LSC BASKETBALL

The Lone Star Conference has two men's teams - Angelo State and Tarleton State - and one women's - West Texas A&M - among the ranks of the unbeatens. ASU and TSU are amid 28 NCAA Division II men's teams with a perfect winning percentage, while WT is one of 17 on the women's side.

The ice storm that hit North Texas affected some games, while this week's slate is limited due to final exams.

The LSC men have a 45-20 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 15-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 39-26 overall. The women's squads are currently 10-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Mohammed Lee, Tarleton State University, JR, Guard, Bronx, N.Y., Faith Baptist Christian Academy

Lee was a great spark to the offense this past week, coming in off the bench and scoring a season-high 23 points in Tarleton's 55-point win over Oklahoma Panhandle State. Lee, who ranks 21st in the LSC with a 10.7 points per game average, was an impressive 8-for-10 from the field, while going 3-for-4 from downtown. The transfer-junior led the Texans at the charity with a 4-for-5 effort, pulled down three rebounds and dished out three assists as well.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Antjuan Ball, West Texas A&M University, JR, Forward, Collirene, Ala., Central Hayneville

Ball had a monster game for the Buffs this past weekend as they topped the Jets of Newman University, 82-65 in Canyon for career win number one for interim head coach Vinay Patel. The Collirene, Alabama native went 8-of-13 from the floor to shoot .615 in the game for 16 points while also grabbing an impressive 20 rebounds (8 offensive, 12 defensive) with one block and one steal on the afternoon.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Lacy Reinke, Cameron University, SR, Forward, Lawton, Okla., Lawton HS

Reinke has continued to impress this season scoring a career high 16 points against Northwestern Oklahoma for the Aggies sixth win of the season. She also shot 80% from the field and pulled down nine rebounds against the Rangers. In seven games this season Reinke has averaged 9.9 points per game and 6.3 rebounds.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Casey Land, West Texas A&M University, SR, Guard, Canyon, Texas, Canyon HS

Led the Lady Buffs in scoring with 14 points against Northern New Mexico. Had eight steals and six assists as she was close to a triple-double in the game. The eight steals led the team in 18 steals for the contest and WT forced a season-high 33 turnovers in the game. Held NNMU to 52 points which marked the fifth game in a row WT has held its opponents to under 40 percent shooting and under 55 points.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Rodney Blackmon, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a game-high 24 points in Eastern New Mexico's 90-66 win over Northern New Mexico on Saturday. He was 9-for-15 from the field including 5-of-9 from beyond the arc while also dishing out three assists, committing zero turnovers and grabbing two rebounds. Blackmon scored the Greyhounds' first eight points of the game and 13 of ENMU's first 15 in the first 4:48 of the game. Currently, he leads the LSC in scoring at 19.8 ppg and has reached double-figures in points in all six games he has played in this season.

Tez Dumars, West Texas A&M University, continued his hot shooting for the Buffs this last weekend as they topped the Jets of Newman University at home, 82-65. The Garland native went 6-of-9 from the floor including 5-of-7 from long range to shoot .667 on the night as the junior tallied 21 points to go along with two rebounds and three assists in the win.

Rashad Basey, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, continued his season-long streak of double-digit performances this past week averaging 20.5 points a game over two games. The senior scored 25 points at A&M International last Wednesday and had 16 points in the Javelinas 52-51 loss to St. Mary's on Saturday. He led all players in scoring for both sides.

Eddie D'Haiti, Midwestern State University, poured a game-high 17 points and pulled down seven rebounds in 17 minutes to lead Midwestern State to a 73-65 win over Science & Arts (Okla.) Tuesday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The 6-9 senior forward from Orlando, Fla. knocked down 6 of his 10 shots from the field and went 5-of-6 from the charity stripe to amass his season-best output. D'Haiti is averaging 14.5 points while shooting 12-of-16 (.750) in two home contests this season.

Kenny Brown, Texas A&M University - Commerce, led the Lions with 17 points off the bench in the two point loss to Northwood this past week. The 17 points also sets a new career high for the Meridian, Mississippi native. Brown was also the only Lion to hit at least 45% of their shots.

