LSC SOFTBALL

Softball season started last week with all but one Lone Star Conference team on the field. The games roll on with a full slate of non-conference contests this week.

LSC teams are playing a single round-robin schedule with a three-game series against every other team. Each series consists of a doubleheader one day and single 7-inning game the other day.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into the NCAA postseason. The single-elimination championship will be played May 3-5 in Canyon, Texas, as part of the LSC Spring Championships Festival.

LSC softball teams are 21-23 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the group is currently 10-10 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 3-0 opposed to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

Kim Jerrick, Midwestern State University, JR, Catcher, Belle Plaine, Kan., Belle Plaine HS

Jerrick rocked a .600 average going 12-for-20 at the plate while raking four doubles and three homers while driving in 11 runs to lead Midwestern State to a 4-2 showing at the Grand Canyon Invitational last weekend in Phoenix. The junior catcher from Belle Plaine, Kan. became the first player in MSU program history to notch three career multiple home run games when she launched two homers while driving in a school single-game record six runs Sunday against Western New Mexico. The outbreak included her second collegiate grand slam as she homered in consecutive innings. Jerrick collected a hit in each of the Mustangs' six games and accounted for an extra base hit in all but one.

PITCHER

Sandra Serna, Angelo State University, JR, Pitcher, Albuquerque, N.M., Sandia HS

Serna is a perfect 3-0 on the season with a 0.54 earned-run average. The junior shutout a talented Lubbock Christian team, ranked No. 2 in NAIA, in her first start for ASU. She limited the Chaps to only three hits and struck out five. Serna came in to relieve Mary Kate McKay in the season opener to help secure a win against East Central. She earned the win over Texas A&M-International in four innings of work. The Albuquerque native has only allowed one earned run in three starts this season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Courtney Vroman, Tarleton State University, opened her senior season with a bang last weekend at the St. Mary's Invitational Tournament. The senior from Lorena saw action in all five games and hit .429 in 14 at-bats. She also slugged the first two home runs of her career, including a two-out, two-run walk off homer in the bottom of the seventh to defeat Texas-Permian Basin in the tournament finale. Vroman added 6 RBIs on the weekend and racked up 12 total bases.

Rose Stubbs, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, exhibited her value at the top of the Javelinas lineup all weeknd. Stubbs reached base in 10 of 20 appearances with seven singles and two steals. Amazingly she did not strike on the weekend at St. Mary's tournament. She had three hits and a walk in the win over Lubbock Christian- a top NAIA team. She average a team-best .412 with an on-base percentage of .500.

Morgan Spearman, Angelo State University, was named tournament MVP after hitting two grand slams and knocking in 10 RBI's. The junior hit .412 for the weekend. The first grand slam was off of Sarah Debrow of St. Edward's in the second inning that opened the game up. The second came in the third inning off of that was a seven run inning for the Rambelles. The two home runs were the first two of the season and 12th and 13th for her career. She is the team leader with seven hits and total bases with 14. Spearman is No. 2 in the LSC with 10

Kuuleiokealoaha VonSchriltz, Eastern New Mexico University, started all five games for Eastern, last week and posted a .333 batting average with a double and triple. She recorded multiple-hit games against St. Edwards and Texas-Permian Basin.

Briana Sanchez, University of the Incarnate Word, went 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA at the St. Mary's Tournament. She earned all-tournament team honors after her strong weekend. She had a complete game victory over Southeastern Oklahoma allowing five hits, one run and two walks while striking out five. She came back and tossed three shutout innings in a loss to Texas A&M-International on the same day. On Sunday, she shut down Lubbock Christian, the #2 ranked team in NAIA. She scattered four hits and allowed one run in a complete game, 2-1 victory over the Lady Chaps.

Laci Belovsky, Midwestern State University, posted a 2-1 mark and recorded a save with a 1.27 ERA to help Midwestern State to a 4-2 showing last weekend at the Grand Canyon Invitational in Phoenix. The freshman right-hander from Grangerland allowed two runs on eight hits to earn a win in her collegiate debut Friday against Grand Canyon then fanned 13 batters in a 4-1 win over Western New Mexico on Saturday. Belovsky closed the weekend off in strong fashion allowing one run on 6-hit ball in six innings Sunday in a 1-0 loss to Grand Canyon then pitched two scoreless innings of relief to preserve a 7-6 win over Western New Mexico.

