LSC BASKETBALL

The West Texas A&M women improved to 19-1 on the year and a perfect 10-0 in Lone Star Conference play to stretch its league best winning streak to 12 games, which ranks fourth nationally. The 19-1 mark is the best all-time since the 1996-97 season when the Lady Buffs started 29-1.

On the men's side, Tarleton State remains atop the standings at 8-1 in conference play and 19-1 overall. The loss to Midwestern State snapped the Texans longest winning streak in school history at 18 games and ended the third longest home winning streak of 20 straight wins inside Wisdom Gym as well.

LSC play continues with eight men's games and nine women's contests as teams compete for postseason seeding. The Feb. 15 men's game between Texas A&M-Kingsville and TSU in Stephenville, Texas, will be carried live on CSN Houston. The broadcast, which will be carried live on CSN Houston's primary channel as well as via live web streaming on CSNHouston.com, is part of an agreement with the conference. The LSC men have a 102-64 overall record so far this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the men's teams are currently 19-8 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 1-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

The LSC women are 101-84 overall. The women's squads are currently 12-10 combined against the Heartland, and 7-6 versus RMAC teams, which are the other conferences in the NCAA South Central Region.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

MEN'S OFFENSIVE

Monzaigo Williams, Midwestern State University, SR, Guard, Palmdale, Calif., Antelope Valley HS (Western Texas)
Williams rose up to hit an 18-footer with 3.8 seconds remaining in overtime to provide the difference in Midwestern State's 77-75 win over No. 2 Tarleton State Wednesday night in Stephenville. The win snapped TSU's 18-game overall winning streak and sent the Texans to defeat at Wisdom Gym for the first time in 20 games. The senior from Palmdale, Calif. connected on 7-of-16 shots including three 3-pointers to lead the Mustangs. Williams then poured in a team-high 18 points and dished out nine assists with four steals in a 75-63 win over Texas A&M-Commerce Saturday night at D.L. Ligon Coliseum. For the week, Williams averaged 18.0 points, 5.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 48 percent from the field (12-of-25).

MEN'S DEFENSIVE

Xavier Blackburn, Midwestern State University, JR, Forward, New Iberia, La., St. Thomas More HS (ND State Science)
Blackburn notched his fourth double-double of the season with 17 points and 14 rebounds while helping Midwestern State hand No. 2 Tarleton State its first loss of the season 77-75 Wednesday night at Wisdom Gym. The junior from New Iberia, La. battled his way to 17 points while pulling down 11 defensive rebounds go to along with a steal as the Mustangs limited the Texans to a .379 field goal percentage -- TSU's second lowest of the season.

WOMEN'S OFFENSIVE

Ria Pateraki, Texas Woman's University, JR, Forward, Athens, Greece, Second Lyceum Ano Liosia
Pateraki helped the Pioneers to 3-0 record while averaging a double-double (17.7 ppg and 10.7 rpg). She recorded 16 points and 10 rebounds against #19 Tarleton State, 19 points and 11 rebounds against Cameron and 18 points and 11 rebounds against South Dakota School of Mines. Pateraki shot 56.8 percent from the floor, perfect 10-for-10 from the free-throw line and handed out a team-best 10 assists. She hit two free throws in the final seconds to seal an upset win against Tarleton State.

WOMEN'S DEFENSIVE

Christina Caddy, Cameron University, SR, Guard, Lawton, Okla., Lawton HS
Caddy averaged a double-double for the Aggies last week in three games. Caddy's best night was against #21 Tarleton State at home and their 76-72 win where she pulled down 20 rebounds which the second highest total in the Lone Star Conference this season. Her 20 boards was the highest total for an Aggie player in three years. Against Tarleton she added 15 points to lead CU. Caddy went 12-15 (80%) from the line and had three blocks and steals this week. In three games she helped keep teams to .361 shooting on the floor.

MEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

DeAndre Upchurch, Tarleton State University, had back-to-back 20-point games for the Texans this week after scoring 21 points on Wednesday and then following that game up with a 24-point effort. The senior guard averaged 22.5 points per game while shooting 44.4 percent from the field on the week. He drained a season-high five three-pointers on Saturday and tallied a 43.8 percent effort from downtown over the previous two games. Upchurch was even more impressive at the free throw line this week after converting a perfect 14-for-14 attempts from the charity stripe.

Craig Foster, Cameron University, came up with a strong offensive week for Cameron by averaging 22.5 points in two games. Foster sank a career high 32 points (10-17) against Texas A&M Commerce and went a 8-11 from downtown, which was a career mark as well. The 32 points against the Lions was the second highest scoring outburst in the Lone Star Conference this season. Additionally, he chipped in six assists against the A&M-C. Against #2 Tarleton State he was an assist short of a double-double with 13 points and nine assists. Foster also came up with six rebounds for the Aggies against TSU.

WEEKLY AWARDS

Date Men's Offensive

N-13 Kenny Williams, ASU

Rodney Blackmon, Eastern New Mexico University, scored 24 points at Angelo State as six of his seven made shots were three-pointers. He made 4-of-6 free throw attempts and dished out two assists. Blackmon also set a new career-high with six steals in the game. In an overtime win over Texas A&M-Kingsville, he scored 10 points on 4-of-10 shooting, tied his career-high of seven rebounds, dished out three assists and was credited with a block and a steal. For the week he averaged 17.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 2.5 assists in 37.5 minutes of action per game while making 42.3 percent (11-of-26) of his shots and 35.3 percent (6-for-17) from beyond the arc.

Kenny Williams, Angelo State University, recorded his eighth double-double of the season by going for 22 points and 10 rebounds to help lead the Rams to a 77-75 win over Eastern New Mexico on Saturday after scoring 10 in a 69-47 win at West Texas A&M on Wednesday. Williams leads the LSC with 17.9 points per game this season and has scored in double digits in 20 of 21 games. He's averaging 17.9 points per game in conference play and is second in the LSC with 8.1 rebounds per game. For the week, Williams shot 50 percent from the field and averaged 16 points per game.

Omari Gudul, Angelo State University, and the Rams had one of their best defensive efforts of the season last week, earning a 69-47 win over WT on Wednesday and then a 77-75 win over ENMU on Saturday at home. Gudul recorded his second double-double of the season on Saturday, scoring a career-high 14 points and grabbing 10 rebounds against the Greyhounds. He also added two blocked shots against ENMU after having one against the Buffs. Gudul is averaging 4.8 rebounds per game this season for the Rams and has eight blocked shots in his first season at ASU. He helped limit the two opponents to 37.1 percent shooting and to 61.0 points per game last week.

Antjuan Ball, West Texas A&M University, continued to lead the Buffs on the defensive end of the court as the junior forward averaged 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per contest as WT went 1-1 with a loss to Angelo State before a road win at Texas A&M-Kingsville. Saturday's game at the Steinke Center saw Ball grab eight rebounds and score a team high 14 points as the Buffs topped the Javelinas, 58-51 to move into seventh place in the league standings.

Phil Henry, Eastern New Mexico University, recorded the first double-double of his career in an overtime win over Texas A&M-Kingsville with 17 points and 10 rebounds. He also tied his career-high with five blocks while helping hold the Javelinas to just 25.6 percent (10-for-39) shooting in the second half and overtime as Eastern New Mexico overcame an 11-point halftime deficit. Henry followed up with 10 points, four rebounds and a block at Angelo State. For the season, he has 34 blocks which ranks second in school history and is one shy of tying the record. Henry averaged 13.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 3.0 blocks and 1.0 assists per game last week.

WOMEN'S OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Kiara Wright, Tarleton State University, dominated the floor once again for Tarleton last week, including a 35-point, 21-rebound effort to lift the TexAnns past Midwestern State in overtime in front of a historic crowd in Wisdom Gym last Wednesday. The senior was .500 shooting from the field en route to averaging 25.7 points while also grabbing 15.3 rebounds per game. She also had five assists, two blocks and five steals in three games last week. Wednesday was also her third career game with 20 points and 20 rebounds.

