LSC BASKETBALL

Lone Star Conference teams continue non-conference play with three men's squads still unbeaten. Angelo State, Cameron, and Tarleton State head into the Thanksgiving break with perfect records.

The LSC men have a 21-9 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 7-1 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 6-5 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 13-16 overall. The women's squads are currently 2-7 combined against the Heartland, and 5-2 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

The LSC champion will be the regular season winner determined by league games, while the postseason tournament winner is designated as LSC Tournament Champion and earns the conference's automatic qualification. The top eight teams in the final conference standings qualify for the postseason tournament set for March 4-7 in Allen, Texas.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

LaDon Carnegie, Texas A&M University - Commerce, SR, Guard, Grand Rapids, Mich., Union HS

Carnegie saw his first action of the season at Ouachita Baptist and tallied 20 points to lead all scorers in the game. He was 7-of-16 from the field and 4-of-9 from behind the arc in the loss for the Lions. At Dallas Baptist he scored his second career 30-point game notching a career-high 37 points. He was 8-of-18 from the floor and 18-of-23 from the free throw line setting school records for both makes and attempts. He also finished the game with nine rebounds just one shy of a double-double.

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Desmond Henry, Cameron University, SR, Guard, Dallas, Texas, Irving HS

Henry paced the Aggies to a 78-54 win on the road at Northwestern Oklahoma with a double-double performance. He recorded a career mark 14 rebounds, 13 on the defensive side, and five fewer than the entire NWOSU squad on Saturday night. The 14 boards was a four year high for the Aggies last set in the 2009-10 season. Henry went 50 percent from the field scoring 11 points, while helping hold NWOSU to 37.5 percent shooting on the floor.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Tori Tucker, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, Forward, Portales, N.M., Floyd HS/Howard College

Tucker led Eastern New Mexico to a 77-61 win over Western New Mexico last weekend at The Pit. She registered her second 20-point performance of the season with 25 points and added seven rebounds. She connected on a career-high 12 free throws including all eight attempts over the final 42 seconds of play to seal the win. Tucker shot 60 percent from the field and 92.3 from the charity stripe.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, SR, Forward, Angleton, Texas, Angleton HS

Carter garnered Most Valuable Player honors while leading Midwestern State to wins over Central Oklahoma and St. Mary's (Texas) in the TWU Pioneer Premiere. All this after the 5-9 senior forward from Angleton matched a career-high with 20 rebounds to along with 12 points and four steals in a 60-47 win over Texas Wesleyan earlier in the week. Carter added her third and fourth double-doubles of the season over the weekend in Denton going for 16 points and 18 rebounds against Central Oklahoma then scored 10 points and pulled down 11 rebounds versus St. Mary's. The preseason All American finished the week pulling averages of 12.7 points, 16.3 rebounds and 3.0 steals per game.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Antjuan Ball, West Texas A&M University, had an outstanding week offensively for the Buffs, going an efficient 16-for-24 from the field, leading the team in FG% at .667, while also shooting .600 from beyond the arc (3-for-5). Ball averaged 20.5 points as the team went 1-1 in two games, including a big 82-66 win over undefeated CSU-Pueblo at home on Saturday. In that contest, Ball led all scorers with 20 points and grabbed six rebounds while adding an assist, a block, and four slam-dunks in 35 minutes on the hardwood. Ball led the team to its fourth-straight 80+ point scoring output to begin the season, a feat not accomplished by WT since the 2001-'02 season.

Don Thomas, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, finished with a game-high 20 points against St. Mary's University in Texas A&M-Kingsville's 76-71 win over the Rattlers Wednesday... Thomas finished 8-of-9 from the charity stripe and added six assists, four rebounds and one steal in 32 minutes of action.

Demario Mayfield, Angelo State University, continued his strong start to the season by averaging 18 points per game for the Rams last week in wins over McMurry and Arkansas Tech. Mayfield led the Rams with 22 points in an overtime win over the Wonder Boys on Saturday after scoring 14 points in a 56-point win over McMurry on Tuesday. He scored eight of his 22 points against Arkansas Tech in overtime and also had four assists, five steals and six rebounds in the win. Mayfield is averaging 15 points per game through the first four games this season and also added six assists and six steals for the Rams last week. He is averaging 6.0 rebounds per game this season and has 11 assists for the Rams.

Michael Harge, Tarleton State University, put together one of his best all-around performances in his fourth

career start Saturday night for the No. 12 Texans. The junior point guard scored a team-leading and career-high 14 points and tied his career high with six assists. Hardge played a team-best 30 minutes and added three rebounds and two steals.

