LSC BASEBALL

Lone Star Conference baseball is in full swing with all six teams in partaking in non-conference play.

In 2014, LSC teams are playing a 10-week schedule with a four-game series and three-game series against every other team. Each four-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday, a 7x7 doubleheader Saturday and 9-inning contest Sunday, and each three-game series shall consist of a 9-inning game Friday and a 7x9 doubleheader Saturday.

The overall LSC Champion will be the team(s) with the best winning percentage in regular-season conference games, while the winner of the postseason championship will be recognized as LSC Tournament Champion and receive the league's automatic qualification into NCAA postseason. The championship will be played May 8-10, at the No. 1 seed.

LSC baseball teams are 19-10 overall this season. In the NCAA South Central Region, the teams are currently 6-3 combined versus Heartland Conference teams and 8-3 against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

HITTERS

Brett David, Angelo State University, JR, DH, El Paso, Coronado

David went on a tear in Laredo last weekend, going 7-for-10 with three doubles in Angelo State's three-game sweep of Texas A&M International. He scored six runs in the series and had two RBI for the Rams who improved to 5-0 on the season. David is hitting .615 on the season with eight hits in four games played to start his junior season. He has three doubles this season, already passing his season total from last season when he battled through a hand injury.

Sam Hedrick, Eastern New Mexico University, SR, Infielder, Fairfield, Calif., Rodriguez HS/Sacramento CC

Hedrick led Eastern New Mexico with a .500 average (6-for-12) and had five stolen bases in five attempts in a four-game series against Adams State. He also scored four times and drove in three runs. Hedrick recorded two extra base hits, a double and triple. On his triple, the first of his career, he plated two runs in the Greyhounds 13-3 victory. He stole two bases apiece in games three and four of the series that tied his career-high that he set back in the 2012 season. Hedrick also posted a .750 slugging and .625 on-base percentage, both team-highs. In the field he did not record an error at third base in nine chances with three putouts and six assists.

PITCHERS

Jake Feckley, Angelo State University, SR, RHP, Wylie, Texas, Wylie HS

Feckley posted another stellar start for Angelo State, leading the Rams to a 10-1 win over Texas A&M International in the second game of last Saturday's doubleheader in Laredo. The senior, who moved to 2-0 on the season with the win, also maintained his 0.00 ERA by not allowing an earned run in 6.0 innings of work for the Rams. He struck out four Dustdevils and scattered four hits. The win pulled him even with Kenny Elkind and Joseph Key with 16 career wins for the program's all-time record.

Steve Matta, Cameron University, SR, P, Chandler, Ariz., Mesa CC

Matta earned his first win at Cameron after tossing 6 1/3 innings of work in a 5-2 win against UT-Permian Basin. He held batters to a .174 average and only one earned run to cross home plate.

OTHER TOP PERFORMERS

Tobin Mateychick, Cameron University, hit in three games and pitched in one for the Aggies last weekend at UT-Permian Basin. In 11 at bats Mateychick recorded a pair of doubles and four RBI against the Falcons. Overall he have five hits (.455 hitting percentage) and scored all three of Cameron's runs in a 4-3 loss on Saturday. Mateychick would tack on one more RBI on Sunday off of a double in Cameron's win.

Ben Monticello, Eastern New Mexico University, pitched opening day for Eastern New Mexico, throwing seven strong innings and picking up the victory in a 7-2 game. He struck out six without allowing a walk and allowed just two runs on eight hits. Monticello's ERA for the week was 2.57 while Adams State mustered just two extra-base hits off him.

Dylan James, West Texas A&M University, pitched six innings in the season-opener Saturday at Colorado State-Pueblo. Though he didn't factor into the decision, James fanned 10 in the game and walked just four while scattering four hits. He allowed three runs with two earned runs.

Angelo State

The Rams improved to 5-0 with a three-game sweep of Texas A&M International last weekend in Laredo. ASU hit .388 as a team, while its pitching staff limited the Dustdevils to a .188 average and finished the weekend with a 2.35 staff ERA. ASU outhit TAMIU 40-15 in the series and outscored its opposition 30-7. Brett David led the Rams at the plate, going 7-for-10 with three doubles, while Tyler Coughenour added six hits and two RBI. David Goggin and Nehwon Norkeh each had five hits in the series, with Norkeh hitting a three-run home run in the top of the seventh in the finale to lift the Rams to the run-rule win. Jake Feckley (2-0) shutdown the Dustdevils with four strikeouts and no earned runs in 6.0 innings, while Dillon Becker (1-0) earned the victory in the opener after throwing 1.2 innings with two strikeouts and Miles Gully (1-0) earned the win in the finale

after throwing 2.2 innings and striking out five. The Rams return to action this weekend with a three game series at Lubbock Christian.

