LSC BASKETBALL

The Tarleton State men extended its best start in school history to 17-0 including a 6-0 Lone Star Conference record, which matches the longest winning streak in school history that was set in the 1990-91 and 2011-12 seasons. The Texans have scored 75 points or more in all 17 games this season.

On the women's side, West Texas A&M tops the standings with a perfect 7-0 league mark and 16-1 overall record. The Lady Buffs have scored 80 points or more in each of its last five games during a LSC-best nine game winning streak.

LSC action continues this week with four men's contests and six women's games.

The Feb. 1 men's contest between Midwestern State and Cameron will be aired on the Comcast SportsNet Houston regional sports network. Tipoff is set for 4:30 p.m. at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. The broadcast, which will be carried live on CSN Houston's primary channel as well as via live web streaming on CSNHouston.com, is part of an agreement with the conference. The LSC men have an 88-52 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 85-69 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Tommy Woolridge, Angelo State University, JR, Guard, Chicago, Ill., Edwin G. Foreman HS

Woolridge established a new career-high with 32 points in an ASU win against Cameron which came on the back of going 6-for-6 on 3-pointers. Woolridge also scored 12 points in the Rams' midweek win over Midwestern State and finished the week averaging 22 points and shooting 65 percent from the field. He went 9 of 13 on 3-pointers in the two games (69 percent) and also hit nine free throws. He is averaging nine points per game this season and leads the Rams with 27 made 3-pointers (40 percent).

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Davene Carter, Tarleton State University, JR, Forward, Duncanville, Texas, Duncanville HS

Carter registered the third double-double of his career this past week, pouring in 12 points and 12 rebounds in Tarleton's win over West Texas A&M in Canyon. For the week, Carter averaged 7.5 boards per game, had a blocked shot and one steal as well. The junior forward was a key factor in Tarleton's defense limiting the opposition to just 43 percent shooting and averaging just 63.5 points per game. His play down low helped Tarleton out-rebound its two opponents 71-53, to a clip of nine more boards per game.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, SR, Center, Pittsburg, Texas, Pittsburg HS

Wright was dominant last week for the TexAnns, including a new career-best performance against Eastern New Mexico on Saturday night. The senior center poured in a personal best 39 points on 13-13 shooting from the floor against the Zias to lift Tarleton to the win. For the week, Wright posted two double-doubles with 15 points and 10 rebounds at West Texas A&M and 39 points and 16 rebounds against Eastern New Mexico. She was an incredible 19-23 shooting from the floor for the week for a team-high .826 shooting percentage. Of her 26 rebounds, four were offensive while 22 came on the defensive end of the floor and she added six assists, two blocks and five steals.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, JR, Forward, Angleton, Texas, Angleton HS

Leading the Mustangs on both ends of the floor, Carter paced Midwestern State to a pair of Lone Star Conference victories with a 67-63 road win at Angelo State and an 81-59 thrashing of Texas A&M-Kingsville at Ligon Coliseum. The 5-10 junior forward from Angleton, Texas posted consecutive 20-point games, including her seventh double-double of the season during the week with her season-high 21 points against A&M-Kingsville and her 20-point, 12 rebound performance at Angelo State. Her defensive play helped MSU hold A&M-Kingsville to shooting only 29.0 percent from the floor (16-of-55), a season-best in field goal defense for the Mustangs. She led MSU in board work, averaging 9.0 rebounds for the week (6.5 per outing defensively) and averaged 3.5 steals a contest, with five at Angelo State. For the week, Carter shot 61.5 percent (16-of-26) from the floor including 1-of-2 (50 percent) from the 3-point arc. She also connected on 8-of-10 from the free throw line and tallied 2.5 assists.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Drimir Ferguson, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the way offensively for the Buffs this past week as the senior guard from the Bronx, New York averaged 20.0 points per contest with nine assists, six steals and 10 rebounds in a pair of WT losses to #4 Tarleton State and Texas A&M-Commerce. Ferguson tallied 31 points to go along with six rebounds and five assists on Saturday afternoon as the guard went 7-of-14 from the floor including 6-of-8 from deep and 11-of-13 from the free throw line in the 93-84 loss to the Lions.

