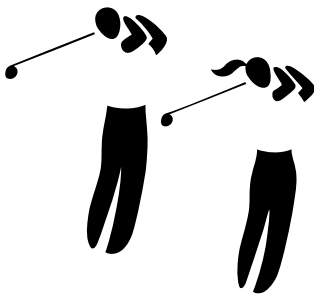

GOLFERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S

Alex Carpenter, Abilene Christian University, SR, Little Rock, Ark., Arkansas Baptist HS

Carpenter won his 19th career tournament on Tuesday, winning the Arkansas-Little Rock / First Tee Collegiate Classic on his home course in Little Rock, Ark. ... Carpenter shot a three-round total of 2-over-par 218 in tough conditions to win the tournament championship at the Chenal Country Club. ... Carpenter carded a 73 in the first round and had a tournament-best 69 in the second, which was his 31st career round in the 60's. ... Despite recording his highest round of the two-day tournament this afternoon at 4-over 76, none of the other 65 competitors could gain any ground as Carpenter began the morning seven strokes ahead at 2-under 142. He won the tournament by 10 strokes.

WOMEN'S

Glory Jangthongsiri, West Texas A&M University, FR, Bangkok, Thailand, Yothinburana School

Had her best finish at WT as she tied for second at the Bluebonnet Classic this week. Jangthongsiri fired rounds of 76 and 75. She helped lead the team to its best finish of the season, second place on the Tangle Ridge Golf Course in Cedar Hill, Texas. She lost her ball on the first hole in the final round and was +5 through three holes and finished the round just 3-over. She has a 76.3 stroke average in 14 rounds to lead the team. Jangthongsiri has 11 rounds in the 70s and has not scored over 80 all season.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Courtney Rutledge, Angelo State University, finished in a tie for seventh place at the UAFS Lions Classic after a second round surge. Rutledge shot a 76 on Tuesday for her third top-10 finish of the season. The final round scoring cut seven strokes off her first-round total.

ACU senior golfer Alex Carpenter won his 19th career tournament Tuesday as he won the Arkansas-Little Rock / First Tee Collegiate Classic by 10 strokes. ... Playing his home course at the Chenal Country Club, the Little Rock, Ark., native shot a three-round total of 2-over-par 218 in tough conditions. ... He shot a second-round 69, which was his 31st collegiate round in the 60s. ... The ACU men – ranked No. 6 in the latest NCAA Division II rankings – finished fourth in the tournament, which was largely a Division I tournament.

The Rambelles finished in fifth place at the UAFS Lions Classic which was played at the Hardscrabble Country Club in Fort Smith, Arkansas. ASU was tied for fourth entering the final round after an opening round of 330 as a team. ASU cut four strokes off its score in the final round. Courtney Rutledge led ASU with a seventh-place showing after carding a 83-76 - 159, while Abby Bobo claimed 17th with a 164. Bobo was in eighth place following an 80 in her first round. Krista Czarnecki recorded her first top-20 finish of her senior season after shooting a 166 and finishing 20th.

The Lady Buff women's golf team had its best finish of the season at the Northwood Bluebonnet Classic as it finished second to the host Knights. Freshman Glory Jangthongsiri finished tied for second which was her best finish as a Lady Buff with a 7-over 151. She has a team-high 11 rounds in the 70s this season with three 80s as the only player on the team to not score over 80. Jangthongsiri sat tied for fourth entering the final round, but her 75 moved her up. Freshman Whitlee Woods finished a career-best tied for sixth with a 78 and 77 in the tournament. WT opened the tournament with a 315 and dropped to a 306 in the second round.
