LSC BASEBALL

The 2013 Lone Star Conference baseball season rolls on with non-conference games. Eastern New Mexico remains unbeaten, while four other teams have just one loss.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into the NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 3-6 in Canyon, Texas, as part of the LSC Spring Championships Festival.

LSC baseball teams are 33-17-1 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 1-0 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 8-1 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

DIAMOND PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

Colton Sims, Eastern New Mexico University, JR, Second Base, Reno, Nev., Lassen College

Sims led the Greyhounds in batting with a .889 average (8-for-9) while slugging 1.222 in four games against Adams State. He hit a two-run home run and drove in five runs while scoring five times and drawing five walks as well. Sims was also 4-of-5 in stolen base attempts. He was successful in his two sacrifice bunt attempts that moved runners into scoring position. His eight assists for the week were the second most on the team and he was a part of all three double plays that the team turned.

Lee Neumann, Angelo State University, SR, Center field, Brenham, Texas, Brenham HS

Neumann continued his strong start to the season by driving in nine runs and hitting two triples in a three-game series against Southern Arkansas and a Tuesday game at McMurry. Neumann opened his week with a four-RBI game against Southern Arkansas in the series opener, including a two-run home run in the first inning to set the tone for the weekend. Neumann, who finished last season with nine triples, already has three this year after having one against the Muleriders and then hitting a three-RBI triple in the Rams 7-2 win over McMurry on Tuesday. Neumann is hitting .484 for the season with 14 RBI and 15 hits.

PITCHERS

Alexis Garza, University of the Incarnate Word, JR, SP, McAllen, Texas, McAllen HS

Garza was completely dominating in his 7-0 win over Florida Southern. He retired the first 13 batters he faced and did not allow a hit until two outs in the fifth inning. He retired the side in five of six innings he pitched. He allowed a single and a walk while striking out 10 in the game. He required just 76 pitches to get through 6.0 innings.

Mike Weatherly, Angelo State University, SR, RHP, Mesquite, Texas, Mesquite HS

Weatherly has made the move from closer to starter look easy in his first two starts of the 2013 season. He shut the door on Southern Arkansas in the first game of their series last weekend by striking out 10 and throwing eight scoreless innings against the Muleriders in Angelo State's 4-1 win last Friday. Weatherly, who was a first-team LSC reliever last season, has now thrown 14 innings and given up only one run this season and has 15 strikeouts. The 10 strikeouts and eight innings pitched were both career-highs for Weatherly.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Tyler McKnight, West Texas A&M University, hit a grand slam in a big five-run first inning in a 9-2 win Sunday. He went 3 for 4 with two runs scored and six RBI in that game alone along with two doubles. In the outfield with a very stiff wind the entire weekend, he had eight chances with seven put outs and one assist as he helped gun down a CSUP runner at the plate. Played and started all four games for the 3-1 Buffs.

James Black, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, hit .385 for the week and was 5-of-8 in the final two games of the week. He was a key player in the win over St. Mary's on Tuesday going 3-of-5 with three RBI and two runs scored. He finished a triple shy of a the cycle in the game. Known more for his defense than offense, Black recorded seven assists in Friday's win over St. Cloud St.

Zac Russell, University of the Incarnate Word, helped lead the Cardinals to a 3-game sweep over visiting Florida Southern College. Russell had a double and scored a run in the 8-7 series opening win. He came back with a double, run scored and two RBI's in a 7-0 win. He saved his best for last when he hit a clutch three-run double with two outs and a 1-2 count in a tie game in the bottom of the eighth inning of a 6-4 win in the final game of the series. He was 3-for-8 with five RBI's and three doubles for the weekend.

Ryan Boydston, Eastern New Mexico University, threw six shutout innings against Adams State in the third game of the series, a 3-0 win. He struck out five while allowing five hits and walking two. Only five batters of the 25 batters Boydston faced advanced beyond first base. He was credited with a combined shutout as a fellow pitcher threw the final inning in relief. The six innings Boydston pitched are tied for the longest outing in his career.

Nick Duncan, West Texas A&M University, went 5.1 innings of work in a 9-2 win over regionally-ranked CSU-Pueblo to earn win in the game and team the series win 3-1. In his first start with the Buffs, Duncan tallied a 1.69 ERA allowing five hits over his 5.1 innings of work with two runs allowed (one earned) two walks and had a team-high seven strikeouts. The Thunderwolves hit just .238 against him. His timely pitches, along with solid defense from the Buffs, helped get him out of a bases loaded jam with less than two outs early in the game

when it was still in doubt.