Rafael Love, Eastern New Mexico University, led Eastern New Mexico in scoring (18.0) and rebounding (6.0) while also dishing out 1.0 assists per game over two contests. In a win at home against Texas A&M-Commerce, he scored 16 points on 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) shooting that included going 2-for-3 (66.7 percent) from beyond the arc while making 4-of-5 (80.0 percent) free throws. Love also grabbed eight rebounds and had two assists with no turnovers. He followed up with 20 points at Tarleton State. Love made 6-for-8 (75.0 percent) field goal attempts, 4-of-6 (66.7 percent) on three-pointers, and was a perfect 4-for-4 at the charity strip while retrieving four boards. He increased his scoring and rebounding averages on the season to 13.0 and 4.7, respectively.

Chuck Guy, Tarleton State University, helped lead the No. 4 ranked Texans to a pair of victories this week that extended Tarleton's winning streak to a record-tying 17 straight games. The Fort Worth native averaged 15.5 points per game, shot 62.5 percent from beyond the arc, was a perfect 10-for-10 at the charity stripe and dished out 15 assists as well. The junior guard scored a game-high 17 points at West Texas A&M on Wednesday and then followed that performance with 14 points and a career-high 11 assists to record the first double-double of his career against Eastern New Mexico on Saturday.

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, continues to be one of the most versatile players in the conference and helped the Rams to wins over Midwestern State and Cameron with strong defensive prowess to go along with scoring 14 points per game. Williams finished the two-game week with 16 rebounds, two blocked shots and three steals. He is averaging 8.5 rebounds per game has 16 blocked shots on the season. He also leads the Rams with 18.4 points per game and has seven double-doubles on the season.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, with two of her best performances of the season, led Midwestern State to a pair of Lone Star Conference victories with a 67-63 road win at Angelo State and an 81-59 thrashing of Texas A&M-Kingsville at Ligon Coliseum. The 5-10 junior forward from Angleton, Texas posted consecutive 20-point games, including her seventh double-double of the season during the week with her season-high 21 points against A&M-Kingsville and her 20-point, 12 rebound performance at Angelo State. For the week, Carter shot 61.5 percent (16-of-26) from the floor including 1-of-2 (50 percent) from the 3-point arc. She also connected on 8-of-10 from the free throw line. Carter averaged 9.0 rebounds for the week with 3.5 steals and 2.5 assists.

Tori Tucker, Eastern New Mexico University, averaged 15.3 points and 7.7 rebounds over a grueling three-game stretch, which spanned just four days. During those games, she connected on 41 percent from the floor, 30 percent from three-point range and hit all eight free throws. In the Zias win over A&M-Commerce, Tucker registered his third double double of the season, with 20 points, 11 rebounds and three assists. She added a 14-point, eight-rebound performance against Texas Woman's and 12 points at 17th-ranked Tarleton State.

Rebekah Cluley, Texas Woman's University, averaged 14.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.5 steals and helped the Pioneers to 1-1 record last week. She was perfect 14-for-14 from the free-throw line in the two games. Cluley recorded 11 points, 4 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 steals at Eastern New Mexico in TWU's third straight win. She then added a game-high 17 points, five rebounds, and four assists against #7 West Texas A&M to help the Pioneers go toe-to-toe with the Lady Buffs. On the season Cluley leads the team in scoring (11.2 ppg), assists (54), steals (24) and FT percentage (.855).

Abigail Leaupepe-Tele, Texas A&M University - Commerce, was the only Lion to record double digit points in both games this past week with 14 versus Eastern and 10 versus West Texas ... At Eastern the senior connected on a season best six free throw attempts and going 5-of-8 from the field ... The San Diego native came back versus WT and posted her second double-double of the season (10p and 12r) including tying a season high with five offensive rebounds ... The two steals versus the Lady Buffs also tied a season high.

Leah LeMaire, Angelo State University, recorded her first double-double of the season in a 71-61 win over Cameron in Lawton. The senior scored a season-high 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting and grabbed a season-high 11 rebounds. The Corpus Christi native has scored in double figures in four games this season.

Danielle Logan, West Texas A&M University, continued her impressive season going 6 of 12 in triples for the week and 8 of 16 from the field coming off the bench in three key wins for the Lady Buffs to remain unbeaten in LSC play. Logan averaged 7.3 points and 2.0 rebounds in the wins and had big 3's in each game to help WT to double-digit wins in all three contests. As a team, WT shot an even .500 from beyond the arc on 26 of 52 and were 93 of 189 from the field overall. Logan has 19 triples on the year and has multiple made 3's in five of her last six games.

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, averaged 12.5 points and 6.0 rebounds to help the Pioneers to 1-1 record. She recorded 9 points and 8 rebounds at Eastern New Mexico in TWU's third straight win. Pateraki then added 16 points and 4 rebounds against #7 West Texas A&M to help the Pioneers go toe-to-toe with the Lady Buffs. She led the team in field goal percentage (50.0) including 60.0 percent against WT. On the season Pateraki leads the team in shooting percentage (.463), second in scoring (9.8) and tied for first in rebounding (4.8).

