LSC SOFTBALL

Lone Star Conference teams head into another week of non-conference action with six squads owning winning streaks of three games or more. West Texas A&M, Abilene Christian and Texas Woman's are competing in the NFCA Division II Leadoff Classic this weekend in Tucson, Ariz.

LSC teams are playing a single round-robin schedule with a three-game series against every other team. Each series consists of a doubleheader one day and single 7-inning game the other day.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into the NCAA postseason. The single-elimination championship will be played May 3-5 in Canyon, Texas, as part of the LSC Spring Championships Festival.

LSC softball teams are 47-39 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the group is currently 23-17 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 6-0 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-HITTER

Arianna Rodriguez, Tarleton State University, SR, IF, Bruceville-Eddy, Texas, Bruceville-Eddy HS

Rodriguez was a force at the plate for the TexAnns, leading Tarleton to four straight wins at the Tarleton Invitational Tournament last weekend. The senior shortstop was 9-11 at the dish for an .818 batting average. The hit two doubles and a home run while driving in 10 RBIs over the last two days en route to a slugging percentage of 1.273. She also stole two bases on two attempts on her way to being named the Co-MVP of the tournament.

Christina Roosmalen, Midwestern State University, SR, 1B, Plano, Texas, Plano West HS (Southern Mississippi)

Roosmalen collected multiple hits in every game at the Javelina Softball Classic last weekend leading Midwestern State to a 3-1 showing. The senior from Plano hit .643 (9-of-14) with a double, two homers and five RBIs to raise her season average to .433. Roosmalen connected on her first homer of the season in a 9-1 win over Texas A&M International then went 2-for-4 against St. Edward's on Saturday. Her second homer of the weekend highlighted a 3-for-4 effort in a 5-4 win over St. Edward's on Sunday before closing the weekend with a 2-for-3 effort against Texas A&M International.

CO-PITCHER

Brenna Hennan, Tarleton State University, SO, RHP, Burkburnett, Texas, Burkburnett HS

Hennan was spectacular in her two starts of the Tarleton Invitational Tournament last weekend. In her home debut for Tarleton, Hennan pitched a five-inning complete game shutout against Oklahoma Panhandle before winning her second game of the tournament with a seven-inning performance against Texas-Permian Basin. Over her two starts, the sophomore hurler did not allow a single earned run in 12 innings of work while striking out 15 batters. She held opposing batters to just a .188 batting average in two games. She was also named the All-Tournament team pitcher.

Briana Sanchez, University of the Incarnate Word, SR, SP, San Antonio, Texas, Marshall HS

Sanchez picked up both of the Cardinals' wins this week. She pitched 8.0 innings to get the win over St. Mary's. She allowed four hits, two runs and four walks while striking out nine in the game. She came back with a strong performance at Texas Lutheran. She scattered five hits without allowing a walk and struck out nine in a 4-2 win. She improved to 4-0 on the season with a 1.09 ERA.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Katie Hines, Texas Woman's University, led the team with five RBI and 10 total bases in a three-game sweep against Newman. She batted .556 with two doubles and a home run. Hines also picked up a complete-game win in game-two with a career-high six strikeouts. On the season she leads the team with 7 RBI, .739 slugging percentage and .519 on base percentage.

Corina Noel, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, helped lead the Javelinas to a 2-2 mark at their own Javelina Classic with three starts and a pinch runner appearance in the opening game. Noel led the way with a .500 average with five hits in 10 at bats. She finished with a team-best three doubles and was tied for the lead with five RBI. In the Javelinas two wins she was 4-of-7 with five RBI and three doubles.

Monica Acuna, University of the Incarnate Word, was the top hitter for the Cardinals last week as they split doubleheaders at St. Mary's and Texas Lutheran. She was 2-for-4 in a 3-2 extra inning win over St. Mary's. In the doubleheader at TLU she went 4-for-6 with a double, two home runs and six RBIs. She hit a two-run homer and drove in another run with a single in a 4-2 win. In the second game, it was her two-out, three-run homer that tied the game in the top of the sixth inning of an eventual 4-3 loss. She hit .500 with a 1.083 slugging percentage for the week.

