wallace's 28 kills last week moved her into 10th place on the program's alltime kill list with 924 moving past Geneva Hammond (908, 1987-90)... Wallace is second on the school's all-time block assists chart (256) and third on the total blocks list with 298... Wallace ranks eight in the LSC and 116th in D2 with 0.94 blocks per set... Midwestern ranks 17th in team digs per set led by junior Casey Fletcher (3.95), redshirt-freshman Madelyn Johnson (3.31), sophomore Nicole Marzik

(2.92), junior Kaitlyn Molloy (2.43) and sophomore Marissa Olivares (2.32)... Senior right-side hitter Michelle Blount has multiple blocks in each of her last five matches including a 7-kill, 4-block effort in the regular season finale Saturday at Southwestern Oklahoma... Sophomore Marissa Olivares delivered her seventh double-figure dig effort with 15 digs Tuesday at Dallas Baptist... Senior middle blocker Caitlin Wallace recorded her ninth match with at least five blocks Saturday at Southwestern Oklahoma State... Freshman middle blocker Sarah Garfield hit .297 averaging 1.89 kills per set. She had five kills without a miscue in 10 attacks Thursday against Texas A&M-Kingsville also recording her fourth match with 5-or-more blocks with six... Senior outside hitter Brandi Flores appeared in two matches last week finishing with two kills at Dallas Baptist and against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Sophomore outside hitter Nicole Marzik put down a season-high 15 kills with nine digs Saturday at Southwestern Oklahoma... Marzik also delivered her eigth double-figure dig performance with 12 Tuesday night at Dallas Baptist...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State split the last two games of the regular season to secure the No. 5 seed in the LSC Championship Tournament. After dropping its third straight game Tuesday at Commerce, Tarleton rallied from an 0-2 deficit to defeat No. 17 Angelo State for the first time since 2006. Danielle Barker also became the school's all-time assist leader, passing her former teammate, Jessie Hartman (3,266), for the all-time lead.

Texas A&M-Commerce

The Lions wrapped up the 2013 regular season with a 2-1 week. The wins coming versus Tarleton State and Eastern before falling to West Texas A&M in the finale. The Lions split the season series with the TexAnns, swept the Zias and were swept by the Lady Buffs.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

With 20 kills and 20 digs on Saturday at Cameron, Kelsey Washington posted her 17th double-double of the season. The 20 kills are a season high for the junior while 20 digs marked the fifth time this season she had 20-or-more. With 20 kills, the junior now has 1,001 kills in her career. Last season, Kingsville took Tarleton State the distance in the opening round of last year's tournament the distance falling 3-2... The Javelinas are making their third appearance in the LSC Tournament under Coach Allen and 13th in since 1988. The Javelinas are 2-12 in that time with 12 appearances...Washington hit .226 in the finale against Cameron. It was the best she hit since hitting .294 against Eastern New Mexico.

Texas Woman's

The Pioneers finished the regular season with a 21-9

overall record and 11-5 in the Lone Star Conference. TWU posted a 2-1 record last week and moved into a tie with Angelo State for the second place in LSC standings. The Pioneers own the tie breaker over ASU and will be the second seed in the conference championship tournament. Senior Marcel Alves leads the Pioneers with 267 kills, .287 hitting percentage, 19 solo blocks, 125 block assists and 144 total blocks. Senior Josie Santos is the team leader in kills per set with 2.59 and second in total kills with 256. Senior Chloe' Tate is third in kills (254) and second total blocks (124). Junior Morgan Wilson has a team-best 519 digs on defense while junior Kayla Rivero and freshman Kimberly Bell ran a 6-2 offense this season and has 592 and 560 assists respectively.

West Texas A&M

The #6 Lady Buffs finished off the 2013 regular season on a high note this past week as they picked up wins over Lubbock Christian, Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce to move to 28-3 with a perfect 16-0 mark in the LSC. The Lady Buffs used Saturday night's victory over the Lions to finish a perfect 16-0 in Lone Star Conference action to mark the 15th time that WT has finished the conference season unbeaten since 1986. WT will host the LSC Championships this weekend as they open up postseason action against the eighth seeded Zias of Eastern New Mexico on Thursday night with first serve set for 7:30 p.m. at the WTAMU Fieldhouse "The Box" in Canyon.