She was 20 of 39 from the field for .519 average and 7 of 12 from the line. Griffin had seven offensive rebounds for the week and led the team with four blocks while recording five steals. She is closing in on 500 career rebounds as she stands at 494. Griffin helped lead WT to hold the opposition to .428 shooting and just 32.7 rebounds per game and 63.7 points in all three wins by double digits.

Angelo State

The Rams continued their strong start to the season by earning a home victory over Midwestern State last Wednesday before traveling to Lawton to take down the Aggies by 15 points. ASU improved to 14-4 on the season with the pair of victories and has matched its conference win total from last season after only six LSC contests. Kenny Williams continues to lead the Rams and is averaging 18.4 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. ASU is also getting contributions throughout its roster on a nightly basis, highlighted last Saturday with a 32-point effort from junior guard Tommy Woolridge and 20 points from senior Chris Talkington. Bryan Hammond, a senior from New Orleans, also continues his strong play and is averaging 9.9 points per game and leads the Rams with 78 assists. The Rams do not have a midweek game this week and return to action at 4 p.m. on Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville at the Junell Center.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-1 last week with a win at home over Texas A&M-Commerce and a loss at No. 4 Tarleton State on the road. Rafael Love led the Greyhounds in scoring at 18.0 points per game and tied for first in rebounding at 6.0 with Phil Henry. Devone Davis posted 15.5 ppg, Cornelius Cammock added 14.5 ppg and Rodney Blackmon contributed with 12.0 ppg. Blackmon tied his career-high for the second time this season with 5 steals against the Lions. Also in the game, Henry blocked his 50th shot of career, becoming just the second ENMU player to ever reached that mark (Jamaal Hunnicutt, 2001-05) and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds. The leading scorers in the game were Blackmon and Cammock with 19 points apiece. Facing the fourth-ranked team in the nation, Love scored a team-high 20 points, his third such game of the year, while Jordan Romero retrieved a team-best five rebounds coming off the bench. Davis reached double-figures with 16 points, half coming at the free throw line, while Cammock added 10. This week the Greyhounds play their final non-conference game of the season when they host South Dakota School of Mines & Technology on Thursday and follow up with a trip to LSC rival West Texas A&M Saturday afternoon.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State split a pair of Lone Star Conference games last week falling 83-68 at Angelo State before claiming an 83-62 win over Texas A&M-Kingsville... MSU's 15-point loss at Angelo State matched its largest margin of defeat to the Rams matching a 95-80 setback on Jan. 6, 1969... It was the first time since the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons that Midwestern lost consecutive games to Angelo State... Midwestern extended its winning streak to 12 games over Texas A&M-Kingsville Saturday night at D.L. Ligon

Coliseum... The Javelinas last beat MSU on Feb. 16, 2008... MSU continues to lead the LSC in rebounding margin (+7.4), offensive rebounds per game (15.1), defensive rebound percentage (.719) and offensive rebound percentage (.387)... The Mustangs have won the battle on the boards in each of their last eight games and in 14 of 18 contests this season... MSU matched a season team high with 11 steals Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville including four from Monzaigo Williams and three from Xavier Blackburn... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams booked at least 20 points for the fourth time this season finishing with 20 points on 6-of-8 shooting while dishing out five assists Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Williams ranks third in the LSC in scoring (18.9 ppg), 14th in field goal percentage (.483), third in assists (4.3 apg), second in steals (1.9 spg), third in 3-point percentage (.456) and second in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0)... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti matched a season high with three 3-pointers to finish with a season-best 17 points Wednesday at Angelo State... Senior guard DeJuan Plummer scored 13 points in his first career start as a Mustang Saturday night against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Junior guard Kevin Wagner matched a season-high with six points in 14 minutes Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Redshirt-freshman guard Patrick Smith banked in his first collegiate 3-pointer Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Junior forward Tavarion Nix recorded a team-high three blocked shots against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Junior forward Xavier Blackburn scored in double figures for the eighth time this season scoring 12 points to go along with four rebounds, three steals and two blocked shots Saturday against Texas A&M-Kingsville... Blackburn matched a season high connecting on two 3-pointers against TAMUK... Senior guard JaMichael Rivers scored six points in both games last week while making his return from a broken foot suffered in MSU's first exhibition game this season... Senior guard Cam Adderley banged in 10 points for his sixth double-figure scoring effort this season Saturday against TAMUK... Adderley has connected on a 3-pointer in each of his last four games... Junior forward DeVaughn Jones came off of the bench to score four points and swatted a campaign-best two shots in 10 minutes Saturday against TAMUK...