Casey Land, West Texas A&M University, had an outstanding week as she went 12 of 18 from the field and 6 of 12 from beyond the arc helping the Lady Buffs to two big wins for a 19-1 start and a 10-0 mark in LSC play. Land tallied 17 points in WT's win over Angelo State on Wednesday and then responded with a 20-point outing, four triples and a perfect 6 of 6 from the line in an 81-70 win at Texas A&M-Kingsville Saturday. She averaged a team-high 18.5 points and tallied her third 20 or more point performance of the season. She led the team with four steals.

Devin Oliver, Texas A&M University - Commerce, recorded a new career high 25 points in the Lions' loss to Midwestern State ... The junior guard also set a new season in free throws made with nine on 11 attempts ... The five three-pointers made last week is also a season high ... The Rowlett native also averaged four rebounds and 2.5 steals per game last week.

Kirsti Degelia, Midwestern State University, led directed the Mustangs offense in as Midwestern State fell in overtime 78-75 at Tarleton State and defeated Texas A&M-Commerce at home 100-67 last week. Degelia scored 11 points at Tarleton, then followed it with a season-high 25 points with five assists in the win over A&M-Commerce. The 5-8 senior guard from Denton, Texas/Krum averaged 18.0 points and 3.0 assists per game for the week, while shooting 56.0 percent from the floor (14-of-25), including 50.0 percent from the 3-point arc (5-of-10). She also connected on 3-of-5 free throws (60.0 percent), while tallying 2.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals a contest. Degelia moved into seventh place all-time at MSU in career assists this week with 307, passing J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) who had 303.

Karli Kellermeier, Angelo State University, scored a career-high 21 points to lead the Belles to a 69-44 win over ENMU. The Wall native went 8-for-9 from the field and a perfect 4-for-4 in the win. Kellermeier also scored 11 points in a loss to West Texas A&M. She has scored in double figures in three-straight game for the Belles. The junior averaged 16.0 points per game for the week.

Lauren Jay, Texas A&M University - Kingsville, led the Javelinas in scoring for the week with 14 points in both games. She hit .722 of her attempts from the floor and tied her high for points as Javelina with 14 in each game. Against Eastern New Mexico, Jay recorded a career-best four steals.

Jordyn Cooper, Eastern New Mexico University, registered 12-point outings against both Texas A&M-Kingsville and Angelo State, last week. She shot over 40 percent from the field and three-point range and went four-for-five from the free-throw line. Cooper has connected on at least one three-point basket in nine consecutive contests.

Devin Griffin, West Texas A&M University, had her second double-double of the season with 15 points and 10 rebounds in the Lady Buffs' 81-70 win at Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday. Earlier in the week, she had 11 points and went 9 of 11 from the line in WT's win over Angelo State. Griffin had seven assists to go along with a team-high three blocks, while averaging 7.0 rebounds in the two games to lead the team. Griffin and the Lady Buff "D" held ASU to 56 points and 32.2 percent shooting on Wednesday.

Andrea Carter, Midwestern State University, was a force on both ends of the floor as Midwestern State split games in Lone Star Conference play last week. Carter collected her eighth double-double of the season

with 25 points and 13 rebounds in the Mustangs heartbreaking 78-75 overtime loss at No. 21 Tarleton State, then collected 19 points with nine rebounds in the 100-67 win against Texas A&M-Commerce. The 5-10 junior forward from Angleton, Texas also notched three blocked shots against the TexAnns. For the week, Carter shot 45.2 percent from the floor (14-of-31) and connected on 16-of-20 from the free throw line (80.0 percent). She averaged 22.0 points and 11.0 boards for the week, with 68 percent of the boards defensive.

Jasmine Johnson, Eastern New Mexico University, averaged 8.5 rebounds against Texas A&M-Kingsville and Angelo State, in addition to a steal in each game. She also posted a seven points per game average, with nine against Texas A&M-Kingsville.

