LSC BASKETBALL

The Tarleton State men improved to 15-0 overall with a pair of Lone Star Conference wins, and remain one of just five NCAA Division II teams with an unbeaten record.

On the women's side, West Texas A&M tops the standings with a perfect 4-0 league mark.

LSC play controls this week's schedule with eight men's contests and 10 women's games. WT hosts TSU Wednesday in a match-up of two of the top women's teams.

The LSC men have a 80-44 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 75-59 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Tashawn Mabry, Tarleton State University, JR, Forward, Rocky Mount, N.C., Rocky Mount

Mabry put together one of his best weeks donning the Purple and White as he helped guided the No. 6-ranked Texans to a pair of LSC wins over Midwestern State and Cameron. The junior averaged 18.5 points per game this week after scoring 16 points in Tarleton's showdown win at MSU on Wednesday and then followed it up a career-high 21-point effort in a blowout win over Cameron that helped the Texans take sole possession of first place in the LSC. Mabry was an impressive 12-for-19 from the field, which included the Rocky Mount, N.C., native going 6-for-9 from beyond the arc. He was 7-for-10 from the charity stripe, tallied five offensive boards and dished out two assists on the week as well.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Cornelius Cammock, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, Forward, Austin, Texas, Reagan HS/Abilene Christian
Cammock recorded his second double-double of the season in an overtime victory at home against Angelo State as he totaled 16 points and matched his career-high of 11 rebounds as nine of them came on the defensive glass. Cammock was also credited with a career-best three steals, an assist and a block as he helped hold the Rams to 40.3 percent shooting, their fourth lowest this season. In the overtime period, Eastern New Mexico allowed ASU to shoot just 33.3 percent (3-for-9) from the field including 0-of-1 from beyond the arc. Earlier in the week, he matched his career-high of 20 points while grabbing five rebounds, dishing out two assists, blocking a shot and getting a steal in a four-point victory at Texas A&M-Kingsville. The win was the Greyhounds' first in three seasons against the Javelinas on the road.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Danielle Logan, West Texas A&M University, SO, Guard, Sudan, Texas, Sudan HS

Had a great two games coming off the bench for the Lady Buffs as she led the team in scoring at 12.5 points per game in two wins at Angelo State and at home against Texas A&M-Kingsville. Logan tallied a career-high 15 points including five triples at Angelo State as WT nailed a season-high 11 triples in the game in an 81-47 win. Logan went 7 of 15 from beyond the arc for the week. WT shot just south of 50 percent for the week at a .496 clip from the field and the team buried 19 triples for a .388 average, while outscoring the opposition 81.5 to 44.5 for a margin of 37 points.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Mary Kovtun, Texas Woman's University, SR, Center, Lviv, Ukraine, Lyceum#1

Kovtun helped the Pioneers to back-to-back conference wins with a team best 8.0 rebounds per game, 3.0 blocks per game and .667 shooting percentage. She also averaged 11.5 points and hit 70.0 percent of her free-throws. Kovtun cleared seven rebounds and blocked three shots at Cameron on Jan. 16 before a breakout game against Midwestern State with a career-high 19 points, nine rebounds and three blocks on Jan. 19. In a 66-65 win over MSU, she hit the go ahead free-throw in the final seconds and then blocked the field goal attempt by the Mustangs on the other end to secure the win.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, recorded his seventh double-double of the season by going for 23 points and a season-high 15 rebounds against ENMU after scoring 20 points and pulling down eight rebounds against West Texas A&M last week. Williams averaged 21.5 points and 10.5 rebounds during the week and also led the Rams with five assists and two assists. He is averaging 22.3 points and 9.8 rebounds per game in conference play this season has scored 20 or more points in nine games - including all four LSC games so far this season.