Kacie Easley, Angelo State University, hit two home runs this weekend to move to within five to tying the ASU career home run record. The senior hit .500 on the weekend and led the team with six hits and 12 total bases. She scored three runs and recorded six RBIs over the weekend. She is ASU's leader in slugging percentage at .883 and finished the weekend with a 1.000 slugging percentage.

Lyndi Smith, Abilene Christian University, ripped seven hits last weekend, but none was bigger than her last - a walkoff home run vs. No. 16 Central Oklahoma that propelled ACU to a 6-5 win over the Bronchos.

Smith finished the weekend with a team-best .500 batting average, which included two doubles, three RBI and four runs scored. Smith started the four-game weekend vs. UCO and Eastern New Mexico with a 1-for-4 RBI game vs. the Zias, and then in her first contest vs. the Bronchos went 2-for-3 with two singles. In the following day's doubleheader vs. the Zias and UCO, she finished 4-for-7 with three runs and two RBI. Smith is batting .400 on the season with two home runs and six RBI.

Jessica Sipe, West Texas A&M University, made the most of her first weekend as a Lady Buff as she hit .429 with eight RBI and two home runs to lift the Lady Buffs to the 2013 Desert Stinger Invite Championship this past weekend in Las Vegas, Nevada. The Pima CC transfer drove in four runs including a first inning two run bomb to center field in the tournament finale against Minnesota Duluth.

Leslie Martini, Cameron University, helped carry the Aggies with her bat at the Southeastern Regional going 6-for-15, with three home-runs, and 10 RBI. Against Washburn, Martini went 4-for-4 with four runs scored, six RBI, and a pair of home-runs, one of which was a grand slam. Martini also homered against Missouri Western with a pair of RBI. Her performance vs. Washburn tied a career mark for RBI in a game that was last set in the 2011 season. Martini is in her fourth year at Cameron has hit 36 home-runs in the Black and Gold with 99 RBI.

Kyra Sirag, Eastern New Mexico University, hit safely in three of the week's four games, and crushed a grand slam against 16th-ranked University of Central Oklahoma. She also tossed out a potential base stealer in the second meeting against Abilene Christian. In the second contest against UCO, she batted two-for-four, with a double and two runs batted in.

Larisa Garcia, Texas Woman's University, picked up a complete-game victory while striking out six batters to help the team sweep the three-game series against Newman. She allowed just one unearned run on three hits and did not allow any walks.

Caitlyn Crain, Abilene Christian University, was a workhorse for the Wildcats this week, totaling 10.1 innings pitched through three games with five strikeouts. Crain was called to start the first game vs. 16th-ranked Central Oklahoma Friday and suffered a tough 2-1 defeat, in which both runs were unearned and two Wildcat runners were thrown out a home plate in the later innings. She faced the Bronchos for a second-straight night on Saturday, but this time got the win in relief thanks to a bases-loaded walk from Keanna Winkfield and a walkoff home run courtesy of Lyndi Smith with two outs in the seventh. Crain pitched 3.1 innings of relief vs. the Bronchos, giving up three hits - one of which was a solo home run by Kacie Edwards. Crain this weekend also pitched the final frame of a 9-1 (5 inning) victory over Eastern New Mexico.

Sandra Serna, Angelo State University, stayed went a perfect 2-0 over the weekend striking out 15 batters. She held teams to a 2.00 earned-run average and only allowed four earned runs. The junior is a perfect 5-0 on the season and has only allowed five earned runs all season. Serna struck out a season-high nine batter in the win against Southeastern Oklahoma this past weekend.

Lauren Heinrich, West Texas A&M University, made an immediate impact on the WT pitching staff in her first weekend as a Lady Buffs, registering a 2-0 record with one save this past weekend as the Lady Buffs took the 2013 Desert Stinger Invite Championship. Heinrich, a Lubbock, Texas native, picked up wins out of the bullpen against Fort Lewis and Minnesota Duluth while registering a save against defending RMAC Champion Colorado School of Mines on Saturday night. The freshman registered a 1.68 ERA over the weekend with five strikeouts.

