LSC BASKETBALL

The Tarleton State men extended its best start in school history to 13-0 overall with a pair of Lone Star Conference wins. Midwestern State and Cameron join the Texans with undefeated records in league play. On the women's side, TSU and West Texas A&M lead the standings with perfect LSC marks.

This week features a full league schedule with seven men's games and nine women's contests. The three top teams on the men's side square off with TSU at MSU Wednesday, and CU at TSU Saturday.

The LSC men have a 73-37 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 66-50 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Monzaigo Williams, Midwestern State University, SR, Guard, Palmdale, Calif., Antelope Valley HS (Western Texas)

Williams ripped the nets for a game-high 27 points including five 3-pointers to lead Midwestern State to a 76-70 win at West Texas A&M Wednesday night in Canyon. The senior guard from Palmdale, Calif. connected on three consecutive treys to ignite a 13-0 run late in the opening to pull the Mustangs even at 38-38 just 1:45 before intermission. Williams hit consecutive treys early in the second half to give MSU control in its second straight win in Canyon -- a first in series history. Williams closed the week with a 13-point, 5-assists, 4-steal effort in just 26 minutes in a 66-41 rout of Eastern New Mexico. For the week, Williams averaged 20 points while shooting 70 percent from the field (14-of-20) and 75 percent from the 3-point land (6-of-8) while averaging 4.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists with five steals.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Xavier Blackburn, Midwestern State University, JR, Forward, New Iberia, La., St. Thomas More HS (North Dakota State Science)

Blackburn played a key role in an historic defensive night as Midwestern State rolled to a 66-41 win over Eastern New Mexico Saturday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The 6-4 junior from New Iberia, La. scored eight points, but snagged a game-high 11 board -- nine defensive -- with two blocks and a steal as the Mustangs limited the Greyhounds to a 19.3 percent shooting night which ranks as the second lowest opponent field goal percentage in school history. Blackburn delivered a 15-point, 7-rebound effort helping the Mustangs overcome a 13-point first-half deficit to beat West Texas A&M Wednesday in Canyon. For the week, Blackburn, averaged 12.0 points and 9.0 rebounds -- with 16 defensive boards -- to go along with two blocked shots and a steal.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Kathy Thomas, Tarleton State University, JR, Guard, Flint, Mich., Hamady HS

Thomas exploded for 36 points over the last two games to lead Tarleton to back-to-back wins over Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville. The junior poured in a career-high 20 points against the Rambelles Wednesday before turning in a 16-point effort on Saturday at Kingsville. She was 13-18 from the floor, including 9-12 from beyond the arc, to lead all TexAnn guards in shooting percentage. She also grabbed seven rebounds in two games and dished out seven assists.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, SR, Center, Pittsburg, Texas, Pittsburg HS

Wright continued her defensive dominance last week as she anchored the Tarleton defense that allowed Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville to average 58.5 points per game on .342 shooting from the floor in two Tarleton victories. Wright grabbed 24 rebounds for the week - with 17 of them coming on the defensive end - and added two steals. Wright also led the Tarleton defense to second half dominance, as the TexAnns outscored opponents 87-59 in the second half last week. Wright also led the team in scoring with 18.5 points per game.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, turned in another stellar week by averaging 23 points and 9.0 rebounds per game in conference contests against Tarleton State and Texas A&M-Commerce. Williams opened the week by going for 25 points and 10 rebounds against TSU for his sixth double-double of the season before leading the Rams with 21 points and eight rebounds in a 67-65 win over the Lions on Sunday. Williams is now averaging 18.6 points and 8.3 rebounds per game for the Rams. He also had five assists during the week.

Chuck Guy, Tarleton State University, helped lead the Texans to a 2-0 mark in LSC play this week, averaging 21.0 points per game with a 52.6 shooting percentage from the field. The senior guard was nearly perfect from the free throw line after going 19-for-22 on the week and he was 37.5 percent from the three-point line as well. His 24 points against Angelo State led all players on Wednesday and he followed it up with an 18-point effort at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday. Guy tallied nine total rebounds on the week and dished out 11 assists as well.

Will Cook, Cameron University, was a factor in helping the Aggies start LSC play 2-0 for the second time in program history as the team has won its last three games by two points or less. Cook gave CU a solid 13 points

off 5-7 shooting in a low scoring 59-58 win at Eastern New Mexico; this was the Aggies third win at Portales in the last 20 years. A few days later at home against West Texas A&M, Cook dominated the last minutes of the first half with eight straight points. Cook finished the game with 23 points, three short of his career mark, with 54% shooting in the 69-68 win over the Buffs. So far this season Cook is averaging 15.8 points and 6.9 rebounds per game.