Angelo State

The Rams continued their season-long resurgence by going 2-0 last week with a 69-47 win at West Texas A&M on Wednesday followed by a 77-75 victory over Eastern New Mexico at home on Saturday. With the wins, ASU swept WT in the regular-season series and evened its season record against the Greyhounds. ASU's defense was at its best throughout the week, limiting its opposition to 37.1 percent shooting and outrebounding them 83-63. The Rams shot 49.5 percent as a team and had 30 offensive and 53 defensive rebounds. Developing a strong inside presence, the Rams won both games despite only hitting four 3-pointers in the two contests. Bryan Hammond led ASU with 20 points against WT with Tommy Woolridge adding 19. Against ENMU, Kenny Williams turned in his eighth double-double of the season with 22 points and 10 rebounds, while sophomore Omari Gudul had his second double-double with a career-high 14 points to go along with 10 rebounds. ASU hosts Tarleton State on Wednesday before traveling to A&M-Commerce on Saturday.

Cameron

Cameron went 0-2 last week and they have lost their last six games in a row. However in both their losses this week the Aggies had chances for wins but they would fall late. Cameron took #2 Tarleton State into overtime and led late but the Texans would hit the go-ahead free throw with two seconds left to win the game. On Wednesday, Craig Foster had a career high 32 points off of eight made three-pointers which was also a career mark. Cameron will host Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday and they will travel to West Texas A&M on Saturday.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico went 1-1 last week with a home victory over Texas A&M-Kingsville (68-62) in overtime on Wednesday and a road defeat at Angelo State (77-75) on Saturday. Phil Henry recorded his first career double-double against the Javelinas with 17 points and 10 rebounds and also tied his career-highs in blocks (5) and assists (2). Cornelius Cammock added 12 points while Rodney Blackmon and Devone Davis contributed with 10 points apiece. The Greyhounds came back from an 11-point halftime to win which is their largest comeback of the season. It is also the first time since 2003-04 that ENMU won two overtime games in a season and first since 1994-95 that they had two extra period victories at home. In the two-point defeat to the Rams, Blackmon scored a game-high 24 points as he was 7-for-16 from the field, 6-of-12 on three-pointers and 4-for-6 at the charity stripe. He also was credited with a career-high

six steals. Rafael Love and Henry added 14 and 10 points, respectively, while Davis tallied 13 points and a team-high five rebounds and three assists off the bench. This week the Greyhounds face Cameron on the road on Wednesday at 7 p.m. MT and follow up by hosting Midwestern State on Saturday with tipoff set for 6 p.m.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State extended its current winning streak to four games with critical South Central Region and Lone Star Conference wins against Tarleton State and Texas A&M-Commerce... The Mustangs snapped No. 2-ranked Tarleton State's 20-game homecourt winning streak and program-best 18-game winning streak with a 77-75 overtime win Wednesday night at Wisdom Gym... MSU claimed its second win in five attempts over teams ranked No. 2 in the NABC Division II poll with its win over Tarleton State Wednesday. The other win came over Sam Houston State (81-72) on Feb. 8, 1986... Midwestern improved to 6-4 against nationally ranked opposition during the Nelson Haggerty era... MSU also put an end to Tarleton's unbeaten run in the LSC. The last team to go unbeaten throughout LSC play was Abilene Christian (10-0) in 1985-86... Midwestern improved to 15-11 all time at Wisdom Gym and leads its all time series with the Texans 44-24... The Mustangs claimed their fourth straight win over Texas A&M-Commerce and have won 14 of the last 15 against the Lions dating back to the 2005-06 season... The Mustangs have outrebounded the opposition in each of its last 11 games by an average margin of 10.2 rebounds per game... MSU ranks 10th in NCAA Division II and tops the LSC with 15.6 offensive rebounds per game... The Mustangs rank 16th national and top the LSC with a +8.0 rebound margin... Midwestern also tops the LSC in both defensive (.724) and offensive (.391) rebound percentage... Senior guard Monzaigo Williams ranks third in the LSC in scoring (17.2 ppg), 13th in field goal percentage (.476), fourth in assists per game (4.5), eighth in free throw percentage (.760), second in steals per game (1.9), seventh in 3-point percentage (.434), fifth in 3-pointers per game (2.0) and second in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0)... Williams is averaging 19.5 points and 5.2 assists per game over his last four outings... Senior forward Eddie D'Haiti connected on 7-of-11 of his shots from the field including three 3-pointers on his way to a career-high 18 points while pulling down seven rebounds with three blocked shots Saturday against Texas A&M-Commerce... Senior guard DeJuan Plummer is 1-of-13 from the field and has just three total points in his last three games, but his lone made field goal against Tarleton State sent the game to overtime... Plummer scored in double figures in 13 of 17 games from the start of the season... Senior guard JaMichael Rivers scored eight of his 10 points during a 16-5 run in the final 6:44 of the first half Saturday against Texas A&M-Commerce... Rivers is averaging 7.6 points and 2.0 assists in five games since returning from injury... Senior guard Cam Adderley knocked down a career-high four 3-pointers on his way to a 16-point effort Saturday night against Texas A&M-Commerce... Junior forward DeV Vaughn Jones matched a season high by scoring four points at Tarleton State and against Texas A&M-Commerce last week...

