GOLFERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S

Santiago Gomez, **Midwestern State University, R-FR, Armenia, Columbia, GI School**

Gomez won his first tournament title as a collegian and led Midwestern State to back-to-back tournament wins with the Mustangs win in the MSU Invitational. Gomez fired an even-par 216 to win the 54-hole tournament at The Champions Course at Weeks Park with rounds of 75, 70 and 71. The redshirt freshman from Armenia, Columbia also helped MSU post the best round played in the tournament with a 3-under-par 285 in the final round to win the 15-team tournament by four strokes over Cameron and 14 over Incarnate Word.

WOMEN'S

Taylor Klutts, **Midwestern State University, SR, Lake Kiowa, Texas, Callisburg**

Klutts placed third individually in leading Midwestern State to it's second tournament win of the year with a triumph in the 18-team MSU Invitational at the Wichita Falls Country Club. Klutts fired rounds of 73 and 75 to finish with a 4-over-par 148, just two strokes off the individual tournament lead. The senior from Lake Kiowa, Texas/Callisburg helped the No. 8 Mustangs to a nine stroke win over No. 12 Central Oklahoma with the two best team rounds of the tournament of 314-309 – 623.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Chris Martinez, University of the Incarnate Word, led the Cardinals to a third place finish at the MSU Invitational this week. On the par-72 course, he posted rounds of 77, 71 and 69 to finish in second place, one shot behind the leader. His final round 3-under tied for the low round of the day.

Ethan Peterson, West Texas A&M University, fired rounds of 81, 75 and 76 at the Midwestern State Invitational this week as he paced the Buffs finishing tied for 29th. He helped lead the team to an 11th-place finish in the tournament and helped drop a total of eight strokes from the first round to the third round.

Austin Weaver, Cameron University, had his highest finish at Cameron this last week at the MSU Invite placing third. Weaver improved his game during each round picking up four strokes after round one and three more after round two. He carded a 69 in the final round which was tied for the lowest score of the day. In six events played during the 2012-13 season Weaver has quietly lead the Ags with the lowest per-round average on the team with a 73.44.

Glory Jangthongsiri, West Texas A&M University, finished fourth at the Midwestern State Invitational this week as she led the Lady Buffs to tie for sixth in the tournament with Angelo State. Jangthongsiri fired rounds of 79 and 72 for a 7-over 151. Her round of 72 on Tuesday was the low-round of the day for the 97-player field and tied for the low-round of the tournament. She helped lead the Lady Buffs to move up two places on Tuesday and drop seven strokes from Monday (328) to Tuesday (321). She had 14 pars, two birdies and two bogeys in the final round.

Isabell Jimenez-Perea, Tarleton State University, shot a nine over-par (77-76=153) over two days in Palm Desert, Calif. last week and finished in a tie for fourth-place overall at the Augustana Spring Fling. Just a freshman for the TexAnns, Jimenez-Perea has had a top-10 finish in all seven of Tarleton's events this year. Her performance this past week helped guide the TexAnns to a second-place finish, just 18 strokes back of first-place St. Edward's and 33 strokes better than Augustana in third-place.

Cameron

The Cameron men's golf team had one of their strongest showing of the season at the MSU Invite finishing in second place with a three round total of 887. Cameron led late but had three double-bogeys to falter to second place. Austin Weaver and Trey Lawson both placed third in the event, while Corey Bounds and Gregg Wood tied for 16th. The Cameron women struggled at the MSU women's invite placing in 14th with a two round total of 677. Lindsey Alexander would lead the Ags with a 41st place tie carding a two round total of 166 (84-82).

Incarnate Word

The UIW women's golf team tied for fourth place at the Midwestern State University Invitational with a 322-321=643 total. The Cardinals moved up one place in the team standings during the final round at the Wichita Falls Country Club, a par-72, 5875-yard layout. The Cardinals only had one player finish in the top 20 at the 18 team tournament, but they had four players in the top 30. Jessica Cornish was the team's top finisher after rounds of 79 and 82 for a 161 total to finish in 18th. Junior Flower Castillo bounced back after a tough first round to post the team's lowest score of the round, a 77 to finish in 30th. Lizeth Escobedo and Samantha Martinez each finished tied for 23rd. Sophomore Chris Martinez UIW men's golf team at the Midwestern State Invitational with a 1-over par 54-hole total to finish as the individual runner-up. Martinez and the Cardinals finished in third place as a team at the 15 team tournament played at the par-72, 7034-yard Champions Course at Weeks Park. Martinez posted a score of 77-71-69=217 and his final day 3-under par tied for the low round of the day. The Cardinals had three players in the top 20. Austin Jordan and Archie Ramos finished in a tie for 16th

with a score of 229. Austin Wylie had the second lowest round of the day for the team with a 77 and finished with a 232 total to put her in 18th place.

Midwestern State

Both the MSU men and women won the Midwestern State Invitational this week. For the MSU men, it is back-to-back tournament titles for the first time in school history as the Mustangs won Arkansas Tech's Dave Falconer Memorial last week in Danville, Ark. The MSU men have finished third or better in six of their eight tournaments this year, and have finished second twice and won twice in their four tournaments played this spring. MSU is ranked 28th by Golfstat. Sophomore Derek Oland leads the Mustangs with a 73.47 scoring average, while redshirt freshman Santiago Gomez has a 73.53 average. The two have three tournament wins between them. The MSU women are ranked No. 8 in the latest Golf World/WGCA Division II Coaches Poll and No. 9 by Golfstat. The Mustangs collected their second tournament team title this year with the win at the MSU Invitational and have four other second place finishes this year, marking 6 of 7 tourneys played finishing at least second, with the seventh a top five spot. Senior Taylor Klutts and sophomore Brenna Moore each have a 77.29 stroke average, while senior Kendra Whittlely has a 77.64 average. The trio has a win, three seconds and a third among them this year.

Tarleton State

The TexAnns finished in second-place at the Augustana Spring Fling, which was held at Classic Golf Club in Palm Desert, Calif. last week... Tarleton's Isabell Jimenez-Perea, Jacqueline Lau and Jessica Pickwick each carded a nine over-par (153) for the event to finish in a tie for fourth-place overall... The TexAnns have a few weeks off before returning to action at the CenturyLink Doc Housewright Invitational Apr. 8-9... Tarleton will host the event, which will be held at Harbor Lakes Golf Course in Granbury.

West Texas A&M

The West Texas A&M men's and women's golf teams traveled to Midwestern State for the Midwestern State Invitational this week. The women's team finished tied for sixth with a 36-hole score of 649 as freshman Glory Jangthongsiri finished fourth with a 7-over 151. The Lady Buffs dropped seven strokes from Monday's 328 round to Tuesday's 321 score. Jangthongsiri carded rounds of 79 and 72 with her 72 being the low-round of the final round and tied for the low-round of the tournament...The men's team finished 11th at the Midwestern State Invitational as freshman Ethan Peterson tied for 29th carding rounds of 81, 76 and 75 for a 232 score. He helped lead the Buffs to drop eight strokes over the three rounds, while Peterson's 75 on Monday was the low-round of the tournament for WT.