Phil Henry, Eastern New Mexico University, scored a career-high 27 points on 9-of-11 (72.2 percent) shooting and a 9-for-11 (72.2 percent) performance at the free throw line as Eastern New Mexico won at Texas A&M-Kingsville for the first time since the 2010-11 season. His field goal and free throw attempts and makes also set new career-bests for him in a game. He also grabbed a game-high eight rebounds in the contest as well. Henry followed up with nine points, five rebounds, three blocks and two steals in a career-high 37 minutes of action as the Greyhounds defeated Angelo State at home in overtime.

David Duncan, West Texas A&M University, led the Buffs this past week as WT moved to 8-7 overall with a 1-3 mark in league play. The junior forward from Washington, D.C. averaged 16.5 points per game to go along with 6.5 rebounds per contest. Duncan registered a career high 20 points to go along with nine rebounds on Saturday afternoon as the Buffs picked up their first league win over the visiting Javelinas of Texas A&M-Kingsville in Canyon. WT hosts #6 Tarleton State on Wednesday night at the First United Bank Center before traveling to Texas A&M-Commerce on Saturday afternoon.

Will Cook, Cameron University, helped Cameron turn the ship around after the New Year leading the Ags to five straight wins before falling at #6 Tarleton State on Saturday night. Over the week, Cook shot about 46% from the field and averaged 16.5 points per game; he also pulled down seven rebounds per contest for the Ags. Cook scored 17 points and had eight rebounds in their win on Jan. 15 against Texas A&M Commerce. On Saturday, Cook sank nine straight points for Cameron late in the first half at Tarleton and ended the night shooting 50% from the field and had 16 points. In 15 games this season Cook has hit double-digits in 13 contests, averaged 15.9 points per game, and hit 49.4% of his shots from the field. Within the league he is inside the top six in scoring, field goal percentage, minutes played, and in rebounding.

Damion Clemons, Tarleton State University, play was one of the main factors in the No. 6-ranked Texans picking up LSC wins over Midwestern State and Cameron this week. The Dallas native averaged 5.5 boards per game this week, but his seven rebounds effort against the Mustangs was key in Tarleton's two-point road win. With Tarleton up 71-70, Clemons blocked MSU's shot with 4:29 left in the game and it led to two points at the other end of the court. He averaged 10.5 points per game this week as well, going 10-for-10 from the field and dishing out one assist.

Craig Foster, Cameron University, against the top two scoring offences in the league Foster helped hold teams to around 71 points this week. The 66 points scored by Texas A&M Commerce was their second lowest scoring game this season and 76 points by Tarleton was their second lowest total of the year. In both games Foster picked off a pair of steals and dished out eight assists total. The 5-11 Senior also broke a personal high with a pair critical blocks against Texas A&M Commerce.

Ryan Marsh, Angelo State University, has stepped up his defensive presence with the start of conference play, providing three blocks in a win over West Texas A&M and another one against ENMU last week. Marsh has eight blocked shots in the past three games with the addition of four blocks last Sunday against Texas A&M-Commerce.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, was dominant for Tarleton last week as the TexAnns went 1-1, including a comeback victory over Midwestern State at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The senior was sidelined with foul trouble in the first half against the Mustangs but came back to lead Tarleton to victory over MSU with 15 points and 15 rebounds - recording her ninth double-double of the season and the eighth in nine career meetings against MSU. She bounced back Saturday to score 18 points and grab 16 rebounds against Cameron. For the week, the nation's leader in field goal percentage shot .522 from the floor.

Rebekah Cluley, Texas Woman's University, helped the Pioneers to back-to-back conference wins with a team-best 14.0 points per game and 4.5 assists per game. She recorded 14 points, seven rebounds and five assists at Cameron on Jan. 16 before added 14 points, four rebounds and four assists against Midwestern State on Jan. 19. Cluley also hit 83.3 percent of her free-throws in the two games. On the season she leads the team in scoring (10.9 ppg), free-throw percentage (82.3), 45 assists and 19 steals.