Chris Wymys, Eastern New Mexico University, scored in double-digits in all three games this week including a season-high 15 points at Colorado State-Pueblo. He made 11 field goals with eight coming from beyond the arc. For the week Wymys averaged 12.3 ppg, 3.7 rpg, 1.7 spg in 23.3 mpg.

Chris Jones, Angelo State University, led the Rams with eight steals and also added 4.5 rebounds per game in a pair of wins last week. Jones also averaged 12.5 points per game with 12 points against McMurry and 13 points against Arkansas Tech. Jones had four steals in each win and leads ASU with 15 steals this season along with adding 19 assists and 11.0 points per game.

Miles Gatewood, West Texas A&M University, led the Buffs defensively in two games last week, including an 82-66 victory over undefeated Colorado State-Pueblo at home on Saturday. In that game against CSUP, Gatewood helped hold the ThunderWolves to .333 percent from the field while he grabbed seven boards on the defensive end along with three steals. Between two games he totaled six steals, nine rebounds, and 10 assists to go with 20.5 points per game, shooting 16-for-27 from the field (.593).

TaShawn Mabry, Tarleton State University, led No. 12 Tarleton State with five defensive rebounds in his first career start Saturday night. Mabry's defense helped keep Dallas Christian to just 58 points in the Texans' 88-58 blowout to improve to 3-0 Saturday night.

John Gilliam, Eastern New Mexico University, grabbed 14 rebounds, 11 of them defensive, and had six steals in three games for Eastern New Mexico. He had seven boards and three steals at Colorado State-Pueblo while scoring 11 points. At Fort Lewis, he recorded six rebounds, two steals, two assists and a block. Against Western New Mexico in The Pit, Gilliams scored a career-high 25 points on 7-of-10 shooting including going 5-of-6 on three-pointers and made all six of his free throw attempts. For the week, he averaged a team-high 14.7 ppg, 4.7 rpg, 2.0 apg and 2.0 spg.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

La'Tisha Hearne, Texas A&M University - Commerce, came off the bench to lead all Lions scorers with 21 points in A&M-Commerce's 66-56 win against Ouachita Baptist Tigers on Saturday. Not only did she score in bunches, she did it with a highly efficient 64.3 percent from the field. With five offensive boards and another five rebounds on the defensive end, Hearne earned her second double-double of the year, and currently averages an 18-10 on the season.

Michaela Neuhaus, West Texas A&M University, had a career-high 25 points at Adams State in the Lady Buffs' 75-46 win Saturday. It topped her previous career-high set at Denver. She added 11 points earlier in the week at New Mexico Highlands in the Lady Buffs' first win of the season. Neuhaus went 7 of 11 with four triples in seven attempts, along with 7 of 8 from the line at Adams State. She had three assists and three steals. She tallied 11 points on 4 of 9 shooting with one triple and two free throws at New Mexico Highlands.

Raven McGrath, Tarleton State University, poured in a team-high 15 points off the bench for Tarleton State in Saturday's 78-70 win over Texas Wesleyan. The junior guard drilled a career-high five (5) three-pointers in the effort and also grabbed a pair of offensive rebounds and dished out two assists.

Dianna Jones, Midwestern State University, led Midwestern State to three wins averaging 13.3 points, four assists and 3.7 rebounds a game including victories over Central Oklahoma and St. Mary's (Texas) in the TWU Pioneer Premiere. The 5-9 senior point guard poured in a season-high 16 points and dished out four assists including two 3-pointers in a decisive second-half run in a 60-47 win over Texas Wesleyan. Jones notched her third and fourth consecutive double digit outings going for 13 points, six rebounds and five assists against Central Oklahoma and 11 points, three assists and two rebounds versus St. Mary's.

Toree Mason, Texas Woman's University, shot a team-best 53.3 percent from the floor including 71.4 percent from the three-point range to help the Pioneers to 1-1 record at the 2014 Marriott Champions Circle Pioneer Premiere. She was selected to the all-tournament team after averaging 11.5 points and 5.0 rebounds. Mason led the game with 17 points against Central Oklahoma and added a team-best eight rebounds in a win against #25 St. Mary's. On the season she leads the team with 53.5 percent shooting and 71.4 percent from the three-point range. Mason is second in scoring (11.5) and rebounding (5.0).

Emily Spector, Texas Woman's University, led the team with 13 rebounds and helped the Pioneers to 1-1 record at the 2014 Marriott Champions Circle Pioneer Premiere. She cleared a team-best eight rebounds in a win against #25 St. Mary's and then posted 13 points and five rebounds while shooting 40.0 percent from the floor against Central Oklahoma. On the season she is the team leader with 5.5 rebounds per game and third in scoring with 10.5 points per game.