Irvin Hollinger, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had his best week as a member of the Javelinas. He averaged 14.5 points a game including a career-best 17 at A&M-Commerce. He closed out the week with 12 points versus Tarleton State. He hit 9-of-12 shots from the floor for 75%. Against the Lions he was 4-of-5 from behind the 3-point line and had two steals. He now has six treys on the season.

Rafael Love, Eastern New Mexico University, led Eastern New Mexico in scoring in both Lone Star Conference games last week as he averaged 14.0 points per game. He posted 15 points at home against Cameron with eight coming in the final minute of the game on 5-of-10 shooting, 2-for-5 from beyond the arc and a perfect 3-for-3 at the free throw line. Love followed with 13 points at Midwestern State as he was the lone Greyhound to reach double-figures in the contest. On the glass, he grabbed four rebounds against the Aggies and a season-high eight boards versus the Mustangs. Over the two games he also averaged 1.5 assists and steals per game.

Jon Cathey-Macklin, Tarleton State University, was a great presence for the Texans down low this week, pulling down 7.5 rebounds per game and helping guide Tarleton to a 2-0 record in conference play this week. The senior forward was inspirational in helping limit ASU to just 18 second half points on Wednesday and holding both opponents to just a 38.9 shooting percentage this week. Cathey-Macklin continues to rank among the best players in blocks as well after finishing the week with three blocked shots.

Ronald Scott, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, had two blocks on the season entering the game with Commerce. Both of those blocks came against Colorado State-Pueblo. Against the Lions, Scott swatted three shots. It was the most in a single-game by the Javelinas this season since the season opener at St. Mary's when Rashad Basey blocked five. He also had five defensive rebounds and an assist.

Phil Henry, Eastern New Mexico University, tied a season-high with four blocks at Midwestern State while also grabbing seven rebounds. For the week he averaged 6.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 blocks. Henry scored six points at home versus Cameron and seven against the Mustangs coming off the bench. He was part of a defense that helped hold CU and MSU to just 62.5 points a contest.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Jazzmine Robinson, Cameron University, led the Aggie offense last week with a 18.5 point average against West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico. Robinson shot 50% from the field (14-28) and averaged 5.5 rebounds; her 21 points against the Zias on Wednesday was an Aggie career high. In 12 games this season Robinson has hit double-figures in eight of those games. Robinson has averaged 12.5 points per game this season and has averaged 6.3 rebounds per game.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, led the team averaging 16.0 points and had 5.5 rebounds in two wins over Midwestern State and at Cameron. She went an impressive 11 of 15 from the field for a season-high .733 average, while going 10 of 13 from the line. Against Midwestern State, she was 7 of 9 from the field and 5 of 7 from the line for 19 points. The seven field goal makes tied her season-high set against Colorado State-Pueblo.

Breanna Harris, Texas A&M University - Commerce, tallied her seventh double-double (19 and 12) of the season in the Lions loss to A&M-Kingsville ... The senior posted 10 points versus Angelo State for her fourth straight game in double figures ... Harris is third in the LSC in scoring during conference season (16.3) and first in rebounding (13.3).

Ashley Viera, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in scoring in the three LSC games. The sophomore tallied double figures in all three games. After scoring 12 points against Texas Woman's before fouling out, Viera led the Javelinas with 18 points in their first LSC win of the season at Texas A&M-Commerce as she missed her season-best by a single point. She also dished out seven assists in the win over the Lions, which is a season-high. The native of Corpus Christi added 13 points against Tarleton State. She hit five threes on the week and was 10-of-13 from the foul line.

Kirsti Degelia, Midwestern State University, paced the Mustangs in a 1-1 week. The 5-8 senior from Denton, Texas/Krum chalked up two more double-digit scoring efforts in the win, including a season-high 18 points in Midwestern State's 75-44 win over Eastern New Mexico. Degelia shot 8-of-19 from the floor (42.1 percent), including 3-of-9 from the 3-point arc (33.3 percent) and led MSU with 9-of-13 from the foul line. She averaged 2.5 assists for the week, with 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals. She helped MSU collect its seventh game of 75-plus points this season.