Jazzmine Robinson, Cameron University, guided the Aggies through a roller coaster week that peaked with winning at #14 Tarleton State for the first time in seven years. Robinson scored 10 or more points in each of the Aggies three games this week and has hit double-digit scoring in her last seven. In three games she went 50% from the field and averaged 5.7 rebounds per game. On Thursday, she recorded her first career double-double at Cameron against Texas Woman's with 10 boards and 13 points. In 17 minutes of action at Tarleton State she racked up 11 points and shot a perfect 5-5 at the line.

Jasmine Johnson, Eastern New Mexico University, shot a team-high .588 from the floor and tallied 12 points in consecutive games. At Texas A&M-Kingsville, she shot 6-for-11, and grabbed five rebounds to lift Eastern to victory. On Saturday, Johnson shot an efficient four-for-six from the floor and four-for-five from the line, to lead ENMU to a win over Angelo State. In 52 minutes of play, she committed just three turnovers, while contributing an assist and steal.

Symone Brown, Texas A&M University - Commerce, set a new career high with her 17 points in the Lions win over Cameron this past week ... The Los Angeles native was also perfect from the free throw line (7-7) including 4-4 in the win over the Aggies ... Brown grabbed five rebounds this past week, giving her three straight weeks of grabbing at least five and keeping fourth on the Lions per game (4.1) this season.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, continued her impressive season as she averaged 12.0 points and a team-high 6.5 rebounds in two wins this past week. White and the WT defense stymied Angelo State and Texas A&M-Kingsville as WT won both games 81-42 and 82-47, respectively. White was a force in the middle as the opposition shot just .283 from the field for the week (30-106) and averaged just 31.0 rebounds, while scoring just 44.5 points per game. White had a team-high four offensive rebounds and nine defensive stops during the week. WT forced 46 turnovers in the two games and had 29 steals.

Cara Barnard, Eastern New Mexico University, sparked the ENMU defense in a pair of wins last week, with four steals and a blocked shot. Her efforts on defense helped limit Texas A&M-Kingsville and Angelo State to a combined .311 from the floor and just .214 from three-point range. The opposition committed 16.5 turnovers per game and averaged 60.5 points. Barnard also scored six points against the Javelinas and scored to put ENMU ahead for good against Angelo State.

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, was dominant for the TexAnns on both ends of the floor. The senior center averaged 15.5 rebounds per game and posted back-to-back double-doubles. The senior had a 15-point, 15-rebound in 26 minutes of action to lead Tarleton past Midwestern State Wednesday night before finishing off the week with an 18-point, 16-rebound effort against Cameron in Wisdom Gym. Wright also had three steals and three blocks for the week.

Angelo State

The Rams went 1-1 last week with a 71-59 home win over West Texas A&M on Wednesday followed by a 72-68 overtime loss to Eastern New Mexico. ASU is 2-2 in LSC play after the games and will host Midwestern State on Wednesday at the Junell Center. The Rams continue to get strong production from senior Kenny Williams who averaged 21.5 points and 10.5 rebounds per game last week. He recorded his seventh double-double with 23 points and a season-high 15 rebounds against ENMU. Bryan Hammond added 14 points per game with Tommy Woolridge and Reggie Sutton each scoring 9.0 points per game during the two games. Daniel Skinner contributed 7.5 rebounds per game.