Tarleton State

The Texans dropped its first game of the regular season this week and went 1-1 after rebounding with a win on Saturday ... The Texans lost 77-75 in overtime to the Midwestern State Mustangs on Wednesday before picking up a 75-74 overtime win over Cameron on the

road on Saturday ... Tarleton played in back-to-back overtime games for the first time since 2006-07 when the team played in four consecutive overtime affairs ... The Texans scored 75 points in both games this week, extending the team's run of at least 75 points or more in all 20 games this season ... Wednesday's loss snapped Tarleton's longest winning streak in school history at 18 games and it also snapped the third longest home winning streak of 20 straight wins inside Wisdom Gym as well ... Tarleton's No. 2 ranking last week marked the first time the Texans have earned the ranking since Dec. 13, 2006 ... The Texans have been ranked No. 2 in the nation six different weeks since the 2002-03 season ... The Texans will stay away from Wisdom Gym to begin the week with a road game at Angelo State on Wednesday ... The Texans will then return to Stephenville to host Texas A&M-Kingsville on Saturday, in a game that will be carried live on CSN Houston.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Texas A&M-Kingsville men's basketball team hosts Texas A&M-Commerce on Thursday at 8 p.m. before travelling to Tarleton State on Saturday for a televised game on CSN Houston...The Javelinas dropped a pair of close battles this week. They lost in overtime on Wednesday to Eastern New Mexico by six points and by seven on Saturday to West Texas A&M. Of the team's seven Lone Star Conference setbacks this season four have come by seven or fewer points... Rashad Basey had quite the game Saturday as he came off the bench for the first time this year. The senior finished with 20 points in 23 minutes of play going 8-of-15 from the field. The senior guard added five rebounds, five assists and four steals in the contest. For the week, he averaged 14 points with four rebounds, four assists, and two steals a game. He shot 50 percent from the field...After rejoining the Javelinas for Lone Star Conference play, Daymon Warren had his best offensive game of the season on Saturday as he posted a season-best 15 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the floor...Rashad Basey and Daymon Warren combined to shoot 15-of-25 from the field for 60% on Saturday for Kingsville. Angelo State

The Belles are 12-9 on the season and 6-4 in the LSC ... ASU is 4-2 in home conference games after a 69-44 win over ENMU ... ASU is holding teams to 58.6 points per game and 37.3-percent shooting ... Karli Kellermeier scored a career-high 21 points in the win

over ENMU ... Amanda Weaver is hitting 40.2-percent of 3-pointers after five against ENMU ... Three Belles averaged double figure points last week in Kellermeier (16.0), Hillari Adam (15.0) and Amanda Weaver (11.0).

