LSC BASEBALL

Lone Star Conference baseball teams are being affected by the weather including snow in west Texas and New Mexico. Incarnate Word tops the standings with one loss, followed by Eastern New Mexico, West Texas A&M and Texas A&M-Kingsville.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into the NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 3-6 in Canyon, Texas, as part of the LSC Spring Championships Festival.

LSC baseball teams are 68-30-1 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 3-3 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 28-8 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

DIAMOND PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

Luis Quinones, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, Outfield, Las Cruces, N.M., Mayfield HS

Quinones led Eastern New Mexico with a .588 batting average (10-17), four RBI and two stolen bases in his first action of the season. He had at least two hits in all four games against Metro State. In the second game versus the Roadrunners, Quinones drove in three runs while going 3-for-4 at the plate with a stolen base. He played all four games at shortstop for the first time since high school because of an injury. With his 10-hit performance this past week, Quinones is now ninth on the Greyhounds all-time hits list.

Spenser Smith, West Texas A&M University, SR, INF, Denver, Colo., Mullen HS

Hit .429 for the week as the Buffs went 5-0 including their first two sweeps of the year in Southwest (N.M.) and Colorado Christian. He belted six hits, including a double, a triple and a home run for the week with four RBI and four runs scored. Smith slugged .857 and reached base at a .556 clip along with four walks and no strikeouts. He was one of just four players to play and start all five games this week. The home run was his first of his career at WT and the triple was the first of the season for WT. He helped lead the Buffs to back-to-back run-rule games in the last two contests. For the season he leads the team among everyday starters with a .462 average on 12 of 26 from the plate. He has five runs scored along with five doubles, one triple, one home run and six RBI. He has six walks and no strikeouts on the year.

PITCHERS

Bryce Zak, Angelo State University, JR, RHP, San Angelo, Texas, Central HS

Zak went eight innings of scoreless baseball and earned his second win of the season last Saturday at CSU-Pueblo. Zak (2-0) allowed only two hits, struck out two and held the ThunderWolves to a .080 batting average in the game. Zak, who also has a win over McMurry this season, is in his first season at ASU after pitching the last two seasons at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. He has a 1.93 ERA in 23.1 innings of work this season to lead the Rams

Paul Pulley, West Texas A&M University, SR, RHP, Amarillo, Texas, Tascosa HS

Earned his first win of the season in a combined 11-0 shutout of Southwest (N.M.) last Tuesday. He went five innings in the game allowing just two hits with three strikeouts and no walks. He followed that with one inning pitched in a 3-2 win over Colorado Christian. He allowed one hit with two strikeouts in the relief appearance and picked off his one base runner at second to end the inning as it would have potentially been the game-tying runner. For the season, he has an 0.00 ERA in nine innings of work with five hits, one walk and seven strikeouts as opponents are hitting just .167 against him.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Chris Ballou, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas with a .500 average in three games last week raising his average to .428 on the season which is fifth in the league. He reached safely in all three games. He had two hits in the series opener and capped the series with three hits in four at bats with two runs scored and a double. Ballou has now reached safely in all 12 games in which he has appeared.

Christian Summers, Angelo State University, had four doubles, a triple and hit .500 during the Rams four-game series against CSU-Pueblo last weekend in Colorado. Summers also delivered four RBI and didn't commit an error in the series at short stop. Summers, who is in his first year at ASU after playing the last two seasons at Texas, is hitting .333 with six doubles, two triples and two home runs for the Rams this season.

Ryan Small, Tarleton State University, had a great weekend at the plate, hitting .750 after recording nine hits in 12 plate appearances. He tallied four doubles and finished the weekend with a 1.083 slugging percentage. Small led the team with seven runs batted in and was tied for the team lead with five runs scored.

Zachary Pettiford, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, tossed the first complete game of his Javelina career on Friday night at Houston-Victoria in a 4-0 win over the Jaguars. He scattered five hits and struck out three. The shutout and complete game were both the first of the season for the Javelinas. Pettiford is now 2-1 on the season and boasts a 0.35 ERA which is second in the LSC. He has a pitched a league-high 26 innings as of Monday.

Ben Monticello, Eastern New Mexico University, threw a career-high eight innings in the first game against of the series against Metro State. He surrendered seven hits and only two runs while striking out five to the then

11th regionally ranked team. Monticello is now 2-0 on the year with a staff-low 2.60 ERA and is averaging five strikeouts per game.

Matt Buckmaster, Tarleton State University, moved to 2-1 on the season after he tossed a four-hit, complete game shutout against Arlington Baptist on Saturday. The south-paw did not walk a batter and struck out six while throwing his first career shutout. He continues to lead the LSC with his flawless earned run average of 0.00, having given up just one unearned run all season. Opponents have scored just one run off Buckmaster in his 23.2 innings of work so far this season.

Angelo State

The Rams split their four-game series against CSU-Pueblo last weekend and are now 10-5 on the season. ASU won the first game of the series 7-5 before a sixrun eighth inning cost them a 6-5 loss in last Friday's final game. Bryce Zak threw a gem in a 2-0 win in Saturday's first game but the ThunderWolves once again mounted a late-inning comeback to take a 3-2 win in the series finale to split the series. ASU was limited to a .262 batting average in the series with 11 doubles, three triples and to three stolen bases. ASU does not play this week and will return to action on Monday, March 4 and Tuesday, March 5 against Bellarmine at Foster Field for a two-game series.