Cameron

The Cameron men saw their five game winning streak snapped at #6 Tarleton State 76-52 on Saturday night. Overall the Aggies went 1-1 getting a win earlier against Texas A&M Commerce in Lawton. This was their third league win and a row and the first time in program history they went 3-0 to open LSC play. Will Cook led the Ags once again averaging 16.5 points per game and seven rebounds per contest. With the loss to Tarleton the Aggies have fallen into a second place tie with Midwestern State. Cameron will return to action on Jan. 22 at Texas A&M Kingsville.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 2-0 last week with a road win against Texas A&M-Kingsville and a four-point overtime victory at home versus Angelo State. The win over the Javelinas was the Greyhounds first against them on the road since Feb. 23, 2011. Phil Henry scored a career-high 27 and Cornelius Cammock matched his career-best with 20 points. Rodney Blackmon had 12 points to reach double-figures scoring for the first time in Lone Star Conference action this season. Henry also had a game-high eight rebounds in the contest. The Hounds won the game at the free throw line as they were 28-for-38 (73.7%) that included a 20-of-26 (76.9%) performance in the second half. ENMU was led by Cammock in their victory against the Rams as he recorded his second double-double of the season with 16 points and 11 rebounds, matching his career-high. Of his 11 boards, nine of them were on the defensive glass which was a new career-best for him. He also tied his career-high of three steals while adding an assist and block shot. Devone Davis and Blackmon had 13 and 12 points, respectively, in the game with Davis dishing out a game-high five assists. Rafael Love added 10 points and tied his career-high of four assists. Blackmon, Davis, Henry and Love all were credited with two steals against ASU as well. While the Rams outrebounded the Greyhounds 43-30 including 16-8 on the offensive glass, Eastern held them to just seven second chance points. ENMU also had a 25-8 advantage over ASU in points off turnovers. This week the Greyhounds host Texas A&M-Commerce on Wednesday and then travel to nationally ranked Tarleton State for a Saturday evening game.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State dropped its first Lone Star Conference game of the season falling 83-81 to No. 6 Tarleton State Wednesday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum... The loss is MSU's second home setback this season and is the first time since 2006-07 and 2007-08 season that the Mustangs have lost 2 home games in consecutive seasons... MSU is 73-6 (.924)

at D.L. Ligon Coliseum since the start of the 2008-09 season... The Mustangs are tied for second place with Cameron -- a game back from Tarleton State for the LSC lead... MSU took over the LSC rebound margin lead by thumping Tarleton State on the glass 43-33 -- good for a 23-17 edge in second-chance points but defensively yielded a 50 percent shooting night for the second time this season -- the other came against No. 9-ranked Cal State, San Bernardino... The Mustangs lead the league in rebounding margin (+7.3), defensive rebound percentage (.718), offensive rebound percentage (.386), offensive rebounds per game (15.1) and total rebounds per game (41.8)... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams ranks third in the LSC in scoring (17.3 ppg), 14th in field goal percentage (.479), fourth in assists (4.5), second in steals (1.9), second in 3-point percentage (.461), fourth in 3-point makes per game (2.2) and second in assist/turnover ratio (2.3)... Williams has scored in double figures in each of his last 17 games dating back to last season... Williams has connected on 9-of-13 from 3-point range (.692) over his last three outings and has hit a trey in each game this season... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn is averaging 11.8 points and 8.3 rebounds a game while shooting 47.6 percent from the field (30-of-63) since being inserted into the starting lineup eight games ago... Blackburn is averaging 10.6 rebounds a game over his last five outings to raise his season rebounding average to 6.6 which ranks fifth in the Lone Star Conference... Blackburn notched his season double-double of the season finishing with a season-high 18 points to go along with 10 rebounds while going 5-for-11 with a pair of 3-pointers Wednesday against Tarleton State... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti drained a career-high three 3-pointers on his way to a season-high 13 points to go along with six rebounds Wednesday night against Tarleton State... Senior guard DeJuan Plummer knocked down a pair of treys to finish with 13 points off of the bench Wednesday night against Tarleton State... Plummer has scored 10-or-more points in 12 games as a reserve this season... Junior guard Kevin Wagner set season highs with six points and five assists in 13 minutes Wednesday against Tarleton State... Junior guard Derrell Gibbs delivered one of best all-around games as a collegian Wednesday against Tarleton State finishing with eight points, 10 rebounds and five assists...