Chontiquah White, West Texas A&M University, averaged a double-double in the Lady Buffs' two wins this week averaging 16.5 points and a team-high 12.0 rebounds per game. She tallied a season-high 13 rebounds in the 75-46 win at Adams State Saturday. White tallied 11 defensive rebounds in the game as the Lady Buffs held ASU to just 33.3 percent shooting and 16 points in the first half. With her 13 rebounds Saturday, she is just five career rebounds out of sixth all-time in school history. She has 681 for her career. White had one steal as the Lady Buffs forced a season-high 26 turnovers against ASU.

Sarah Stinnett, Eastern New Mexico University, scored nine points, grabbed eight defensive rebounds and had a steal in the Zias win over Western New Mexico. Her defensive performance helped limit the Mustangs to just a pair of three-point field goals in the game and held them to 0-for-9 outside the arc in the first half.

Karli Moore, Tarleton State University, filled up her stat line in Saturday's win over Texas Wesleyan. The senior forward in just her third career start tallied 12 points and grabbed nine rebounds, including five defensive boards, while also dishing out three assists and making three steals.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-2 last week. They opened with losses at Colorado State-Pueblo and Fort Lewis but closed the week with a win over in-state foe Western New Mexico in The Pit on the campus of the University of New Mexico. They allowed 109 and 104 points to CSUP and FLC, respectively. It was the first time since Dec. 1979 they had given up 100+ points in consecutive games. The Greyhounds also gave up tripe-digits in back-to-back games they lost for the first time since Feb. 1979. John Gilliam led ENMU with 14.7 ppg and 2.0 spg while scoring a season-high 25 points versus WNMU. Chris Wymys added 12.3 ppg while Lawrence Domingo and Michael Randle averaged 12.0 and 11.7 ppg, respectively. Domingo and Randle also led the team with 5.0 rpg. Demetrius Balark put up 11.5 ppg over the first two games but did not play versus the Mustangs. This week the Greyhounds play in the Pak-A-Sak Thanksgiving Classic hosted by West Texas A&M. ENMU will take on Emporia State on Friday and follow with Harding Saturday afternoon. Both games will tip-off at 1:30 p.m. MT.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State rebounded to take wins over Oklahoma Science & Arts (86-65) and Colorado State-Pueblo (68-57) to improve to 3-1 on the season... Each of MSU's three wins this season have been by double figures... Redshirt-freshman Devante Pullum's 19-point effort against Colorado State-Pueblo were the most points scored by a freshman since Marquette Wilkins scored 21 points at Angelo State on March 2, 2001... Junior forward Khapri Alston scored a season-high 19 points and pulled down five rebounds in MSU's 86-65 win over USAO Tuesday night at Ligon Coliseum... Junior guard Bretson McNeal has scored in double figures in each of his first four games for the Mustangs... McNeal was a perfect 5-for-5 from the field including three 3-pointers in the second half of MSU's 68-57 win over Colorado State-Pueblo as he scored 14 of his 16 points after intermission... McNeal ranks third in the LSC in scoring at 18.5 points per game and is fourth in the league hitting 2.8 3-pointers a contest... Junior guard Hershell Grant averaged 10 points and five rebounds while making his first two starts of the season last week in wins over USAO and Colorado State-Pueblo... Senior forward Xavier Blackburn snared 10-or-more rebounds for the second time this season finishing with 11 boards Sunday against Colorado State-Pueblo... Senior Derrell Gibbs has not committed a turnover in 81 minutes of court time over MSU's first four games of the season... The West Texas A&M men's basketball team started off the week with a road loss to Wayland Baptist, 99-91, but rebounded with big 82-66 triumph over CSU-Pueblo in its home opener Saturday at the FUBC to improve to 1-3. The win gave Tom Brown his first career victory as a head coach. All three of the Buffs' seniors (Antjuan Ball, Tez Dumars, and Miles Gatewood) averaged over 20.5 points, 4.0 rebounds, and .538 shooting from the field in the two contests last week. WT also eclipsed 80+ points for its fourth straight game to open the season for the first time since the 2001-02 season. Midwestern State rolled to three wins taking a 60-47 victory over Texas Wesleyan on Tuesday before claiming decisions over Central Oklahoma (67-60) and St. Mary's (Texas) (62-48) at the TWU Pioneer Premiere to improve to 4-1 on the season... The Mustangs are off to their best start since beginning the 2012-13 season at 4-1... Senior forward Andrea Carter garnered TWU Pioneer Premiere tournament MVP honors after averaging 13 points and 14.5 rebounds in wins over Central Oklahoma and St. Mary's (Texas)... Carter has recorded double-doubles in four of five games this season and has 33 for her career...