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, recorded his fourth double-double of the season last Tuesday in a 68-55 win over McMurry in Angelo State's only game of the week. Williams had 16 points and 12 rebounds in the game to go along with three assists. He leads the Rams this season with 17.3 points and 8.1 rebounds per

game and is shooting 57 percent from the field and 88 percent from the free-throw line.

Davene Carter, Tarleton State University, recorded his best defensive effort of the young season last week, pulling down a game-high 11 rebounds in Tarleton's 90-35 win over Oklahoma Panhandle State. His defensive effort was a key part in Tarleton holding the Aggies to 41 points lower than its season scoring average and .190 points lower than its season field goal percentage. He recorded a career-high three blocks in the game as well, while pouring in six points for the Texans.

Christian Macauley, Texas A&M University - Commerce, followed up his six-block performance over HSU with three more in the Lion's loss to Northwood. The D.C. native has also recorded a steal in three straight games. Macauley continues to lead the LSC in total blocks (23) and bpg (2.6). The 2.6 average puts the senior in the top 25 nationally in blocks per game.

Monzaigo Williams, Midwestern State University, ripped five steals playing a key defensive role in Midwestern State's 73-65 win over Science & Arts (Okla.) Tuesday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The 6-foot senior guard from Palmdale, Calif. delivered his ninth straight double-figure outing with 15 points while dishing out five assists in 31 minutes. He played a key role in helping the Mustangs limit USAO to 27.6 shooting in the opening half as the Mustangs rolled out to a 42-20 lead at the break.

Omari Gudul, Angelo State University, helped Angelo State to a 68-55 win over McMurry with four steals and five rebounds in the only game of the week for the Rams. Gudul is averaging 4.9 rebounds and has seven steals this season for the Rams. ASU ranks 14th in the nation by limiting opponents to 37 percent shooting from the field.

Will Cook, Cameron University, came away with his fourth double-double of the season after scoring 19 points and pulling down 11 rebounds, eight were on the defensive end. This was the second game in a row that Cook had a double-double and the first time since 2007 that an Aggie player came away with consecutive double-doubles. Cook is averaging 16.8 points per game and 9.1 rebounds in eight games this season.

Dennis Hardwell, Eastern New Mexico University, helped lead the team to a 24-point victory at home over Northern New Mexico on Saturday. He scored a season-high 10 points on 4-of-6 shooting and was 2-for-2 at the free throw line. While Hardwell grabbed just one rebound, he tied his career-high of four steals. Hardwell also blocked a shot and set a season-high of three assists while not turning the ball over. ENMU forced the Eagles to commit 23 turnovers, a season-best for the Hounds, as 13 of them were the result of a steal.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Devin Oliver, Texas A&M University - Commerce, was one of just two Lions to score in double figures in the loss to Abilene Christian this past week. The 18 points left Oliver just one point short of tying a career high and three steals tied a career mark for the junior.

Hillari Adam, Angelo State University, led the Belles to a 1-1 record with a 15.5 scoring average over the two games. She hit 57.1-percent of her shots from the field and 50-percent from the three-point line. The junior's 17 points in the win against UT-Permian Basin was the third highest of the season. The Wall native grabbed 4.5 rebounds per game and dished out three assists. Adam is No. 6 in scoring in the LSC at 14.1 per game and No. 3 in rebounds at 8.4 per game.

Devin Griffin, West Texas A&M University, had 13 points in the Lady Buffs' 99-52 win over Northern New Mexico. WT improved to 7-0 on the year. She went 3 of 5 from the field and 7 of 8 from the line. Now has 1,021 career points and 433 career rebounds.

Jaylyn Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, poured in 12 points and grabbed six rebounds in the Zias 75-36 route of University of the Southwest. She shot .417 from the floor for the game, but shot .500 in the second half, when she scored nine of her 12 points and grabbed five rebounds.

Tori Tucker's, Eastern New Mexico University, standout performance helped limit University of the Southwest to a .175 shooting percentage and just 36 points. Her 17 rebounds, which included 13 off the defensive glass, helped ENMU to outrebound the Mustangs by an incredible 69-39 margin, which led to a 17-0 edge in second-chance points. Tucker already had four rebounds, 9:20 into the game, as Eastern built an insurmountable 14-0 advantage. She also added two steals and 12 points.