Tarleton State

The sixth-ranked Texans remain one of just five teams with an unblemished record after going 2-0 this week and improving to 15-0 overall and 4-0 in the LSC ... Tarleton's two-point win at MSU on Wednesday gave the Texan basketball program its first .500 record since Nov. 28, 1961 when the Texans were 1-1 overall ... Saturday's win over Cameron gave the program its first winning record since becoming a senior college, with an all-time mark of 725-724 ... After falling behind by 12 points in the first half at MSU, Tarleton chipped away and trailed by just three points at the break ... It was Tarleton's second largest deficit to overcome this season, following a win over Angelo State in which they trailed by 13 points at one portion in the first half ... Tashawn Mabry averaged a team-high 18.5 points for the Texans, pouring in 16 points at MSU and then catching fire from the three-point line against CU and finishing with a career-high 21 points ... Damion Clemons had his best week as a Texan, recording a career-high 16 points against the Mustangs and finishing the week with a 10-for-10 effort from the field ... The Texans scored 76 points against the Aggies, giving Tarleton a streak of 15 consecutive games to start the season scoring at

least 75 points or more ... With its win over Cameron, Tarleton extended its home winning streak to 18 games ... Tarleton is just two home wins shy from tying its fourth-longest home winning streak in school history ... The Texans will take its 2-0 road record to Canyon this Wednesday as the Texans take on the Buffs at First United Bank Center ... Tip-off is set for 7 p.m.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

It was a tale of two games for Texas A&M-Kingsville senior Rashad Basey. The Javelina senior just missed his season-high of 27 points on Wednesday scoring 25 against Eastern New Mexico. It was his seventh, 20-point game of the season. On Saturday, West Texas held Basey scoreless in the game's first 20 minutes. Basey did not score until the 18:19 mark of the second half. He finished with just eight points making it the first time this season that he did not score double figures in a game...The Javelinas and Greyhounds played in front of 2,222 fans on Wednesday morning as part of Texas A&M-Kingsville's Live the Dream promotion. Over 2,000 of those in attendance were elementary school students from the second to fifth grade, who were given a presentation between games about the importance of a college education... The Javelinas fell victim to a pair of hot shooting teams this past week. Eastern New Mexico hit 53.1% from the floor, while West Texas A&M hit 63% from the floor including 5-of-7 from behind the 3-point line...Rashad Basey had nine baskets on Wednesday against Eastern New Mexico matching his season best for field goals. It was the third time this season and fourth time this season that a Javelina made nine baskets...Irvin Hollinger was a perfect 6-of-6 from the foul line versus the Greyhounds. He is one of four Javelinas to be perfect from the line this season with at least six visits to the charity stripe.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs used a career high performance by junior forward David Duncan on Saturday afternoon to claim the teams first Lone Star Conference win to move to 8-7 overall with a 1-3 mark in league play. WT continues their homestand on Wednesday night as they host the league leading #6 Texans of Tarleton State before traveling to Commerce, Texas on Saturday afternoon for a matchup with Texas A&M-Commerce.

Angelo State

The Belles are 9-6 and 3-3 in the Lone Star Conference ... ASU is tops in the league in scoring defense at 57.3 points per game and second in field goal percentage defense at 36.7-percent ... The Belles are forcing 17.1 turnovers per game and 8.4 steals per game ... Hillari Adam still leads the Belles at 12.4 points per game ... Amanda Weaver is averaging 8.9 points per game and hits 41-percent of her three pointers ... Rochelle Norris scored double figures for the fourth-straight game against ENMU and 10th time overall this season ... ASU is 7-2 overall when recording at least 10 steals in a game ... The five assists against ENMU and seven against WTAMU is only the fourth and fifth time to not have at least 10 in a game ... The Belles host Midwestern State at the Junell Center on Wednesday ... ASU is 4-3 overall at home and 2-1 against Lone Star Conference opponents.