Tori Tucker, Eastern New Mexico University, paced the Eastern New Mexico University women's basketball team with 12.5 points per game and hit .500 from three-point range in games against Cameron and Midwestern State. She led the Zias in their come-from-behind win over Cameron, outscoring the Aggies 15-5, over the final four minutes of play, by herself.

Rochelle Norris, Angelo State University, set a season high in points in back-to-back wins against Texas Woman's and Texas A&M-Commerce. The senior scored 12 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the win against TWU. The very next night against Texas A&M-Commerce the Dallas native scored a season high 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting. Norris is averaging 8.6 points per game this season for the Belles.

Cassidy Doherty, Eastern New Mexico University, helped limit the opposition to 68 points per game, last week and registered three rebounds and a steal in a win over Cameron.

Devin Griffin, West Texas A&M University, was second on the team in scoring at 13.5 points in two wins over Midwestern State and at Cameron. She led the team with 6.5 rebounds and had eight offensive rebounds to lead the team as well. Griffin had four assists, a team-high three blocks and a team-high five steals for the week. Griffin came up with a huge defensive rebound off a missed free throw late in the Cameron game as the Aggies were down five with eight seconds left and could have gotten closer. She helped lead WT to outscore its opposition by 12 points (72.0-60.0) and held the opponents under 40 percent shooting for the week. Griffin and the Lady Buffs held Midwestern State to just .371 from the field for the seventh team WT has held under 40 percent this season in 12 games.

Men and Women: March 5-6-7-8, 2014



Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, led the squad defensively in a 1-1 week that saw MSU hold Eastern New Mexico to its lowest scoring output this season in a 75-44 win. The 5-10 senior forward from Angleton, Texas averaged 14.0 points, while grabbing 8.0 rebounds for the week to go with 4.0 steals a game and one blocked shot. Carter shot 55.0 percent from the floor (11-of-20) and 6-of-8 from the foul line (75.0 percent). Carter accounted for nearly half of MSU's steals for the week, recording eight of the team's 19. She led both teams with nine rebounds at West Texas A&M as MSU outrebounded the Lady Buffs 37-30, and was a team leader with seven boards against Eastern New Mexico. A junior, Carter joined Midwestern's Top 10 in rebounding with her efforts, ranking eighth with 624 career boards. Carter helped MSU hold its opponents to shooting 39.6 percent from the floor for the week, including 22.6 percent from the 3-point arc.

Sheana Jones, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas defensive effort. The senior had nine steals in three games with 13 rebounds, eight assists. She averaged 8.7 points per contest. Jones had six steals on Saturday against Tarleton State tying teammates Rosalie Cutri and Lindsey Mahone for the most steals in a game. They are tied for the second most steals in a contest.

Angelo State

The Rams opened Lone Star Conference play with a 1-1 record after falling to Tarleton State last Wednesday before securing a 67-65 win over Texas A&M-Commerce on Sunday at the Junell Center. ASU senior Bryan Hammond hit a layup with four seconds remaining in the game against the Lions to lift the Rams to the win. Kenny Williams led the Rams with 21 points and eight rebounds, while Hammond finished with 15 points. Senior Ryan Marsh had a season-high four blocks with Daniel Skinner matching Williams with eight rebounds. The Rams return to action with a home game against West Texas A&M on Wednesday before traveling to Eastern New Mexico on Saturday. ASU (11-3, 1-1 LSC) is averaging 75.2 points per game and improved to 7-0 at home this season with the win over the Lions.

Cameron

Cameron went a perfect 2-0 in conference play after taking down Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M. Both games came down to the wire with the Aggies winning by one point in each game and tied their second best LSC start in program history. Will Cook led Cameron in both games averaging 18 points and Craig Foster followed Cook with 11 points. As a group the Aggies shot 46.5% from the field and they went 40% from the arc. Cameron will remain at home to host Texas A&M Commerce on Wednesday at 8 pm.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico began Lone Star Conference play 0-2 as they fell at home to Cameron 59-58 and followed with a 25-point on the road against Midwestern State. This is the second time in three years that Eastern has lost their first two LSC games. The Greyhounds' 41 points versus the Mustangs were their fewest in a game since Jan. 21, 2009 at home against Tarleton State. Senior guard Rafael Love led the team with 14.0 points per game while also posting 6.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.5 steals in 34.5 minutes a contest. Sophomore Lawrence Domingo came off the bench to average 6.5 rpg. Senior forward