Angelo State

The Rams picked up a 68-55 non-conference win over McMurry last Tuesday in their only game of the week to move to 8-0 and establish the program's best start to a season. ASU was originally scheduled to play Arkansas-Fort Smith last Saturday, but that game has been rescheduled for noon on Friday in Plano because of weather. The Rams are averaging 76.1 points per game and are ninth in the nation by shooting 53.4 percent from the field. The Rams are 5-0 at home this season.

Cameron

After a tough month on the road, the Aggies picked up a win at home against Oklahoma Christian, 77-75, to move back to .500 on the season. As a team, Cameron shot 56% in the second half to hold off the Eagles. Seniors Craig Foster and Will Cook both led CU in scoring with 19 points. Cook also led the team with 11 rebounds to pick up his fourth double-double of the season. The Aggies will have the week off before facing Northwestern Ok. State at home on December 18.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico played just once last week as they hosted Northern New Mexico as part of the Eastern New Mexico Tip-Off. The Greyhounds used a 19-0 run in the second half to pull away for a 90-66 victory. Head Coach Andrew Helton won his 53rd game at ENMU that moved him into 6th place on the school's wins list ahead of Sterling Gibson (1973-78). Rodney Blackmon scored a game-high 24 points, dished out three assists and grabbed two rebounds. He scored ENMU's first eight points of the game and 13 of their first 15. Jordan Romero broke out of his slump by making five three-points while getting three steals. Dennis Hardwell was the only other Hounds to reach double-digits in points with 10. He tied his career-high of four steals, set a season-best of three assists, blocked a shot and grabbed a rebound. Devone Davis dished out five assists while

Midwestern State

Midwestern State improved to 6-2 on the season with a 73-65 win over Science & Arts (Okla.) Monday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum... MSU did not commit a personal foul in the first half and finished with a season low of eight against USAO. Midwestern had committed at least 20 fouls in each of his previous seven games as the Mustangs and Drovers combined for 20... The Mustangs moved to 71-4 (.947) at D.L. Ligon Coliseum since the start of the 2008-09 season... Midwestern controls a +49 rebound margin over their last five games... The Mustangs have been outscored in the second half in each of their last three contests after outscoring the opposition in each of their first five games after intermission... MSU remains the winningest four-year collegiate program in the State of Texas since 2008-09 with a 138-34 mark (.802)... The Mustangs claimed their 48th consecutive win over non-NCAA Division II/III opposition and is 53-2 since making the jump to Division II prior to the 1996-97 season. MSU is 40-0 against that competition at D.L. Ligon Coliseum... MSU slipped 14 spots to No. 20 in the latest NABC Division II Coaches Poll... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams scored 15 points and dished out five assists to notch his ninth consecutive game with at least 10 points for MSU... Williams has connected on a 3-pointer in all eight of the Mustangs' games this season... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti poured in a season-high 17 points with seven rebounds in 17 minutes against USAO... D'Haiti is averaging 14.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in two home games this season... Senior guard DeJuan Plummer connected on a trey for the fifth consecutive game to finish with seven points and four assists in 25 minutes off of the bench against USAO... Redshirt-freshman guard Patrick Smith had an assist and a rebound in a season-high 6 minutes against USAO... Junior forward Tavarion Nix erupted for a campaign best 10 points and eight rebounds while shooting 5-of-7 from the field in 20 minutes off of the bench against USAO... Junior forward/guard Xavier Blackburn had eight points and pulled down a season-best eight rebounds against the Drovers... Senior forward Derek Kaster notched his fourth double-figure performance with 11 points in 17 minutes against USAO including his third 3-pointer of the season... Senior guard Cam Adderley has grabbed at least five rebounds in six of MSU's eight games this season...