Cameron

A tough week turned around for the Aggie women who stunned #14 Tarleton State for their first conference win of the season on Saturday night. The win for Cameron was their first at Tarleton in seven years and their second win in a row against the TexAnns. Earlier in the week Cameron went 0-2 at home against Texas A&M Commerce and Texas Woman's; last Saturday CU also fell to West Texas A&M. Cameron got solid efforts several different players but it was out-rebounding the TexAnns 35-33 and 26 free-throws that helped guide the Ags to their upset. Cameron will return to action on Jan. 22 at Texas A&M Kingsville.

Eastern New Mexico

The Eastern New Mexico University women's basketball team is heating up and has won three of its last four contests. The 3-1 start to conference play is the best such start for the Zias since the 2003-04 season. Last week, Eastern posted a road win over Texas A&M-Kingsville, before coming home to defeat Angelo State. For the week, Jasmine Johnson paced Eastern, with 12 points per game and a .588 shooting percentage. This week, ENMU will host Texas A&M-Commerce and Texas Woman's, before visiting Tarleton State.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 10-7 overall, 2-4 in Lone Star Conference play ... The Mustangs recorded their third two-game losing skid of the season with the loss at Texas Woman's on Sunday, and has now dropped four of their last five games ... MSU hasn't lost three straight since the 2012 season ... Midwestern has held it's last three opponents to 66 or fewer points in the last three games, despite losing twice. In fact MSU has held it's opponents to less than 70 points in five of their last seven contests ... The loss to TWU snapped a three-game winning streak for the Mustangs over the Pioneers. Still MSU has claimed six of the last eight meetings with the Pioneers ... MSU had it's best game from the free throw line of the season, percentage-wise, hitting 89.5 percent (17-of-19) at TWU. It was the eighth time this season MSU has made 17 or more free throws in a game and the third time the Mustangs have shot 80.0 percent or better in a contest from the foul line ... MSU was outrebounded by Texas Woman's 36-27. It was the sixth time MSU has been out boarded, with the Mustangs losing four of those outings ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum moved into ninth on Midwestern State's career scoring list. Degelia currently has 1,250 points, passing Shannon Boase (1995-98) with 1,248. She needs six points to pass Dee Wood (1987-91) with 1,255 in eighth and nine to surpass Annette George (1981-85) with 1,255 in seventh on the list ... Degelia also ranks eighth at MSU with 292 career assists ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas slipped to fifth in scoring in the Lone Star Conference, averaging 13.9 points and remained third in rebounding with 8.6 rebounds a game, while ranking fourth in the LSC in steals (2.0), seventh in field goal percentage (52.0 percent), ninth in blocked shots (0.5) and ninth in free throw percentage (73.1 percent) ... Carter is MSU's 10th woman to grab 600 career rebounds and moved into eighth at MSU all-time with 637, passing Emily Dill (1990-94) with 629. Seventh on the list is Rulinda Vogtsberger (1978-81) with 666 ...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State pushed its winning streak to 10 in a row with a comeback victory over Midwestern

State Wednesday night in D. L. Ligon Coliseum. The TexAnns fell in an early hole Wednesday night and had to battle back with two of their top three leading scorers on the bench in foul trouble. Tarleton trailed by seven at the break but outscored MSU 33-20 in the second half to claim the win. For the week, Tarleton went 1-1 to bring their season record to 13-2 and are 4-1 in LSC play.

Texas A&M-Commerce

The Lions went 1-1 last week with a road loss to Angelo State and a road win over Cameron ... The win over Cameron is first win for Lions in Lawton since the 2008-09 season ... A&M-C also shot a season high 81.8% from the free throw line in win over CU ... This week the Lions travel to Eastern, looking for their third straight win the series, and host West Texas, looking for their first win over WT since beating the Lady Buffs in 2007 LSC Championship Game.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

