LSC SOCCER

Non-conference play continues this week for Lone Star Conference teams. A&M-Commerce leads the league with a 2-1 overall record.

The women's teams are 10-13-4 overall this season. The squads are currently 5-6-3 combined versus Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference teams, and 1-2 against the Heartland Conference, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Ashley Cottrell, Midwestern State University, SO, Forward, Arlington, Texas, Mansfield Summit HS

Cottrell erupted for two goals and an assist to lead Midwestern State to a 3-0 win over Oklahoma Christian. The 5-9 sophomore striker beat numerous defenders traveling to the goal line before beating the OC keeper for a tally in the 38th minute then dished an assist to Katy Catney in the 85th minute. Cottrell polished off the effort by knocking in a tally off of a corner kick in the final minute of the match. It was her third career multiple-goal game and highest point output.

DEFENSIVE

Alyxandra Ortiz, Eastern New Mexico University, SO, Rio Rancho, N.M., V. Sue Cleveland HS

Ortiz posted two shutouts last week and made 15 saves. Her biggest save preserved a scoreless double-overtime tie against then sixth-ranked Colorado School of Mines. Ortiz followed with a 1-0 victory at Adams State. In four contests this season, she has allowed just one goal and currently has a shutout streak of 200 minutes.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jasmine Shultz, West Texas A&M University, had a strong return to the Lady Buffs' lineup on Tuesday night against Lubbock Christian. The junior recorded four shots (three on target) and provided a late game-winner in the 81st minute to lead WT to its first victory of the season.

Maggie Schaffer, Angelo State University, scored the Rambelles opening goal in the win over Colorado Mesa on Sunday. The goal was the first of the season for Schaffer and the 11th in her career at ASU. The senior had two shots over the weekend for the Rambelles.

Anitra Wright, Texas A&M University - Commerce, came on in the 26th minutes and scored the game winner for the Lions in the 43rd minute against Harding University for the 2-1 win in the only of the week for A&M-Commerce...The goal came on her only shot of the game...It was Wright's second goal of the season.

Alyssa Prince, Eastern New Mexico University, tallied the game-winning goal, late in the second half at Adams State. For the week, she had four shots with two on net.

Kallie Essary, Midwestern State University, made three saves to secure her second clean sheet of the season in a 3-0 win over Oklahoma Christian. The 5-4 senior from Carrollton ranks among league leaders with a 0.75 goals against average and a .500 shutout percentage while making 4.5 saves per match.

Dani Edwards, Angelo State University, continues to show why she earned Lone Star Conference Goalkeeper of the Year last season with strong play in goal for the Rambelles this season. Edwards earned a shutout win over Colorado Mesa on Sunday after having five saves in ASU's double-overtime loss to Fort Lewis. The loss came after a handball call allowed Fort Lewis a penalty kick from 12 yards out. The goal was the only points allowed by Edwards and her defense in 192 minutes of action last week. The shutout was the ninth in her career.

Catie Hyde, Texas A&M University - Commerce, led the Lions defense in 2-1 win over the Lady Bison of Harding University...The Lion defense only allowed three shots on the night including no shots in the last 30 minutes of the game to preserve the victory.

Yvette Bedoy, West Texas A&M University, had an outstanding week between the pipes for the West Texas A&M women's soccer team. The senior did not allow a regulation goal in five of the six total halves in which she played. She started all three of the Lady Buffs' games and played a total of 293 minutes while enduring three overtime periods. Bedoy tallied 18 saves on the week and leads the Lone Star Conference with 40 total saves on the season. She is just six saves away from breaking WT's all-time career saves record.

Angelo State

The Rambelles went 1-1 last week with a 2-0 win over Colorado Mesa following a tough 0-1 double-overtime loss to Fort Lewis on Friday. Maggie Schaffer and Brianne Brown scored goals for ASU in the win, while goalkeeper Dani Edwards earned her first individual shutout of the season. The win followed the second double-overtime loss of the season and came on a penalty kick after a handball call was made. The penalty kick came from 12 yards out two minutes into the second overtime. Offensively, sophomore Sierra Anderson took 12 shots to lead the Rambelle attack.