Dallas Ponder, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, made two starts last week earning a pair of victories over ranked teams. He tossed 7 scoreless inning versus nationally-ranked St. Cloud State on Friday. He struck out seven and walked one. With short rest on Tuesday, he beat his third-ranked foe of the season. He went five innings for the win allowing two hits in six innings to No. 5 St. Mary's.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats went 2-2 at home this last week, splitting a four-game series vs. East Central. ACU won games one and three by scores of 14-2 and 2-1, but lost games two and four by scores of 3-0 and 10-5. Rodge Macy led all ACU hitters with a .444 batting average, going 4 for 9 with two runs, four RBI and five walks. Seth Spivey hit .333, scored six runs and drove in three with two doubles. Kyle Conwell, Travis Schuetze and Chuck Duarte also hit well over .300 vs. the Tigers. Jordan Herrera won the series opener vs. ECU, allowing just two runs on five hits through 6.0 innings with six strikeouts. Carter Hahn won game three of the series after striking out six in as many innings. Aaron Lambrix came on in the seventh and walked one, struck out one to earn the save.

Angelo State

The Rams earned a 2-1 series win over nationally ranked Southern Arkansas last weekend at Foster Field before traveling to Abilene to pick up a 7-2 win over McMurry on Tuesday to improve to 7-1 on the season. ASU has climbed to as high as No. 10 in the College Baseball Lineup poll and are No. 11 in D2BaseballNews and Collegiate Baseball. The Rams are hitting .318 as a team with eight doubles, four triples, three home runs and seven stolen bases through the first eight games of their season. ASU returns to action this weekend with a three-game, three-day series against Lubbock Christian in San Angelo.

Cameron

Cameron went 0-4 in their home opener series versus the Henderson State Reddies. Cameron lost the first game on Saturday 5-4 in seven innings and then followed that up with an 8-1 loss later that day. CU then came back the next day to try and even the series, but could not find any offense in the first game, losing 7-0, and then could not stop the Reddies offensive attack in the second game of the day, losing 10-6. Nick Smith went 5-14 this weekend with three runs scored and Brad Blumer went 5-12 this weekend with two RBI's. Brandon Raidy collected two RBI's in the first game on Saturday and then added one more in the final game of the series on Sunday to give him four RBI's for the season. Tyler Cox also had three RBI's this weekend. The Aggies will take back to the diamond on Tuesday, Feb. 12 for a nine inning game against Southwestern Oklahoma State.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico opened the 2013 season with a four-game sweep of Adams State at home. The Greyhounds beat the first-year program by scores of 9-8, 19-4, 3-0 and 19-12. Junior second baseman Colton Sims batted .889 (8-for-9) in the series with five RBI, five runs scored, five walks, four stolen bases, two sacrifice bunts and his first career home run. Senior outfielder Brooke Brooks scored a series-best 10 times, accounting for 20 percent of ENMU's

total output, and had a series-high nine hits. Senior catcher Peter Creamer was 8-for-14 (.571) with two doubles, a triple, and his first career home run. He also drove in a team-high eight runs. On the mound, sophomore Ryan Boydstun started the third game of the series and threw six shutout innings with five strikeouts and allowing only five hits in the 3-0 victory. Junior Kyle Kesmarki came on in relief in three games and recorded a 2-0 mark with a save. He finished with a 3.00 ERA and four strikeouts. This is the first 4-0 start in Greyhound history since 2007 when that squad won their first seven games. ENMU scored 19 or more runs in two games of a series for the first time since they scored 22 and 19 runs in the two games of a doubleheader at West Texas A&M on April 9, 1994. Eastern hits the road to face New Mexico Highlands in a four-game series that begins Friday with a doubleheader scheduled for Saturday.

Incarnate Word

The Cardinals swept a three-game series from visiting Florida Southern last weekend. They won a pair of close games and had one blow out victory. Alexis Garza was completely dominating in his 7-0 win over Florida Southern. He retired the first 13 batters he faced and did not allow a hit until two outs in the fifth inning. He retired the side in five of six innings he pitched. He allowed a single and a walk while striking out 10 in the game. He required just 76 pitches to get through 6.0 innings.