Randi Fentress, Tarleton State University, despite what her record indicates, she had a great weekend in the circle. The junior from Birdville took over the role as ace of the staff and lived up to expectations by keeping her team in a position to win every time out. She took a pair of hard luck losses in the first two games of the season before notching victories in the final two. She saw action in all five games of the weekend - amassing 22.2 Complete results on page 5 of the release.

The Wildcats began play with a 10-0 win over Texas A&M-International, but then lost to #2 Lubbock Christian, 1-3, and St. Edward's, 0-8, before rebounding with a 10-2 win vs. Texas-Permian Basin. Shelby Hall and Caitlyn Crain combined on the shutout of International. Crain also finished the weekend with a team-best 10Ks. Freshman Demi McNulty paced the offense with a .500 batting average (5-10) with two runs, double, and RBI ... Four additional Wildcats all batted over .400: Sara Vaughn, Heather Peacock, Keanna Winkfield, and Anna Jones ... Courtney Flanary had the most RBI with five. ACU welcomes Central Oklahoma and Eastern New Mexico this Friday and Saturday for the Whitten Inn Classic.

Angelo State

The No. 4 Rambelles started the season a perfect 5-0 at the St. Mary's Classic this past weekend against St. Edward's, Lubbock Christian, St. Mary's, Texas A&M-International and East Central. Morgan Spearman was named tournament MVP after hitting two grand slams and knocking in 10 RBI's. The junior hit .412 for the weekend. Three others were named to the tournament team. Sandra Serna went 3-0 with a 0.69 earned-run average with one shut out. Lauren Smith (.357, four RBI's, five runs scored) and Maddy McGarity (.462, six hits, four runs scored) were also named to the team. ASU is 9-1 in season-opening games under head coach Travis Scott. The Rambelles will play in the Southeastern Regional Tournament in Durant this weekend.

Junior catcher Kim Jerrick belted three home runs to move past Alyson Reynolds and Jessica Rodriguez (22 homers each) to move into fourth place. She needs five homers to become the program's all-time homers leader... Jerrick matched an MSU single-game record by driving in six runs Sunday against Western New Mexico. Kristen Stonecipher achieved the feat in consecutive days against Southern Arkansas and Texas Woman's on Feb. 2-3, 2007... Jerrick became the first player in MSU history to record three career multiple homer games with two bombs against Western New Mexico on Sunday. She also belted two homers against St. Edward's (3/27/11) and at Henderson State (2/5/12)... Bennett set a program single game mark with four stolen bases Friday against Western New Mexico. She also became the first MSU player to steal 100 bases in a career...

Tarleton State

After dropping three close contests to open the season, Tarleton finished the St. Mary's Invitational Tournament. Courtney Vroman ended the tournament with a bang, slugging a two-out walk off home run against Texas-Permian Basin. Vroman hit .429 for Tarleton over the weekend, including the first two home runs of her career.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Senior Rose Stubbs exhibited her value at the top of the Javelinas lineup all weekend. Stubbs reached base in 10 of 20 appearances with seven singles and two steals. Amazingly she did not strike on the weekend at St. Mary's tournament. She had three hits and a walk in the win over Lubbock Christian- a top NAIA team. She average a team-best .412 with an on-base percentage of .500...Sophomore transfer Katrisha Arocha (2-2) pitched 20 innings in four games over the weekend. She allowed only nine earned runs off 20 hits and struck out 12. The opponents were only able to hit a .250 against Arocha. Arocha earned wins against Lubbock Christian and Permian Basin. She had two each against International and East Central... The Javelinas host the Javelina Classic this weekend with Midwestern State, St. Edward's, and A&M International coming to town.

Texas Woman's

The Pioneers opened the season at St. Mary's Division II College Classic and posted a 2-3 record. TWU defeated UT-Permain Basin and East Central but fell to St. Mary's, Southeastern Oklahoma State and Lubbock Christian. Freshman Shley Maddox leads the team with .571 batting average and 1.000 slugging percentage. Junior Bailey Vrazel is second with .412 batting average. Junior Brandie Lander has a 2-0 record and 12 strikeouts to lead the pitching staff. She tossed a complete-game shutout in her debut with the Pioneers against UT-Permian Basin. Senior Jordan Readicker hit her 29th career home run in her first at bat of the season. Senior Larisa Garcia picked up her ninth career save in the win against East Central. Both Readicker and Garcia are the all-time leaders in their respective categories at TWU.