Tarleton State

The Texans extended its best start in school history to 17-0 with a pair of wins at WTAMU and at home against ENMU this week ... Tarleton's 17-game winning streak matches the longest streak in school history that was set in the 1990-91 and 2011-12 seasons ... Tarleton won its 19th straight home contest and another win would tie the school's third-longest home win streak ... The Texans have scored 75 points or more in all 17 games this season ... The Tarleton bench is outscoring the opposing bench players 716-361, or 42.1 ppg to 21.2 ppg ... The Texans did not trail in its game against Eastern New Mexico, giving the Texans three straight games without falling behind to the opponent ... The Texans have led from start to finish in 11 of its 17 games this season ... Tarleton had two players record double-doubles this past week with Davene Carter scoring 12 points and pulling down 12 boards at WTAMU, while Chuck Guy poured in 14 points and dished out 11 assists against ENMU ... Guy now ranks among Tarleton's top-20 all time with 106 free throws made this season ... He is 49 free throws away from setting the all-time school record of 154 FT's made ... The Texans are outscoring its opponents by a margin of 23.3 points over the past three games During that span, the Texans have also out-rebounded the

opposition, 103-80 ... Tarleton will have a week before taking the court again, this Saturday against A&M-Commerce ... The Texans and Lions will close-out the first half of LSC play at 7 p.m. in Wisdom Gym.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville men's basketball team went 1-1 last week downing Cameron Wednesday at home before falling at Midwestern State on Saturday in Wichita Falls...In the Javelinas 59-57 win over Cameron, Kingsville trailed the entire way until the final seconds. Irvin Hollinger scored on an off-balance drive to the basket with two seconds left for the win. It was the Javelinas first Lone Star Conference win of the season and snapped a 4-game losing streak... Ronald Scott led the way for Kingsville against the Aggies with 24 points which matched his career-best as a Javelina. Scott first scored 24 against UTPB on Hampton Inn Court during the Javelina Classic. Irvin Hollinger and Adonis Bailey joined Scott in double figures scoring 10 apiece as the Hoggies competed without leading scorer Rashad Basey, who missed his first game of the season...In the win over Cameron, the Javelinas warmed up in the second half to rally for the win. After hitting under 40% of its attempts in the first half, the Hoggies hit just over 52% in the second half. They were 4-of-8 from 3-point range and 8-of-11 from the charity stripe in the second half... In Saturday's loss to Midwestern State, Jordan Jahr led Kingsville with 22 points. It was the second time this season he reached 20-plus points. The University of Evansville transfer set a personal-best earlier this season when tallied 24 points at Schreiner. Jahr hit three treys to match his season high...After missing the game with Cameron on Wednesday, Rashad Basey returned to the lineup on Saturday to score 12 points at Midwestern State. Basey sits second in the Lone Star Conference in scoring with 17.7 points a game. On the year, the Javelina senior has tallied double digits in all but one game. He had eight points at West Texas A&M the week before...After scoring 24 points against Cameron, Ronald Scott had just two points versus Midwestern State. He did dish out seven assists which is the second most assists for Scott in a game this season. Scott is tied for fifth in the Lone Star Conference with in assists with 4.2 a game.

West Texas A&M

The Buffs continued to struggle in Lone Star Conference play this past week as they fell to #4 Tarleton State and Texas A&M-Commerce to fall to 8-9 overall with a 1-5 mark in the league. Angelo State

The Belles moved to 10-8 and 4-4 in the LSC after a 1-1 week ... ASU defeated Cameron in Lawton for the first time since 2011 ... The six turnovers committed against Cameron, the lowest of the season, is the first time the Belles have committed less than 10 since 2007 ... ASU is No. 1 in the LSC in scoring defense at 58.0 and No. 16 nationally ... Leah LeMaire