Tarleton State

The No. 14-ranked Texans are 7-0 to start the season for the first time since becoming a senior college in 1961-62 after downing Oklahoma Panhandle State 90-35 last Wednesday in Stephenville ... Tarleton extended its home-court win streak to 14 straight games and its win streak against non-conference opponents to 14 straight games as well ... The Texans were among some of the nation's top teams when national statistics were released last Monday, with Tarleton ranked first in the nation in both scoring defense (56.0) and scoring margin (41.7) ... The Texans ranked sixth in field goal percentage (55.0) and seventh in the nation in both scoring offense (97.7) and field goal percentage defense (35.7) ... Chuck Guy leads one of four Texans players averaging double figures with his 17.1 points per game average ... De'Andre Upchurch is right behind him with 14.7

ppg, while Mohammed Lee (10.7) and Davene Carter (10.3) are both in double-digits as well ... Guy leads the team with 47 assists and 14 steals ... Carter leads the squad with his 8.7 boards per game average ... Jon Cathey-Macklin tops the squad with 14 blocked shots ... The Texans have scored at least 75 points or more in seven straight games for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign ... Tarleton will not have a game this week with finals being taken on campus ... The Texans will return to action next Tuesday, Dec. 17, in a home contest against McMurry ... Tarleton will then go on the road for the first time this season, playing in a pair of neutral court contests against Central Washington and No. 5-ranked Western Washington in Las Vegas, Nev.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce was shocked by Northwood University (NAIA), 75-73, on December 3. The Lions shot just 1-19 from three in the two point loss and had three chances to tie the game in the final seconds but could not get one to fall. Angelo State

The Belles went 1-1 last week to move to 5-4 overall ... ASU started the week by defeating UTPB, 71-64, before falling to Western New Mexico, 59-52 ... The Belles are 4-2 away from the Junell Center this season ... ASU won't play again until facing Schreiner on Dec. 17 ... Hillari Adam, the league's No. 3 rebounder and No. 6 scorer, is averaging a team high 14.1 points per game and 7.8 rebounds per game ... The Belles are No. 14 nationally in scoring defense at 55.4 per game ... Amanda Weaver ranks No. 36 nationally and No. 1 in the LSC hitting 47.4-percent of her three pointers.

Cameron

The Aggies improved their record to 6-1 after a 66-61 win against Northwestern OK. State last Tuesday. A 13-3 run five minutes into the second half helped CU take the lead, and they would never give that lead up. Cameron was able to stay on top by shooting 20-23 from the free throw line. Lacy Reinke led CU with a career high 16 points and a game high nine rebounds.

Jade Herl also helped the cause with 12 points off the bench. Cameron will be back in action on December 14 when they play Dallas Christian at home.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University women's basketball team opened with a 14-0 burst and cruised to a 75-36 win over visiting University of the Southwest, last week. They also used an incredible 69-39 rebounding advantage and a 17-0 lead in second-chance points, to power to the win. Tori Tucker grabbed 17 rebounds, the most since Elizabeth Richards had 19, on February 14, 2007. On Friday, the Zias will close out the semester, at Wayland Baptist.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 5-3 overall and did not play this week ... The massive ice storm that gripped North Texas caused the cancellation of the Lone Star Conference opener with Texas Woman's that was scheduled for Thursday, Dec. 5. A makeup date for that contest is still pending ... The Mustangs are off until Saturday, Dec. 14 for final examinations at MSU ... The Mustangs start a week of three games before the Christmas break with Saturday's game at home against East Central (Okla.). MSU travels to Texas-Permian Basin for a Wednesday, Dec. 18 game and hosts Cedarville (Ohio) of the Great Midwest Athletic Conference on Dec. 20 ... Midwestern State is leading the Lone Star Conference for the fewest turnovers so far this season and ranks 12th in Division II giving it up just 13.6 times a game ... MSU also ranks 33rd nationally and third in the LSC in field goal percentage, hitting 45.4 percent of their shots from the floor (203-of-447), and is 37th nationally and second in the conference with a 1.10 assist-turnover ratio ... Junior guard Dianna Jones of Hewitt, Texas/Midway ranks second in the LSC in assists, ranking 70th in Division II with 4.4 per game. She is seventh in the LSC with a 77.5 free throw percentage (31-of-40). Additionally, she is shooting 54.0 percent from the floor (27-of-50) and 58.3 percent from the 3-point arc (7-of-12), below the per game minimums for ranking in those categories ... Senior guard Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum ranks third in the LSC in assist-to-turnover ratio, 67th in Division II, with her 2.00 mark. She is sixth in the LSC in assists at 3.5 per game ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas continues to lead the team and rank fourth in the LSC with 14.9 points and 7.8 rebounds an outing. She is sixth in the league with a 48.9 field goal percentage and is seventh in steals at 1.88 per contest.