Phil Henry also came off the bench to post 2.5 blocks a game along with 6.5 ppg and 3.5 rpg. This week ENMU travels to play Texas A&M-Kingsville at 11 a.m. MT and then return home to host Angelo State on Saturday with tip-off set for 4 p.m. MT.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State improved to 3-0 in Lone Star Conference play by claiming wins over West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico to improve to 11-4 on the season... The Mustangs' 76-70 win over West Texas A&M in Canyon gave MSU back-to-back road wins for the first time in the series which dates back to the 1946-47 season... Midwestern State limited Eastern New Mexico to a 19.3 percent shooting from the field which is the second lowest opponent field goal percentage in school history... The Mustangs held ENMU to a 19.3 percent from the field which is the lowest opponent field goal percentage since MSU limited Tarleton State to a 16.9 percent shooting night in a 50-34 win on Jan. 12, 2013... MSU held Eastern New Mexico to 41 points which is the lowest scoring output by the Greyhounds in its series history with the Mustangs... MSU shot a season-best 50.8 percent from the field in its 76-70 win Wednesday at West Texas A&M... The Mustangs have controlled the edge on the boards in their last five games and in eight of the last nine... Midwestern opened LSC play with three straight wins for the third consecutive year... MSU has outscored its opposition by a 6.7 points in the final eight minutes of its first three LSC wins over Texas A&M-Commerce, West Texas A&M and Eastern New Mexico... The Mustangs face their first nationally ranked opponent Wednesday night against Tarleton State... MSU is 29-46 (.387) all time against nationally ranked opposition, but is 5-3 under coach Nelson Haggerty... The Mustangs have eight of their last 12 games against opponents carrying a national ranking including three wins over Tarleton State... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams connected on 11-of-14 from the field including five 3-pointers to finish with a game-high 27 points Wednesday at West Texas A&M. It was his third game with at least 20 points this season... Williams, who is shooting 45.1 percent from the arc, has connected on a 3-pointer in all 15 games this season... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn is averaging 10.9 points and 8.0 rebounds while shooting 48.1 percent from the field since he was inserted into the starting lineup seven games ago... Senior guard Cam Adderley broke out of a shooting slump to hit 5-of-8 from the field with two 3-pointers to finish with 14 points and seven rebounds Saturday against Eastern New Mexico...

Tarleton State

The No. 9-ranked Texans extended its best start in school history to 13-0 overall while picking up two Lone Star Conference wins this week as well ... The Texans downed Angelo State 80-54 in Stephenville on Wednesday after holding the Rams to just 18 points in the second half ... Tarleton then traveled to Kingsville and played its first official road game of the season and downed the Javelinas 103-84 ... The 100-point effort marked the first time in school history that the Texans have eclipsed the 100-point mark four times in a season ... Tarleton shot nearly 61 percent from the field in Kingsville on Saturday, which marks the third time this season that the Texans have managed to shoot 60 percent or better in a win ... Tarleton has now shot 80 percent or better from the free throw line in four of its past five games ... Chuck Guy averaged 21.0 points and had 11 assists this week ... De'Andre Upchurch scored a career-high 27 points against TAMUK - he had 22 points in the first half

