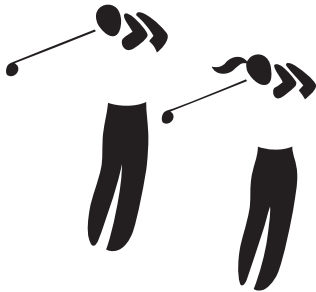

MEN'S

Austin Jordan, University of the Incarnate Word, SO, Rainbow, Texas, Glen Rose

Jordan birdied two of his last three holes to finish 5-over-par 221 on the par-72, 7,070-yard Club at Sonterra's North Course. He was the leader in the clubhouse with five groups remaining and watched as all the challengers fell away save for Northwestern State's Derek Oland. Oland posted a 221 to tie Jordan. The two players then replayed hole 18 to determine an individual champion at the James S. Litz Memorial Tournament hosted by UIW. Jordan hit his drive down the middle of the fairway while Oland found trouble in the trees on the left. Oland took two shots to get out of the trees and his short chip left him eight feet away for bogey. Jordan responded with an approach shot into the heart of the green. He left his birdie putt six feet long and then watched as Oland missed his bogey putt before calmly draining his par putt for win.

WOMEN'S

Glory Jangthongsiri, West Texas A&M University, FR, Bangkok, Thailand, Yothinburana School

Opened the 2013 spring season with a fourth-place finish at the St. Mary's Lady Rattler Roundup. Jangthongsiri opened the tournament with a 1-under-par 71 and finished with 7-over-par 151 in the 36-hole event. She fired a long birdie putt on No. 18 in the first round to finish under par in her career-low round at WT. The Lady Buffs finished eighth as a team in the tournament and the fourth-place finish for Jangthongsiri tied the best finish of her young career (WTAMU Stampede, Sept. 10-11).

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Derek Oland, Northwestern State University, was second individually and helped lead the Mustangs to a second place team finish at the James S. Litz Memorial Tournament in San Antonio this week. The sophomore from McKinney, Texas/Boyd fired a 5-over-par 221 to tie for the lead after regulation and placed second after dropping a one-hole playoff at the Club at Sonterra's North Course. Oland led the tournament in pars with 36, and was eighth in the tourney in birdies with eight as he was in the top five in par 3, par 4 and par 5 scoring in the tournament. His low round was a one-under 71 in the second round.

Brenna Moore, Northwestern State University, finished fifth individually at St. Mary's Lady Rattler Roundup in San Antonio this week. She rebounded from an off first round to post the lowest round in the second with a one-over-par 73 as she tallied a 8-over 152 at the Dominion Country Club. The sophomore from Burkburnett helped MSU post a top five team finish in the spring season opening tournament. She led the tournament in birdies with seven and was fourth in par 4 scoring (+3), and sixth in par 5 scoring (+1).

Courtney Rutledge, Angelo State University, opened the spring season as the top Rambelle at the Lady Rattler Roundup after carding a 5-over, 77 on Tuesday following shooting an 82 on Monday. Rutledge was 25th overall with a two-round total of 159.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State University, The Midwestern State women and men opened the spring season in San Antonio ... The No. 9 MSU women placed fifth at the St. Mary's Lady Rattler Roundup, rebounding from a poor first day to record a 633 total ... Sophomore Brenna Moore collected her second top 5 finish of the year with her fifth place 152. It's Moore's fourth consecutive Top 10 finish for the year ... Senior Taylor Klutts tied for 19th with

a 158 for her fourth consecutive Top 20 finish this season ... Moore leads MSU with a 75.60 scoring average through the four fall tournaments and the one spring tourney ... The Midwestern State men recorded back-to-back second place finishes as they opened the spring season by placing second at Incarnate Word's James S. Litz Memorial Tournament at the Club at Sonterra ... MSU had the best team score of the tournament in the second round of the tournament with a 292 ... It's the third top 3 finish for the Mustangs as a team this season ... Sophomore Derek Oland tied for the lead after regulation at 5-over 221, but fell in a playoff on the first hole. It was Oland's highest finish of the season and his third Top 5 finish of the year ... Freshman Santiago Gomez placed fourth at 7-over 223, picking up the best score of the final round with a 1-under 71. It is Gomez' first Top 5 finish as a collegian ... freshmen Antonio Herran and Ian Gallagher had top 20 finishes with Herran 16th and Gallagher 20th ...Oland leads the team with a 72.58 scoring average, while Gomez right behind at 73.17 ...