Denise Arnold, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, was credited with both wins by the Javelinas in the Javelina Classic on Sunday. She finished with a 2-1 mark at the tournament. She pitched 2-1/3 innings of scoreless relief in the 3-2 win over St. Edward's and was credited with win in a 11-3 run rule victory over A&M International. Both wins avenged losses in the tournament on Saturday.

Abilene Christian

The Wildcats won 3 of 4 at their annual Whitten Inn Classic this past weekend, which included two wins over Lone Star Conference rival Eastern New Mexico and a split with preseason 16th-ranked Central Oklahoma. ACU lost its first game to UCO, 2-1, on a pair of unearned runs, but won the second, 6-5, thanks to a 2-out walkoff home run by junior Lyndi Smith in the bottom of the seventh. Smith led all ACU hitters with a .500 average, going 7 for 14 with two doubles, home run, three RBI and four runs scored. Keanna Winkfield finished the weekend with four RBI, two of which came on a triple vs. UCO, and Madison Buckley cranked out a two-run shot vs. Eastern New Mexico to finish with a team-best five RBI. As a team, ACU hit .313 with 24 runs scored. Ten of its 31 hits were for extra bases. Seniors Shelby Hall and Caitlyn Crain both pitched very well for ACU. Hall went 2-0 in her two starts vs. Eastern New Mexico with seven strikeouts, while Crain went 1-1 through three appearances - two in relief. Crain totaled 10.1 innings pitched and allowed just one earned run while striking out five. ACU pitchers finished the weekend with a 2.15 ERA and 17Ks.

Angelo State

The Angelo State Rambelles moved to 8-1 overall after going 3-1 at the Southeastern Regional Invitational. Sandra Serna stayed perfect on the season winning two games striking out 15 for the weekend. Kacie Easley hit two home runs over the weekend while hitting .500 (6-12) and driving in six runs. Morgan Spearman had another strong weekend scoring four runs, drawing two walks and hitting .455. ASU is the No. 2 LSC team in team pitching with a 1.84 earned-run average. Serna is third in pitching with a 1.30 ERA. The Rambelles will host the ASU George McCorkle Classic this weekend.

Cameron

After a 1-3 start to the season, the Cameron University softball team went 1-3 at the Southeastern Regional this weekend in Durant, Okla. The Aggies started the weekend with two eight inning loses against Missouri Western (4-5) and Central Missouri (5-7). They then came back and won the first game on Saturday, 16-1 against Washburn, but then dropped the second game of the day to St. Mary's (4-13). Jerrick has collected a hit in each of MSU's first 10 games this season and now boasts matching 10-game hitting streaks in each of her freshman, sophomore and junior campaigns... Jerrick rides a 16-game hitting streak dating back to last season and has reached base in each of her last 28 games dating back to the 2012 campaign... Sophomore third baseman Kelley Schaefer has slugged out two hits in seven of 10 games this season to hit .484 with three doubles and 10 RBI's... Senior center fielder Elena Bennett is fourth in the LSC with a .567 batting average but leads the lead with 11 stolen bases in 12 attempts including a steal of home Sunday against Texas A&M International... Freshman outfielder Katelyn Vinson is hitting .429 during a current five-game hitting streak with a pair of RBI's... Senior first baseman Christina Roosmalen recorded multiple-hit games in all four games at the Javelina Softball Classic to hit .643 (9-for-14) with a double, two homers and five RBI's to raise her season average to .433... Arianna Rodriguez hit .818 over the four-game stretch while Brenna Hennan and Randi Fentress were spectacular from the circle, posting a 0.00 and 1.27 earned run average in 23 total innings of work.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas moved to 4-5 with a pair of wins on the second day of the Javelina Classic. They were 2-2 in their tournament...Katrisha Arocha and Denise Arnold were solid on the mound. The duo had a combined 2.07 ERA. They struck out 15 combined hitters while walking just five total. Arocha had a 1.11 ERA but was done in by unearned runs to finish 0-1 in two starts. Arnold was 2-1 with both wins on Sunday...Offensively, the Javelinas hit just under .300 on the week at .295 a rise of nearly 20 points from the week before. Five players with at least 10 at bats recorded a .400 or better average.