and finished the game going 8-for-8 from the charity stripe ... Jon Cathey-Macklin averaged 7.5 boards this week and tallied three blocks ... Damion Clemons had five blocks this week, including a career-high four-block effort against ASU ... The Texans have scored at least 75 points or more in all 13 games this season ... The Texans will look to remain undefeated as the team travels to Midwestern State on Wednesday before returning home to host Cameron on Saturday.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville men opened Lone Star Conference action 0-2 this week facing Texas A&M-Commerce and ninth-ranked Tarleton State...The Javelinas added some more size to their roster this week as Daymon Warren rejoined the team after not playing during the fall. Warren, who is a 6-8 post player, had nine points in making his first start of the season on Saturday...Sixty-eight fouls were called in Saturday's game with Tarleton. The total was the most in a Javelina game dating back to at least 2004-05. The teams combined for 87 free throws attempt also a high during that span...The Javelinas had just 11 turnovers in Saturday's game which ties for the team's third lowest total this season. Of the 11 turnovers, nine were the result of offensive fouls. Robert Powell and Daymon Warren each fouled out on offensive fouls...The three players - Rashad Basey, Robert Powell and Daymon Warren -- fouling out in a single game is a season-high for the Javelinas. They had two players foul out in a contest on two other occasions this season. The last time three players fouled out a game was the 2011-12 season when it happened twice. The last was when Derryl Nash, Marshall Bonds III and Reid Wallace each fouled out at Incarnate Word (1/18/12)...Rashad Basey entered Saturday's game as the Lone Star Conference's leading scorer with 18.6 points game. He finished with 14 points on Saturday as he was limited to 21 minutes of play which matched his season low. Basey was 4-of-8 from the field and 6-of-7 from the foul line. He fouled out of the game with just under five minutes to go in the game. He has scored double-digit points in all 14 games this season...Irvin Hollinger had his best week as a member of the Javelinas. The Belles moved to 9-5 and 3-1 in the Lone Star Conference with wins over TWU and Texas A&M-Commerce ... The Belles limited opponents to 36.8-percent shooting in their last three games ... On the season ASU is limiting teams to 54.4 points per game ... Rochelle Norris and Kayla Turner both scored career highs against Texas A&M-Commerce with 16 and 19 points, respectively ... The Belles are outscoring opponents 191-140 in the first half of games at the Junell Center ... ASU has won the last four against Texas A&M-Commerce ... The Belles will host West Texas A&M on Wednesday at home at 6 p.m. before traveling to ENMU on Saturday.

Cameron

Despite going 0-2 last week Cameron came close to taking down both Eastern New Mexico and West Texas A&M this last week. Cameron rallied back from 15 points against #7 West Texas A&M and got within three after drilling six second half three-pointers. Jazzmine Robinson led the Aggies this last week averaging 18.5 points with Ali Brown leading CU with 7.5 rebounds. Cameron will return to action hosting Texas A&M Commerce on Wednesday and Texas Woman's on Thursday before traveling to Tarleton State on Saturday.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University women's basketball team posted a win in their Lone Star Conference opener for the third time in the last four years. Tori Tucker scored 15 of her team-best 20 points over the final 3:57 of play, to help the Zias come from behind and post a 70-61 win over Cameron. Over the weekend, Eastern dropped a contest to Midwestern State. This week, ENMU will visit Texas A&M-Kingsville, prior to hosting Angelo State.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 10-5 overall, 2-2 in Lone Star Conference play ... The Mustangs snapped a two-game losing skid with Saturday's 75-44 win over Eastern New Mexico at Ligon Coliseum ... MSU recorded its largest win over the season, 31 points, and the Mustangs eighth double-digit victory margin of the year ... The Mustangs 31-point win was the largest margin of victory since downing Texas A&M-Commerce by 37, 81-44, on Nov. 30, 2011 and the pair are the largest against NCAA Division II competition in the Noel Johnson era ... Eastern New Mexico's 44 points are the fewest allowed by MSU this season as the Mustangs held the Zias to a season-low for scoring in 2013-14 ... The Mustangs have now held opponents to less than 60 points five times this season and to less than 70 eight times ... The win over ENMU came after the Mustangs had their second-worst margin of defeat this season after losing at West Texas A&M 71-54, a 17-point difference ... MSU broke out of a 2-for-33 drought from the 3-point arc against ENMU by hitting 7-of-18 (38.9 percent). The seven treys equaled the amount of triples in the previous three games and was the second-most in a game for MSU this season ... The Mustangs face Tarleton State on Wednesday before meeting Texas Woman's for the second time this year next Sunday ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum became Midwestern State's 10th woman to score 1,200 career points. Degelia currently has 1,229 points and needs 20 points to pass Shannon Boase (1995-98) with 1,248 in ninth all-time at MSU ... Degelia also ranks eighth at