Cameron

Cameron went 1-2 last week and snapped a five game skid by beating #21 Tarleton State 76-72 in overtime at the Aggie Gym on Saturday night. Oddly, the Aggies are 3-21 in their last 24 conference games and all three wins have come against Tarleton State. Christina Caddy had a career night with a double-double, her 20 rebounds was second highest this season in the Lone Star Conference and highest total for an Aggie player in three years. Cameron will host Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday and they will travel to West Texas A&M on Saturday.

Eastern New Mexico

The EasternNewMexicoUniversitywomen'sbasketball team was led by Jordyn Cooper's 12 points per game, last week. The Zias enter this week looking to snap a five-game skid, after setbacks to Texas A&M-Kingsville and Angelo State. This week, ENMU will visit Cameron University, before they host Midwestern State.

Midwestern State

Midwestern State is 14-8 overall, 6-5 in Lone Star Conference play ... The Mustangs had their three-game win streak snapped on Wednesday night with the 78-75 overtime loss at Tarleton State, but made it four wins in the last five games with the 100-67 triumph over Texas A&M-Commerce ... The TSU contest was the second overtime loss of the season, and marked the first time since the 2005-06 campaign that MSU had lost multiple overtime games in a year ... It was just the eighth time this season a team has scored more than 70 against MSU, with two games breaking the mark in overtime. MSU is 3-5 when allowing more than 70 points ... MSU then held A&M-C to 67 meaning the Mustangs have held 11 of their last 14 opponents under 70, with 13 of the last 14 staying under 70 during the regulation 40 minutes ... Midwestern has still limited opponents' scoring over the last eight games, holding their opponents to an average of 62.9 points over that span ... MSU outrebounded A&M-Commerce 51-30, marking the first time in eight games the Mustangs won the rebound war in a game. The Mustangs are 8-1 when having a rebounding advantage, 4-5 when being outrebounded by opponents and 2-2 when both teams have an equal number of rebounds ... Junior Shambreka Jones of Mesquite, Texas/Poteet tied the MSU single-game record for blocked shots when she swatted seven against A&M-Commerce. She now has 10 on the season and is ranked 12th in the LSC averaging 0.5 per game ... Senior Kirsti Degelia of Denton, Texas/Krum became just the seventh Midwestern State women's player to score 1,300 points after her 11 points at Tarleton and 25 vs A&M-Commerce to amass 1,326 career points – seventh all-time. She is 69 points away from Lounette Adkins Decker (1978-79, 80-81, 93-95) with 1,395 points in sixth ... Degelia is now seventh at MSU with 307 career assists, passing J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) with 303 in seventh. She needs eight to reach Mandy Clueley (1994-98) with 315 in sixth ... Degelia is 13th on the MSU career steal's list with 149 passing the 147 of J.J. Anderson (1997-2001) and Stacey Staten (2004-08) ... Junior forward Andrea Carter of Angleton, Texas is second in the Lone Star Conference in scoring, third in rebounding and fifth in steals, averaging 15.5 points, 8.9 rebounds and 2.0 steals a game. She also ranks

sixth in field goal percentage (51.8 percent), sixth in free throw percentage (75.0 percent) and 11th in blocked shots (0.5) ... Carter moved into seventh in career rebounds at MSU after her 13 boards at Tarleton and nine vs A&M-C. She now has 685, passing Rulinda Vogtsberger (1978-81) with 666. Carter needs 46 boards to tie Shannon Boase (1995-99) in sixth with 731 ... Carter is also 12th in career steals at MSU, with 164 and needs three more to pass Jennifer Butler (1994-99) with 166 in 11th ... Junior Diana Jones of Hewitt, Texas/Midway leads the Lone Star Conference with 4.9 assists per game and leads the league with a 2.04 assist/turnover ratio. Jones is fourth in the LSC with a 78.4 free throw percentage (69-of-88) and 11th in steals (1.5 per game) ...

Tarleton State

No. 21 Tarleton State went 1-2 last week but the one win came in front a record crowd at Wisdom Gym when the TexAnns handed Midwestern State an overtime loss. Kiara Wright recorded her third career 20-20 game with 35 points and 21 rebounds.

