### LSC BASKETBALL

The Lone Star Conference has two men's teams - Angelo State and Tarleton State - still undefeated. ASU and TSU are among 24 NCAA Division II men's teams with a perfect winning percentage.

Several non-conference games are scheduled for this week before teams stop play for a seven-day holiday break.

The LSC men have a 50-21 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 18-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 43-28 overall. The women's squads are currently 11-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

#### MEN'S OFFENSIVE

**Jordan Jahr, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, JR, Forward, Lake Travis, Texas, Lake Travis HS**

Jahr had the highest scoring game of his brief Javelina career at Schreiner. He led the team with 24 points and eight rebounds. He added two assists and a pair of blocks. He was 6-of-9 from the floor including a 3-of-4 performance from behind the arc. Jahr was perfect at the foul line in nine attempts. He is averaging 11.4 points and 6.4 rebounds this season.

#### MEN'S DEFENSIVE

**Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, SR, Forward, St. Louis, Mo., Vashon HS**

Williams produced a double-double for the fifth time this season by grabbing a season-high 13 rebounds to go along with scoring 22 points in a win over No. 16 Arkansas-Fort Smith last Friday in Plano. Williams secured 11 defensive rebounds and also provided three blocked shots and three steals for the Rams who limited the Lions to 32 percent shooting in the neutral court game. Williams is averaging 8.7 rebounds a game and 17.8 points for the 9-0 Rams.

#### WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

**Rosalie Cutri, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, SR, Guard, Waterloo Corners, Australia, Our Lady of Sacred Heart**  
Cutri played a key role in the Javelinas second overtime win of the season against A&M International. She scored 14 points with six rebounds, five assists and two steals to stuff the box score. Cutri scored four points of the Javelinas 10 points in the overtime period and drew a crucial charge late in the contest.

#### WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

**Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, JR, Forward, Angleton, Texas, Angleton HS**

Carter led the Mustangs in their 73-60 win over East Central (Okla.) on Saturday. Carter collected her third double-double of the year with her 15 points and 10 rebounds against the Tigers in Midwestern's only contest last week due to final examinations. Carter connected on 6-of-7 shots from the field and hit all three of her free throw attempts. Her .857 shooting from the floor was the highest allowed by East Central this season. She also snagged a steal in the contest.

### MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Rodney Blackmon, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a career-high 29 points in Eastern New Mexico's game versus Henderson State. He went 11-for-18 (61.1%) from the field including 5-of-7 (71.4%) on three-pointers while making 2-of-3 free throws. The Los Angeles, Calif. native set a career-high with 11 made field goals and tied his career-best of five steals. He also dished out three assists and grabbed two rebounds. Blackmon increased his scoring average to a conference-best 21.2 ppg.

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, recorded his fifth double-double of the season with a 22 point, 13-rebound performance in a 71-69 win over No. 16 Arkansas-Fort Smith last Friday in ASU's only game of the week. Williams, who is averaging 17.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game, has scored in double-figures in eight of nine games to help lead the Rams to their first 9-0 start to a season in program history. Williams also added five assists and three blocks against the nationally-ranked Lions in the neutral court game played in Plano.

David Duncan, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the charge in the middle for the Buffs this past Saturday as he led the team to a 72-62 home win over Oklahoma Panhandle State in Canyon. The junior forward from Washington, D.C. led the Buffs in scoring with 16 points as he went 6-of-11 from the floor including 4-of-7 from the free throw line to shoot .545 on the afternoon with eight rebounds (6 offensive, 2 defensive) in the win.

Dennis Hardwell, Eastern New Mexico University, grabbed a team-high six rebounds while getting credit for three steals of Eastern New Mexico's 11 steals against Henderson State. Three of his rebounds were offensive as he scored a season-high 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting including a 4-for-6 performance at the free throw line. Hardwell also blocked a shot for the second straight game. The Los Angeles, Calif. native saw his steals per game average increase to 1.8, the eighth best in the LSC, while also dishing out two assists.

her previous career high by 10 points. She converted on six of her nine three-point attempts, helping Eastern finish with 14 treys for the contest, just one shy of the team record. From the floor, she shot .615 for the game and grabbed five rebounds.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, had another outstanding game against No. 3 Emporia State with 18 points on 6 of 11 from the field and 6 of 6 from the line. She pulled down five rebounds with one assist and one steal in 29 minutes of action. For her career she has 769 points and 454 rebounds.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, led the Mustangs in their 73-60 win over East Central (Okla.) on Saturday. Carter collected her third double-double of the year with her 15 points and 10 rebounds against the Tigers in Midwestern's only contest last week due to final examinations. Carter connected on 6-of-7 shots from the field and hit all three of her free throw attempts. Her .857 shooting from the floor was the highest allowed by East Central this season. She also snagged a steal in the contest.