Lindsey Mahone posted her second double-double of the season and third by a Kingsville player in the Javelina loss to Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday. The Hoggies' leading scorer finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds. She posted the first double-double of her Javelina career against Texas A&M International with 22 points and 12 rebounds. Mahone has finished in double-digit points 10 times and in double figure rebounds twice...In Saturday's game at West Texas A&M, junior transfer Lauren Jay led the Javelinas with 14 points tying her career-high. Jay also snared eight rebounds just missing her first career double-double. The eight caroms are a career high...The 82 points allowed to West Texas are tied for the second most allowed by the Javelinas this season. WT hit 30-of-60 shots in the win for 50% which is the second highest by a Hoggie foe this season...In the two games last week the Javelinas scored 57 against Eastern New Mexico and 47 against West Texas. The totals are the two lowest scored by the Javelinas this season. The Javelinas hit a season-low 16 shots in Canyon. The 47 points scored in Saturday's loss to West Texas were the fewest since Kingsville had 42 against Midwestern State in Wichita Falls last Feb. 2. The 35-point margin was the largest since a 37-point loss to UTPA to open last season...After missing a month due to injury, Rosalie Cutri made her return on Saturday playing eight minutes at West Texas. She didn't record any stats. Prior to getting hurt Cutri was averaging 11.6 points with five rebounds and a league-best 3.0 steals a contest...Sheana Jones knocked down three, 3-point baskets at West Texas. It ties her for the second most treys in a game this season...When the Javelinas host Cameron on IBC Bank Pack the House Night on Wednesday they will be looking to avoid its first 4-game losing streak of the season. Kingsville, which stopped a prior streak at A&M-Commerce, has lost 6-of-7. The last three losses have come to the team's sitting 1-2-3 in the LSC. The losses were to West Texas, Eastern New Mexico and Tarleton State which are a combined 11-2 in the league.

Texas Woman's

The TWU basketball team improved to 7-8 on the season and 3-3 in the Lone Star Conference with back-to-back wins last week. The Pioneers defeated Cameron 66-53 on the road before knocking off Midwestern State 66-65. Senior Rebekah Cluley led the team on offense with 14.0 points per game, 4.5 assists per game and 83.3 free-throw percentage. Senior Mary Kovtun was the leader on defense with 8.0 rebounds per game and 3.0 blocks per game. She also led the team with 66.7 field goal percentage and

second in scoring with 11.5 points per game. Kovtun cleared seven rebounds and blocked three shots at Cameron on Jan. 16 before a breakout game against Midwestern State with a career-high 19 points, nine rebounds and three blocks on Jan. 19. In a 66-65 win over MSU, she hit the go ahead free-throw in the final seconds and then blocked the field goal attempt by the Mustangs on the other end to secure the win. On the season Cluley leads the team in scoring (10.9 ppg), free-throw percentage (82.3), 45 assists and 19 steals. Junior Ria Pateraki is second in scoring with 9.5 ppg and tied for first in rebounding (4.7 rpg) with Kovtun and sophomore Danielle Westerfield.

West Texas A&M

The No. 7-ranked Lady Buffs improved to 13-1 on the year and are 4-0 in conference play atop the league standings...WT shot .496 from the field for the week on 62 of 125 and drained 19 triples in 49 attempts for a .388 average...The Lady Buffs had a season-high 11 made triples at Angelo State on Wednesday in an 81-42 win...Sophomore Danielle Logan led the team in scoring for the week with a 12.5 average as she went 7 of 15 from beyond the arc for a .467 clip...Both Logan and senior Raven Gerald each tallied five triples at ASU...WT averaged 81.5 points in the wins and allowed just 44.5 and held the opposition to just 31.0 rebounds, while WT rebounded at a 46.0 clip...Lady Buffs more than doubled the opposition's made field goals (30) for a season-best .283 clip...The opponents were just 6 of 33 from beyond the arc for the week and a .182 average...The lone sore spot for WT this week was free throws as it was an uncharacteristic .556 from the line on 20 of 36...The Lady Buffs had a season-low 6 of 13 free throw shooting at Angelo State.