Cameron

Cameron went 1-3 last weekend in a non-conference series at UT-Permian Basin. The Aggies were led by Brad Blumer and Tobin Mateychick who went a combined 13-25 with six RBI. Steve Matta went 6 1/3 innings on the mound for the Ags and allowed only one run to cross home plate. The Aggies are 3-3 this season and they will host Northwest Missouri State for a three game series starting on Friday.

Eastern New Mexico

Eastern New Mexico opened the season by winning three of four from Adams State at home. The Greyhounds began with a 7-2 victory on Friday followed by a walk-off 2-1 win in the first game of a doubleheader and followed with a 13-3 victory in the second game on Saturday. The Grizzlies took the series-finale 6-2. Sam Hedrick led ENMU with a .500 average, .750 slugging percentage, .625 on-base percentage and was a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen base attempts. Brett Ackerman drove in a team-high five runs and was 2-for-2 in steals. Matthew Burks led off the first game of the year for ENMU with a solo home run on just the fifth pitch of his Greyhound career. Chad Highberger also hit a homer in the first game, a three-run shot, that sealed the win for Eastern. As a team, the Greyhounds batted .300 with a .433 slugging percentage, .396 on-base percentage and was 12-for-14 in stolen base attempts. In the field they committed just two errors leads the Lone Star Conference with a .985 fielding percentage. On the mound, starters Rusty Edwards and Ben Monticello picked up victories while Keigan Basso needed just seven pitches in an inning of relief for his first career win. Matthew Artalejo struck out seven in six innings while Monticello had six strikeouts with zero walks in seven innings. Eastern pitchers struck out 26 ASU batters and allowed them to hit .254 with seven extra-base hits. This week the Greyhounds host New Mexico Highlands for a four-game series this weekend beginning on Valentine's Day at 5 p.m. with a single contest. Saturday will feature a doubleheader starting at 1 p.m. while the finale on Sunday will see the first pitch at 1 p.m.

Texas A&M-Kingsville

The Javelinas went 0-3 last week in a 3-game series with nationally-ranked Southern Arkansas. It was the first time since last March that the Javelinas lost three games in a row. The last time they lost three straight was in the first three games of their series with Abilene Christian...The Hoggies have just one game this week as they travel on Friday to Houston-Victoria to take on the Jaguars at 5 p.m. ...Derrick Walls opened the series with four hits going 4-for-5. He finished the weekend with a .385 mark. It was the first 4-hit game of the season by the Javelinas...Justin Lee finished the weekend going 3-of-10 at the plate with a double. Lee is now second with a .385 average at the plate and leads the team with .529 on-base percentage Lee's slugging percentage of .538 is second only to Taylor Taska (.722)...Cody Williams had a solid long relief outing tossing 4-1/3 innings of scoreless relief in the opening game of the series. He has now tossed 5-1/3 innings of scoreless relief on the season scattering three hits while striking out three...Taylor Taska has reached safely in all five games this season and had two RBI this past week. He is averaging .333 on the season with six RBI and four runs scored with a .478 on-base percentage.

West Texas A&M

The West Texas A&M baseball team went 1-2 to open the 2014 season in three, one-run games at Colorado State-Pueblo over the weekend...The Buffs won the opener 4-3 behind strong pitching from senior Dylan James who had a game-high 10 strikeouts...CSUP won the next two 5-4 in 10 innings and 2-1...WT struggled offensively hitting just .198 for the series with just 21 hits in 106 at bats and just three extra-base hits...Despite the poor offense, the staff was pretty good with a 2.08 ERA surrendering 18 hits (.189 opp/ba) 10 runs with six earned, 11 walks and 31 strikeouts...The teams left a combined 50 men on base as WT stranded 26...In both of the losses the Buffs had good chances, but were unable to break through...WT opens the 2014 home slate Tuesday at 2 p.m. against Southwestern Oklahoma State, before traveling to McMurry this weekend for a four-game set.