Lacy Reinke, Cameron University, only needed 16 minutes of action and scored 15 points and had three blocks in CU's 101-33 win over Dallas Christian on Saturday night. She shot a perfect seven-for-seven from the field which was the best shooting night for an Aggie player in the past two seasons. Reinke also pulled down seven boards and chipped in an assist. In her past two games, Reinke has made 11 straight shots and connected on 15 of 17 (88%) from the field. In eight games this season she is averaging 10.5 points, 6.4 rebounds, with a block per game.

Lindsey Mahone, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in points with 15 in Saturday's win over the Dustdevils. She had eight rebounds to lead the way including six on the defensive end. Mahone also swiped three steals and is among the LSC leaders in the conference in the category. The transfer added a blocked shot.

Jordyn Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, registered a career-high six steals at Wayland Baptist and shot .462 from the floor, to finish with 19 points.

### Angelo State

The Rams extended their program-best start to a season to 9-0 with a 71-69 win over No. 16 Arkansas-Fort Smith last Friday in a neutral court game played at Collin College in Plano. ASU led the game from the start and held off a late-game charge from the Lions to secure its first win over a nationally ranked opponent in two years. The Rams shot 43 percent in the game from the field and limited UAFS to 32 percent. Kenny Williams led ASU with 22 points and 13 rebounds, while Tommy Woolridge added 16 points, Daniel Skinner 13 points and Chris Talkington another 10. The Rams return to action with three games this week with a home game against Oklahoma Wesleyan (Tuesday) and road games against Arkansas Tech (Thursday) and Arkansas-Monticello (Saturday).

### Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico fell to 4-4 on the season as they lost 89-82 to Henderson State in Lawton, Okla. on Saturday. The defeat was the largest this season for the Greyhounds as their other three were be a combined eight points. Rodney Blackmon scored a career-high 29 points versus the Reddies. He made a career-best 11 field goals while attempting 18. Blackmon also went 5-for-7 on three-pointers, 2-for-3 at the free throw line, dished out three assists and matched his career-high of five steals. Cornelius Cammock added a season-best 18 points on 6-of-9 shooting and was 6-for-7 at the free throw line while grabbing five rebounds and blocking two shots. Dennis Hardwell retrieved a team-best six rebounds, had three steals, two assists and a block. He also contributed on the offensive end of the court with 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting and went 4-for-6 on free throws. Rafael Love scored all 12 of his points in the second half as he went 5-for-9 from the field, 2-of-4 from beyond the arc. Love grabbed five rebounds and had a steal. The Greyhounds shot 48.4% for the game but made just 36.7% of their shots in the second half. In all eight games this season, ENMU has forced their opponents to commit more turnovers and have had more steals in seven of the eight contests. This week Eastern plays one game before the Christmas break as they travel to California to take on Azusa Pacific on Wednesday at 8:30 p.m. MT.

### Midwestern State

Midwestern State has been outscored in the second half in each of its last three games. The Mustangs had gotten the better of the opposition following intermission in each of its first five outings... MSU connected on a season-low three 3-pointers last time out against Science & Arts (Okla.) after hitting at least six treys in each of the previous seven games... The Mustangs have attempted just 15 free throws over their last two games... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams has 10-or-more points in each of his last nine games dating back to last season... Williams has hit at least one 3-pointer in each game this season... Williams has attempted just eight free throws over the last five games -- none in the last two -- after getting to the charity stripe 29 times in MSU's first three games of the season... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti notched a season-high 17 points and pulled down seven rebounds in 17 minutes last time out against Science & Arts (Okla.)... Senior guard DeJuan Plummer has hit a trey in each of his last five games... Junior forward Tavarion Nix notched season highs with 10 points and eight rebounds in 20 minutes against Science & Arts (Okla.)... Junior guard Derrell Gibbs has recorded just two turnovers in 212 minutes on the floor this season... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn was perfect from the floor (4-for-4) to finish with eight points and a campaign-best eight rebounds against USAO... Junior forward Derek Kaster notched his fourth double-digit performance of the season finishing with 11 points on 5-of-11 shooting in 17 minutes including his third 3-pointers of the season against Science & Arts (Okla.)... Senior guard Cam Adderley struggled from the floor (2-of-12) over his last two games but still contributed four rebounds at Arkansas Tech and five boards against USAO...

**Texas A&M-Commerce**

A&M-Commerce avenged their lone loss of the season to Northwood with 105-75 blowout win at The Field House last week. The win saw all five starters score in double figures along with Kenny Brown off the bench. Kameron Price led the way with 22 and LaDon Carnegie recording a double-double (11p, 11r). The Lions return to the court tonight versus Dallas Baptist to make up a rescheduled game due to the recent storm.