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 12-7 overall, 4-4 in Lone Star Conference play ... The Mustangs put together consecutive wins for the first time since the calendar turned to 2014 with the 67-63 win at Angelo State and the 81-59 victory at home over Texas A&M-Kingsville ... The 22-point win over the Javelinas was the second-largest of the for MSU ... The Mustangs shot 51.0 percent from the floor against TAMUK (26-of-51), recording their fifth game shooting 50 percent or better this season. It was the second-best shooting performance of the year ... MSU held TAMUK to 29.1 percent shooting (16-of-55), a season-best for field goal defense... Midwestern has limited opponents' scoring over the last five games, holding all to 66 points or less with an average of 57.8 points allowed over the span ... The Mustangs have held nine of their last 11 opponents under 70 points, with those two each scoring 71 ... MSU has done well at the free throw line the last five games, going 81-of-102 for a 79.4 percentage, with three games over 80 percent ... MSU was out rebounded by Angelo State 36-33 and tied the Javelinas on the boards at 36 each marking the fifth straight game where MSU was either behind or tied on the boards. MSU is 3-4 when being out rebounded by opponents and 2-2 when both teams have an equal number of rebounds. The Mustangs are 7-1 when having a rebounding advantage ... The Rambelles was just the second time MSU has beaten ASU at the Junell Center and did it in consecutive meetings ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/ Krum moved into seventh on MSU's career scoring list with her 13 points against ASU and nine against TAMUK to post 1,272 points, passing Dee Wood (1987-91) with 1,255 and Annette George (1981-85) with 1,255. She is 123 points away from Lounette Adkins Decker (1978-79, 80-81, 93-95) with 1,395 points in sixth ... Degelia also ranks eighth at MSU win 296 career assists and needs eight more to pass J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) with 303 in seventh ... Degelia is 15th on the MSU career steal's list with 143 and needs five to pass the 147 of J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) and Stacey Staten (2004-08) ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas is once again third in the Lone Star Conference in scoring and rebounding and fourth in steals, averaging 14.6 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.2 steals a game. She also ranks fifth in field goal percentage (53.2 percent), seventh in free throw percentage (74.0 percent) and 11th in blocked shots (0.4) ... Carter is MSU's 10th woman to grab 600 career rebounds and is eighth at MSU all-time with 655 she needs 12 boards to pass Rulinda Vogtsberger

(1978-81) with 666 in seventh ... Carter is also 12th in career steals at MSU, with 162 and needs five more to pass Jennifer Butler (1994-99) with 166 in 11th ... MSU is idle until Saturday when they face Cameron in a game moved to 6:30 to follow the men's contest that was moved to 4:30 ...

Tarleton State

Tarleton State got back in the win column Saturday night with a win over Eastern New Mexico to snap a two-game skid. Kiara Wright had a career night against the Zias, scoring 39 points on a perfect 13-13 shooting from the field.

Texas A&M-Commerce

The Lions dropped both games this past week. A&M-C dropped a road decision in Portales, 90-76, and a home decision to West Texas A&M, 99-66. The Lions continue to struggle on the defensive by giving up 90+ plus points for the third and fourth times this season. A&M-C hosts Texas Woman's on Wednesday from heading to Stephenville on Saturday to close out the first half of LSC play.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville women posted a 1-1 mark this past week downing Cameron at home on Wednesday night before losing to Midwestern State on Saturday...The Javelinas did a tremendous job on the offensive glass this past week. Of the Hoggies' 80 total rebounds 37 came on the offensive glass. They pulled down 21 rebounds off the offensive glass against the Aggies in the win, while snaring 16 offensive rebounds on Saturday at Midwestern State. The offensive rebounds led to 26 second-chance points for the week...The Javelinas were quite efficient in turning turnovers by their opponents into points on the other end. Against Cameron, Kingsville forced 29 turnovers and turned the miscues into 30 points on the offensive end. At Midwestern State, the Hoggies forced 14 turnovers into 18 points... In the win over Cameron, the Javelinas rallied from a 48-42 deficit with 7:16 remaining to win 60-48. Kingsville closed out the contest with an 18-0 run for its second LSC victory. They have posted more steals than their opponents in 11 contests and lead the conference in steals per game with 11.65. West Texas A&M is second at 10.88...Through seven LSC games, Sheana Jones has picked up her scoring and is averaging 2.5 more points a game. Jones, who tallied 13 in both games last week, has gone from 8.1 points a contest to 10.6. Her defense has helped her

offensive game. In 17 games overall, she has forced 31 steals. Twenty of those steals have come in seven league games.

Junior Barbara-Scott Kolb also averaged 13.0 points and senior Mary Kovtun continues to dominate on defense with five blocks including four against the Lady Buffs. On the season Cluley leads the team in scoring (11.2 ppg), assists (54), steals (24) and FT percentage (.855) while Pateraki leads the team in shooting percentage (.463), second in scoring (9.8) and tied for first in rebounding (4.8) with Kovtun and sophomore Danielle Westerfield.