MSU win 290 career assists ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas remains third in scoring and rebounding in the Lone Star Conference, averaging 14.9 points and 8.9 rebounds a game, while ranking fourth in the LSC in steals (1.9), seventh in field goal percentage (54.5 percent), seventh in blocked shots (0.5) and eighth in free throw percentage (73.8 percent) ... Carter became MSU's 10th woman to grab 600 career rebounds and moved into ninth at MSU all-time with 624 boards. She needs six rebounds to move into eighth ahead of Emily Dill (1990-94) with 629 ... Junior guard Lisa Hampton of Kennedale, Texas/Nolan Catholic connected on 4-of-7 3-point field goals against Eastern New Mexico, her third game of three-or-more treys in a contest ...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State pushed its current winning streak to nine in a row with a pair of wins against Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville. Kiara Wright and Kathy Thomas led the way for Tarleton with 18.5 and 18.0 points per game, respectively, while Brianna Bledsoe added 12.5 points per game.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-Commerce went 0-2 this past week with losses to Kingsville and Angelo State. The Lions are now 1-3 in conference and 2-11 overall. Seniors Danielle Dixon and Breanna Harris are pace to hit 1,000 points in their careers this season. Dixon is just 17 away while Harris is 58 away. They would be the ninth and tenth players in program history with 1,000 points. Harris is also on pace to be the greatest rebounded in A&M-C history. The senior is 71 away from that all-time mark.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas went 1-2 in three games last week as they opened Lone Star Conference action...Ashley Viera led the Javelinas in scoring in the three LSC games. The sophomore tallied double figures in all three games. After scoring 12 points against Texas Woman's before fouling out, Viera led the Javelinas with 18 points in their first LSC win of the season at Texas A&M-Commerce as she missed her season-best by a single point. She also dished out seven assists in the win over the Lions, which is a season-high. The native of Corpus Christi added 13 points against Tarleton State. She hit five threes on the week and was 10-of-13 from the foul line...One highlight of Saturday's conference home opener against Tarleton State was the 13 steals by the Javelinas. It was the most by the Javelinas since posting 13 in back-to-back games against Texas A&M International earlier this season. Kingsville, which had a season-high of 16 earlier in the season, is averaging 11.7 thefts a game, which is first in the Lone Star Conference. Kingsville had swiped just five steals A&M-Commerce earlier in the week which is the season low...Sheana Jones led the Javelinas defensive effort. The senior had nine steals in three games with 13 rebounds, eight assists. She averaged 8.7 points per contest...With Wednesday's win over A&M-Commerce, Kingsville recorded its sixth win of the season. In 2012-13, the Javelinas posted just five wins on the year... As a team, Kingsville hit 9-of-30 three-point baskets on Saturday against Tarleton. The nine treys and 30 attempts both match the season-high for the Hoggies, who first hit nine in most recent home game prior to Christmas against Texas A&M International. Six different players hit a trey in the contest. Ashley Viera, who has hit a trey in 10-of-13 games, led the way with three and Tonje Milde had two from behind the arc...Lindsey Mahone, who came off the bench for the first time this season in Saturday's game with Tarleton, finished

with just under 13 points a game on the week. She missed just missed her second double-double of the season on Tuesday at TWU when she had 18 points and nine rebounds. Her only double-double came against A&M International in Laredo with 22 points and 12.

Texas Woman's

TWU basketball is 5-8 on the season and 1-3 in the Lone Star Conference after splitting the two games last week. The Pioneers defeated Texas A&M-Kingsville, 72-69, before falling at Angelo State, 62-55. Junior Ria Pateraki led the team with 10.0 points per game and 5.5 rebounds per game. Sophomore Danielle Westerfield averaged 9.5 ppg and 5.5 rpg while shooting a team-best 57.1 percent. On the season senior Rebekah Cluley continues to lead the Pioneers with 10.4 points per game. Pateraki is averaging 4.8 rebounds while Cluley handed out 36 assists. Junior Barbara-Scott Kolb leads the team with 17 steals.

West Texas A&M

The No. 7-ranked Lady Buffs had two quality wins this week with a 71-54 win over Midwestern State in WT's conference opener and a 73-66 win at Cameron for a 2-0 start in league play...The win Saturday at Cameron was head coach Mark Kellogg's 200th career win. He came to WT with a 188-59 record and now is 200-60 in his ninth season of coaching...The Lady Buffs snapped a three-game skid to Midwestern State and avenged a heartbreaking overtime loss in the LSC championship last season...The 71-54 score was the most lopsided WT win since an 88-54 win on Feb. 10, 2010...WT the avoided an emotional let down with a hard-fought 73-66 win at a pesky Cameron team...In that game, the Lady Buffs fought off a furious rally from Cameron in the second half for the win...It was the second consecutive season WT fought off a rally at Cameron for a win...WT averaged 72 points and allowed an average of 60 for the week...The Lady Buffs shot 45.9 percent from the field and .333 from beyond the arc on 10 of 30...The Lady Buffs were 44 of 54 from the line for an .815 clip...WT had 17 steals for the week, while forcing 35 turnovers.