Cameron

The Cameron Aggies' baseball team went 3-1 this week as they beat Southwestern Oklahoma State twice (3-2, 10-4) on Tues. Feb. 19 and then split their double header on Sun. Feb. 24 against William Jewell (7-6, 5-10). Cameron got a dominant start by Drew Reidt in the first game against SWOSU, going six innings and only giving up two earned runs and striking out four, however Aaron Kleekamp came in the 10th inning and came away with the win. The defense stepped up in the ninth and turned a 3-2-6 triple play to preserve the tie. The offense came alive in the second game, with six players having multiple hit games. Game one against William Jewell was tight throughout, but Kleekamp came in with a one run lead in the seventh and shut the door for the save. Although game two's score looked rough, it was back and forth until the Cardinals scored five runs in the top of the seventh inning. Offensively the Aggies were led by Brad Blumer, who was 7-17 with four RBI's for the week, Nick Smith, who was 6-17 with two runs scored, and three RBI's, and Kaz Sanders, who drove in five RBI's this week. Since their game against East Central got postponed due to weather, the Aggies will play next at the ACU tournament this weekend.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 4-1 last week with three wins over Metro State and defeated Lubbock Christian in a weekday contest. Prior to their loss on Sunday, the Greyhounds had won seven straight which was tied for the second longest in program history. Senior outfielder Luis Quinones led the team with 10 hits last week and moved up to ninth place on the school's all-time career hit list with 185. Junior second baseman extended his hitting streak to 13 games with his fourth home run of the season in the series finale versus the Roadrunners. His four bombs

are the most in the Lone Star Conference. Junior Ben Monticello threw a staff-high eight innings on Friday against MSU, allowing seven hits and two runs while striking out five to improve to 2-0 on the year. ENMU's game against the University of the Southwest scheduled for Tuesday was postponed because of snow. The Greyhounds will play in the Whitten Inn Classic hosted by Abilene Christian with their first game on Friday against the host school. Eastern will also play Tarleton State and Cameron on Saturday and Sunday, respectively.

Tarleton State

The Texans earned a series sweep over Arlington Baptist this weekend, downing the Patriots 11-3 on Friday, and then defeating the visiting squad 19-3 and 9-0 in Saturday's twin bill at Cecil Ballow Baseball Complex in Stephenville... Two of three Tarleton starters on the weekend picked up wins in their efforts on the mound. Miguel Ramirez (1-0) won his first game in over two years since returning to the Texans following an arm injury sidelined him in March of 2011. Matt Buckmaster (2-1) tossed a four hit, complete game shutout on Saturday as he picked up the win for the Texans as well. Friday's starter, Pete Perez (ND), got the no decision as he allowed three runs on 10 hits, while striking out five... Ryan Small led the Texans at the plate this weekend, going 9-for-12 with four doubles. He drove in seven runs and scored a team-high five runs as well... Alvaro Moreno hit .500 over the two-day span, collecting seven hits in 14 trips to the plate... Fola Lajide had four hits on the weekend, with all four hits going for extra bases (three doubles, one triple)... Tarleton's offense lit up the Arlington Baptist pitching staff for a total of 39 runs on 44 hits this weekend... 20 of those hits came for extra bases in the three-game set... Tarleton raised its batting average .057 points with its offensive barrage against the Patriots... The Texans came into the weekend batting just .228 as a team, but with it's .419 average this past weekend, Tarleton is now hitting .285 as a team.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Zachary Pettiford tossed the first complete game of his Javelina career on Friday night at Houston-Victoria in a 4-0 win over the Jaguars. He scattered five hits and struck out three. The shutout and complete game were both the first of the season for the Javelinas... Pettiford is now 2-1 on the season and boasts a 0.35 ERA which is second in the LSC. He has a pitched a league-high 26 innings as of Monday...A pair of Javelinas have reached safely in each of their appearances this season. Senior second baseman Ben Villafuerte has started all 14 games and has reached base all 14 times. Outfielder/designated hitter Chris Ballou has now reached safely in all 12 games in which he has appeared...Jeremy Flores leads the LSC in saves with four. He now has 14 career saves. He is just two shy of Juan Obregon (2001-04) who had 16. Denver Diefenbach has two saves which ties him for second in the LSC this season. The duo shares the conference lead for appearances with eight...At 4-0, Dallas Ponder leads the LSC in wins, while fellow starter Matt Rhodes is tied for second with three wins... Joe Tallerine has a team-best eight steals as the Javelinas have swiped 32 as a team and are on pace to better the school mark of 120... With their early success the Javelinas are climbing up the rankings, Kingsville is ranked 20th in the most recent Collegiate Baseball Newspaper poll, 21st in the D2BaseballNews.com poll, and 17th in the College Baseball Lineup rankings.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs improved to 11-2 on the year going 5-0 this past week with sweeps of University of the Southwest (N.M.) and Colorado Christian...WT hit .392 for the week with 56 hits, 41 runs, 14 doubles, three triples and three home runs...The Buffs slugged .594 and reached base at a .480 clip. WT went 5 of 6 in stolen bases as well...The staff held the opponents to just seven runs and five earned runs for a 1.29 ERA with just five walks and 37 strikeouts as the opposition hit just .216...WT run-ruled Colorado Christian in back-to-back games with a 13-3 win in the nightcap Saturday and an 11-1 win Sunday...The interesting part is in both games the run-rule clinching run came on a bases loaded hit batsman in the seventh inning as both games were scheduled for nine innings...WT scored double-digit runs in three of the five games this week and has had double-digit runs in four games this season all wins...The two series sweeps are the first back-to-back sweeps of teams since Oklahoma Panhandle and East Central Mar. 29-Apr. 2, 2011.