**Texas A&M-Kingsville**

The Javelinas went 1-0 last week with a 79-67 win at Schreiner on Saturday. They host Texas Lutheran Wednesday at 7 p.m. They don't return to the court until Jan. 8 at Texas A&M-Commerce in the Lone Star Conference opener...In the win over the Mountaineers, the Javelinas were extremely impressive at the foul line. Kingsville went 30-of-33 from the foul line including a 19-of-20 performance in the second half. The 30 free throws surpassed the team's high of 29 against St. Edward's. Jordan Jahr was a perfect 9-of-9 from the stripe, while Ronald Scott was 6-of-6...Kingsville also had its second-best shooting performance of the season. They hit 54.9 percent from the floor for the game including 62.5% during the second half. Their best was 55.4% from the field at Texas A&M International...Defensive stopper Dwight Taylor appeared in his first game of the season at Schreiner and had 13 points in 24 minutes of action. Kingsville is now hitting 70.7% from the line...The Javelinas did a tremendous job protecting the ball on Saturday matching their season low of eight turnovers. On the year, Kingsville has given up more than 14 turnovers just twice. They are averaging 12.2 turnovers a game...Junior Jordan Jahr had the highest scoring game of his brief Javelina career. He led the team with 24 points and eight rebounds. He added two assists and a pair of blocks. He was 6-of-9 from the floor including a 3-of-4 performance from behind the arc. The six assists matched his season-high set against CSU-Pueblo...The Javelinas won for the first time this season not winning the rebounding war. Kingsville was outrebounded 28-22.

**West Texas A&M**

The Buffs moved their overall record to 6-3 this past weekend while giving WT interim head coach Vinay Patel a perfect 2-0 record as they topped the visiting Aggies of Oklahoma Panhandle State, 72-62 on Saturday afternoon in Canyon. The Buffs were led offensively by David Duncan with 16 points and eight rebounds followed by Drimir Ferguson with 12 and Tez Dumars with nine while David Gibbs grabbed eight rebounds in the game. West Texas A&M went 24-of-60 from the field including 4-of-20 from deep and 20-of-36 from the free throw line to shoot 40% in the game with 48 rebounds, 11 assists and 13 turnovers. The Buffs return to action on Wednesday afternoon as they travel to Pittsburg, Kansas to play their final game of 2013 against the Gorillas of Pittsburg State with tipoff set for 4:30 p.m. from John Lance Arena. The Buffs took the first meeting from Pitt State on November 30th as they topped the Gorillas, 70-58 during the Pak-A-Sak Thanksgiving Classic in Canyon.

**Cameron**

The Cameron women went 1-0 last week getting a 101-33 win over Dallas Christian on Saturday night. Cameron's win puts them at 7-1 this season and it is their best start in the last ten seasons. Each suited player for the Aggies played at least 15 minutes with five players hitting double-figures in scoring. Additionally, Cameron started the game with an amazing 22-0 run with Lacy Reinke scoring 11 points in the first 10 minutes of the game. Reinke went 7-7, scoring 15 points, with seven rebounds, and three blocks. She has also nailed down her last 11 shots in a row over the last two games. Cameron will have a challenge this weekend traveling outside of the lower 48 states for the first time in program history making a visit to Alaska. The Aggies will face Alaska-Anchorage and Brevard or Saint Leo on Saturday night.

**Eastern New Mexico**

The Eastern New Mexico University women's basketball team reached the 80-point mark for the first time this season, but dropped a 92-83 decision to Wayland Baptist. During the game, the Zias came hit 16 three-point baskets, to come within one of the single-game team record. Tori Tucker and Jordyn Cooper each had six three-point baskets in the game, with Tucker scoring a career-best 22 points, while Cooper contributed 19 points. The Zias will return to action on January 6, to host Lubbock Christian.

**Midwestern State**

Midwestern's Lone Star Conference opener against Texas Woman's that was postponed on Dec. 5 by an ice storm has been rescheduled for Thursday, Jan. 2 at Ligon Coliseum with a 7 p.m. tipoff. The MSU vs. Texas Wesleyan game scheduled for that date and time has been indefinitely postponed ... The 60 points allowed to East Central was the third-fewest given up by MSU this season and was the third-lowest output by the Tigers this year ... Junior Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas, ranks third in the LSC with her 14.9 points and 8.0 rebounds a game. She is also fifth in the conference with 1.9 steals per contest ... Junior guard Dianna Jones of Hewitt, Texas/Midway, ranks 12th in the LSC in scoring with 11.1 points a game, while ranking second in the league with 4.6 assists each outing ...