Eastern New Mexico

The Zias turned in a strong week, with a scoreless tie against sixth-ranked Colorado School of Mines and a 1-0 win at Adams State. The tie against CSM marked the fourth time in team history in which neither team scored. Zia goal keeper Alyxandra Ortiz has three shutouts in four starts this season and a miniscule 0.46 goals against

Midwestern State

Midwestern State erupted for a season high output in a 3-0 win over Oklahoma Christian to even its season mark at 2-2... It was just third time MSU tallied at least three goals since the start of the 2012 season and the first time since notching a 3-0 win over Texas A&M-Commerce on Oct. 21, 2012... Sophomore forward Ashley Cottrell notched her third career multiple-goal outing matching a career high. She also scored two goals at West Texas A&M and against Texas Woman's last season... Junior midfielder Katy Catney tallied her fourth collegiate goal and added an assist Saturday against Oklahoma Christian. It was her first score against a team other than West Texas A&M as she scored two against the Lady Buffs as a redshirt freshman in 2011 and tallied another against WT last season... Senior goalkeeper Kallie Essary logged her second clean sheet of the season making three saves Saturday against Oklahoma Christian... The Mustangs kickoff a four-match homestand with matches against East Central (Okla.) and Rogers State (Okla.) Friday and Sunday at the MSU Soccer Field...

Texas A&M-Commerce

Anitra Wright scored the GWG in the 43rd minute of a 2-1 victory for the Lions over Harding on 9/13 in the only game of the week for A&M-Commerce. Taylor Lambeth picked up the assist on the game winner. Freshmen forward Savannah Henderson scored her first colligate goal off a free kick in the 10th minute to tie the score at 1. Starting with Dallas Baptist on Wednesday (9/18) the Lions will play six games in 11 days.

Texas Woman's

TWU soccer team dropped both games last week and is now 1-3 on the season. The Pioneers fell at Ouachita Baptist 2-1 before losing at Central Oklahoma 1-0. Freshman Alisa Velasquez scored TWU's lone goal during the week. She leads the Pioneers with two goals and four points on the season. Freshman Tori Crook has assisted on three of the Pioneers' seven goals this season. TWU will make their home debut this week with a three-game homestand. The Pioneers will host East Central on Wednesday, Harding on Friday and Northwestern Oklahoma State on Sunday.

West Texas A&M

The Lady Buffs began the week by playing the now-24th ranked Lady Bulldogs of Southwestern Oklahoma State to a 1-1 draw on Thursday. Sophomore Emily Krenek came through for the Lady Buffs in the 48th minute with her first goal of the season to take the advantage on the board. In the 63rd minute, Alexis Russell evened up the score for the Lady Bulldogs with her sniper-like shot from outside the box. Senior goalkeeper Yvette Bedoy recorded a season-high 10 saves in the contest. WT played into an extra period for the third-straight match as it dropped its first road contest of the year to Dallas Baptist in overtime, 1-0. The Lady Buffs defense held strong in the first half despite early pressure from the Patriots. Bedoy performed as usual in regulation, grabbing six saves while not allowing a goal. Bedoy earned her first shutout of the season on Tuesday night as the Lady Buffs picked up their first win by defeating Lubbock Christian, 1-0. A season-high 10 players contributed to the shot chart. Junior Jasmine Shultz scored the late game-winner in the 81st minute to propel the Lady Buffs to victory. The Lady Buffs will hit the road on Friday, Sept. 20, as they travel to Portales, N.M., for a neutral site matchup with No. 19 St. Edward's. Game time is scheduled for 5 p.m. (central time). WT is 5-1-2 all-time against the Hilltoppers and 1-0-1 when playing them at neutral locations.