Texas A&M-Commerce

A&M-C went 1-1 last week with a win over Cameron at home and a loss to Midwestern State in Wichita Falls. The Lions swept the season series with the Aggies for the first time since the 2008-09 season. The Lions have a chance to sweep Midwestern State with a win but dropped their fourth straight away from Commerce versus the Mustangs. The Lions play South Dakota School of Mines on Monday night and travel to Kingsville on Thursday this week.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelina women went 1-1 last week running away in a win over Eastern New Mexico before falling in a battle with West Texas A&M...The Javelinas have a busy week ahead of them with three Lone Star Conference games in a four-day period. The Hoggies face Texas Woman's at home on Wednesday with Texas A&M-Commerce coming to town on Thursday. On Saturday, Kingsville travels to Stephenville to meet Tarleton...The Javelinas posted a Lone Star Conference-high with 22 steals against Eastern New Mexico. The steal total was just three off the single-game record for the Javelinas. Kingsville's previous season-high was 16 done twice in back-to-back games with McMurry and Our Lady of Lake in the second and third games of the season. Going into the weekend, Kingsville was tenth in the nation with 12.2 steals in the most recent statistical report. Individually, Rosalie Cutri was 42nd in the country with 2.57 steals a game, while Lindsey Mahone was 64th with 2.33...In swiping the 22 steals, three Hoggies posted four steals as Lauren Jay and Ashley Viera posted career-highs and Cutri had four. Lindsey Mahone added three... In the win over the Zias, Kingsville took advantage of the 29 forced turnovers outscoring Eastern 43-5 in points off turnovers...Lauren Jay has picked up her scoring in recent games for the Javelinas. The junior transfer from Southern Arkansas has posted three consecutive double-digit scoring performances. After putting up 10 points at Angelo State, Jay has had back-to-back games of 14 points. In those three games Jay has shot 16-of-26. She has shot 61.5% from the floor during that span. For the season, Jay is shooting 47.1% and averaging 12.7 points a game... With 18 points against Eastern New Mexico, Lindsey Mahone posted 18-of-more points for the sixth time this season and has 12 double-digit outings. She had six in 20 minutes of action on Saturday...After falling by 35 points to the Lady Buffs in West Texas, A&M-Kingsville played a much better game on Saturday

cutting the margin by a third. The 70 points were nearly 12 points more than West Texas was allowing on the season.

Texas Woman's

The TWU basketball won all three games last week to improve the record to 12-9 on the season and 7-4 in the Lone Star Conference. The Pioneers defeated #19 Tarleton State, 64-59, on Monday, Cameron, 62-58, on Thursday and South Dakota School of Mines, 73-50, on Saturday. TWU is currently tied for second with Tarleton State in the LSC Standings. Junior Ria Pateraki led the team with 17.7 points per game, 10.7 rebounds per game and 10 assists. She also shot a team-best 56.8 percent from the floor and perfect 10-for-10 from the free-throw line. Senior Rebekah Clueley averaged 15.0 points while recording a career-high 23 points against Cameron.

West Texas A&M

The Lady Buffs won two more games this week and improved to 19-1 on the year and a perfect 10-0 in Lone Star Conference play...WT won 95-56 over Angelo State and downed Texas A&M-Kingsville 81-70 on the road...WT scored 80 points or more in each game running the streak to eight consecutive games the Lady Buffs have scored 80 or more points...It was WT's 11th and 12 consecutive victories marking the longest streak in the LSC and fourth longest nationally...It also marked the longest winning streak for the Lady, Buffs since the 2006-07 season when they won 14-straight...The 19-1 start is the best start since the 1996-97 season when WT started 29-1... With senior Devin Griffin's 10 rebounds on Saturday, she surpassed 500 career rebounds (508) marking the second Lady Buff this season to eclipse 500 rebounds (Chontiquah White)...WT ranks 24th nationally in attendance this season which is third-best in the LSC...Chontiquah White has 914 points and tallied 500 rebounds last month...Senior Devin Griffin eclipsed the 1,000-point mark earlier this season.
